The births of 1,648 children, viz., 825 boys and 823 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of April. In the month of March, 1,338 births were registered, or 310 less than in the month under review. The births were 537 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 225 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 749, viz., 407 of males and 342 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 899, or 120 per cent. The deaths were less than those in March by 43, but exceeded the average of April during the previous ten years by 101; if, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 120.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.37, and of deaths registered 1.53.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 82.5° on the 6th, and the lowest was 41.0° on the 26th. The mean temperature of the month (57.9°) was one degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32.0°) took place on the 10th. The least range (5.8°) was on the 16th and 21st. The mean daily range was 16.2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.449 inches on the 30th, and the lowest was 29.814 inches on the 21st. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.154 inches) was a twelfth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.41 inches. The average rainfall in April during the previous ten years was 2.00 inches, or two-fifths of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on one day during the month.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 44 per cent. to that mortality, as against 37 per cent. in April, 1890; 41 per cent. in April, 1889; 33 per cent. in April, 1888; 39 per cent. in April, 1887; 41 per cent. in April, 1886; 39 per cent. in April, 1885; 40 per cent. in April, 1884; 33 per cent. in April, 1883; 41 per cent. in April, 1882; and 36 per cent. in April, 1881.

Thirty-five deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month:—Of these, a labourer, aged 75, died of Bright's disease; a widow, also aged 75, of obstruction of the bowels and syncope; a gentleman, aged 76, of dysentery; a housewife, also aged 76, of hepatic cirrhosis; a gentleman, aged 77, of apoplexy; a clerk, aged 77, of pleuro-pneumonia and fatty degeneration of the heart; two females, each aged 78, of diarrhoea; a male, aged 78, of heart disease; a female, aged 79, of bronchitis; a widow, aged 80, of chronic diarrhoea; a female, aged 81, of cerebral paralysis; a gentleman, aged 81, of uræmia; a gentleman, aged 81, of chronic cystitis; a female, aged 82, of cancer of the uterus; a female, aged 82, of apoplexy; a painter, aged 82, of valvular disease of the heart; an accountant, aged 82, of enteritis; a lady, aged 84, of cancer; a shoemaker, aged 84, of apoplexy; a female, aged 84, of valvular disease of the heart; a plumber, aged 87, of old disease of the brain; a lady, aged 89, of chronic enteritis; a lady, aged 93, of fracture of the neck—how caused not stated; a female, aged 75, two females, each aged 76, a housewife, aged 78, a labourer, aged 80, a stonemason, aged 81, a female, aged 82, a gentleman and a widow, each aged 83, a female, aged 85, and a lady, aged 91, of old age.

Thirty-seven violent deaths took place during the month, of which 32 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, 1 to suicide, and 1 to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A compositor, aged 41, and a cook, aged 45, were passed over by railway trains; a traffic superintendent, aged 45, was killed by a locomotive engine; a boy, aged 10, by being passed over by a train car; a carpenter, aged 69, died of fractured and dislocated ribs, caused by being knocked down by a cab; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 40, of a fracture of the ribs, the result of a fall from a cart; a labourer, aged 57, of fracture of the pelvis, consequent on a dray upsetting on him; a coal and wood dealer, aged 47, of rupture of the intestines, the result of a kick from a horse; a storeman, aged 31, was killed in a lift; a bootmaker, aged 26, died of injury to the head, and a carter, aged 30, of fracture of the skull, consequent on falls in the street, the former whilst intoxicated; two labourers, aged 19 and 41 respectively, were killed by a fall of earth; a girl, aged 4, and a boy, aged 3, died of burns, the former by her night-dress having become ignited; a boy, aged 13, died of injuries consequent upon an explosion of gunpowder; four persons were accidentally drowned, viz., a male infant, aged 10 months, at Malvern, a boy, aged 6, whilst bathing in the river Yarra, a dealer, aged 26, in the same river, and a cabinet-maker, aged 58, in the city baths, whilst seized with a fit; two persons were found drowned, viz., a tobacconist, aged 32, in the Bay near Brighton, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 45, in the river Yarra; a female, aged 50, died from an overdose of some narcotic, self-administered to procure sleep, when suffering from derangement of mind; a clerk, aged 61, was suffocated by vomited matter becoming impacted in the air-passages; a female infant, aged eight days, from being overlain by the mother; a female child, aged 17 months, by falling into the loop of a venetian blind cord; a labourer, aged 40, by chloroform, administered during an operation; a male infant, aged 3 days, died of injuries at birth; a male and a female infant, aged 12 and 21 days respectively, of umbilical hæmorrhage; a printer, aged 21, of tetanus, the result of an injury to the foot; and a female, aged 93, of fracture of the neck and thigh, how caused not stated. The deaths classed as homicidal were those of a newly-born female infant, who was strangled; a female, aged 30, who was wounded in the lower part of the abdomen; and a plasterer, aged 27, who was killed by a wall falling on him—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the first two cases, and of manslaughter in the last case. The suicidal death was that of a labourer, aged 41, who shot himself. The case of judicial hanging registered was that of a tram conductor, aged 23, who was executed in the Melbourne Gaol, on the 23rd of the previous month, for murder.

One hundred and forty-eight deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—73 in the Melbourne Hospital, 16 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 9 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Women's Hospital, 12 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Infant Asylum, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 326, of which 163, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 163, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 253 were under one year of age, 40 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 15 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 423. Of these, 244, or 58 per cent., were males, and 179, or 42 per cent., were females; 24 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 31 were between twenty and twenty-five, 36 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 30 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 34 were between fifty-five and sixty, 49 were between sixty and sixty-five, 23 were between sixty-five and seventy, 21 were between seventy and seventy-five, 14 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 21 were upwards of eighty.

In the month under review the mortality from both typhoid fever and diphtheria was not only lower than in the previous month, but very much lower than in the corresponding period of the two preceding years. An increased mortality amongst parturient women occurred during the month, as many as 12 deaths (including 8 from puerperal fever) having been recorded, as against 6 in the preceding month. These were in the proportion of 1 death of a mother to every 137 births registered in April, and 1 such death to every 223 births registered in the previous month.

The large falling-off which took place in the mortality from both typhoid fever and diphtheria in the first four months of 1891, as compared with that which prevailed in the corresponding periods of the two previous years, will be observed by the following statement, which shows the deaths set down to those complaints in each of the first four months of 1891, and of the two previous years:—

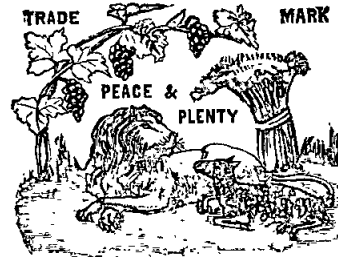

KYABRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1891.

REGULATION No. 8.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1891 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

(1) For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

(2) For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Ten pounds annual value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), Two shillings and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water is supplied by measure, shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, Thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

3. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house-walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

4. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, one-half inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, three-quarter inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

6. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

8. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

9. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

10. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

12. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

13. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Kyabram Waterworks Trust."

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

15. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap, or in any way interfere with, any main the property of the Trust. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be £1.

MURCHISON WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Murchison Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 3.

1. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such persons either by fitting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied: but no such cutting off of the water supply shall exempt the offender from payment of the water-rate during such suspension of the supply, nor from any fine or penalty provided for such offence by the *Water Act 1890* or these regulations.

2. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe or service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

3. Before any such licence shall be granted the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

4. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend, by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with any pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication, except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

6. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise as the said Trust may think fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

7. The Trust may order meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter to be provided, fixed, and maintained at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied will be charged for at the rates provided for in the regulations made by the Trust from time to time in that behalf.

8. Every meter shall be so placed so as to be open to inspection and as far as practicable in a situation where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto.

9. The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence and according to the directions of the Trust's officer, and any disputes between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done or to the exact meaning of this specification and the general conditions, shall be referred to the Trust, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding on all parties.

Timaru Harbor Lights.

THE Timaru Harbor Board notify that, on and after the 1st November, 1891, the following lights will be shown at the Port of Timaru:—

Harbor Light: The Timaru Light-house is 30 feet high, built of wood, and painted white. The light is a fixed white light, of the fifth order dioptric, and will show a green sector 22° (two points) from S.S.W. to S. magnetic as viewed from seaward. It stands 85 feet above the sea level, and, allowing 15 feet for the height of the observer's eye, should be visible in clear weather at a distance of fourteen nautical miles.

Entrance Light to Inner Harbor on End of the Eastern Breakwater: This light will be red, visible in clear weather at a distance of five nautical miles, and viewed from seaward will show from W.N.W. to S.E. magnetic. Its height above high-water mark will be 33 feet.

Entrance Light at End of North Mole: This will be a green light, 16 feet above high-water mark, visible for one mile, and viewed from seaward will show from W.N.W. to S.E. magnetic.

Sailing Directions: Masters of vessels are particularly cautioned that on nearing the port and while laying at anchor they must remain in the white light, and that if compelled to make the inner harbor they must come in on the white light until it bears S.W., and continuing on that bearing until the entrance lights are made out. After making these lights vessels should keep to the northward until the lights open sufficiently to come in, taking care not to open harbor light green. The width of the entrance is 350 feet. The green sector of the harbor light will show over the *Lyttelton* wreck, distant three-quarters of a mile from entrance to inner harbor, and is intended to warn masters of vessels to keep clear of the *Lyttelton* wreck and the *Ninety-mile Beach*. Except in the case of vessels of small tonnage, and of those whose masters are well acquainted with the port, the attempt to enter the inner harbor by night should not be made unless a pilot is in charge. This warning is also rendered necessary as when a vessel is moored at the outer buoy it is in the fairway.

Directions for Anchoring: Vessels of large tonnage, say 800 tons register and over, must not anchor in less than seven fathoms of water, with the flagstaff bearing W.S.W.; but vessels of less tonnage may anchor on the same bearing in less water, but not within a mile of the breakwater.

By-LAW No. 16.

Part I.—Preventing obstructions, &c., to roads and streets, &c., by cattle, &c.

A By-law of the Shire of Bellarine made under section 213 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 16, for the purpose of adopting sections 41, 42, 43, 45 of subdivision 9 of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bellarine order as follows:—

That the following sections 41, 42, 43, 45 of subdivision 9 of Part I. of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:

(9). Obstructions, &c., to streets, &c., by cattle, &c.

41. If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle; and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein and of publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short or if no sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings; and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and the charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.

43. If any goat shall have been impounded under the provisions of either of the two last preceding sections, or under the provisions of this by-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and shall not after the expiration of twenty-four hours be released, and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges be paid by the owner thereof, any justice may by warrant under his hand directed to any constable authorize the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

45. It shall not be lawful to break in any horse or other animal in any street or road, whether public or private, or in any public place save such public places as from time to time may be appointed by some regulation of the council in that behalf, which regulation the council are hereby authorized to make, or by locking the wheels of any cart or other vehicle or otherwise to test or try any horse or other animal, so as to obstruct or injure any street or public place; and any person offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.
