NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR EMPLOYMENT IN THE VICTORIAN MOUNTED POLICE FORCE.

A PPLICATIONS from persons desirous of being employed in the Victorian Mounted Police Force will be received at the Police Depot, Victoria Barracks, St. Kilda-road, Melbourne, on Tuesday, the 12th May, 1891, at Ten o'clock a.m.

Each applicant must present *personally* a written application in his own handwriting, when, if considered suitable, he will be examined by the Board appointed by the Government for the purpose.

As no exceptions to the rule above set forth will be allowed, it will be useless to make application for admittance into the Force in any other manner or place than above prescribed, or than at the duly advertised times.

Candidates must be over twenty and under twenty-five years of age, must be at least five feet seven inches high, must not exceed eleven stone seven pounds in weight, and must be able to ride well.

All candidates must be smart and active, of a strong constitution, and free from any bodily complaint or defect. To ascertain these facts independently, candidates must undergo a strict medical examination.

They must be able to read and write well, and must indispensably produce satisfactory testimonials of character. Those candidates who have served in any other Force or Government Department must also produce their discharge therefrom.

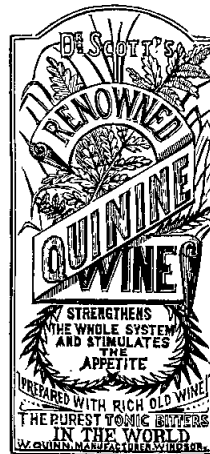

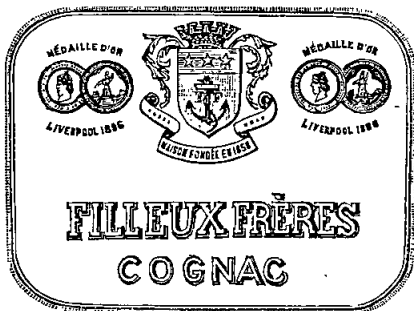

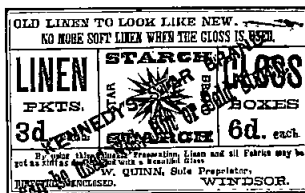

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. XIX. of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid by Order in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of October, 1890, as amended by Order in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of February, 1891, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz.:

XIX.—DRILL AND GYMNASTICS.

1. Allowances, by way of results, will be made to teachers who may be appointed in accordance with the provisions of the *Public Service Act 1890* to give instruction in military drill, subject to the following conditions:—

- That the teacher giving the instruction hold a certificate of qualification from the Department, or have passed in the written work of the examination for such certificate, and have not failed or refused to submit to examination in the art of teaching drill, or have passed an examination in Parts I. and II., Field Exercises, before a military board.
- That every class receiving instruction be taught for not less than one hour per week at the time specified in the school time-table.
- That the pupils exhibit a fair amount of proficiency.

2. The maximum allowance that may be obtained will be as follows:—

Where the Average Attendance at Drill Class is—	First Teacher.	Second Teacher.	Third Teacher.
Under 50	£ 10	£ ..	£ ..
Not less than 50 but under 100	15
" 100 " 150	15	10	..
" 150 " 200	15	15	..

and so on; but teachers of drill will not be appointed to schools with an allotment based upon an average attendance of less than 50 pupils, and only boys in classes above the Second will be included in estimating the attendance by which the number of teachers of drill will be determined.

3. Any qualified teacher of drill may be required by the Department to take charge either of a drill class or (with the approval of the Defence Department) of a cadet detachment in his own school.

4. The payments to a teacher of drill may at any time be discontinued should the allotment be based on an attendance of less than 50 pupils, or should the attendance at the drill class render necessary a reduction in the number of teachers of drill.

5. The maximum allowance to be paid to each teacher of drill will be determined upon examination by an inspector or other officer appointed for the purpose.

6. When gymnastics are taught by a qualified instructor appointed in accordance with the provisions of the *Public Service Act*, an allowance at the rate specified in clause 2 above will be paid, subject to the foregoing regulations respecting military drill, so far as they are applicable.

No. 1106, Part I., section 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations made under the provisions of section 142 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, and bearing date the 4th day of August, 1890, that is to say:—

CHAPTER II.—OF SURVEY.

In the Schedule to Section 35, as altered by Order in Council of the 20th day of April, 1891, the figures and words "1st Class" are hereby substituted for the figures and words "3rd Class" and the figures and words "3rd Class" for the figures and words "1st Class."

SCHEDULE XLVIII.—(CHAP. XIV., s. 17.)

Condition No. 8 is hereby rescinded, and the following is substituted therefor—

8. If the land comprised in this licence is fenced, wholly or partly, the licensee shall post and keep posted at conspicuous places, notices to the effect that the land is licensed under section 67 of the *Land Act 1890* and may be entered upon at any time for mining purposes, and shall also paint in red colour the corner posts and gate posts in connexion with such fencing from one foot from the ground to the top of the posts as a further indication that the land is available to the miner.

The following condition (No. 14) is hereby added—

14. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do, he will be prosecuted according to law.

SCHEDULE LXXX.—(CHAP. XXI., s. 9.)

The following condition (No. 12) is hereby added—

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do, he will be prosecuted according to law.

And the Honorable Allan McLean, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1891.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulations:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at £24 (Twenty-four pounds etc.) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1891.

2. Upon properties of the municipal value of £15 and not more than £23, a rate of One pound and ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at £14 and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be payable.

4. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) from the works of the Trust, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum, otherwise by special agreement.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of two hundred gallons or under, Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stoneworks, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Ten shillings, and a maximum rate of Forty shillings, per annum for persons using a hose for ornamented or garden purposes.

11. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid monthly.

12. Such person or persons as the commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the 20th day of March, 1891.

**BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1891.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1891:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to Seven and a half per cent. (7½%) on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per One thousand (1,000) gallons, or at such price as shall be specially agreed upon.

4. For water supplied to Government departments, police station, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged Two pounds (£2) each per annum.

5. For every public water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be paid.

6. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

7. Overflow waste pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

8. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notices; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified at his own expense provide a meter.

9. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise; and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

10. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

11. Fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

12. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for each offence.

13. The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1891, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1891, and shall be payable in two instalments. The first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1891, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1891.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.
