## GENERAL ELECTION 1892.—ISSUE OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

**I**t is hereby notified that the General Rolls of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly must be prepared during the week ending the 1st December prox., and that persons who have not already enrolled may do so by obtaining Electors' Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

2. The rolls so prepared, as far as relates to the Legislative Assembly, will be used at the general election which will, in the ordinary course, take place about the month of April, 1892.

3. The Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars will keep open their offices for the issue of Rights until Ten o'clock p.m. on two nights in each week during the whole of November (see advertisements in newspapers), and on every night (except Sunday) during the last ten days of the month.

4. Intending applicants for Electors' Rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that those who so delay will be deprived of the opportunity for enrolment.

5. Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

6. Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining Electors' Rights when not qualified.

7. No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a Province may obtain an Elector's Right for such Province, and no person whose name is already on any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of an Electoral District may obtain an Elector's Right for such District.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces made under the provisions of the *Discipline Act 1870*, and bearing date the 3rd day of December, 1888, that is to say:—

## Part II.—Section IV.—Permanent Section, Victorian Engineers.

Para. 2. Free kit (clothing).—Strike out—"1 helmet, blue." Add, after "1 blue cloth cap"—"2 puggarees, white; 2 cap covers, white."

Para. 3. (Annual allowance).—Add, after "1 blue cloth cap"—"1 cap cover, white."

Para. 4. Strike out—"1 helmet, white, and 1 helmet, blue, every 5 years," and substitute—"1 helmet, white, every 2½ years."

WHEREAS by section 150 of the *Customs Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time specify the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of drawback to be so allowed; and may alter or cancel any such Order; and may approve of regulations and conditions for the repacking of dutiable goods, whether such goods be in bond or be entitled to drawback; and for the due protection of the revenue under which or upon which drawbacks may be allowed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following additions to and alterations in the Regulations relating to Drawbacks made on the twenty-ninth day of September, 1890, and doth order that such additions and alterations shall come into force and take effect from the 1st December, 1891, that is to say:—

The following are additional Regulations:—

No. 15. Exporters of earthenware and glassware must cause the goods upon which they intend to claim drawback to be stacked for measurement in the smallest possible compass consistent with safety, and as may be directed by the officer or officers superintending the operation, and the said goods shall be placed in the packages in which it is intended to export the same in the presence of such officer or officers.

No. 16. Exporters of earthenware and glassware under drawback shall, on rendering their debentures, produce to the proper officer, prior to the passing of the claims, properly certified documents showing the freight measurements of the packages included in the entries.

No. 17. The officer or officers superintending the packing of earthenware and glassware for drawback, in addition to the actual net measurement of the goods, shall also take the outside measurement of the package or packages into which the goods shall be placed, and record both measurements on the back of the entries. They shall also take an account of any other goods contained in such package or packages.

No. 18. When the packing of any goods entered for drawback has been completed the packages containing the same shall be sealed by the officer or officers superintending the operation before leaving the warehouse or place where the goods shall have been packed, and a distinctive mark or label shall be placed by them upon each package, by which it may be identified when received for shipment.

No. 19. Wherever in the Drawback Regulations dated the 29th September, 1890, the words "export value" occur, the said words shall be deleted, and the words "value for home use" substituted therefor.

Form E, appended to the aforesaid Regulations made on the 29th day of September, 1890, is repealed, and the following Form E is substituted therefor:—

FORM E.

DRAWBACK REGULATIONS.

*Declaration on Export Entry.*

I do hereby declare that I am [the exporter or the exporters] [I am the duly authorized representative of the exporter or the exporters] [I am a member of the firm] [the exporter or the exporters] of the goods mentioned in this entry, that the particulars therein contained are true and correct, that the goods are to be exported for use and consumption outside the colony of Victoria, and that drawback on same is claimed on the quantities, values, and rates as specified in said entry. That the goods are not entered at a higher value for drawback than the fair market value of such goods in Melbourne, and are not of less value for home use than the amount of drawback claimed.

(2) [I further declare that the invoice, dated and signed by represents the actual price paid, or to be paid, to the exporter [or exporters] for the same, subject to the following terms, viz.: and without any other discount, rebate, or other allowance by the purchaser thereof, trading, residing, or about to reside at in the colony of and that the goods mentioned in the said invoice have been actually and *bond fide* sold to the said purchaser by the exporter [or exporters] at the prices mentioned in such invoice.]

(3) [I further declare that the said goods are unsaleable in Victoria at a fair price, and are shipped as returned goods, and that the values shown in the invoice, dated and signed by are the true values of same.]

(4) [I further declare that the said goods are shipped for the supply of branch house or agent at in the colony of and that the values shown in the invoice, dated and signed by are the true values of same.]

(5) [I further declare that the statement dated and signed by is a true extract from, or copy of, the original invoices now produced (or to be produced to the proper officer), and upon which the duty was paid.]

(6) [I further declare that said goods are shipped as travellers' samples, to be accounted for at the rates, quantities, values, and general description, as specified in the invoice, dated and signed by the exporter's traveller.]

And I further declare that the said goods were properly cleared at the Customs, and duty paid thereon at the rates specified in this entry, and that none of the said goods were the produce of,

or manufactured in, Victoria, except such as are so specified, and that no drawback or rebate on account of damage has been claimed or paid on the said goods, and that the amount of drawback claimed does not exceed the amount of duty paid.

NOTE.—The first and last clauses are to be used in each and every case, and are the only portions of the declaration that are required for goods on which duty on "Fixed rates" is paid.

One of the clauses numbered 2, 3, or 4 (in addition to the first and last) is required when *ad valorem* goods are exported and drawback claimed at schedule rates, as under.\*

The fifth clause (in addition to the others to be used which are appropriate to the particular circumstances of the case) is required when the full duty paid is claimed as drawback.

The sixth clause (in addition to the first and last) is required for travellers' samples.

\* No. 2. When the goods have been sold. No. 3. When the goods are returned unsaleable. No. 4. When the goods are transferred to a branch house.

The declaration is to be printed with a margin of not less than three inches on the left-hand side.

The declaration as to measurement goods is required to be made before the Drawback officer by the exporter after the goods have been packed and before being shipped.

The words in Schedule No. 2 to the aforesaid Regulations, made on the 29th day of September, 1890, as follow, are repealed, viz.:—

# SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1892.—No. 2.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1892, which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments liable to be rated, shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling (1s.) in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not, in any case, be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling (1s.) in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be One pound (£1) per annum for each and every additional allotment by which a main passes.

4. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and the 1st July, 1892.

5. Such person or persons as the commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to five per cent. on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (otherwise than by meter), Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 16,000 gallons for any trough not exceeding 12 feet in length, and 8,000 gallons for every additional 5 feet or fractional part thereof.

4. Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter, affixed by the consumer according to the directions of the Trust, provided nevertheless that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall not be less than that charged for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement through a meter, the charge shall be One shilling and threepence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 16,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (otherwise than by meter), Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such prices as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other land where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre; for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables and all other stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds, used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

That each syphon-pump must have a meter affixed, and that Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons be charged for all water registered at such meter.

That the occupiers of all tenements not already rated, situated within a distance of a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe, shall pay a rate equal to one-half; and where such tenements are situated at a distance of more than a quarter of a mile therefrom, such occupiers shall pay a rate equal to one-quarter of the amount which would be payable if such tenements were supplied with water from service-pipes.

And further, in addition to the foregoing rules and regulations, and under sections 121, 122, and 124 of the *Water Act 1890*, the following additional regulations for the year 1892 are made, and shall apply in lieu of the foregoing regulations in all instances decided from time to time by the Horsham Waterworks Trust Commissioners:—

A. All rateable properties having tenements erected on them to be charged an amount equal to five per cent. on the municipal valuation for 1891-92; and in the case of tenements being erected during such year of 1892, then such to be charged an amount equal to five per cent. on a valuation for the remaining unexpired portion of such year as may be decided upon by the borough valuer or valuer for Horsham Waterworks Trust for the time being; always provided that the said annual value is not less than £20, in which case the minimum charge shall be £1. All rates to be paid in two instalments, half-yearly in advance, that is to say, on 1st January and 1st July of the year 1892.

B. Where water is laid on or used under section 124 of the *Water Act 1890*, a minimum charge of £1 shall be made, with a maximum charge of 1s. 3d. per 1,000 gallons per annum, payable half-yearly in advance as before-mentioned, in the case of a minimum charge; and when the maximum charge is made it shall be payable at the end of each quarter, that is to say, on 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, 1892.

Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure under this clause shall, at his or her own expense, provide a meter which shall have been tested by the Water Supply Department, Melbourne, and when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter shall be so placed as to be open for inspection, and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1892, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1892, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in such year; or quarterly, as the case may be. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

## SHEPPARTON WATER TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1892.

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

### REGULATION No. 12.

1. This regulation shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah, as such district is proclaimed and defined in a certain Order in Council bearing date the 23rd June, 1890.

2. The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said urban district shall pay in respect of the year 1892, in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes.

3. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Thirteen pounds ten shillings, or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings; on every house or tenement, above the annual value of Thirteen pounds ten shillings, according to the municipal valuation for the time being, an amount equal to seven and a half per centum on the amount of the said municipal valuation; provided that no owner or occupier shall be rated in respect of more than one vacant allotment.

4. Such rates shall be payable in two equal instalments, on the 1st day of January, 1892, and the 1st day of July, 1892.

5. Such person or persons as the commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust on the 6th day of November, 1891.

## SHEPPARTON WATER TRUST. REGULATION No. 13.

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

1. This regulation shall apply to the urban district of Numurkah, as such district is proclaimed and defined in a certain Order in Council bearing date the 23rd June, 1890.

2. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made.

3. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract and extras for brickwork, stonework, and plastering.

4. All charges for water supplied under this regulation shall be paid half-yearly, or as may be agreed upon.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for per half-year to the various owners or occupiers hereinafter mentioned, shall be as follows:—

In respect of steam-boilers—for each inch of the diameter of the largest cylinder, 4,000 gallons.

In respect of livery and carriers' stables—for each stall, 1,000 gallons.

In all other cases the minimum shall be a quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per one thousand (1,000) gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

7. Such meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect, and the meter, when fixed, shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection; and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the



meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

8. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

9. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

10. All service-pipes, with the necessary stop-cocks, shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

11. All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure, and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a movable key or handle.

12. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and fix meters, or to re-lay or re-fix the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

13. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

14. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

15. Any person who, having been served with the notice mentioned in clause 6 of this regulation, shall refuse or neglect to provide a meter within the time in such notice specified, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall still refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

16. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste.

17. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

18. No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus, without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust, and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

19. All water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, to prevent overflow.

20. No hose or pipe shall be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing houses, or walls, carriages, or horses, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

21. No person receiving water from the Trust shall take or carry away such water from his premises, nor shall allow any person to take or carry away any such water, nor shall sell the same to any other person.

22. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly-authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose.

23. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding £20 annual value,  $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding £20 but not more than £100 annual value,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding £100 annual value, 1-in. diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

24. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each such offence.

# SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1892 IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF TUNGAMAH.

## REGULATION No. 11.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Yarrawonga Waterworks Trust, for that part of its waterworks district proclaimed "The Tungamah Urban District," for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, and in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by section 122 of the said *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156), do hereby make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1892 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Tungamah:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds, and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds, and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the annual municipal valuation of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such lands, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.

6. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Two pounds per annum.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every one thousand gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and excepting cases in which the Trust have made special agreement).

8. A minimum rate of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1892.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The Regulation No. 3 of the said Trust, made on the 3rd day of May, 1886, is hereby extended to and shall be in force within the Urban District of Tungamah, as described by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th December, 1889, p. 4453.

The foregoing Regulation numbered eleven (11) was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Yarrawonga Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 2nd day of November, 1891.

In Division I.—A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling upon the annual municipal value of all rateable property situated therein.

In Division II.—A rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling upon the annual municipal value of all rateable property situated therein.

In Division III.—A rate of One shilling and tenpence in the pound sterling upon the annual municipal value of all rateable property situated therein.

The above rates are hereby made payable on the 15th day of December, 1891.

Such person or persons as the Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf, the 20th day of November, 1891.

**W**HEREAS default has been made in payment by the Avoca Water Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on a loan of £15,630 granted by the Governor in Council to such Water Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loan in accordance with the Act of Parliament in that behalf: And the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf it enabling, has taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notices that the said Water Trust District is supplied with water have been duly given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by a Proclamation by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 10th day of March, 1885, a portion of the said waterworks district was proclaimed an Urban District within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 16th day of November, 1891, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said Urban District should be made for the year 1892, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 16th November, 1891, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban District for the year 1892, that is to say:—

1st. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1892 on the annual shire valuation of the said Urban District.

2nd. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban District.

3rd. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the Trust works, Three shillings and fourpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.

4th. Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1892.

Such person or persons as the Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf, the 20th day of November, 1891.

# AVOCA WATER TRUST.—REGULATION BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Avoca Water Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on a loan of £15,630 granted by the Governor in Council to such Water Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loan in accordance with the Act of Parliament in that behalf: And the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf it enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notices that the said Avoca Water Trust District is supplied with water have been duly given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 16th day of November, 1891, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that rates which should be made by the Board of Land and Works under the said Act should be made in accordance with the provisions of the said Act for one year, that is to say, for the year 1892, and should be made equally upon all rateable property within the said Avoca Water Trust District, exclusive of the lands comprised within a certain Urban District (being part of the Waterworks District) proclaimed on the 10th day of March, 1885, and gazetted in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th March, 1885, and that such rates should not exceed Two shillings in the pound on the net annual value of such rateable property, and should be recovered in the manner provided in the said Act: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 16th November, 1891, in that behalf, make the following Regulation, that is to say:—The following rate is hereby made, and shall be payable for the year 1892, equally upon all rateable property within the said Avoca Water Trust District, not included within the boundaries of the Urban District proclaimed on the 10th day of March, 1885, before mentioned, according to the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the district within which such lands and tenements are respectively situate, that is to say, on all such rateable property the sum of One shilling in the pound sterling on such valuation, such rate is made hereby payable on the 1st day of March, 1892. Such person or persons as the Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rate.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf, the 20th day of November, 1891.

## HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST. REGULATION No. 3.

THE Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District under the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Healesville Waterworks Trust shall pay for the year 1892 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates to be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in such year:—

- (1) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Twenty shillings.
  - (2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of One shilling in the pound of such valuation.
  - (3) The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied township or subdivisional allotments shall be Sixpence in the pound of the municipal valuation of such vacant allotment during the said year, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Ten shillings be made.
2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

- (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence for every one thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where so supplied shall be twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at Ninepence per thousand gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, Sixpence.

- (3) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or in the event of there not being any contract, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

3. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement, or by measure, shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.
4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The births of 1,510 children, viz., 778 boys and 732 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of October. In the month of September, 1,534 births were registered, or 24 more than in the month under review. The births were 438 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 151 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in October numbered 1,042, viz., 546 of males and 496 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 468, or 45 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in September by 145, exceeded those in October, 1890, by 451, or 76 per cent., and population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 402 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3·08, and of deaths registered 2·12.

The highest temperature in the shade was 88.0° on the 14th. The mean temperature of the month (56.8°) was a fraction above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32.4°) took place on the 23rd, and the least range (7.1°) was on the 2nd. The mean daily range was 16.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.303 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.252 inches on the 16th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.894 inches) differed from the average by a very small fraction. Rain fell on 14 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.07 inches.

The average rainfall in October during the previous ten years was 2.48 inches, or about half-an-inch less than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 52 per cent., and females 48 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 27 per cent. to that mortality, as against 31 per cent. in October, 1890; 40 per cent. in October, 1889; 35 per cent. in October, 1888; 36 per cent. in October, 1887; 32 per cent. in October, 1886; 29 per cent. in October, 1885.

Thirty violent deaths took place during the month, of which 23 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female child, aged 4, was passed over by a tramcar, and a carpenter, aged 84, by a buggy; a jockey, aged 15, died of concussion of the brain, the result of the horse he was riding coming into collision with another horse; a girl, aged 7, died of injury to the brain, caused by falling down stairs; two labourers, aged 35 and 50 respectively, were killed by a fall of earth; a plumber, aged 23, a telegraph clerk, aged 49, and a widow, aged 59, of fracture of the skull, consequent on falls; a housewife, aged 59, died of fracture of the thigh; a labourer, aged 61, of fracture of the skull; and a labourer, aged 73, of fracture of the neck, the manner in which the accident occurred not being stated in either case; a male child, aged 4, died of burns; a schoolboy, aged 7, was drowned at Footscray, and one of the same age at Newport; a labourer, aged 46, and a market gardener, aged 47, were found drowned in the River Yarra; two new-born male and two female infants were overlain; a greengrocer, aged 57, and an artist, aged 80, died from the effects of poison, accidentally administered. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born female infant, who was suffocated, and a boy, aged 5, who was poisoned with strychnine—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a draper, aged 31, who shot himself; a female, aged 35, and a grocer, aged 72 who cut their throats; a female servant, aged 25, who drowned herself; and a female, aged 57, who hanged herself.

One hundred and ninety-two deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 76 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Women's Hospital, 8 in the Children's Hospital, 1 in the Austin Hospital, 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 12 in the Immigrants' Home, 23 in the Benevolent Asylum, 22 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 10 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 286, of which 150, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 136, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 205 were under one year of age, 47 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 13 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 756. Of these, 396, or 52 per cent., were males, and 360, or 48 per cent., were females; 22 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 30 were between twenty and twenty-five, 43 were between twenty-five and thirty, 45 were between thirty and thirty-five, 44 were between thirty-five and forty, 55 were between forty and forty-five, 55 were between forty-five and fifty, 51 were between fifty and fifty-five, 76 were between fifty-five and sixty, 80 were between sixty and sixty-five, 65 were between sixty-five and seventy, 67 were between seventy and seventy-five, 43 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 48 were upwards of eighty.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.



7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September, 1892, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

## BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

## BY-LAW No. 1.

A By-law of the Borough of Wangaratta, made under the provisions of section 47 in Part VII. of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (No. 1091), to provide for the closing of all shops within the borough other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the said Act at the hour of One o'clock p.m. on Wednesday in each week, except those weeks in which certain fixed holidays occur.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (No. 1091), the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wangaratta order as follows:—

That all shops within the Borough of Wangaratta other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Act shall be completely and properly closed and shall remain so closed from the hour of One o'clock p.m. to the hour of Twelve o'clock mid-night on Wednesday in every week, except those weeks in which occur New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Queen's Birthday, the annual show days, Prince of Wales' Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

That if any shopkeeper fail or neglect to close his shop in accordance with the provisions of the Act or of this by-law he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Ten pounds.
