## APPLICATION TO VICTORIA OF PART II. OF THE IMPERIAL "MEDICAL ACT 1886."

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

MY LORD,—With reference to your Despatch, No. 139, of the 16th of December last, and to my reply, No. 27, of the 29th instant, I have the honour to transmit to you, for communication to your Lordship's Government, an Order of Her Majesty in Council applying the Second Part of the *Medical Act 1886* to the colony of Victoria.

WHEREAS by the *Medical Act 1886* it is provided amongst other things that Her Majesty may from time to time by Order in Council declare that the second part of the said Act shall be deemed on and after a day to be named in such Order to apply to any British possession which in Her Majesty's opinion affords to the medical practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in the said British possession as to Her Majesty may seem just, and from and after the day named in such Order in Council such British possession shall be deemed to be a British possession to which the said Act applies within the meaning of the second part thereof, and that until such Order in Council has been made in respect of any British possession the said second part of the said Act shall not be deemed to apply to any such possession.

And whereas the colony of Victoria in Australia is a British possession within the meaning of the said Act, and affords in Her Majesty's opinion to the registered medical practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in such colony of Victoria as to Her seem just under and by virtue of the provisions of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, and intitled the *Medical Practitioners Statute 1865*.

Now therefore Her Majesty doth hereby, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, order direct and declare that on and after the first day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety the second part of the *Medical Act 1886* shall be deemed to apply to the colony of Victoria in Australia.

**REGULATION No. 7.**

**T**HE Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, do make the following Regulations:-

*Regulations fixing the annual charges for water supplied for stock and domestic purposes for storage in private tanks on lands through which the Trust channels run, and on holdings abutting on rivers, creeks, streams, channels, water-courses, lakes, reservoirs, and swamps, the waters in which have been supplemented by Trust works.*

**I.** The annual charges for water on all holdings through which the Trust channels run north of the River Wimmera for each and every tank not exceeding a capacity of one thousand cubic yards, and for every time the tank is filled, shall be as follows:-

- (a) On holdings up to one hundred acres, Two pounds.
- (b) On holdings exceeding one hundred acres and not exceeding six hundred and forty acres, Four pounds.
- (c) For each and every tank exceeding a capacity of one thousand cubic yards, a special agreement to be made with the Trust.

**II.** The annual charges for water on all holdings through which the Trust channels run south of the River Wimmera for each and every tank not exceeding a capacity of one thousand cubic yards, and for every time the tank is filled, shall be as follows:-

- (d) On holdings up to one hundred acres, Two pounds.
- (e) On holdings exceeding one hundred acres, and not exceeding six hundred and forty acres, Three pounds.
- (f) For each and every tank exceeding a capacity of One thousand cubic yards, a special agreement to be made with the Trust.

**III.** The annual charges for water on all holdings abutting on rivers, creeks, streams, channels, lakes, water-courses, reservoirs, and swamps, the waters in which have been supplemented by Trust works, shall be as follows:-

- (g) On holdings up to three hundred and twenty acres, Two pounds.
- (h) On holdings exceeding three hundred and twenty acres, and for every additional Three hundred and twenty acres or portion of three hundred and twenty acres, Two pounds.

**IV.** In the construction of these regulations the word "Trust" shall mean "The Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."

The foregoing regulation, numbered Seven, was made by the Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust this second day of May, One thousand eight hundred and ninety.

## MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of July, 1890.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 916, it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should—

(a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expense of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the costs of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted;

(b) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust should have authority, to be called a waterworks district;

(c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;

(d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and

(e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And it was further enacted that the Governor in Council might, where a waterworks district is either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Councillors of the Central Riding of the Shire of Mansfield, for a loan of Six thousand pounds sterling (£6,000) to carry out certain waterworks for the domestic supply of a waterworks district under the said Act, embracing the township of Mansfield, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application, deposited in the Department of Victorian Water Supply, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1) The construction of the said waterworks, and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust.

(2) That the councillors for the Central Riding of the Shire of Mansfield and three other persons shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.

(3) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Six thousand pounds sterling (£6,000), for the purpose of constructing works for the supply of the township of Mansfield with water, and also for paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.

(4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Portion I.—Commencing at south-east angle of allotment 60A, parish of Loyola; thence westerly by south boundary of said allotment 60A to south-west angle thereof; thence northerly by west boundary of said allotment 60A and a line across road to south-east angle of allotment 69, parish of Mansfield; thence westerly by south boundary of allotments 69 and 73 to south-west angle of allotment 73; thence northerly by west boundary of allotments 73, 72, and

71, a line across road, west boundary of allotment 66, a line across road, and west boundary of allotments 59 and 56 to north-west angle of allotment 56; thence easterly by north boundary of allotments 56, 57, 38, a line across road, north boundaries of allotments 37, 36, a line across road, and north boundaries of allotments 24 and 23 to north-east angle of allotment 23; thence south by east boundary of allotment 23, a line across road, east boundary of allotments 21, 1A, a line across road, east boundary of allotment 8A, a line across road, and east boundary of allotments 13A and 14A to south-east angle of allotment 14A; thence westerly by south boundary of allotments 14A, 15A, a line across road, and south boundary of allotments 16A, 23A, and Pound reserve to south-west angle of said Pound reserve, all in the parish of Mansfield; thence south by a line across road to eastern boundary of allotment 60A, parish of Loyola; thence south-easterly by eastern boundary of said allotment 60A to the commencing point.

Portion II.—A strip of land, one chain wide, along line of channel: Commencing at its offtake from the Delatite River at south-west angle of allotment 84, parish of Delatite; thence running in a general north-westerly direction through allotments 81B, 81A, 79A, 80B, 80A, 70A, 71B, 78B, 78A, 77B, 77A, 75, 76, 54, 53, 35, 53, 36, 38B, 38A, 39B, 39A, 40B, 40A, 41B, 41A, 31A, 9B, 9A, 10A, 6B, 8A, 6B, 5B, 5A, 4, and 3, all in the parish of Delatite, and allotments 90, 91, 69, 70A, 63, and 61B, all in the parish of Loyola, to the south boundary of allotment 60A, in said parish of Loyola.

(5) That the principal works to be constructed shall consist of an offtake channel from the Delatite River, the construction of a service reservoir, and the reticulation of the township of Mansfield.

(6) That the name of the Trust shall be the Mansfield Waterworks Trust.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

LITTLE RIVER AND DUCK PONDS UNITED  
FARMERS' COMMON.—REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the management of the Little River and Duck Ponds United Farmers' Common.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st May, 1888, the managers of the Little River and Duck Ponds United Farmers' Common having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bonâ fide* owner.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows:—For every horse, Twelve shillings (12s.) per annum; for every head of other large cattle, Six shillings (6s.) per annum; for every head of small cattle, Three shillings (3s.) per annum; and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year.

4. Sheep and goats shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

5. All stock depasturing on the common shall be mustered on or about the first day of April and the first day of October of every year, and branded with the common brand in pitch or tar; and the owners of such stock shall be in attendance and assist in the branding.

6. No person shall place on the common or remove therefrom any stock without giving notice to the herdsman.

7. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the common, but the herdsman shall, in the event of any stock straying from the common, give notice thereof to the owners.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1884."

THE Governor in Council has made the subjoined Regulations pursuant to the provisions of section 27, sub-section 10, and section 38, sub-section 11, of *The Land Act 1884*.

In pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by *The Land Act 1884*, and of every other power and authority, enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the colony of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive

Council thereof, doth make the following regulations with respect to the resumption, as sites for townships or villages or for mining purposes, of lands forming part of any pastoral allotment or grazing area, in accordance with the condition required to be inserted in the lease thereof, by the 10th sub-section of section 27 and the 11th sub-section of section 38 of the said *Land Act 1884*.

1. Whenever it shall appear to Her Majesty, her heirs, and successors that it is expedient to resume as sites for one or more townships or villages any land forming part of a pastoral allotment or grazing area under the condition above recited the full value not exceeding the amount expended thereon by the lessee of all houses, fences, wells, reservoirs, tanks, dams, and other substantial and permanent improvements made, erected, or constructed by the lessee on the land so resumed, shall be ascertained by arbitration.

2. Such arbitration shall be carried out in the same manner as is hereinafter provided with respect to resumption for mining purposes.

3. Any person desirous of moving Her Majesty, her heirs, and successors to resume for mining purposes any of the land comprised in any lease of a pastoral allotment or of a grazing area, shall do so by addressing the Minister in the form or to the effect contained in the first schedule hereto.

4. Such resumption may be enforced under the 10th sub-section of section 27 or the 11th sub-section of section 38 of the said *Land Act 1884*.

5. Such applicant shall forward to the Minister, with his application, the sum of £10, which shall be dealt with as hereinafter directed. He shall also forward a plan showing what portion of the leased lands he desires to have resumed and a statement in the form of a statutory declaration of the reasons why he desires such resumption.

6. Such statement shall be in duplicate.

7. On the receipt of such application, plan, and duplicate statement, the Minister may, if in his opinion a *prima facie* case for resumption is made out, require the lessee, as also his registered mortgagee or mortgagees (if any), to show cause before him, on a day to be fixed by him, why, on payment to him of the full value of all the matters and things enumerated in sub-section 11 of section 38, Her Majesty, her heirs and successors should not resume possession of and re-enter upon the lands applied for, or such part as the Minister may approve of.

8. Such cause shall be shown by the lessee or his registered mortgagee or mortgagees (if any) by his or their forwarding to the Minister in the form of a statutory declaration his or their reasons why such resumption should not take place, or why a smaller area than that desired by the applicant should be resumed.

9. Before making such statement the lessee may require to be furnished with the duplicate statement before mentioned for his guidance in framing his counter statement.

10. Should such lessee or mortgagee or other of them decline or neglect to forward to the Minister such counter statement the Minister may act, should he think proper so to do, on the statement made by the applicant, and any other evidence that the Minister may require; but before so acting he shall satisfy himself that the intended application has been brought to the notice of the lessee or mortgagee or their agents or representative.

11. On receipt of such counter statement of the lessee and mortgagee the Minister may, if he be of opinion that such counter statement is a sufficient answer to such application, inform both parties of such his opinion and determination, and may, should he so think fit, out of the money deposited with him by the applicant, award all reasonable costs to the lessee or mortgagee, or both, and pay the balance (if any) to the applicant.

12. Should the Minister be of opinion that such counter statement is an insufficient answer to such application he may inform all parties of such his opinion and determination, and shall at the same time fix definitely the area and boundaries of the land to be resumed, and (unless all parties agree within one week after having been notified thereof as to the amount of compensation, or unless within 14 days thereafter the lessee or mortgagee shall in writing desire the amount to be ascertained by arbitration as hereinafter is mentioned) may refer the question of such amount to a warden.

13. Such warden shall fix a day for the determination of such question, and on such day, or any later day to which such determination may be adjourned, shall in the presence of all parties, or in the absence of either of them on proof satisfactory to him that such party has been duly notified of the time and place where such inquiry shall be held, fix the amount of the valuation to be paid to the lessee.

14. The warden shall report to the Minister the amount of the compensation as fixed by him, as also the amount of costs (if any), which the applicant, ought to pay to the lessee.

15. Such costs shall be paid out of the sum deposited by the applicant, and the balance (if any) shall, on the resumption of the land applied for by the applicant, be paid to him.

16. Should the lessee or mortgagee within the time hereinbefore limited desire that the amount of compensation be ascertained by arbitration and not by a warden he may do so, provided that he signifies his desire to the Minister and appoints his arbitrator and communicates such desire and appointment to the applicant within one week after the Minister has informed him that his counter statement is insufficient, and thereupon the applicant shall within one week after such communication has reached him appoint his arbitrator and inform the Minister of such appointment, and these two arbitrators shall appoint a third.

17. If the land in question is mortgaged the lessee and mortgagee shall only appoint one arbitrator between them, and if they cannot agree upon such arbitrator the Minister shall elect between the person nominated by the lessee and first mortgagee respectively, and the person elected by him shall be the joint arbitrator of the lessee and the mortgagee or mortgagees.

18. Should either party neglect to appoint an arbitrator, or should such arbitrator when appointed die, refuse to act, or become incapable of acting, such proceedings shall *mutatis mutandis* be taken for the purpose of remedying the consequence of such neglect, death, refusal to act, or incapacity as are contained in the 47th and 48th sections of *The Land Act 1884*.

19. The arbitrators or a majority of them shall, within one month after their appointment, or such later day as shall from time to time be allowed by the Minister, report to him the amount of compensation as fixed by them, as also the amount of costs (if any) which the applicant ought to pay to the lessee.

20. Such costs shall be paid in the same manner and out of the same fund as is provided with respect to a reference to a warden.

21. On the amount of compensation being ascertained it shall be paid to the lessee or mortgagee, or as may be agreed upon between them, but if they cannot agree upon the disposal of such amount, or if when tendered to the lessee or mortgagee it shall be refused to be accepted, it shall be paid into the Supreme Court to abide the direction of the Court as to its distribution.

22. On such amount of compensation being paid or tendered to the lessee or mortgagee such lessee shall forthwith surrender to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, his lease, and he shall be entitled to receive free of cost a fresh lease for the unexpired term thereof, at a rent reduced in proportion to the area of land resumed.

1st. All charges must be paid to the secretary when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.

2nd. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the proper fees.

3rd. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper and the relatives unable to pay the usual fees, subject to the direction of the Governor in Council. *Vide section 7, Cemeteries Act 1864.*

4th. Order for interment to be given either to the secretary, or at the office of the trustees, on the day previous, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.

5th. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the proper fees. Parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, or any two of them.

6th. The time fixed for a funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7th. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months.

8th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-stones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9th. A plan of every monument or head-stone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

10th. All persons destroying the fences or in any way injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted as the law directs.

11th. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in, or cemented, or covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

12th. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.

13th. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

14th. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations, from time to time, in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.

15th. No interment shall be less than six feet in depth for adults and children over seven years of age, nor less than five feet in depth for children under seven years of age.

- The charges for burying, or otherwise using the cemetery, must be paid before an order can be given for the particular work or privilege required.
- Orders for interment must be given to the caretaker at least Six (6) working hours before the time appointed for the burial, so as to allow sufficient time for digging the grave within working hours, otherwise the charge for digging will be increased one-half.
- The caretaker will dig all ordinary graves, but when the friends of any indigent person deceased wish to dig the grave themselves, or when brick graves or vaults are required, then the excavations must be made and the ground filled in or removed under the inspection and to the satisfaction of the caretaker.
- The hours fixed for interments are from Ten (10) o'clock a.m. till Six (6) o'clock p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from Ten (10) o'clock a.m. till Four (4) o'clock p.m. during the other four months, except Sundays, when the hours are from Two (2) o'clock till Five (5) o'clock p.m. throughout the year.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, grave-stones, and fences must be kept in proper condition and repair by the owners, otherwise they may be removed by the trustees, after having given notice of their intention to remove them by posting such notice to the last known address of one of the parties concerned.
- Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in and cemented, and covered in by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
- A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every inscription must be submitted to the trustees, without whose approval it shall not be erected or inscribed.
- The ground will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.
- No grave will allowed to be re-opened so as to disturb any remains therein, but a second or more coffins may be placed on the top of the first, provided a depth of not less than three (3) feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground is obtained after the last interment.
- No new grave can be made without paying for the ground, or satisfying the trustees that it has already been paid for.
