PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE SHIRE OF OAKLEIGH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c. &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112, section 388) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Oakleigh has requested that the streets hereinafter mentioned, acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making streets within the said shire, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the Shire of Oakleigh aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

The estimated population of Greater Melbourne at the end of 1890 was 478,120, as compared with 458,470, at the same period of the previous year. There was thus an apparent increase of 19,650, or of 4.29 per cent., during the year.

Of the increase referred to, only 8,562 was due to excess of births over deaths, the balance being attributable to immigration from the country districts and places outside the colony.

In Greater Melbourne as a whole, the registered births exceeded the registered deaths by 92 per cent. in 1890, as compared with 93 per cent. in 1889; but excluding the births and deaths which occurred in hospitals, asylums, &c., the excess of the former over the latter was 123 per cent. and 89 per cent. in those years respectively.

In 144 instances twins, and in one instance triplets, were born in Greater Melbourne during the year under notice. As the births in the same period numbered in all 17,850, the confinements must have numbered 17,713. Thus one mother in 122 gave birth to more than one infant.

The births set down as illegitimate in 1890 numbered 1,246, or 43 more than in 1889. More than a third of these took place in the Women's Hospital or in buildings under the supervision of the officers of that institution. The proportion of illegitimate births to the whole number of births registered was 1 in 14, or the same proportion which prevailed in the previous year.

Subjoined are the birth and death rates in each sub-district in 1890. Births and deaths in hospitals, asylums, &c., are excluded, and the sub-districts are arranged in order, the sub-district with the highest birth-rate and the highest death-rate being placed first and the rest in succession:—

In calculating the rates for the above table, the births and deaths occurring in hospitals, asylums, &c., have been excluded, as already stated. If these should be included, the proportion per 1,000 of the mean population of Greater Melbourne would be—births, 38.11; deaths, 19.84.

According to the table, the birth-rate is lower in Melbourne City than in any other sub-district, and the death-rate in that city is also much below the average.

In consequence of the excessive mortality which attends the period of infancy, high death-rates are usually concurrent with high birth-rates, and vice versa. This is especially exemplified in the case of Footscray, which in 1890 had the highest birth and death rates; it is also observable though to a less marked extent in many of the other sub-districts.

In Greater Melbourne, taken as a whole, the average number of persons to the acre at the end of 1890 was nearly three (2.91), but the density of the population varies considerably in the different sub-districts, ranging from 30 persons to the acre in North Melbourne Town, to less than 2 persons to the acre in Kew Borough, and about 1 person to every 3 acres in the portion of the district situated in shires. The following table shows the area of, and density of the population living in, each sub-district:—

It should be remarked that in some of the sub-districts extensive parks, gardens, and other public reserves exist, so that the population is really living in closer proximity than the figures indicate. Melbourne City contains 1,723 acres of such reserves; Kew, 634 acres; portion of district situated in shires, 569 acres; South Melbourne, 474 acres; Williamstown, 440 acres; Flemington and Kensington, 307 acres; St. Kilda, 250 acres; Richmond, 190 acres; Brighton, 167 acres; Port Melbourne, 80 acres; Essendon, 54 acres; Fitzroy, 41 acres; and smaller areas in the other municipalities.

The estimated population, the births and deaths, and their proportions to the population, the excess of births over deaths, the mean temperature in the shade, the rainfall, and the mean atmospheric pressure in Greater Melbourne, during each of the twenty years ended with 1890, were as follow:—

The births in Greater Melbourne were much more numerous in 1890 than in any previous year named in the table, as also was their proportion to the total population.

The deaths in 1890 were also much more numerous than in any previous year except 1889, but their proportion to the population was lower than in any of the previous 9 years except 1883 and 1881; and was also slightly lower than the average of the 10 years ended with 1880.

The proportion by which the births exceeded the deaths was higher in 1890 than in any other year since 1878. All the figures in this table relating to births and deaths include those which occurred in hospitals, asylums, &c., which accommodate large numbers of persons coming from country districts. Should these be eliminated, the number of births would be somewhat less and that of deaths would be considerably less, whilst the excess of births over deaths would be very much higher.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the year 1890 was 103.4° on the 6th February; and the lowest was 29.0° on the 16th July. The mean temperature of the year (58.7°) was higher than in any of the

previous 19 years, and was more than a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (48°3') took place on the 5th January, and the least range (3°0') on the 7th December. The mean daily range was 17°0'. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30·511 inches on the 16th July; and the lowest was 29·185 inches on the 13th November. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·92 inches) was about the average. Rain fell on 140 days, and the amount of rainfall was 24·24 inches, the latter was 8 inches below that in 1887, and was also below that in 1884, 1885, and 1889, but was above that in any other of the last ten years, and was three-quarters of an inch below the average of the decennial period. The number of days in which fog occurred was 31.

Of the births registered in Greater Melbourne during 1890, 51 per cent. were of males, and 49 per cent. were of females. Of the deaths during the year, 55 per cent. were of males, and 45 per cent. were of females. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 39 per cent. to the total mortality, as against 44 per cent. in 1889, 42 per cent. in 1888 and 1887, 41 per cent. in 1886, 38 per cent. in 1885, 41 per cent. in 1884, 36 per cent. in 1883, 40 per cent. in 1882, 38 per cent. in 1881, and 40 per cent. in 1880 and 1879.

The deaths of 2,571 infants under 1 year of age occurred in Greater Melbourne during 1890, the proportion being 14·40 to every 100 births. This was the lowest infantile death-rate that has occurred in the district during the last 18 years, the highest being 19·43 in 1889. The corresponding proportion in 1888 was 17·18; in 1887, 17·51; and in 1886, 17·84. In the 17 years ended with 1889, the mean proportion to every 100 infants born of those who died before completing their first year of life was 17·19.

The deaths of 447 persons, viz., 250 males and 197 females, of the age of 75 years or upwards occurred during 1890, or 11 less than in the previous year. Of these, 224 were between 75 and 80, 126 between 80 and 85, 64 between 85 and 90, 25 between 90 and 95, and 8 between 95 and 100. Before the fifteenth and after the twenty-fifth year of age, deaths of males were more numerous than those of females; but between the ages of 15 and 25, deaths of females were slightly the more numerous. The following are the numbers of deaths in 1890 which took place in Public Institutions:—731 in the Melbourne Hospital, 231 in the Alfred Hospital, 51 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 68 in the Children's Hospital, 61 in the Women's Hospital, 120 in the Immigrants' Home, 114 in the Benevolent Asylum, 87 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 85 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 47 in the Austin Hospital, 42 in the Melbourne Gaol, 7 in the Pentridge Stockade, 2 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, 9 in the Protestant Refuge, 3 in the Industrial Schools, 2 in the Blind Asylum, and 15 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor. The number is 1,692 in all, which figures, compared with the total deaths (9,297), furnish a proportion of 18 per cent., or, in other words, 1 person in every 5·5 who died in Greater Melbourne during 1890 ended his days in a hospital, an asylum, or a gaol.

The large number of deaths from diphtheria (combined with croup) forms an important feature in the mortality returns of 1890; the excess over 1889 was 76, and that over any other year was much greater. Moreover, deaths from phthisis and from heart affections were more numerous in 1890 than in any of the previous years, whilst deaths from typhoid fever and from nervous affections, although less numerous than in 1889, were more so than in any previous year. Deaths from affections of the lungs and chest exceeded the number in either of the five previous years, but were exceeded in 1884, 1883, and 1882. Deaths from most of the other complaints mentioned in the table were fewer in 1890 than in 1889.

The following table shows the number of deaths from all causes, also from typhoid fever, diarrhoeal diseases, and diphtheria and croup, registered in each month of the last seven years:—

According to the experience of the seven years named, the general mortality and the mortality from diarrhoeal diseases are greatest between November and April, the worst months being December and January; the mortality from typhoid fever is greatest between January and June, the worst months being February, March, and April; and the mortality from diphtheria and croup is greatest between April and September, the worst month being July. It will be noticed that the last is the only one of the complaints named which appears to be more destructive in winter than in summer.

It will be noticed that the birth-rate was higher in Melbourne than in Sydney, Adelaide, Hobart, or Wellington; but lower than in Brisbane; that the death-rate in Melbourne was slightly higher than in Hobart and considerably higher than in any of the other cities; and that the proportion of excess of births over deaths was lower in Melbourne than in any, except Hobart.

It should be mentioned that the death-rate of Melbourne is much swelled by the large number of country residents who are admitted to and die in the Metropolitan hospitals. In some of the other colonies it is the custom to eliminate such entries, and it is probable that in Melbourne such deaths bear a higher proportion to the total number of deaths recorded than they do in any of the other cities named.

**NOTICE.**—Applications (to be accompanied by a fee of 10s.) to be examined in country districts for Certificates as Engine-drivers under the *Mines Act 1890* and the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* will be received until the 21st March next, addressed to the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne.

Applications will be received from candidates desirous of being examined in Melbourne up to 20th May next.

Intending candidates can obtain forms of application and copies of regulations from the Office of Mines and from the various Mining and Factory Inspectors throughout the colony.

Applications will also be received for Certificates as Boiler Attendants only.

Candidates for Second-class Mining Certificates of Competency will require to have twelve months' experience assisting in the driving of engines instead of six months as heretofore.

Candidates for First-class Mining Certificates of Competency will require to have six months' experience in assisting driving winding-engines instead of three months as heretofore.

No. 1112) it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may from time to time make orders amongst other things to constitute any part of Victoria not exceeding in area nine square miles and having no point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and containing a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, a borough; And it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may make orders altering for the purpose of adjustment the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition; And it is further enacted that every order constituting any new municipality shall constitute the same as either a borough or a shire, and shall assign a name to such borough or shire, describe the boundaries thereof, determine of how many members the council shall consist, determine whether the municipal district constituted is to be subdivided or not, and in case it is to be subdivided name and describe the subdivisions; and it is further enacted that every order severing any district from any subdivided municipal district may abolish all the subdivisions and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or resubdivide the same; and that every order under the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall be published in the Government Gazette, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication; And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Oakleigh, praying that a certain area described in such petition, being part of the Centre and South Ridings, be severed from the said shire and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Borough of Oak-



leigh: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a borough to be named the Borough of Oakleigh, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shire of Oakleigh and of the Centre and South Ridings of the said shire as reduced and of the North Riding thereof, shall be those hereunder set forth and described, and doth order that the said new Borough of Oakleigh shall be not subdivided at present, and doth further order that the council of the said new Borough of Oakleigh shall consist of nine members.

REGULATION No. 7.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following regulation:—

Regulation No. 7.

For the care and protection of the Trusts' works, and such reserves as may now or hereafter be placed under the control and management of the Trust.

1. No person shall cut down or remove any live or dead timber, bushes, scrub, trees, or plants, nor damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs, bushes, or plants within any reserve or reserves that may now or hereafter be placed under the control and management of the Trust without the permission in writing of the said Trust.

2. No person shall remove any gravel, stone, sand, earth, or other material from any reserve or reserves that may now or hereafter be placed under the control or management of the Trust, nor mine thereon, nor light any fires thereon, nor deposit any sludge, rubbish, refuse, or debris of any kind thereon, nor in any way break, remove, damage, or interfere with the surface thereon without the permission in writing of the said Trust.

3. No person shall erect any dwellings, fences, enclosures, or other structures upon any of such reserve or reserves, nor erect any booth or other structure therein for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the written permission of the said Trust.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates of any enclosure upon any such reserve or reserves, nor commit any nuisance therein, nor offend against decency therein in dress, language, or conduct, nor interfere with or in any way damage or deface any buildings, seats, enclosures, notice-boards, fences, pipes, races, bridges, or any other property of the said Trust.

5. No person shall enter or trespass upon any of the works or buildings belonging to the Trust, nor upon any reserve or reserves that may now or hereafter be placed under its control and management, except upon such as are open to the public, and then only during such hours as such works, buildings, or reserves are open to the public.

6. Any person offending against any of these regulations shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £5, irrespective of any sum which such person offending may be lawfully adjudged liable to pay to the Trust for any damage done to the works or loss sustained by the said Trust.

The foregoing regulation numbered seven was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this day sixth of February, 1891.

**GISBORNE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.**

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the Waterworks Trust area, according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

**SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.  
REGULATION No. 1.**

THE Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

The following Regulations shall apply to that portion of the Waterworks district of the Seymour Waterworks Trust proclaimed an urban district by the Governor in Council on the 3rd day of February, 1891, the boundaries of which urban district are fully described in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th February, 1891, page 764.

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements, situated within the aforesaid water district and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1891, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half yearly, in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July in such year.

(1) On every house and tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Twenty shillings.

(2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of One shilling in the pound of such valuation.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every one thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where so supplied shall be Twenty thousand gallons per half year, or a quantity which at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of

water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive, according to his assessed rate for the year, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

- (2) The stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, One shilling.
  - (3) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the event of there not being any contract, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, and plastering.
3. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

#### REGULATION NO. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach.

4. When water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter, or under special agreement, the supply shall be through service-pipes of the following diameter, *viz.*, all pipes ( $\frac{1}{2}$  in.) three-quarters of an inch, except where a special agreement is made.

5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for any livery stables or carriers' stables, or for manufacturing purposes.

6. No person shall apply a hose or pipe to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing the house walls, or a carriage, or for any similar purposes, unless where the water is charged for by meter, except by the written authority of the Trust; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Before any such licence being granted by the Trust, the person applying shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

9. The quality of material required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (except those connecting the service-pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.
- (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c., &c.
- (4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

10. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust; each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

13. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of a hydrant and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

15. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any land or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

16. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

18. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. The water supply in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

20. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole. The word "officer" shall be deemed and be taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Seymour Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing regulations were made and passed by the Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust this 20th day of February, 1891, and the seal of the Trust was hereunto affixed in the presence of—

#### BALLARAT WATER COMMISSION.—LOAN.

THE Governor in Council has authorized the granting of a loan of Eight thousand pounds sterling (£8,000) to the Ballarat Water Commission for water supply purposes in the district of the said Commission; the said loan to be advanced in such sums as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct.

The boundaries of the water supply district to be the same as those heretofore defined by Order in Council.

The rate of interest to be paid by the said Commission on the said loan to be Three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per centum per annum, payable on the 1st day of July and the 1st day of January in each year, the first of such payments to be made on the 1st day of July, 1891.

The amount of the said loan to be repaid by the said Commission in four years, by four annual payments of not less than Two thousand pounds sterling (£2,000); the first of such annual payments to be made on the 1st day of July, 1892.

As it is not in contemplation that the work in respect of which the said loan is granted shall be inspected or reported on by the Chief Engineer of Water Supply, his certificate to the accounts will not be required.

**BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.—BY-LAWS.—  
GEELONG WATER SUPPLY.**

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by the *Water Act 1890*, make the By-laws following:—

1. All by-laws heretofore made relating to the Geelong Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed, or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.
2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—
  - (i.) On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
  - (ii.) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £100 inclusive; Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £100 up to £200; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £200 up to £500; and Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £500.
  - (iii.) Buildings used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
  - (iv.) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.
  - (v.) For water supplied by the Board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Board, the rate shall be One shilling per thousand gallons.
  - (vi.) The rate to be charged, for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Twopence per hundred gallons.
  - (vii.) Horses shall be charged for at the rate of Seven shillings and sixpence each per annum.
  - (viii.) Water for steam-boilers shall be charged at the rate of Fifteen shillings per horse-power per annum, except in such cases as the Board shall require that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.
  - (ix.) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in such cases as the Board shall require that the supply shall be by measure, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.
  - (x.) On all buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the rate to be charged shall be Five shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, excepting in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, or by special agreement.
  - (xi.) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be One shilling per hundred gallons for the first three hundred gallons; above three hundred gallons and not in excess of four hundred gallons the charge shall be Ninepence per hundred gallons; above four hundred gallons and not in excess of five hundred gallons the charge shall be Eightpence per hundred gallons; in excess of five hundred gallons the charge shall be at the rate of Six shillings per thousand gallons.
3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—(1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge is One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2.) If for other than domestic purposes only twenty-five thousand gallons per quarter.
4. The Board may grant permission to persons requiring water for "domestic" and for "other than domestic purposes" to affix two service-pipes, one for domestic supply without meter, for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter, the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Board against the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for irrigation or any other purpose not domestic.
5. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected

with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable as the Board shall see fit; and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employes, committing any breach of these by-laws.

9. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Board, without giving two days' notice to the Board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Board, without the permission, in writing, of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

Diameter of Pipe.	Weight of Pipe per yard.
1/2 inch	5 lbs.
3/4 inch	6 lbs.
1 inch	7 1/2 lbs.
1 1/4 inch	9 lbs.
1 1/2 inch	12 lbs.
1 3/4 inch	16 lbs.
2 inch	20 lbs.

Ordinary connexions with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules. One service-pipe only for domestic supply for each tenement will be permitted. No service of a larger bore than 1/2 inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Board.

12. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper-bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

13. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

14. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which, after notice that service-pipe requires repairing, any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

15. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

17. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector or any authorized officer of the Board as out of repairs or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

18. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Board.

19. A separate meter shall, in every case, be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.

20. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meter, shall not exceed six feet three inches in length along the centre line, by a mean width of two feet, and a depth of one foot nine inches, the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

21. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

22. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

23. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed, and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each such offence.

24. If any person supplied with water by the Board does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

25. The streets shall not be watered from hydrants or fire-plugs by means of a hose, but the water is to be supplied to the streets by carts, or by manual labour, or by special stand-pipes of approved size and form.

26. Channel flushing and filling of public baths shall only be permitted between the hours of Ten o'clock p.m. and Six o'clock a.m.

27. The water supplied in the above district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations; and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations, and not otherwise.

28. In the construction of these by-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

CHILDERS AND THORPDALE PUBLIC CEMETERY.  
*Rules and Regulations.*

1. All the charges must be paid when the orders are given, or before the ground is broken or vault reopened.
2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the proper fees.
3. Order for interment to be given to the trustees at least eight hours previous to interment, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.
4. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick or other grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them.
5. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.
6. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from sunrise to sunset until otherwise ordered.
7. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.
8. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
9. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
10. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.
11. No interment will be allowed to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a deputy-registrar, or coroner holding an inquest or inquiry on the body to be interred, or from a magistrate. Every such certificate must be delivered to the person in charge at the cemetery before the funeral enters the gates.
12. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR AGRICULTURAL SHOW YARDS AND FOR PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MAFFRA, AT MAFFRA.

THE Council of the Shire of Maffra, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Agricultural Show Yards and for purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Maffra, at Maffra, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges, for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twenty-four in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart by the committee of management for the Maffra Agricultural, Pastoral, and Horticultural Society's shows, cricket or football matches, sports or holiday amusements; on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding five shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every person to the reserve. Provided always that not more than twelve (12) of such days in any one year shall be utilized for the Maffra Agricultural, Pastoral, and Horticultural Society's shows.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, seats, or trees, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission in writing of the committee of management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No persons shall, except on the days set apart for the Maffra Agricultural, Pastoral, and Horticultural Society's shows, bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained, but the Maffra Agricultural, Pastoral,

and Horticultural Society shall be at liberty to erect or effect on the reserve such buildings, yards, pens, booths, or other improvements as may be at any time required by the society, provided that no such buildings or fences be erected within fifty yards of the centre of the present enclosure. The committee of the Maffra Agricultural, Pastoral, and Horticultural Society shall have the exclusive right to use and control all buildings, yards, pens, and other improvements erected on the reserve by the society.

8. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. Persons renting or hiring from time to time, upon such terms and conditions as the Maffra Agricultural, Pastoral, and Horticultural Society may think fit, any stand or stands, or booth or booths, or the gates of admission to the reserve, or any part thereof, on any or all of the twelve (12) days specified in clause 1, shall abide by any order or instructions given by the committee of the society.

10. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall, together with any horse or other animal or animals, or any vehicle or other article in his or her possession or care, be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person or persons may have purchased, or is, or are, or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve:—

- (a) Assaulting any other person.
- (b) Being drunk or disorderly.
- (c) Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the track or ring during an agricultural show.
- (d) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (e) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (f) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (g) Being found in any part of the reserve, or any of the buildings thereon, and not producing on demand, or not surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management of the reserve or the committee of the Maffra Agricultural, Pastoral, and Horticultural Society to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission when such person shall be so found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management or the committee of the society, or any person duly deputed by either of them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by such person, and that such ticket has been lost.
- (h) Obtaining admission to any part of the reserve when disentitled to such admission under these Regulations.

11. All persons paying for admission to the reserve shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which he or she shall on demand produce, or if required, surrender to any person having authority from the committee of management of the reserve or the committee of the Maffra Agricultural, Pastoral, and Horticultural Society to demand production or surrender thereof.

12. No person shall be admitted to the reserve during any show who has been proved to the satisfaction of the committee of the Maffra Agricultural, Pastoral, and Horticultural Society to be a defaulter, or to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonourable conduct in connexion with any agricultural show.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
