Marine Act 1890.

AMENDED REGULATION FOR THE MANAGEMENT AND GOVERNMENT OF PILOTS.

WHEREAS by section 60 of the Marine Act 1890 it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may make and alter or repeal rules and regulations for the management and government of pilots, and for the order in which they shall perform their services, and generally for all matters relative to the efficient discharge of their duties: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following amended regulation, that is to say:—

- 1. Regulation No. 5 of the amending regulations relating to pilots, approved by the Governor in Council on the 9th June, 1890, and published in the Government Gazette of the 13th June, 1890, is hereby repealed, and the following shall be substituted therefor, viz.
 - 5. There shall be three pilot stations, namely:—The "Inner Station," which shall mean the anchorage inside Port Phillip Heads; the "Middle Cruising Station," which station shall extend from Port Phillip Heads to a distance seaward not exceeding a radius of seven miles from a point midway between Port Phillip Heads; and the "Outer Cruising Station," which station shall extend from the outer boundary of the last-mentioned station to a distance seawards of fifteen miles from the aforesaid point upon a line bearing north-east by north and south-west by south, with Zealey Point bearing from the extremity of such line north-west by north and Cape Schanck east three-quarters north. The southern boundary of the Outer Cruising Station shall extend in an easterly direction from the extremity of the line as aforesaid until Arthur's Seat bears north-east a quarter north and thence towards the shore. All bearings are magnetic.

This regulation shall form portion of and be read with the Pilot Regulations now in force, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1891; and all clauses, words, phrases, or provisions contained in the said Pilot Regulations which may be deemed inconsistent with, or contrary in any way to the spirit of, this regulation shall be repealed from the said 1st day of October, 1891.

The foregoing regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this 4th day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.



REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1891 respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply

in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be charged.

3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value of a nor pound five shillings shall be charged.

4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.

6. For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

7. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be anthorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Education Act 1890. ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the Education Act 1890 (54) Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Excetive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. XII. of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid bearing date the 16th day of October, 1890, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz.:—

XII .- SCHOOL HOURS AND TIME-TABLE,

XII.—School Hours and Time Table.

1. Subject to the provisions of the Education Act 1890, the hours of work to be observed in each school shall be such as may from time to time be determined by the Minister; but in no case shall the whole time set apart for instruction be of less than four and a half hours' duration on each school day.

2. Between the morning and afternoon school meetings there shall be an interval of not less than one hour, except on days of heavy rain, when the interval may, at the discretion of the head teacher, be reduced to half-an-hour. Whenever this is done—and it should rarely be necessary—the times of opening and of closing the afternoon school meeting must be specially noted on the roll sheets in the column for "Remarks."

3. The time-table must be kept hung up in a conspicuous place in the school-room, and shall set forth the hours of opening and closing school, the employment of the everal classes at any time, the teachers in charge thereof respectively, the time set apart for the instruction of the pupil teachers and for instruction in extra subjects, and the arrangements made for the supervision of children in the play-ground.

4. The time-table, should be so arranged that female teachers and pupil teachers may not be required to stand continuously for a longer period than one hour and a half.

5. When any entertainment is given to a school, as such, or to two or more schools in combination, with the sanction of the board of advice or of the Department, all members of the teaching staffs of the schools entertained will attend for the purpose of aiding in the maintenance of order, and will give such other assistance as may be required of them.
