# LOWANSHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATIONS.

HERGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by section 75 of the Water Act 1890 (No. 1156)
it is enacted that the Commissioners of any Waterworks
Trust appointed under the said Act may, subject to the approval
of the Governor in Council, make regulations for or relating to
all or any of the subjects mentioned in said section. Now therefore the Chairman and Commissioners of the Lowanshire Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers
and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations
following—

REGULATIONS.

1. The provention and remedying of the waste, unduo consumption, fouling, or contamination of water contained in or supplied from any part of the works within any part of the district or area under the control or management of the said Lowanshire Waterworks Trust.

2. The water and every part of the waterworks within any reserve or within any part of the district or area under the control or management of the said Lowanshire Waterworks Trust, or within any proclaimed urban district under such control or management, shall be protected from trespass and injury of any kind whatsoever.

The penalty for each offence in respect of the hounds.

The penalty for each offence in respect of the breach of any such regulations shall not exceed live pounds, and may be re-covered from any offender in a summary way before any two


