## PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD.

APPLICATIONS are invited from persons who may be desirous of obtaining the appointment of Assistant Medical Inspector under the Board of Public Health, at a salary of £500 per annum.

The person appointed will be required to perform the following duties, viz.:—

1. To advise the Board on the medical aspects of all sanitary matters which come before it.

2. To prepare regulations, circulars, and memoranda for publication on all sanitary and medical subjects connected with the health of the people.

3. To peruse, minute, and advise on the reports of the local health officers (these are very numerous).

4. To watch the returns and notifications of infectious diseases, and advise when special inquiries are needed, or when special action by the Board is required.

5. To investigate the causes and conditions attending outbreaks of infectious or contagious diseases in particular localities, and to make recommendations for the prevention of the spread and for the abatement of such outbreaks, and to guard against their recurrence.

6. To make periodical inspections of, and to report on the sanitary condition and sanitary administration of the various municipal districts of the colony (190 in number). Such inspection including inspection of drainage and sewerage works, water supply, methods of conservancy in regard to refuse and excrement, inspection of hospitals and asylums, factories, common lodging-houses, abattoirs, noxious trade establishments, dairies, butchers' shops, and private dwellings and premises; inquiry into the prevalence of various diseases and their incidence, into the management of infectious and contagious diseases, into the duties assigned to health officers, sanitary inspectors, and the manner of fulfilment, into by-laws and their observance, into the management of cemeteries; advising the local authorities and health officers on all these matters, and reporting to the Board where its intervention is needed, either to recommend or to order improvements.

7. To study and advise the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them.

8. To inspect, report on, and direct the work of public vaccination throughout the colony (there are about 250 public vaccinators), and supervise the issuing of lymph and the establishment where it is prepared: to inquire into any allegations in regard to ill effects arising from vaccination, or as to inefficacy of the lymph.

9. To advise the Board when the Governor in Council should be moved to proclaim places beyond the sea infected; to advise as to diseases to be quarantined; periods of quarantine; arrangements for quarantining, supplying medical attendance, nurses, &c.; to inspect the quarantine establishments.

10. In connexion with paragraph 9, and with other duties, to keep conversant with the spread of infectious and contagious diseases in other parts of Australia and of the world, and with all advances in sanitary and medical science.

11. To take immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any introduced disease, such as small-pox or cholera.

12. To make original investigations into prevalence of diseases in man, and the relations of the same to disease in animals.

13. To advise the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water and of the various kinds of foods on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of the Health Act in reference to unwholesome and adulterated food, and otherwise.

14. To advise the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for the granting or cancelling of licences for abattoirs and noxious trade establishments.

Every applicant should be between the ages of twenty-seven and forty years, and must be vigorous and of sound health, and he must show that he possesses a surgical and medical qualification recognised by the Medical Board of Victoria, and that he has general experience in the treatment of communicable diseases.

The possession by applicants of the following additional qualifications will be considered to be valuable, although not essential:—

- A scientific degree.
- A diploma or certificate in State Medicine.

*Inebriates Act 1890.*REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT, SUPERVISION, INSPECTION,  
AND REGULATION OF ASYLUMS FOR INEBRIATES.*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of October, 1890.*

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by, the *Inebriates Act 1890*, doth by this Order repeal the regulations for the management, supervision, inspection, and regulation of asylums for inebriates, and for the discipline and conduct to be observed by patients in such asylums, made under the provisions of *The Inebriate Asylums Act 1888*, and doth, for the purposes aforesaid, hereby make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say :—

## REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT.

1. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the subject or context, the words and expressions following shall have the meaning hereinafter respectively assigned to them (that is to say):—
  - “Inspector” shall mean the person for the time being holding the office of inspector or deputy-inspector of lunatic asylums under any Act for the time being in force relating to lunatic asylums.
  - “Secretary” shall mean the lay officer for the time being in charge under the superintendent of any asylum for inebriates.
  - “Superintendent” shall mean the medical practitioner appointed by the Governor in Council to superintend, for the time being, any asylum for inebriates.
2. All patients, officials, and attendants shall strictly conform to the regulations and obey the superintendent's directions.
3. No patient shall go outside the boundary of the grounds of the asylum without the permission of the superintendent.
4. *Admission.*—The secretary shall, immediately on the admission of any person as a patient into the asylum, make and sign an entry with respect to such patient in a book to be kept for that purpose, to be called the “Register of Admissions,” and within 24 hours after such admission shall transmit to the inspector a notice of such admission, with a copy of the order and certificate on which the patient was received.
5. *Diet.*—The following diet shall be allowed daily to each patient and attendant :—Sixteen ounces of bread, two ounces of butter, half-an-ounce of tea, four ounces of sugar, two gills of milk, sixteen ounces of meat, sixteen ounces of vegetables, one ounce of cheese, one ounce of rice, one ounce of coffee, two ounces of flour, also pepper, salt, mustard, and vinegar as required, together with any extras which the superintendent may consider necessary and think fit to order in any particular case, and an entry of such extras shall be made in the “Case Book.”
6. *Fees.*—The fees to be paid by patients for maintenance and treatment within the asylum shall not exceed £5 per week, nor be less than £1 per week for each patient. The Master-in-Lunacy, Judge of County Courts, Police Magistrate, or Justice shall fix the amount at his discretion, according to the means of the patient; provided that the minimum amount shall be fixed only in cases where the inability to pay a higher rate is clearly proved. The current market price shall be charged for any extras the superintendent may think fit to order in any particular case. No payments shall be required from patients received into the asylum at Northcote.
7. *Intoxicating Liquors.*—Without special written authority from the superintendent of the asylum, no person shall take any intoxicating liquor or sedative narcotic stimulant, drug, or preparation, or enter any public-house, or other house where intoxicating liquors are sold.
8. Any employé of the asylum permitting alcoholic liquors to be placed within reach of the inmates under any pretext whatever, except when ordered by the superintendent, shall be immediately suspended by the superintendent, and, on conviction, dismissed.
9. *Letters, Stamps, and Money.*—No patient shall be allowed to have possession of money or stamps.
10. All letters addressed to the patients shall be opened in the presence of the superintendent or his deputy in such a manner as to show their contents.
11. Money or stamps coming in letters, or parcels addressed to patients, or found upon their person or in their apartments, shall be taken charge of by the superintendent, and a receipt given for the same, and all moneys or stamps so taken charge of shall be returned on discharge, or in the case of death or insanity shall be given to the legal representative of such patient.

12. *Letters.*—The superintendent shall post or forward all letters written by patients according to the intention of the writers, unless he shall have good reason to suspect that they are written for the purpose of obtaining intoxicating liquor or other prohibited articles, and all letters about which he has such suspicion shall be forwarded within two days to the Inspector of Asylums, who shall give such directions concerning them as he may think fit. Provided always that all letters written by a patient and addressed to any responsible Minister of the Crown, Judge of the Supreme Court, Inspector of Asylums, or official visitor shall be forwarded unopened and without delay.

13. *Parcels.*—All parcels intended for the patients shall first be submitted to the superintendent for his examination.

14. *Visits of Friends.*—Patients may be visited by their relatives and friends on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays, provided always that if in any case the superintendent shall think that the visit of any particular person or persons would at any particular time or generally be prejudicial to the patient proposed to be visited, or would be likely to hinder the cure of such patient, he may prohibit such visit.

15. In the case of a prohibited visit, the superintendent shall give his reasons for refusal to the visitor, and an entry of such reasons shall be made in the "Case Book," and a copy thereof sent to the Inspector of Asylums within 24 hours.

16. The Inspector of Asylums may at any time give an order in writing for the admission to any patient of any relative or friend of such patient of either sex, or of any medical practitioner whom any such relative or friend of such patient shall desire to be admitted to the patient, and such order of admission may be for a single admission or for an admission for a limited number of times, or for admission generally at all reasonable times.

17. The superintendent may at any time order that no interview shall take place between particular patients and visitors of the opposite sex, except in the presence of an official or attendant of the asylum, in any case in which the superintendent shall be of opinion that any such interview would be prejudicial to or likely to hinder the cure of such patients. In the case of any such order, the superintendent shall give to such visitors his reasons for such order, and an entry of such reasons shall be made in the "Case Book," and a copy thereof shall be sent to the Inspector of Asylums within 24 hours.

18. *Separation of Sexes.*—The superintendent shall, in cases where both sexes are received into an asylum, make due provision for the separation of the sexes at all but defined hours.

19. *Insanity.*—If any patient admitted into or detained in the asylum shall be found to be or shall while there become insane, the superintendent shall immediately give notice thereof to the inspector, and to the person by whom the last payment for such patient was made, to the intent that that patient so being or becoming insane may forthwith be placed under proper care and control as a lunatic; and in the event of the person by whom such last payment was made not taking steps for the removal of such patient within a reasonable time after the receipt of such notice, then the superintendent, with the approval in writing of the inspector, shall have such patient removed to a lunatic asylum, according to the law now or hereafter to be in force relating to lunatics.

20. *Death.*—In the case of the death of any patient in the asylum, a notice and statement of the death and apparent cause of death of such patient, and the name or names of any person or persons who was or were present at the death, shall (in addition to any notice respecting such death required by any law now or hereafter in force relating to the registration of deaths) within 24 hours after such death be drawn up and signed by the superintendent of such asylum, and transmitted to the coroner of the district in which the patient shall have died, and to the inspector, and a copy thereof, signed as aforesaid, shall also within the same 24 hours be enclosed in a pre-paid envelope to the person who shall have made the last payment on account of such patient.

21. *Discharge.*—The secretary shall, within 24 hours after the discharge, removal, escape, or re-capture of any patient, transmit a written notice of such discharge, removal, escape, or re-capture to the inspector; and the secretary shall, within 24 hours after the death, discharge, escape, or removal of any patient make and sign an entry thereof in the said "Register of Admissions," and also in a book to be kept for that purpose to be called the "Register of Discharges."

22. *Medical Journal.*—In every asylum the superintendent shall at least once in every week enter or cause to be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, to be called the "Medical Journal," a statement showing the date of such statement, the number of patients of each sex then in the asylum, the christian and surname of every patient who shall then be or shall have been since the last entry under restraint or in seclusion therein, and when and for what period and reasons, and in cases of restraint by what means, and the christian name and the surname of every patient under medical treatment therein, and for what (if any) bodily disorder, the condition of the asylum, and every death, injury, and violence which shall have happened to or affected any patient since the then last preceding entry.

23. *Case Book.*—There shall also be kept at each asylum a book, to be called the "Case Book," in which the superintendent shall enter the name, sex, and previous occupation of every patient admitted into the asylum, and also the history from time to time of his case whilst he shall continue in such asylum, together with a correct description of the medicines and other remedies adopted for the cure of the patient.

24. *Visitation.*—Every asylum shall, without any previous notice, as often as the inspector thinks fit, and at least once in every three months, be visited by the inspector, and every such visit shall be made on such day or days and at such hours of the day or night and for such length of time as the inspector shall think fit, and such inspector when inspecting such asylum may and shall inspect every part of the same, and see every patient then confined therein, and inquire whether any patient is under restraint, and why; and inspect the order and certificate for the reception of every patient who shall have been received into such asylum since the last visit of the inspector thereto, and enter in a book kept for that purpose, called the "Inspector's Book," the result of the inspection and inquiries with such observations as he shall think proper.

25. *Superintendent may make Regulations as to minor matters.*—Rules for minor matters of domestic arrangement and for giving better effect to these regulations may be drawn up by the superintendent, and when approved by the inspector shall have full force and effect.

26. *Directions of Superintendent.*—The superintendent may from time to time direct that a patient shall receive such treatment as the superintendent may think necessary for the cure of such patient and for the carrying out of these regulations, provided that such directions shall not be inconsistent with these regulations, and such directions shall be strictly carried out by the official or officials to whom they may be given.

27. *Deputy.*—If the superintendent should be absent from the asylum or incapable of acting from illness, some other person may be appointed to be his substitute during such temporary absence or incapacity, and this substitute shall have all the powers and perform all the duties of the superintendent, and the secretary shall send at once to the Inspector of Asylums a notice of such temporary absence or illness for communication to the Governor in Council.

#### REGULATIONS FOR DISCIPLINE.

28. The hours of meals will be as follow:—Breakfast, at 8 a.m.; dinner, at 1 p.m.; tea, at 6 p.m.

29. Patients will retire to bed at 10 p.m., and will rise at 6 a.m. in summer, and at 7 a.m. in winter, unless otherwise directed by the superintendent.

30. Patients must not frequent those portions of the asylum set apart for culinary or other domestic purposes.

31. No patient is allowed to enter the bedroom of another patient unattended.

32. Patients are not permitted to assemble in any attendant's room.

33. The patients shall not be allowed to gamble.

34. No patient shall be allowed to walk beyond the garden and the home paddock, unless in company with an attendant, or by special permission of the superintendent.

35. Patients shall not receive any articles from visitors without the permission of the superintendent. All parcels intended for the patients shall be submitted to the superintendent for examination.

36. The outer doors of the asylum will be locked at 10 p.m., and opened at 6 a.m. in summer, and at 7 a.m. in winter; and no patient shall be allowed out of the asylum between these hours without a special order from the superintendent.

37. All lights in patients' rooms must be extinguished at 10.30 p.m.

38. The superintendent, the secretary, and the attendant in charge on the female side shall respectively have authority to enter the bedrooms of the patients under their care at any time.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

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#### *Lunacy Act 1890.*

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### REGULATIONS FOR THE RECEPTION, CARE, AND TREATMENT OF PAYING PATIENTS.

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*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of October, 1890.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by Section 38 of the *Lunacy Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for the establishment and regulation of cottages or other separate accommodation for the reception, care, and treatment of paying patients, and that such regulations shall prescribe certain things in the said section specified, together with such other matters as the Governor in Council deems necessary: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order repeal the regulations made under the provisions of *The Lunacy Amendment Act 1888*, and doth hereby make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of Terms.*—In these regulations, "Patient," and the expression "paying patient," shall have the same meaning as that assigned to them by Section 3 of the *Lunacy Act 1890*.

2. *Where Cottages, &c., to be established.*—All cottages and other buildings erected or set apart for the reception, care, and treatment of paying patients shall be situated within the grounds or domain of

attached or adjacent to some public lunatic asylum, and shall be deemed for all purposes to be a part of the lunatic asylum within the grounds or domain of which they are respectively situated, and shall also be deemed to be receiving houses within the meaning of the said last-mentioned Act: And all the provisions of any Act or Acts for the time being in force relating to lunatics shall apply to paying patients detained in any such cottage or other building.

3. *Accommodation to be provided in Single-patient Cottages.*—Every cottage intended for the reception of one paying patient only and the necessary attendants shall contain the following accommodation, viz. :—

- One patient's bedroom.
- One patient's sittingroom.
- One spare room for use as a "single room" for the purpose of the seclusion of the patient should he or she become dangerous or violent.
- One room for the accommodation of two attendants.
- One bathroom for the patient.
- One scullery.
- One storeroom.
- One earth-closet.
- Suitable kitchen accommodation.
- Attached to each such cottage shall be a suitable piece of ground for a garden, bounded on the outside by a fence.

4. *Accommodation to be provided in Cottages for more than one Patient.*—Every cottage for the reception of more than one paying patient shall contain—

- In the dormitory or dormitories at least one thousand cubic feet of space for each person sleeping therein, and in the sitting or day room a space of four hundred and eighty cubic feet for each patient residing in such cottage.
- One room for the accommodation of each two attendants.
- One bathroom, with dressingroom attached.
- One earth-closet for every seven patients residing in such cottage.
- Suitable kitchen accommodation.
- Attached to each such cottage shall be a suitable piece of ground for a garden, bounded on the outside by a fence.

5. *Maximum number of Paying Patients in one Cottage.*—Not more than fourteen paying patients shall be placed in any one cottage.

6. *Accommodation to be provided in places other than Cottages for the Reception of Paying Patients.*—When the separate accommodation for paying patients is provided in a building other than a cottage, the accommodation to be provided for each paying patient shall be as follows :—

- In the dormitory or dormitories there shall be at least one thousand cubic feet of space for each person sleeping therein, and in the corridor or rooms used by the patients during the day four hundred and eighty cubic feet of space for each patient residing in such building.

7. *Scale of Payments to be made for Paying Patients.*—The payment to be made for the separate accommodation of paying patients shall vary in accordance with the accommodation provided, and shall in each case be fixed by the Inspector of Asylums, Hospitals, and Licensed Houses, after conferring with the Master-in-Lunacy, but shall in no case be less than One pound per week.

8. *General Dietary Scale.*—The daily rations to be supplied to each paying patient shall, subject to modification in the case of any particular patient by order of the Medical Superintendent, be as follows:—

16 ounces of bread, 2 ounces of butter, $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce of tea, $\frac{1}{4}$ ounces of sugar, 2 gills of milk, 16 ounces of meat,		16 ounces of vegetables, 1 ounce of cheese, 1 ounce of rice, 1 ounce of coffee, 2 ounces of flour.
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Also pepper, salt, mustard, and vinegar, as required, together with any extras which the Medical Superintendent in charge may consider necessary, and think fit to order.

9. *Hours to be kept by Paying Patients.*—Paying patients shall not be required to rise from their beds before the hour of six in the morning, nor to go to bed before the hour of nine in the evening, unless the Medical Superintendent in charge specially order otherwise.

10. *Inspection to which Paying Patients to be subject.*—Paying patients shall be subject to the same inspection in all respects as other patients.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE BOARDING OUT PATIENTS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of October, 1890.*

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by Section 95 of the *Lunacy Act 1890* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations, which shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, for the boarding out of patients, and that such regulations shall prescribe, together with such other matters (if any) as the Governor in Council may consider necessary, the following:—

- (1) The class or classes of persons with whom patients may be placed to reside and board.
- (2) The distance from some asylum within which any house in which a patient is to reside must be situate.
- (3) The accommodation which every house in which any patient is to reside and board shall contain.
- (4) The general dietary scale which must be provided for patients.
- (5) The hours to be kept by patients in such houses.
- (6) The occupations to be permitted to be followed by patients.
- (7) The degree of liberty and absence (if any) from place of residence which may be allowed to patients.
- (8) The inspection to which all such houses shall be subject.
- (9) The scale of payment to be made for patients.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth by this Order repeal the Regulations made for the purposes aforesaid under the provisions of *The Lunacy Amendment Act 1888*, and doth for the purposes aforesaid make the Regulations following in lieu thereof, namely:—

1. *The Class of Persons (in these Regulations called "Guardians") with whom Patients may be placed to Reside and Board.*—Guardians must be either the owners or sole tenants of the houses, and must reside in the houses in which patients are to be boarded; and, in all cases, guardians must be people of good repute, who possess a certificate of respectability, good character, and fitness to be intrusted with the care of patients from a local magistrate or minister of religion who has known the person named in the certificate for a period of not less than six months immediately preceding the date of the certificate. In each case the person selected as a guardian shall be, if possible, of the same social position and of the same religious denomination as the patient.

*Limitation as to Patients.*—Excepting with the written consent in each case of the Honorable the Chief Secretary, one patient only shall be boarded in the same house at the same time, and the same person shall not be guardian of more than one patient at the same time.

2. *The Accommodation which every House in which any Patient is to Reside and Board shall contain. The distance from an Asylum within which such House must be, and the character of the site of such House.*—The house must be well drained and free from damp, with well ventilated rooms, and must be sufficiently commodious to provide for each patient a bedroom of not less cubical contents than 500 feet. Unless within six miles of a railway station, upon a line of railway, house must be within thirty miles of an asylum for the insane; and if within six miles of a railway station, on a line of railway, then must be within 100 miles of an asylum for the insane; and must be in a healthy and cheerful situation.

3. *Furniture.*—Each patient's bedroom must contain a comfortable single bed and suitable bed-clothes, sheets to be changed at least weekly, and such other furniture as the Inspecting Medical Officer shall from time to time require to be supplied.

*Clothing.*—All clothing required by the patients, and not supplied by their friends, shall be supplied from an asylum, and shall be such as is usually worn by ordinary persons in the same social position as the patients.

4. *General Dietary Scale.*—The food must always be sufficient in quantity, of good quality, suitable description, and carefully cooked. Fermented liquors not allowed to patients, unless by direction of the medical officer. The patients shall be supplied with the same kind of food as their guardians, unless the medical officer shall decide otherwise.

5. *The Hours to be kept by Patients.*—Patients shall be allowed eight hours for sleeping, and not be required to work longer than the Inspecting Medical Officer shall approve of. They are not to be allowed out after dark, unless for some special purpose, and suitably attended.

6. *Occupations to be permitted to be followed by Patients.*—Patients, subject to any directions which may from time to time be given by the Inspecting Medical Officer, are to be allowed and encouraged to employ themselves in any occupation or work for which their previous education or training may suit them; but care must be taken that they do not overtask themselves. If the patients should earn any money by their exertions this must be treated as the property of the patients, and the guardians should keep an account of this for the patient, and report the amount to the Inspecting Medical Officer at each visit by him.

7. *The degree of Liberty and Absence (if any) from the Place of Residence which may be allowed to Patients.*—Outdoor exercise by patients should be, as much as possible, encouraged by guardians, but, unless approved by the Inspecting Medical Officer, patients should not be allowed to wander out of sight of their guardian, unless in the care of some person approved by the guardian—but, so far as the safety of

the patient will admit of, freedom from constraint should be permitted to the patient; and, with the written consent of the Inspecting Medical Officer, a patient may be allowed to be absent from residence for not longer than eight days at one time if the guardian is satisfied of the fitness of the person with whom the patient states his intention to reside during his or her absence from his or her guardian and of the reliance which may be placed upon the patient's statement. But in each case of absence from residence for longer than one day, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 7 p.m., the previous consent in writing of the Inspecting Medical Officer must be obtained.

8. *The Inspection to which all such Houses shall be subject.*—In addition to the inspection provided for in the said *Lunacy Act 1890*, all such houses and the patients therein shall be visited and inspected at least once in every three calendar months by the superintendent of the asylum nearest to the house to be inspected, or by some medical practitioner in actual practice to be appointed by the Chief Secretary.

9. In each house a book to be called "The Inspector's Book" shall be kept by the guardian, in which the guardian shall enter—

- The name of the patient;
- The date of the reception of the patient;
- The asylum or receiving-house or other place from which the patient comes;
- The occurrence, and the date of the occurrence, of any physical ailment of, or accident to the patient;
- The date and occasion of any absence of the patient;
- The date of each visit of the Inspecting Medical Officer;
- The date of the removal or death of patient during residence.

And in this book the Inspecting Medical Officer shall enter—

- The date of each visit made by him, with his observations on the state of the house and condition of the patient, and any other observations he may think proper.

10. *The Scale of Payment to be made for Patients.*—The scale of payment may vary, subject to the following condition, from Six shillings per week to Twelve shillings per week. The amount shall be fixed in each case by the Inspector of Asylums, subject in all cases in which the estate of the patient is under the control of the Master-in-Lunacy, or of any committee or guardian, to the approval of the Master-in-Lunacy. In determining the amount to be paid the following conditions shall be considered:—

- (a) The physical and mental condition of the patient as affecting the comfort of the guardian and guardian's family;
- (b) The amount of personal attention which the patient will require;
- (c) Any special diet which the Inspecting Medical Officer may certify to be necessary;
- (d) The ability of the patient to pay, where superior accommodation is desired by the friends of the patient, and the character of the accommodation which, in such case, it is proposed should be supplied.

11. *General Duty of Guardians towards Patients*—

- (a) The first duty of the guardian shall be to secure the safety, the comfort, and happiness of the patient;
- (b) The patient shall receive the personal care and attention of the guardian;
- (c) Any indication of a suicidal tendency or extreme excitement shall be at once communicated to the superintendent of the nearest asylum for the insane.

12. *Termination of Agreement with Guardian, and Removal of Patient.*—The guardian may terminate the agreement for the board of a patient by giving not less than fourteen days' notice in writing to the superintendent of the nearest asylum for the insane; or, in the case of a patient being unmanageable, the guardian may take the patient back to the asylum or receiving-house from which he or she came, after such reasonable notice as the circumstances of the case will admit of. In any case in which the superintendent of an asylum for the insane, or the Inspector of Asylums, shall consider, either upon the report of the Inspecting Medical Officer or upon his own inspection that any of these regulations are not duly observed by the guardian, or that the patient has ceased to be a fit subject to be boarded out, the superintendent of an asylum for the insane or the Inspector of Asylums may remove, or may order the removal of such patient, either after such reasonable notice as in each case such superintendent or inspector shall think proper, or without notice if the superintendent or inspector be of opinion that an immediate removal is necessary. In the event of such removal being upon the ground of a breach of the regulations, then no payment beyond the last day of the preceding week's board shall be paid, but in the event of removal for any other cause, then one week's board in addition to the week's board in which the patient is removed shall be paid to the guardian.

13. *Moneys and Property of Patient.*—Upon the removal of any patient the guardian shall hand over to the superintendent of the nearest asylum for the insane, or to the Master-in-Lunacy, any property of the patient in his or her possession or care, including any moneys which the patient may have earned during residence with the guardian.

14. *Notice of Death, Escape, and Recapture of Patients.*—In the event of the death, escape, or, after escape, of recapture of any patient, the guardian shall, without delay, give notice in writing of such death, escape, or recapture to the Inspecting Medical Officer, to the Inspector of Asylums, and to the Master-in-Lunacy.

15. *Interpretations.*—The term "The Inspecting Medical Officer," when used in these regulations, shall include the Inspector of Asylums for the Insane shall, without delay, give notice in writing of such death, escape, or recapture to the Inspecting Medical Officer, to the Inspector of Asylums, and to the Master-in-Lunacy. The term "The Inspecting Medical Officer," when used in these regulations, shall include the Inspector of Asylums for the Insane (in these regulations called "The Inspector of Asylums"), the superintendent of the nearest asylum for the insane, and any medical practitioner appointed by the Chief Secretary to inspect houses in which patients are boarded out.

**WHEREAS** by the Act No. MXLIII. the sum of Seventy-five thousand pounds was authorized to be spent in giving bonuses to the growers of grapes, fruits, and general vegetable products, to be enumerated in regulations, including payments to be made by way of bonus upon the acreage planted:

And whereas by the said Act the sum of Thirty-seven thousand pounds was authorized to be spent in giving bonuses, in respect of factories, for fruit-canning, fruit-drying, dairying, raisin and currant making, vegetable oil making, preparing for the manufacturer flax, hemp, silk, and other products to be named in regulations:

And whereas by the said Act the sum of Thirty thousand pounds was authorized to be spent in giving bonuses for dairy produce and fruits of best quality, and in best order exported to foreign markets:

And whereas by the said Act various other sums of money are authorized to be spent in making grants or bonuses for the promotion of the agricultural, dairy, fruit, and wine industries:

And whereas the said sums of money authorized to be spent for such purposes as aforesaid are, by the Act No. MXLVI, specially appropriated for such purposes:

And whereas it is by the said Act No. MXLIII. provided that such sums of money hereinbefore specified shall be expended under regulations to be made by the Governor in Council.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby amend the regulations made for the purposes aforesaid, by Order in Council dated the 29th day of April, 1890, in manner following, that is to say:—

Clause 58. The words "save and except so far as relates to canned fruits" to be added after the word "exported" in the sixth line of the said clause.

1. In lat.  $5^{\circ} 27\frac{1}{2}' N.$ , long.  $115^{\circ} 18' 4'' E.$ , a bank of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms was found, but on the charted position of Iris bank 12 to 15 fathoms were obtained. The result of the examination seems to show that this shoal is  $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a sea mile further northward than it is charted, and that the 5-fathom spot is only the edge of this shoal.

2. Hyacinth shoal. (Notice to Mariners, No. 13, II., 1890).  
 H.M.S. *Pigmy* anchored in  $3\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms, with Lubidan Island S.  $1^{\circ} W.$ , Mount Nosong N.  $77^{\circ} E.$  The least water found on this shoal was  $7\frac{1}{2}$  feet S.W. by W.  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cables from ship at anchor.

On a bearing N.  $2\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$ ,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  cables from her anchorage, a spot which dried 2 feet was observed. This is apparently the half-fathom spot of the Jahat shoal. Between this and the Hyacinth shoal, a deep channel, 3 cables wide, was found.

3. The Growler bank as charted could not be found, but a small shoal, with 27 feet least water, was found a little over a mile to the westward.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the mayor, councillors, and burgesses of the borough of St. Arnaud, order as follows:—

1. It shall not be lawful within the following limits of the borough of St. Arnaud to keep any swine:—Commencing at the intersection of the St. Arnaud and Donald railway and Brisbane-street; thence south-easterly by the centre line of railway to the intersection of Sturt-street; thence north-easterly by the centre of Sturt-street and Burke-street to Dundas-street; thence north-westerly by the centre of Dundas-street and Butcher-street to Powell-street; thence south-westerly by Powell-street to Bewley-street; thence by the centre of Bewley-street and Brisbane-street bearing south-westerly to the point of commencement.

2. By-law No. 37 of the borough of St. Arnaud is hereby repealed.

By-Law No. 7.

*Re Wandering Cattle.*

A By-law of the Shire of Warragul, made under section 191, Part 7, of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 7, and for the adoption of such of the provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1874* as are contained in Part I, subdivision 9, under the heading "Obstructions, &c., to streets, &c., by cattle, &c."

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Warragul order as follows:—

That such of the provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1890*, as are contained in Part I, subdivision 9, under the heading "Obstructions, &c., to streets, &c., by cattle, &c.," and hereinafter set out, be, and the same are, hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Warragul.

*Thirteenth Schedule, Part I, Subdivision 9.—Obstructions, &c., to Streets, &c., by Cattle, &c.*

If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner as owner only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected; or if such owner appear, then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid, if demanded within one month, to the owner of the cattle; and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner, if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered. If any cattle

be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged, respectively, before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.

If any goat shall have been impounded under the provisions of either of the two last preceding sections, or under the provisions of this by-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and shall not, after the expiration of twenty-four hours, be released, and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges be paid by the owner thereof, any justice may, by warrant under his hand, directed to any constable, authorize the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations from time to time for appointing the hours during which it shall not be lawful to drive into or through the municipal district or such parts thereof as shall by boundaries be set forth in such regulation any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria or of any other colony to any other part, and to provide, if they shall see fit, in such regulation separately with respect to Sundays and week days; and if any person shall drive any such cattle contrary to such regulation he shall forfeit, for every head of cattle so driven, a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings. Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to horses driven in harness or oxen in yoke.

It shall not be lawful to break in any horse or other animal in any street, whether public or private, or in any public place, save such public places as from time to time may be appointed by some regulation of the council in that behalf, which regulation the council are hereby authorized to make; or, by locking the wheels of any cart or other vehicle, or otherwise to test or try any horse or other animal so as to obstruct or injure any street or public place; and any person offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

##### BY-LAW No. 8.

##### *Re Chimneys and other matters.*

A Regulation of the Shire of Warragul, made under the first subdivision of Part 5 of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1874*, and By-law No. 8, for regulating the construction, alteration, repair, or removal of fireplaces, chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes, in the above-named subdivision commonly called chimneys, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1890*, No. 1112, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Warragul make the following regulation as to the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of chimneys, and for other purposes.

1st. From and after the coming into force of this regulation, it shall not be lawful for any person to use any combustible or inflammable material in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of any fireplace or chimney on any land situated and comprised within the Central Riding of the Shire of Warragul.

2nd. After the expiration of seven years from the coming into force of this regulation, it shall not be lawful for any person within the limits defined and described in the last preceding section, "without the consent of the council," to use, keep, continue, or suffer to remain any fireplace or chimney, or the enclosure of any fireplace or chimney, constructed wholly or in part of any combustible or inflammable material.

3rd. A fee of not less than five shillings, nor more than Forty shillings, shall be charged and received, on account of the shire fund, by the proper officer of the council for any inspection, superintendence, or other services made or performed by him, and the said fees shall be paid by the owner or occupier on demand; and if such owner or occupier refuse or fail to pay the said fee when so demanded, the amount of the said fee or fees with costs may be recovered by the proper officer aforesaid before any two or more justices.

1. If any person drive any horse or cattle on any street, road, track, or thoroughfare under the control of the council without having full and proper control of the said horses or cattle, or who shall be away from his horses or cattle, so as to be unable to have full control of them, or shall turn loose or allow to wander at large any horses, cattle, or other animal upon any of the public roads, streets, or thoroughfares in any township in the shire, shall, on conviction before any two or more justices, be liable to pay for each and every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. The driver or person in charge of any coach, carriage, phaeton, buggy, or any other vehicle running on springs shall, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, have and keep proper lamps and lights fixed on each side and near to the front of every such vehicle, and in such position as the said lights may be plainly seen by any person approaching from the opposite direction, and all vehicles and horsemen shall pass each other on the off side.

3. The driver or person in charge of any cart, dray, waggon, or other vehicle not running on springs shall, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, have and keep one lighted lamp fixed on the off side of each such vehicle, and at such elevation as will admit of the said light being plainly seen by any person coming along the road in either direction. And all such vehicles and horsemen shall pass each other on the off side.

4. Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions contained in the last two preceding sections shall, on conviction before any two or more justices, be liable to pay for each and every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be there whether plying for hire on any appointed stand or otherwise, shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their vehicles thence, and if desiring to remain in the vicinity shall proceed to any other carriage-way, street, or public place, which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in the manner directed by any member of the police force.

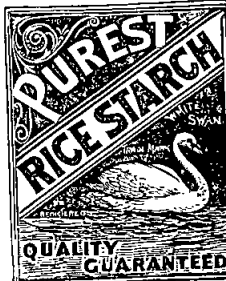
