**LOWANSHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.**

**W**HEREAS by section 75 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Commissioners of any Waterworks Trust appointed under the said Act may, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, make regulations for or relating to all or any of the subjects mentioned in said section. Now therefore the Chairman and Commissioners of the Lowanshire Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The prevention and remedying of the waste, undue consumption, fouling, or contamination of water contained in or supplied from any part of the works within any part of the district or area under the control or management of the said Lowanshire Waterworks Trust.

2. The water and every part of the waterworks within any reserve or within any part of the district or area under the control or management of the said Lowanshire Waterworks Trust, or within any proclaimed urban district under such control or management, shall be protected from trespass and injury of any kind whatsoever.

The penalty for each offence in respect of the breach of any such regulations shall not exceed Five pounds, and may be recovered from any offender in a summary way before any two justices.

*Sourabaya Strait. Provisional notice concerning intended alterations in buoyage of the E. and W. entrance to Sourabaya.*

*Eastern entrance.*—The red wreck-buoy on the wreck of the *Noesan Etajoecer* will be withdrawn, and replaced by the southern white gas-buoy. Between this gas-buoy and the northern one, one gas-buoy more will be placed.

*Western entrance.*—The buoys in the western (old) fairway will be withdrawn and not replaced.

The eastern (new) fairway will be buoyaged with 3 white and 3 black buoys surmounted by balls, the black buoys on the left and the white on the starboard hand if entering. The outer-buoys will be moored on the limit of the 3 fathoms bank, the white outer buoy in the line of the leading lights.

A gas-buoy will be placed on a small 10-foot bank situ about 4,950 yards N.N.E. from Oedjoeng Piering.

A white buoy surmounted by a ball will be placed on the limit of the bank, E. by N. of Fort Erfprins.

**SHIRES OF WOORAYL AND BULN BULN.**

**PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.**

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, sec. 43) the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 41st section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Woorayl described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Woorayl and annexed to the Shire of Buln Buln.

Area described in Petition:—  
Commencing at the south-west corner of allotment 50b, parish of Korumburra, on the boundary of the Shire of Woorayl; thence northerly, north-easterly, southerly and easterly by that boundary to the north-east corner of allotment 77; thence south by that allotment to the north boundary of allotment 79; thence westerly by that boundary to the north-west corner of said allotment; thence southerly to a road bounding said allotment on the south; thence west by that road to the north-west corner of allotment 83; thence south, west, and south by the western boundary to south-west corner thereof; thence south by a road and by the western boundary of several allotments, and again by a road in a straight line to the south-west corner of allotment 72p; thence west, south, and west by a road to the commencing point on the shire boundary.

Petitioners state that a general dissatisfaction as to the manner in which the revenue is expended pervades "The Territory." That they are desirous of having the roads leading towards Melbourne improved and made fit for traffic, but, as they are unable to obtain a fair share of representation at the council table, consider that an undue share of their revenue has been, and is being, spent on roads in portions of riding in which they have no interest.

That the boundary between the Shires of Buln Buln and Woorayl at present passes through the Township of Korumburra, and is in their opinion the cause of much loss and delay in the matter of road requirements, &c.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that Your Excellency will be pleased to exercise the powers conferred by the 14th section of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and cause that portion of the Shire of Woorayl above described to be severed from the Shire of Woorayl and annexed to the South Riding of the Shire of Buln Buln.

**BRUNSWICK TOWN AND FITZROY CITY.  
PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.**

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, sec. 43), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 41st section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Town of Brunswick described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Town of Brunswick and annexed to the City of Fitzroy.

Area described in petition: Commencing at the intersection of Nicholson-street with the northern boundary line of suburban section 93, parish of Jika Jika, county of Bourke; thence extending northwards along the centre of Nicholson-street to the intersection of the said street with the Glenlyon-road; thence east along the centre of the Glenlyon-road to its intersection with King-street; thence south by the centre of King-street to the northern boundary of the aforesaid section 93; and thence west along the northern boundary of the City of Fitzroy to the commencing point.

Petitioners state that their business relations and interests are more immediately connected with the City of Fitzroy than with the Town of Brunswick, and that the severance will benefit them in every way.

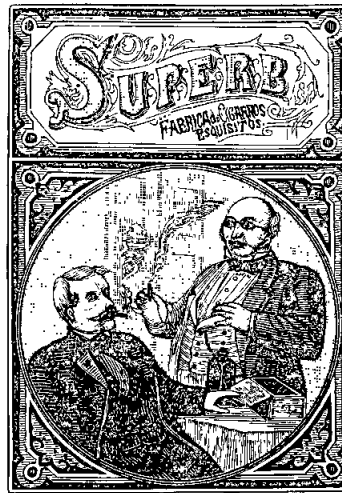

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

7. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

9. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies accompanied by the receipted delivery order. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

13. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. 15. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department, or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. 17. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. 18. 22. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

23. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government will neither claim any decrease upon the contract price nor entertain any application from a contractor for any increase to it.
