REGULATIONS FOR PUPILS IN ARCHITECTURE AND ENGINEERING.

CONDITIONS.

AN applicant for appointment must be not more than 20 years, or less than 16 years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which could interfere with the proper discharge of his profession.

QUALIFICATIONS.

1. The candidate must have passed the Matriculation Examination (including Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic) in the Melbourne or other recognised University; or
2. Passed such other recognised examination, or produce such certificates from the Education Department or other authority as shall satisfy the Inspector-General of Public Works as to his competency in those three subjects, and as to his general educational proficiency.
3. He shall also, with such certificates, submit satisfactory proof of his aptitude for drawing.

PROBATION.

Each candidate approved by the Minister shall enter the office as a probationer for a period of one month without pay; and at the end of that time, if reported by the Inspector-General to have displayed aptitude for the work, he shall be enrolled as a pupil, and shall be subject to the General Regulations for the Public Service so far as they can fairly apply.

No more pupils will be received than are needed for the requirements of the Department.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The term of service shall be two years, and at the end of each year the pupil will be required to pass an examination on the subjects mentioned in the attached schedule.

The Minister reserves the power to displace at any time with the services of any pupil who may, in the opinion of the Inspector-General, be wanting in application or in the careful performance of his work, or whose conduct may be considered by him to be unsatisfactory.

REMUNERATION.

The salary for the first year shall be £40, and, subject to the passing of the required examinations, the salary for the second year shall be £60. On successfully passing the prescribed departmental examinations, a pupil will, at the end of the term of two years, receive a certificate of competency as an engineering or architectural draughtsman in the Clerical Division; or he may be called upon to continue in his pupilage for two additional years, at salaries of £80 and £100 respectively, and to undergo a final examination, upon passing which satisfactorily he will receive a certificate and become qualified for appointment as junior architectural or engineering draughtsman, Professional Division.

SCHEDULE OF SUBJECTS FOR EXAMINATION.

First Year.

Tracing, colouring, drawing to scale, neat lettering, general knowledge of terms used in building and engineering work, mensuration, and elementary freehand drawing.

Second Year.

Simple geometrical and freehand drawing, elementary building materials and construction.

Elementary knowledge of the styles of architecture.

Building quantities, ornamental writing and printing.

For Engineering—Simple practical trigonometry and field work.

Tracings and drawings connected with the subjects for examination for each year, and duly certified as being the work of the pupil, will be considered in connexion with each examination.

- To keep rent-roll, and issue receipts for payment of rents of College lands;
- To issue leases of College lands, and arrange schedules of areas to be let;
- To keep register of applications for admission to Agricultural Colleges as students, and notify of vacancies, and deal with correspondence generally relating to Colleges;
- To prepare all Orders in Council under the Stock Act, Bonus Regulations, Agricultural Colleges Act, Veterinary Surgeons Act, &c., &c.;
- To revise articles of bulletin, and printer's proof of same;
- To act as Secretary to Council of Agricultural Education in absence of the Secretary for Agriculture, and to take charge of the office during the latter's absence on duty;
- To instruct the clerks in the matter of work to be performed;
- To supervise compilation of Agricultural College rolls, prepare returns required by the Honorable the Minister, &c.

PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers in the Public Service who may be desirous of obtaining the appointment of Assistant Medical Inspector under the Board of Public Health, at a salary of £300 per annum.

The officer appointed will be required to perform the following duties, viz.:—

1. To advise the Board on the medical aspects of all sanitary matters which come before it.
2. To prepare regulations, circulars, and memoranda for publication on all sanitary and medical subjects connected with the health of the people.
3. To peruse, minute, and advise on the reports of the local health officers (these are very numerous).
4. To watch the returns and notifications of infectious diseases, and advise when special inquiries are needed, or when special action by the Board is required.

5. To investigate the causes and conditions attending outbreaks of infectious or contagious diseases in particular localities, and to make recommendations for the prevention of the spread and for the abatement of such outbreaks, and to guard against their recurrence.

6. To make periodical inspections of, and to report on the sanitary condition and sanitary administration of the various municipal districts of the colony (190 in number). Such inspection including inspection of drainage and sewerage works, water supply, methods of conservancy in regard to refuse and excrement, inspection of hospitals and asylums, factories, common lodging-houses, abattoirs, noxious trade establishments, dairies, butchers' shops, and private dwellings and premises; inquiry into the prevalence of various diseases and their incidence, into the management of infectious and contagious diseases, into the duties assigned to health officers, sanitary inspectors, and the manner of fulfilment, into by-laws and their observance, into the management of cemeteries; advising the local authorities and health officers on all these matters, and reporting to the Board where its intervention is needed, either to recommend or to order improvements.

7. To study and advise the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them.

8. To inspect, report on, and direct the work of public vaccination throughout the colony (there are about 250 public vaccinators), and supervise the issuing of lymph and the establishment where it is prepared; to inquire into any allegations in regard to ill effects arising from vaccination, or as to inefficiency of the lymph.

9. To advise the Board when the Governor in Council should be moved to proclaim places beyond the sea infected; to advise as to diseases to be quarantined; periods of quarantine; arrangements for quarantining, applying medical attendance, nurses, &c.; to inspect the quarantine establishments.

10. In connexion with paragraph 9, and with other duties, to keep conversant with the spread of infectious and contagious diseases in other parts of Australia and of the world, and with all advances in sanitary and medical science.

11. To take immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any introduced disease, such as small-pox or cholera.

12. To make original investigations into prevalence of diseases in man, and the relations of the same to disease in animals.

13. To advise the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water and of the various kinds of foods on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of the Health Act in reference to unwholesome and adulterated food, and otherwise.

14. To advise the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for the granting or cancelling of licences for abattoirs and noxious trade establishments.

Every applicant should be between the ages of twenty-seven and forty years, and must be vigorous and of sound health, and he must show that he possesses a surgical and medical qualification recognised by the Medical Board of Victoria, and that he has general experience in the treatment of communicable diseases.

The possession by applicants of the following additional qualifications will be considered to be valuable, although not essential:—

(a) A scientific degree.

(b) A diploma or certificate in State Medicine.

Applications accompanied by evidence of qualification will be received by the Secretary, Public Service Board, up to Wednesday, 8th October, 1890.

Explosives Act 1890.
**GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR POWDER
MAGAZINES.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second
day of September, 1890.*

WHEREAS by section 16 of the *Explosives Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations, and rescind the same, providing for the storage of the several substances included in the interpretation of the word "explosive" in Part I. of the said Act in separate magazines, and prohibiting any of such substances being stored in the same magazine with any other of such substances, and prescribing the quantities and kinds of packages in which the several kinds of explosives may be received at and removed from any magazine: Now therefore the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations for Powder-magazines, viz.:

1. The magazine or any part thereof may not be used for any purpose not in accordance with the following regulations.
2. These regulations must be duly observed by all persons employed within the precincts of the magazine, and the keeping of, or any process in, or work connected with, the keeping of gunpowder may not be carried on except in accordance therewith.
3. The interior of every building forming portion of the magazine in which gunpowder is kept, and the benches, shelves, and fittings in such building, shall be so constructed or so lined or covered as to prevent the exposure of any iron or steel, and also to prevent any grit, iron, steel, or similar substance from coming into contact with the gunpowder in such building, and such interior, benches, shelves, and fittings shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be kept free from grit and otherwise clean.
4. Every building in the magazine shall have attached thereto a sufficient lightning conductor, unless, by reason of the construction by excavation or the position of such building, or otherwise, a conductor is considered unnecessary by the Inspector of Explosives.
5. Before repairs are done to or in any room or other part of the magazine, that room or part shall, so far as practicable, be cleaned by the removal of all gunpowder, and the thorough washing out of such room or part.
6. There shall be constantly kept affixed to every building in the magazine, either outside or inside, in such manner as to be easily read, a statement showing the quantities of gunpowder allowed to be stored in such building, and a copy of these regulations and such portions of the *Explosives Act* as the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may from time to time direct.
7. Any carriage, vessel, or other vehicle in which gunpowder is conveyed from one building to another in the magazine, or from any such building to any place outside the magazine, shall be constructed without any exposed iron or steel in the interior thereof, and nothing else but gunpowder shall be carried therein, and shall be closed or otherwise properly covered over, and the gunpowder shall be so conveyed with all due diligence, and with such precautions and in such manner as will sufficiently guard against any accidental ignition.
8. In all cases where the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may think it necessary, and shall, by writing under his hand so require, the premises in which gunpowder is stored must be vigilantly guarded by day and night.
9. Every building in the magazine must be closed during thunderstorms.
10. No person under the age of sixteen years shall be employed in or enter the magazine, except in the presence and under the supervision of the keeper of such magazine or his deputy.
11. No person except those employed in the magazine will be permitted to pass the entrance barriers without a permit and except in the presence of the keeper, who will be held responsible that all persons who enter the magazine shall comply with the precautions herein detailed.
12. The lighting of fires or smoking is entirely prohibited in or near any of the buildings of the magazine. Any person employed on the premises infringing this regulation, or entering or attempting to enter with tobacco, pipes, lucifer matches, keys, or iron or steel articles, or with any combustible in his possession, or any person showing the least appearance of intoxication, will be immediately suspended, or put off duty, and such circumstance must be at once reported to the Secretary for Trade and Customs.

13. No cultivation is to be permitted inside the magazine enclosure, nor are any animals to be admitted thereto during the hours in which the magazine is open.

14. All persons employed in the magazine must, before entering the magazine, change their outer clothes and boots for the special clothing and shoes provided for them.

15. The floors and platforms of the magazine must be kept scrupulously clean.

16. No person whatever is to be permitted to walk upon any clean floors or platforms to which the previous clause applies, unless wearing the special shoes above referred to; nor, while wearing those shoes, is any person to walk anywhere except upon the clean floors and platforms.

17. Wherever powder is to be moved hides or other soft material must be laid down to protect the floor or carriage on which such powder is placed or carried, and these should be frequently dusted.

18. The door mats are for use solely outside the barriers of the magazine; they should therefore be placed at the entrance in the most convenient places for use, and sheltered from the weather. They should frequently be taken up and shaken at a distance from the barriers to prevent any accumulation of mud or grit.

19. No package containing gunpowder or cartridges shall be opened in any buildings except the laboratory, or the examining shed provided for the purpose.

20. Great care is to be taken that all doors and shutters are kept closed unless it be considered necessary to open them for ventilation, or to carry on such operations as may be required in accordance with these regulations. When practicable, the entrance door or gate is to be closed before the magazine door is opened.

21. Whenever the magazine doors or windows are open, a responsible person must always be left in charge of the building.

22. Any defects in, or necessary repairs required to, either the interior or exterior of the buildings must be promptly reported.

23. Inventory boards, showing the contents of the magazine, must be hung in conspicuous positions.

24. The keys of the buildings must be labelled and deposited in a secure place when not in use.

25. The keeper must examine every package externally on its arrival at the magazine, to ascertain that it is perfectly closed in a double package, and to discover if its exterior presents any objectionable substances, such as iron or grit. If necessary, the powder should be shifted, and a defective package must not be admitted into the magazine.

26. All packages must have the contents properly marked thereon, and must be so stacked that the marking will be seen as far as practicable.

27. Empty cases and barrels must not be allowed to be placed in any magazine in which gunpowder or cartridges are stored.

28. Packages must be securely stacked in the several bays, and a clear space left between them and the walls, to allow of the free circulation of air, and prevent injury from damp.

29. Filled cartridges must be kept separate from loose powder.

30. No tubes, detonators, fuzes, quick or slow matches, lights, rockets, fireworks, primers, or similar stores, may be kept in any powder-magazine, nor admitted within the enclosure of such magazine.

31. Packages of small-arm ammunition, or other cartridges or charges which contain their own means of ignition, or which are packed with their proportion of percussion caps, must on no account be stored in the same building as gunpowder, whether the latter is in barrels or made up into cartridges.

32. No gun-cotton, either wet or dry, nor any explosive other than gunpowder, may be stored in the magazine.

33. Oiled rags, cotton waste, cartridge clippings, oakum, or cloths for cleaning must not be kept in the magazine, ammunition stores, or their passages.

34. Gunpowder which has been wetted or otherwise damaged must not be placed in the magazine.

35. No implements of iron or steel may be used in the magazine or laboratory, and the use of iron or steel in any form is strictly forbidden in the construction of packages intended for explosives. Any exception to this rule must be specially authorized. The hoops of powder barrels must be secured with copper rivets only.

36. In heading and unheading gunpowder barrels, the person employed for the work must never use the bare adze against the copper hoops, but must invariably apply the metal driver.

37. Should it be necessary to break bulk or to shift gunpowder from defective packages, care must be taken to copy the original marking on the new packages, adding the date of shifting.

38. Barrels or cases of gunpowder must not be rolled or slid, but must always be carried by hand or on trucks or barrows.

39. A competent person shall be in charge of the fire-engine house (if any), and should know perfectly the arrangement of its contents, and the whereabouts of each article, so as to be able to find it at once in the darkest night.

40. Water for the extinction of fire must, at all times, be ready for immediate use.

41. The keeper of the magazine and every person in or about the same must take all due precaution for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion in the same, and for preventing unauthorized persons having access to the magazine, or to the gunpowder therein, and must abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of the work in the magazine.

42. All persons employed in or about the magazine must unhesitatingly obey the instructions of the keeper. If any person feel aggrieved at any such instructions, he may afterwards forward a complaint to the Secretary for Trade and Customs.

43. The above regulations shall come into force on the 1st October, 1890.

BLUE MOUNTAIN PUBLIC CEMETERY.— REGULATIONS AND SCALE OF FEES.

THE subjoined Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Blue Mountain Public Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them under the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Blue Mountain Cemetery make and promulgate the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given, such fees and charges to be in accordance with those mentioned in the scale relating to the Blue Mountain Cemetery.

2. That all applications for interment must be made to the secretary, and the name, age, late place of residence of deceased, with other particulars as mentioned in Schedule A, must be furnished, as far as practicable, at the time of making such application. The sum for making application for interment to be not later than between the hours of Nine a.m. and Three p.m. of the day previous to that of the funeral.

3. That the hours fixed for interments shall be as follow:—On week days, September to April inclusive, from Ten a.m. to Five p.m.; May to August inclusive, from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.; on Sundays, throughout the year, from Two p.m. to Four p.m. No interment shall be permitted to take place between the hours of Seven p.m. and Seven a.m. unless by special permission of the trustees, and the time fixed for any interment shall mean the time for the funeral to be at the cemetery, and such time must be punctually observed.

4. That no interment shall be permitted to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from the deputy registrar of deaths, or from a coroner, shall have been delivered to the sexton previous to the interment.

5. Every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep, but if it be intended, when the grave is first dug, that there is to be more than one interment in the same grave, then the grave should be sunk to a greater depth than 6 feet, for no subsequent interment in the same grave shall be permitted with a less depth than 4ft. 6in. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground.

6. That the trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug and to be properly filled in after each interment; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be required to construct same under the direction of some person appointed by the trustees, and every coffin placed in such brick grave or vault shall be properly closed in, and covered with a slab of slate or stone, and the whole finished in a satisfactory manner. All stones, bricks, and rubbish remaining on the ground after the completion of any work to be removed without delay.

7. That no interment shall be permitted in any private ground, grave, or vault in the cemetery unless satisfactory evidence be produced to the secretary, or to the trustees, that the owner or the representatives of the owner have consented, or would not object to such interment taking place therein.

8. That any person who may desire to construct any brick grave or vault, or to erect any fence, wall, tombstone, head-board, tomb, cenotaph, or monument of any kind, in the cemetery, must make application to the trustees to do so, and must also submit a plan, design, or drawing, with particulars, for approval; and no person will be permitted to construct or erect anything in the cemetery without the approval and permission of the trustees.

9. Certain allotments in the cemetery will be for public graves, but no burial right in any allotment set apart for a private grave will be issued until the purchase money is paid.

10. That no construction of any brick grave or vault, and no erection of any fence, tombstone, head-board, wall, tomb, cenotaph, or monument of any kind, will be allowed in or on any ground in the cemetery unless such ground shall have been previously purchased, and all such constructions and erections shall be at the expense of the owners or their representatives.

11. That no inscription, epitaph, figure, or design of any kind, shall be placed in the cemetery without the approval and permission of the trustees.

12. That all private graves, vaults, walls, fences, tombstones, head-boards, tombs, cenotaphs, and monuments are to be kept in proper repair and condition by and at the expense of the owners or their representatives.

13. That no corpse shall be disinterred or removed from the cemetery without the permission of the trustees, and in all such cases of disinterment and removal all necessary care and precaution must be taken therewith, and a licence for disinterment by the Minister administering the *Coroners Statute* must be produced.

14. That any person not behaving properly, or committing any trespass or nuisance, or wilfully damaging any erection, tree, plant, or flower, in the cemetery, or infringing any rule or regulation for the protection of the cemetery, will be liable to prosecution.

15. That no dogs will be allowed in the cemetery.

16. That a plan of the cemetery, and a registry of interments, and of certificates of right of burial shall be kept by the trustees.

The inspector shall attend at the office of the council on the first and third Mondays in every month from Nine o'clock in the forenoon until Four o'clock in the afternoon, unless such day shall be appointed a public holiday, or that he may of necessity be absent, notice of which absence shall be posted on the door of the office; and when the said inspector is so in attendance he shall examine, compare, and stamp, if necessary, all weights and measures which may be brought to him, and shall demand and take such fees for so doing as are mentioned in the schedule to this by-law marked A.

If any person shall refuse to pay the inspector the fees for examining, comparing, and stamping any weights and measures after having requested him to do so, such person shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty shillings, in addition to the amount of the fees, and which may be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace; and the inspector shall be at liberty to detain the said weights and measures until the fees are paid.
