*Marine Act 1890.*AMENDED REGULATION FOR THE MANAGEMENT  
AND GOVERNMENT OF PILOTS.

WHEREAS by section 60 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may make and alter or repeal rules and regulations for the management and government of pilots, and for the order in which they shall perform their services, and generally for all matters relative to the efficient discharge of their duties: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following amended regulation, that is to say:—

1. Regulation No. 5 of the amending regulations relating to pilots, approved by the Governor in Council on the 9th June, 1890, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th June, 1890, is hereby repealed, and the following shall be substituted therefor, viz:—

5. There shall be three pilot stations, namely:—The "Inner Station," which shall mean the anchorage inside Port Phillip Heads; the "Middle Cruising Station," which station shall extend from Port Phillip Heads to a distance seaward not exceeding a radius of seven miles from a point midway between Port Phillip Heads; and the "Outer Cruising Station," which station shall extend from the outer boundary of the last-mentioned station to a distance seawards of fifteen miles from the aforesaid point upon a line bearing north-east by north and south-west by south, with Zealey Point bearing from the extremity of such line north-west by north and Cape Schanck east three-quarters north. The southern boundary of the Outer Cruising Station shall extend in an easterly direction from the extremity of the line as aforesaid until Arthur's Seat bears north-east a quarter north and thence towards the shore. All bearings are magnetic.

This regulation shall form portion of and be read with the Pilot Regulations now in force, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1891; and all clauses, words, phrases, or provisions contained in the said Pilot Regulations which may be deemed inconsistent with, or contrary in any way to the spirit of, this regulation shall be repealed from the said 1st day of October, 1891.

The foregoing regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this 4th day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

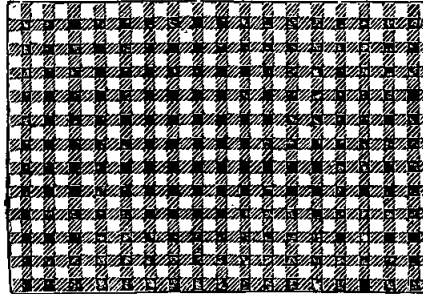

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1891.

REGULATION No. 1.

**THE** Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the regulations following:-

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1891 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:-

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be charged.

3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be charged.

4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.

6. For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

7. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**WHEREAS** by section 20 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in such Order, among other things—

(a) Increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust;

(b) Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Waterworks Trust;

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 24th March, 1890, a Waterworks Trust, known and incorporated as the "Gisborne Waterworks Trust," was duly constituted, and the boundaries of the land comprising the Waterworks District of the said Trust were in and by clause 4 of the said Order in Council defined and limited:

And whereas it is expedient to increase the extent of the said Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth order that clause 4 of the aforesaid Order in Council of the 24th March, 1890, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and that in lieu thereof the following shall be deemed to be clause 4 of the said Order in Council:—

(4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of the township of Gisborne, as gazetted 25th February, 1861, page 404; thence westerly, northerly, and easterly by south, west, and east boundaries of said township of Gisborne to intersection of east boundary with three-chain main road to Melbourne; thence north-westerly by that road to the most westerly angle of allotment 60, section 34, parish of Gisborne; thence due north by a line across one-chain road to its intersection with south-east boundary of Race-course and Recreation reserve; thence north-easterly, northerly, and north-westerly by portion of the east and north boundary of said Race-course and Recreation reserve to the most north-eastern angle thereof; thence north-easterly by a line to the south-west angle of allotment 17, section 34; thence northerly by west boundary of allotment 17 to its intersection with Railway reserve in allotment 23; thence west by boundary of Railway reserve through allotments 23 and 22 to west boundary of allotment 22; thence northerly to a point in west boundary of allotment 25 twenty chains north of south-west angle thereof;

thence due east by a line through allotments 25 and 24 to the west boundary of allotment 16; thence northerly by west boundary of said allotment 16 to the north-west angle thereof; thence north-easterly by a line to the south-west angle of allotment 1, Wooling pre-emptive right; thence northerly by west boundary of said pre-emptive right to its intersection with the Baringo Creek; thence north-easterly by said Baringo Creek to a point distant twenty chains from said west boundary of said allotment 1; thence due north by a line to a point in the north boundary of allotment 2A, section 8, parish of Macedon; thence easterly by north boundary of said allotment 2A to the north-east angle of that allotment; thence north-easterly by a line across road and portion of the east boundary of allotment 1, section 8, parish of Macedon, to the most eastern angle thereof; thence easterly by a line across the Baringo Creek to the most western angle of allotment 160, parish of Kerrie; thence in a southerly, easterly, and southerly direction by a portion of west boundaries of said allotment 160 to the south-west angle thereof; thence southerly by a line across road to the north-east angle of allotment 124; thence south-westerly by north boundary of said allotment 124 to the north-west angle thereof; thence southerly by west boundaries of allotments 124 and 123 to the south-west angle of allotment 123, parish of Kerrie; thence due west by a line to its intersection with west boundary of parish of Kerrie; thence southerly by that boundary to its intersection with the north boundary of parish of Gisborne at the Macedon River; thence westerly by portion of boundary of allotment 13, section 34, parish of Gisborne, to north-west angle thereof; thence southerly by west boundary of said allotment 13 to the south-west angle thereof; thence westerly by road forming south boundary of allotment 14 to north-east angle of allotment 8; thence southerly by east boundary of allotments 8, 7, and 6 to south-east angle of allotment 6; thence westerly by south boundary of allotment 6 to north-east angle of sub-division F, allotment 5; thence southerly by east boundary of said sub-division F to south-east angle thereof; thence continued further south by a line and east boundary of allotment 67, section 34, to south-east angle thereof; thence westerly by road forming south boundary of allotments 67 and 66 to intersection with road forming east boundary of allotments 62, 59, and 58; thence in a general southerly direction by that road and road forming east boundary of allotments 40 and 39, section 34, to the intersection of same with north boundary of township of Gisborne; thence easterly and southerly by north and east boundaries of said township of Gisborne to the commencing point, all of which boundaries are as shown on Order in Council plan deposited in office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

Education Act 1890.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

At Government House, Melbourne, the ninth day of September, 1891.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. XII. of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid bearing date the 16th day of October, 1890, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz:—

XII.—SCHOOL HOURS AND TIME-TABLE.

1. Subject to the provisions of the *Education Act 1890*, the hours of work to be observed in each school shall be such as may from time to time be determined by the Minister; but in no case shall the whole time set apart for instruction be of less than four and a half hours' duration on each school day.

2. Between the morning and afternoon school meetings there shall be an interval of not less than one hour, except on days of heavy rain, when the interval may, at the discretion of the head teacher, be reduced to half-an-hour. Whenever this is done—and it should rarely be necessary—the times of opening and of closing the afternoon school meeting must be specially noted on the roll sheets in the column for "Remarks."

3. The time-table must be kept hung up in a conspicuous place in the school-room, and shall set forth the hours of opening and closing school, the employment of the several classes at any time, the teachers in charge thereof respectively, the time set apart for the instruction of the pupil teachers and for instruction in extra subjects, and the arrangements made for the supervision of children in the play-ground.

4. The time-table, should be so arranged that female teachers and pupil teachers may not be required to stand continuously for a longer period than one hour and a half.

5. When any entertainment is given to a school, as such, or to two or more schools in combination, with the sanction of the board of advice or of the Department, all members of the teaching staffs of the schools entertained will attend for the purpose of aiding in the maintenance of order, and will give such other assistance as may be required of them.

This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.
3. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the licence has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same, without the permission or sanction of the licensee or any one claiming under her, him, or them.
