### Health Act 1890.

THE SHIP "LOCH TAY" RELEASED FROM QUARANTINE.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hopetoun in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the seventeenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, in pursuance of the Health Act 1850, it was directed that the ship Loch Tay should be detained in quarantine, and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean: And whereas the Superintendent of Quarantine has given a certificate under his hand in accordance with the provisions of the Act aforesaid, certifying that quarantine has been duly performed by the said ship Loch Tay, and has also given a certificate under the provisions of the said Act certifying that all things on board the said ship Loch Tay have been opened, aired, fumigated, and disinfected as directed by the said Order in Council, and has further given certificates under the provisions of the said Act certifying that the following persons have duly performed quarantine in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the said Order in Council, that is to say:—H. Crimpton, A. O'Rourke, A. Halley, G. Grearson, T. C. Martin, G. Hamilton, W. Lindsey, D. Rowan, W. Gilchrist, C. Lyons, J. Duncan, L. Holtzman, W. Watts, J. De May, J. McIntosh, — Harley, G. Veitch, D. Campbell, F. Wiseman, — Day, D. Connor, P. Grey, W. Gibson, G. Balfour, E. McKenzie: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby approve and allow the said certificates, and direct that the said ship Loch Tay, the said things, and the said persons shall be released from quarantine, and shall be liable to no further restraint or detention.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and in the fifty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.
