KAIPARA HARBOUR.

THE leading marks for the entrance to Kaipara are now as follow, namely:—

Two beacons on hill about half-a-mile to the north and west of the lighthouse on North Head, and one beacon on low sandhills, North Spit. The upper beacon is painted black, the other two are painted white. These three beacons in line, N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., give a clear channel in from seaward, five fathoms at low water on the outer bar being the least water on the line of beacons. Steer in with these beacons in line until between North Spit and Tory Shoal; then two smaller beacons, erected on the slope of the North Head, eastward of lighthouse, and painted black, will be seen. When these are brought in a line, N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., a vessel will be well clear of the edge of Tory Shoal, and a course may be steered along the land until abreast of the lighthouse, paying attention to any directions given from signal-station close to lighthouse.

The lighthouse is now painted white, and is no longer a leading-mark for entering the harbour.

SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

By-Law No. 5/90.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading, in the colony of Victoria, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the said shire, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 5/90, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 4/88, made and ordered by the Local Board of Health of the said Shire, on the 1st day of October, 1888, and confirmed on the 29th day of October, 1888, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation; and this by-law shall be read in lieu thereof.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or conveyance, properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom. Whenever any nightman is duly licensed for the removal of night-soil, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of any premises which are now or may be hereafter situated within a radius of half-a-mile of the following railway stations, that is to say:— Surrey Hills, Mont Albert, Box Hill, Blackburn, Tunstall, and Mitcham respectively, and no other person shall remove the same.

4. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council of the said shire may be empowered to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BACCHUS MARSH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST PROCLAIMED AN "URBAN DIVISION."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c.; &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may proclaim any city, town, borough, or populous place, or any part thereof, comprised within the Irrigation and Water Supply District of any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, an "Urban Division": Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the land hereinafter described, forming portion of the Bainsdale-Irrigation and Water Supply Trust District, to be an "Urban Division" for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the right bank of the Mitchell River at the junction therewith of the western boundary line of the Centro Riding of the Shire of Bainsdale; thence southerly by the said western boundary to the Bainsdale and Heyfield railway line; thence north-easterly by the said railway line to the south angle of the Bainsdale wharf; thence by the right bank of the Mitchell River to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and in the fifty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation, namely:—

REGULATION No. 8.

Regulating the Supply of Water, Fixing Meters, Water-troughs, &c.

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stable, or to any horses or cattle, or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing the house walls, or a carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless where the water is charged for by meter, except by the written authority of the Trust; and no cock or tap with any connexion for attaching hose shall be affixed to any service-pipe, connexion, or fitting without the written authority of the Trust.
2. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
3. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any water-race, drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
4. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe or service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
5. Before any such licence shall be granted the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.
6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the super-

intendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust. Wrought galvanized-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No service of a larger bore than half-inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Trust.

8. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

9. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe of the Trust with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing such approved self-acting valves as may be directed by the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

11. All boilers or hot-water apparatus must be supplied from cisterns, as in no case will they be permitted to be fed directly from the pipes of the Trust.

12. In every bath the inlets must be distinct from and unconnected with the outlet, and the inlet pipes must be visible and accessible, and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof; and such bath shall be provided with a proper, well-fitted, and perfectly watertight ground outlet, plug, or cock. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

13. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except by permission of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

14. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all such times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied; but no such cutting off of the water supply shall exempt the offender from payment of the water rate during such suspension of the supply, nor from any fine or penalty provided for such offence by the *Water Act 1890* or these regulations.

16. The Trust may order meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter to be provided, fixed, and maintained at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied will be charged for at the rates provided for in the regulations made by the Trust from time to time in that behalf.

Syphon pumps will not be allowed to be used unless where the water is supplied by measure.

17. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial thereof is capable of registering at least One million (1,000,000) gallons, nevertheless the Trust may in such cases as they consider it necessary direct that a meter of a greater registering capacity shall be affixed.

18. A meter shall not be used unless the same is of a kind and is placed in a situation approved in each instance by a memorandum in writing made by the duly authorized officer of the Trust.

19. Every meter shall be so placed as to be open to inspection, and as far as practicable in a situation where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto.

20. A meter shall not be used, or be continued to be used, if it is found, on being tested by the officers of the Trust, to be inaccurate.

21. A meter shall not be connected to more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe or other pipe of the Trust, unless permitted by a memorandum in writing under the hand of the duly authorized officer of the Trust.

22. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by meter shall keep and maintain such meter in good working order to the satisfaction of the officers of the Trust, and in the event of any such meter ceasing to register, registering incorrectly, or requiring repairs, notice in writing shall be immediately given by such person to the Trust.

23. If any person supplied with water by meter, as aforesaid wilfully or negligently fails to give the notice hereinbefore required regarding such meter he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and the secretary or other officer duly authorized by the Trust may give such person notice in writing requiring such meter to be repaired or replaced by an approved meter within a period stated in such notice—being not less than three days—and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken by the proper officer of the Trust before such meter is removed or repaired.

24. If any meter shall cease registering, or register incorrectly, or require repairs, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the time such meter ceased registering or registered incorrectly (or if water is supplied during the time such meter is removed for repairs), or during the time such meter is being repaired, by taking an average of the quantity used during the preceding quarter or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

25. Any person who having been ordered by the Trust or notified by the duly authorized officer thereof under the provisions hereinbefore contained, to affix or repair a meter, shall neglect or refuse to comply with such order or notice, shall for every day during which such neglect or refusal continues after the expiration of the time fixed in such order or notice, and until the supply of water is cut off by the Trust, forfeit the sum of One pound. The Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise until such meter shall have been affixed or repaired to the satisfaction of the Trust.

26. Every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give three days' notice in writing to that effect to the Trust; and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

27. If any plumber or other person fix or re-fix any meter upon any premises supplied with water by the Trust without having first obtained a certificate from the Trust that the said meter has been examined and found in correct working condition he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

28. If any person remove or alter the position of or in any way interfere with any meter, without giving such notice as aforesaid, he shall for each such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds over and above the damage which he may be found liable to pay in any action at law at the suit of the Trust.

29. All water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow. Any person fitting or causing or permitting a water-trough to be fitted up or used contrary to this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and to a further penalty of Ten shillings per day for each day that such trough is supplied with water without a self-acting tap being fitted thereto, after notice having been given by an officer of the Trust requiring such trough to have such tap affixed thereto.

30. The officers of the Trust may enter any house, building, or lands to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or whether there be any waste or misuse of such water; and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; but except with the consent of a justice this power of entry shall be exercised only between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon.

31. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wilfully or negligently causes or suffers any pipe, valve, cock, cistern, bath, soil-pan, water-closet, or other apparatus or receptacle to be out of repair, or to be so used or contrived as that the water supplied to him by the Trust is or is likely to be wasted, misused, unduly consumed for irrigation, or otherwise howsoever, or contaminated, or so as to occasion or allow the return of foul air or other noisome or impure matter into any pipe belonging to or connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

32. Any person guilty of any offence against these regulations not otherwise specifically provided for shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, in addition to being liable to make good any damage or loss sustained by the Trust.

In this regulation the word "Trust" shall mean the "Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust"; "secretary" shall mean the secretary of the Trust or the person for the time being discharging the duty of that office; "officer of the Trust" shall mean any officer of the Trust or other person appointed for the time being to carry out or supervise any work in connexion with the Trust; and the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole.

The foregoing regulation was made and adopted by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust, in lieu of a former regulation numbered Three, passed by the said Trust on the 5th day of April, 1889, which is hereby rescinded.

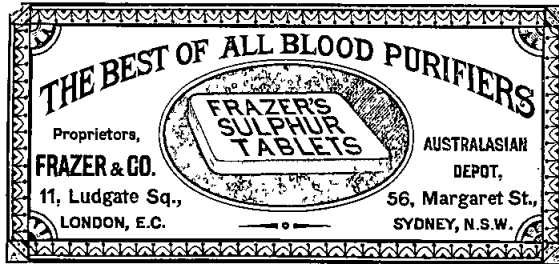
