BUSTARD OR WILD TURKEY TO BE DEEMED
NATIVE GAME.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Game Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1095) it is amongst other things enacted that for the purposes of the said Act the term "game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act, and the term "native game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act; provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time after the passing of the said Act by proclamation to name any other bird or animal which shall be included in such Second or Third Schedule respectively, and after the publication of any such proclamation in the *Government Gazette* and the expiration of the period mentioned in such proclamation for the time of its coming into operation, the birds or other animals so named shall be deemed and considered as being thenceforward included in such schedule; and it is also enacted that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards all or any of the birds and other animals mentioned in the Third Schedule shall be the period set opposite the name of each such bird or animal in the said schedule in each year or such other period as the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* from time to time direct: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby direct that the period of the year during which the *Game Act 1890* aforesaid shall be in operation as regards the "Bustard or Wild Turkey" shall, upon the expiration of the period hereinafter appointed for the coming into operation of this Proclamation, be the whole year, in lieu of the period set opposite the name of such bird in the Third Schedule to the said Act: And, with the advice aforesaid, I do appoint that this my Proclamation shall come into operation upon the ninth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

DREDGING OPERATIONS AT WESTPORT.

Marine Department,
Wellington, N.Z., 20th January, 1891.

THE Westport Harbour Board have notified that, while dredging operations are proceeding at the Port of Westport, the following signals will be shown on the dredge:—

On the side of the dredge that all vessels should pass a red flag will be shown by day, and a red light by night. A white light will also be shown on the side opposite to the red light, as well as a white light, visible all round, at the masthead.

Masters of steamers passing the dredge at night are requested to stop their engines when practicable, and also to slow their engines to less than half-speed for at least one hundred yards before arriving abreast of the dredge by day, as well as by night, to avoid fouling the moorings.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890* (54 Vict., No. 1082) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind such regulations as may be necessary or expedient for the carrying out of the provisions of Division 2 of the said Part of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Every person desirous of growing tobacco shall, before commencing to do so, send to the Chief Inspector of Excise, Melbourne, a notice in writing, in the form or to the effect in the First Schedule hereto, setting forth his name, place of abode, and place where the tobacco is intended to be grown, and the number of acres proposed to be placed under cultivation for the growth of tobacco.

2. Every manufacturer of tobacco, snuff, and cigars shall apply in writing to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs for the approval and appointment of premises as a tobacco factory, and such manufacturer shall enclose a drawing and full description of his premises; and when he has paid the quarterly fee—at the rate of Fifty pounds per annum if a cigar manufacturer, and at the rate of One hundred and fifty pounds per annum if a tobacco and snuff manufacturer—towards the cost of supervision and entered into a bond in the form in the Second Schedule hereto, with two approved sureties, for double the value, duty paid, of the maximum quantity to be in his manufactory at any one time, but no bond to be for a less sum than Two hundred and fifty pounds, the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may, if he think fit, grant him a licence to manufacture tobacco, snuff, and cigars.

3. Any person desirous of manufacturing tobacco in quantities not exceeding Fifty thousand pounds weight annually must make application in writing to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs for the approval and appointment of premises as a tobacco factory, ground plan and full description of which must accompany such application. A bond in the sum of One thousand pounds must be executed by the proprietor or occupier of such tobacco factory, together with two sufficient sureties, to be approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, for the security of the duty due on any tobacco which may be deposited in such factory, and for the due and faithful observance of the terms, conditions, and requirements of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*, and of the regulations now made or hereafter to be made thereunder. An annual fee of Five pounds, payable quarterly in advance, shall be paid by the proprietor or occupier of such tobacco factory to the Collector of Customs, Melbourne, or other person appointed to receive the same.

4. All leaf tobacco entered for manufacture shall be weighed by an officer of Customs or Excise, or such other officer as the Commissioner may appoint, in quantities not less than the weight now prescribed by the Customs laws for imported unmanufactured tobacco, namely, sixty pounds.

5. All manufactured or cut tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes shall be carefully weighed by an officer of Customs or Excise, or other duly appointed officer, before it is removed from the factory; such weight to be in quantities of not less than twenty pounds manufactured tobacco, cigars, and cigarettes, and not less than ten pounds snuff, at any one time.

6. Books of account shall be correctly kept by each manufacturer, showing every pound of leaf tobacco weighed into each manufactory, and every pound of manufactured and cut tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes cleared from such manufactory; and such books shall always be open to inspection by the Customs or Excise officer in charge.

7. No foreign leaf tobacco or strips shall enter any manufactory until the Customs duty required by law has been paid thereon.

8. No manufactured or cut tobacco, snuff, cigars, or cigarettes shall be cleared, except for exportation, from any manufactory until the Excise duty required by law has been paid thereon.

9. Any warehouse approved and appointed by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs under these regulations may be entered at any time by day or night by any officer of Customs or Excise specially authorized by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

10. Every manufacturer shall, before delivery thereof, place upon every package or box his name and address, together with a consecutive number for such package or box, such consecutive number, together with the address of the person to whom such package or box may be sent, shall be entered at the time of delivery in a book to be kept by the manufacturer for that purpose.

11. Every cigar or snuff manufacturer shall give at least twenty-four hours' notice, in writing, to the Chief Inspector of Excise when he wishes to deliver any of his goods.

12. No person shall take or remove any tobacco out of the premises of any tobacco manufacturer except between the hours of eight in the forenoon and six in the afternoon, and then only

on having a permit to take or remove the same out of the said premises signed by a locker or other proper officer of Customs or Excise; such permit to contain the tobacco manufacturer's name, and the place from which such tobacco is to be removed, a description of each package or box in which such tobacco is contained, and the quantity of tobacco contained in each and every such package or box, and the name and residence of the person to whom such tobacco is to be delivered or forwarded.

13. No person shall carry on the trade or business of a dealer in tobacco, snuff, cigars, or cigarettes without first having registered or renewed the registration of his name and premises, or obtained a licence, as required by the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*, in the form in the Fourth Schedule hereto; and no registration shall be considered complete until the licence fee as aforesaid shall have been paid to the Collector of Imposts appointed to receive the same.

14. The Commissioner of Trade and Customs may by order approve and license persons to cut on their premises manufactured tobacco upon which full duty has been paid. The licensee will require to enter into a bond with two sufficient sureties in the form in the Third Schedule hereto in the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds.

15. The regulations made under the provisions of *The Tobacco Act 1880*, on the 10th November, 1880, and all regulations amending or in addition thereto shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS by the *Mines Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to erect any portion of Victoria into a mining district, and to divide any such district into any number of divisions, and to give to such district and each of such divisions some distinguishing name, and to define the limits and boundaries of, and also again to abolish any such district and divisions, and from time to time to alter and vary such limits and boundaries, and from time to time to determine the number of members of the mining board of each district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and until the Governor in Council shall otherwise order the several mining districts and divisions created under the Act of the Parliament of Victoria, No. 32, or *The Mining Statute 1865*, and which shall be in existence at the time of the commencement of the now reciting Act shall be and shall be deemed to be mining districts and divisions under the said Act, provided always that no more than seven such districts shall be erected under the said Act unless addresses praying for a greater number shall be presented to the Governor by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: And whereas it is expedient to alter the mining districts and divisions hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter and vary the limits and boundaries of the mining districts of Gippsland and Beechworth, and the Omeo and Mitta Mitta Divisions, and doth define the limits and boundaries thereof as so altered and varied in manner following, that is to say:—

MINING DISTRICT OF GIPPSLAND.

PORTION OF SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AN "URBAN DISTRICT."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may proclaim any city, town, borough, or populous place, comprising the whole or any portion of a Waterworks District to be an "Urban District" for the purposes of the said Act, and may name the limits thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that portion of the Waterworks District of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, included within the following boundaries to be an "Urban District" for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Act:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 7, parish of Seymour, being also the most south-eastern angle of that parish; thence northerly by road to the north-east angle of allotment 22; thence south-westerly by road to the north-east angle of allotment 27; thence northerly by road to the north-east angle of allotment 10; thence westerly and south-westerly by northern boundaries of allotments 10 and 11 to the intersection of the north boundary of allotment 11 with the eastern boundary of the township of Seymour; thence north-westerly by portion of eastern boundary of that township to the Goulburn River; thence in general westerly, southerly, and easterly directions by that river to a point opposite the centre of one (1) chain road between allotments

48 and 48A, parish of Tallarook; thence in a general north-easterly direction by a line and that road to its intersection with main road from Seymour to Yea; thence south-easterly by that road to the commencing point.

CASTLEMAINE AND SANDHURST WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, has made the following Rules, Regulations, and Orders respecting the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply, the same being a work constructed under the authority of the said Act, viz:—

1. All by-laws heretofore made relating to the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The district which shall be rated for the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply shall be the whole of the Borough of Castlemaine, the whole of the Borough of Chewton, the whole of the United Shire of Mount Alexander, the whole of the United Shire of Metcalfe, the whole of the City of Sandhurst, the whole of the Borough of Eaglehawk, the whole of the Shire of Marong, the whole of the Shire of Huntly, the whole of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye, and the whole of the Shire of Maldon.

3. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board within the said district, that is to say:—

- (i.) On every house or tenement of £20 annual value and under, One pound per annum.
- (ii.) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, a rate of £5 per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700; and Two pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of valuation in excess of £700.
- (iii.) On every shop not used as a domicile above the annual value of £20, a rate of £4 per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive; Two pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700; and One pound five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £700.
- (iv.) The rates to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (v.) The rate to be charged for water supplied by the Board from the mains by measure shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, except in cases hereinafter specially mentioned.
- (vi.) For water supplied from the mains for building purposes the minimum rate shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per month, except in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (vii.) For water supplied from the mains for mining purposes, including sluicing, the rate shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (viii.) For water supplied from the channels to crushing mills, pyrites works, &c., the rate shall be Threepence per 1,000 gallons.
- (ix.) For water supplied from the mains to gardens, nurseries, vineyards, or other lands cultivated for trade purposes, and to cricket grounds, the rate shall be Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons. For water supplied from the channels

for like purposes the rate shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons. All such supplies from the channels shall be continuous or regularly intermittent, and the minimum amount of water to be supplied shall be 30,000 gallons per month, to be made in one (1) delivery; and the water shall be delivered at such times and in such manner as the Minister of Water Supply shall from time to time direct.

- (x.) For water supplied to any cemetery the rate shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (xi.) For water supplied to any public parks or gardens the rate shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (xii.) The rate to be charged for water supplied for sluicing purposes from the main aqueducts which diverge therefrom shall be One halfpenny (½d.) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge to any consumer shall be for not less than 1,000,000 gallons per month. Water supplied from the aqueducts for sluicing purposes shall be delivered at such times and in such manner as the Minister of Water Supply may from time to time direct.
- (xiii.) For water supplied to any trough the rate shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per annum.
- (xiv.) The rate to be charged for water supplied for gas-engines shall be Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied from the mains or pipes shall be:—
- (i.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure; and
- (ii.) If for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter.

5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purposes. No hose or pipe is to be supplied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing the house walls or a carriage, or for any similar purpose unless the water is charged for by a meter. Siphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

6. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Board, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

9. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable, as the Board shall see fit, and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employes, committing any breach of these by-laws.

10. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board the person applying for same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Board without giving two days' notice to the Board or the local inspector of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Board, without the permission in writing of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, or engine, the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or service-pipe therefrom, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

Diameter of Pipe.	Weight of pipe per yard
½ inch	5 lbs.
¾ inch	6 lbs.
1 inch	7½ lbs.
1½ inch	9 lbs.
2 inch	12 lbs.
2½ inch	16 lbs.
3 inch	20 lbs.

Ordinary connexions with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted. No service-pipe of a larger bore than half (½) inch will be permitted, unless by special consent of the Board.

13. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings, all joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

14. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

15. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting of the service-pipe or otherwise as the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

16. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to be run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

17. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter shall be capable of registering at least one million gallons.

18. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

19. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with, except upon written application to and the approval of the Board.

20. Baths supplied from the pipes, except when the supply is by meter, must not exceed six feet three inches in length along the centre line, by a mean width of two feet, and a depth of one foot nine inches, with the ends sloping inwards. Over-flow pipes will not be permitted.

21. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

22. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush, and the supply shall be by meter.

23. If any person supplied with water by the Board does or causes to be done anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully, or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

24. The streets shall not be watered from hydrants or fire-plugs by means of a hose, but the water is to be applied to the streets by carts or by manual labour, or by special stand-pipes of approved size and form.

25. Channel flushing and filling of public baths shall only be permitted between the hours of Ten o'clock and Six o'clock a.m.

26. The water supplied in the above-named district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations and not otherwise.

27. In the construction of these rules and regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include the corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

 Within the boundaries of the North-Western Vermin District—Four shillings.
 Within the boundaries of the Western Vermin District—Five shillings and sixpence.
 Within the boundaries of the Warracknabeal Vermin District—Ten shillings.

TYABB PUBLIC CEMETERY.—REGULATIONS AND
SCALE OF FEES.

THE subjoined Rules and Regulations and Scale of Fees which have been made by the Trustees of the Tyabb Public Cemetery have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council,

Melbourne, 3rd February, 1891.

By virtue of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Mornington, as Trustees of the Tyabb Cemetery, on the 22nd day of December, 1890, adopted by resolution, the following Rules and Regulations for the proper control and management of the said Tyabb Cemetery, that is to say:—

- All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- By the 8th section of the Act, "any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument or tombstone in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or person, and his or their representatives thenceforth."
- Application for such permission to be made to the trustees at the cemetery. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule marked B, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in the schedule A.
- The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of any two of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- Orders for interment to be given either to the secretary or at the office of the trustees on the previous day; that eight working hours' notice, from seven a.m. to six p.m., be given of each interment, or in default thereof an extra fee will be charged, except when the necessity of immediate interment shall be certified by a legally qualified medical practitioner.
- The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
- The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from ten a.m. to six p.m. in the months of September to April, inclusive, and from ten a.m. to four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from two to five p.m. throughout the year.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave stones to be kept in repair and in proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.
- Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.
- A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected must be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in appropriate manner. In erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.
- The plans of all fences to be submitted to the trustees. All wooden fencing must be after a mode to be seen on application.
- No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.
- A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule.

15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do, or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by section 39 of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these Charges and Regulations.

And it is hereby declared that the said _____ shall be entitled to have, maintain, and keep such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of this permission, and for the sole and separate use of the said _____ and his (or their) representatives for ever: Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this grant is made subject to the terms and conditions following, viz.:—First—That the piece of ground shall be kept and used by the said _____ and his (or their) representatives solely as a burying place, and that no other use shall be made thereof. Second—That no enclosing wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone shall be erected or placed on the said piece of ground until a plan thereof shall have been exhibited to the said trustees and their authority given for the erection thereof. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ROYAL PARK, MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, power is given to the Trustees of any Crown lands heretofore reserved from sale for any public purpose whatsoever with the approval of the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of such lands vested in them or any part thereof, or for the preservation of good order and decency in such lands: Now therefore the Trustees of the Royal Park, in pursuance of the power as aforesaid, do hereby make the rules and regulations following to be observed and enforced in the Royal Park, Melbourne:—

1. All rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of the Royal Park, Melbourne, are hereby rescinded.

2. The gates of the park shall be open for horses and private vehicles from sunrise to sunset.

3. No public conveyance, cart, or vehicle plying for hire or bearing either name or number, shall, in any case, be permitted to use any of the roads of the park as a thoroughfare.

4. Vehicles shall approach the entrance to the Zoological and Acclimatisation Society's Gardens from the south, and after setting down passengers, shall be removed to the site set apart as a carriage stand. No horse shall stand within the gardens, or be attached to any of the fences around them.

5. No person shall ride or drive on the grass or on the footways, and all persons using the carriage ways shall keep the proper side of the road as on public roads.

6. No person shall enter the park for the purpose of breaking in horses, or training or exercising horses, or break in, train, or exercise horses within the park, or jump horses over any of the fences, or drive cattle or sheep through the park.

7. No person shall climb any of the fences or trees, or damage the same by cutting or otherwise defacing the same, or stick bills in the trees, fences, or gates, or lie on the seats, or, without the sanction of the trustees, remove any wood, gravel, stone, sand, or other material from the park.

8. No person shall bring any dog into the park unless held by chain or cord, or discharge firearms, or throw stones, or use projectile whatever, or molest any of the animals in the park, or, without the sanction of the trustees, kindle any fire.

9. No person shall be allowed in the park with firearms of any bows and arrows, shanghais, slings, or other such implements.

10. No person shall take birds' nests, or enter upon plots of enclosed for plantations or other purposes.

11. No public meeting or assemblage of people for any purpose shall be held in the park without the sanction of the trustees.

12. No person taking part in sports of any kind (or under any circumstances) shall appear in the park except in decent attire.

13. No person shall (unless by permission in writing of the trustees) offer for sale any article of merchandise or trade in the park.

14. No person shall leave empty bottles, or broken glass, or paper, or any other litter in the park, or beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance.

15. Preaching or public harangues, whereby a crowd is collected, shall not be permitted within the Park.

16. All goats and poultry found within the Park shall be liable to be destroyed.

17. Cricket, football, or other athletic sports, shall not be played or take place in any part of the Park on Sundays.

18. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or taking part in a fight or disturbances, or committing in the park any act of indecency, or appearing in the park in a costume, or making use of foul, indecent, threatening, abusive language to or within hearing of any other person, shall be forthwith removed by any Crown lands bailiff or police constable.

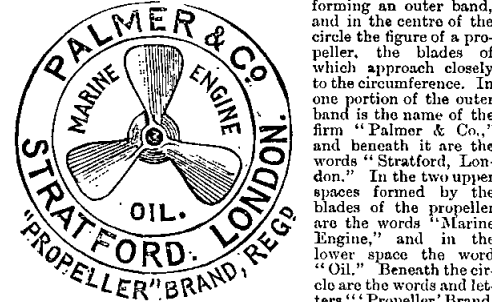


