ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased, upon the recommendation of the Public Service Board, to approve of the following alterations in the Regulations made on the 23rd day of December, 1890, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133):—

CHAPTER II.

REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 26 OF THE "TRADE MARKS ACT 1890."

WHEREAS by the *Trade Marks Act 1890* (hereinafter called "the Act"),

After various provisions against the sale, or exposure for sale, or possession for sale, trade, or manufacture of goods with forged trade marks, or false trade descriptions, or trade marks falsely applied to them ;

And after defining (amongst other things) the expression "trade mark" in manner therein set forth ;

And after defining the expression "trade description" as any description, statement, or other indication, direct or indirect, as to number, quantity, measure, gauge, or weight of goods, as to place or country in which any goods were made or produced, as to the mode of manufacturing or producing any goods, or as to the material of which any goods are composed, or as to any goods being the subject of any existing patent, privilege, or copyright ;

And after defining the expressions "false trade description," and "goods," "apply," and "falsely apply ;"

it is provided by section 26 that—

(1) All such goods as above mentioned, and

(2) All goods manufactured at any place outside Victoria bearing any name or trade mark being, or purporting to be, the name or trade mark of any manufacturer, dealer, or trader in Victoria, unless such name or mark be accompanied by definite indication of the country in which such goods were made or produced,

shall be prohibited to be imported, and, subject to the provisions of the said section, shall be included among goods prohibited to be imported as if they were specified in section 49 of the *Customs Act 1890*.

And whereas by section 28 of the Act, after authorizing the continued use of trade descriptions lawfully and generally applied to goods of the particular class, or manufactured by a particular method to indicate such class or method, it is provided that, where such trade description includes the name of a place or country calculated to mislead as to where the goods were actually made or produced, such goods not having been actually made or produced there, the said reciting section should not apply (and, consequently, goods so marked would be prohibited), unless there be added to the trade description, immediately before or after the name of the place or country, in an equally conspicuous manner with that name, the name of the place or country in which the goods were actually made or produced, with a statement that they were made or produced there.

And whereas it is also provided by the said section 26 that the Commissioner of Trade and Customs (hereinafter called the "Commissioner") may from time to time make, revoke, and vary Regulations, either general or special, respecting the detention and forfeiture of goods the importation of which is prohibited as hereinbefore mentioned, and the conditions, if any, to be fulfilled before such detention and forfeiture; and may by such Regulations determine the information, notices, and security to be given, and the evidence requisite for any of the purposes of the said section, and the mode of verification of such evidence.

And it is further provided by the said last-mentioned section—

That before detaining goods or taking proceedings with a view to the forfeiture thereof under the law relating to the Customs, the Commissioner may require that such Regulations as aforesaid shall be complied with, and satisfy himself as to the liability of the goods to forfeiture.

That such Regulations may apply to all goods the importation of which is prohibited by the said section, or different Regulations may be made respecting different classes of such goods.

And also that the Regulations may provide for the informant reimbursing the Commissioner all expenses and damages incurred in respect of any detention made on his information, and of any proceedings consequent on such detention.

Now therefore the Commissioner, under and by virtue of the hereinbefore recited power in that behalf, hereby makes and requires to be complied with the following Regulations, viz.:—

1. Goods prohibited to be imported as hereinbefore recited; having applied to them forged trade marks, false trade descriptions, or marks, names, or descriptions otherwise illegal, which, upon examination, are detected by the Officers of Customs, are to be detained by them without the requirement of previous information.

2. Any person desirous of preventing the importation of any goods to which the provisions of this Act may apply, shall give notice in writing to the Collector or Chief Officer of Customs of the port (or sub-port) of expected importation.

3. Every such person shall, in addition to such notice, give the following information in writing to the proper Officer, viz.:—

(a) The number of packages expected, as far as he is able to state the same ;

(b) The description of the goods, by marks or other particulars, sufficient for their identification ;

(c) The name or other sufficient indication of the importing ship ;

(d) The manner in which the goods infringe the Act ;

(e) The expected day of the arrival of the ship.

He must also deposit with the Collector or other Officer as aforesaid a sum sufficient, in the opinion of that Officer, to cover any additional expense which may be incurred in the examination required by reason of his notice.

4. If upon arrival and examination of the goods the Officer of Customs is satisfied that there is no ground for their detention, they will be delivered. If he is not satisfied, he will decide either to detain the goods, as in a case of detention upon ordinary examination, or to require security from the informant for reimbursing the Commissioner or his Officers all expenses and damages incurred in respect of the detention made on his information, and of any proceedings consequent thereon.

5. The security thus required must be an immediate *ad valorem* deposit of Ten pounds per cent. on the value of the goods, as fixed by the Officer from the quantities or value shown by the entry, and also subsequently a bond, to be completed within four days, in double the value of the goods, with two approved sureties. The *ad valorem* deposit will be returned upon completion of the bond, and will not be required

if, as an alternative, where time permits, the informant prefers to give a like bond, before examination, upon estimated value of the goods declared to by him under statutory declaration. If the security is not duly given as above required, there will be no further detention of the goods.

6. In the above Regulations the words "Officer of Customs" mean an Officer acting under general or special direction of the Commissioner, and the words "value of the goods" mean value irrespective of duty.

7. The "notice" and "bond" required as above shall be in the forms contained in the Schedule to these Regulations, or in such other forms as the Commissioners may from time to time order and direct.

8. The security taken under these Regulations will be given up at the times following, that is to say:—

Where given before examination, and if no detention, forthwith.

Where given on detention:—

If the forfeiture is completed, either by lapse of time or ultimate condemnation by a court of justice, then on such completion of forfeiture.

If the forfeiture is not completed, then—

If the goods are released by the Commissioner, and no action or suit has been commenced against him or any of his Officers in respect of the detention, then at the expiration of three months from the time of detention; or, if the goods are released for failure of proceedings taken for the forfeiture and condemnation thereof upon information under section 207 of the *Customs Act 1890*, and no action or suit has been commenced against the Commissioner or any of his Officers in respect of the detention, then at the expiration of three months from the trial of such information.

If within such periods as aforesaid any such action or suit as aforesaid has been commenced, then upon the ultimate conclusion of such action or suit and the fulfilment of the purpose for which the security was given.

9. These Regulations apply to transshipment and transit goods, as well as to goods landed to be warehoused or for home consumption.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE "CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DUTIES ACT 1890."

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*, I hereby approve of the following Regulations:—

1. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1891, and shall be divided into Parts, as follows:—

Part I.—Warehousing of Spirits.

Part II.—Rectifying and Compounding Spirits.

2. All regulations made by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs under the provisions of the Act 25 Vict. No. 147 shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

PART I.—WAREHOUSING OF SPIRITS.

3. Every bonding warehouse erected on the premises of any distiller, and approved in accordance with the provisions of section 106 of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*, shall be sufficiently safe to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries for the storing of spirits.

4. Such distiller shall give security by bond, with two sufficient sureties to be approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, in the sum of One thousand pounds, for the due and faithful observance of all laws and regulations respecting the distillation, rectifying, compounding, and storing of spirits warehoused in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, for the payment of the full duties on, or duly accounting for, all spirits which may at any time be deposited in such bonding warehouse.

5. No cask or other vessel containing spirits of less capacity than ten imperial gallons shall be deposited in such bonding warehouse, nor shall any cask or other vessel unduly ullaged be lodged therein without the special permission of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries.

6. Spirits contained in any cask or other vessel in such bonding warehouse may be re-packed into casks or other vessels of not less than ten imperial gallons capacity, upon the permission in writing of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries or officer acting on his behalf. All such re-packs shall be made in the presence of the excise officer in charge of such warehouse.

7. Spirits subject to the different rates of duty specified in the 85th section of the said Act shall not be mixed or blended with each other in any part of the distillery premises. Spirits received from any compounding house licensed under the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890* shall not be mixed with spirits in the bonding warehouse referred to in these regulations, nor shall any sweetening, flavouring, colouring, or other matter be added to the spirits in any cask or other vessel placed in such bonding warehouse.

8. Samples of spirits from vessels lodged in such bonding warehouse may be delivered to the distiller under the conditions made or hereafter to be made by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, but any other samples taken by the excise officer on duty from any cask or other vessel for the purpose of ascertaining the strength thereof shall, unless the Chief Inspector of Distilleries otherwise direct, be returned without unnecessary delay to the cask or other vessel from which they have been respectively drawn.

9. All casks or other vessels of spirits lodged in such bonding warehouse shall, at the expense of the distiller, have painted on the outside thereof proper distinguishing marks, consecutive numbers, or brands, and shall be stored to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries or officer acting on his behalf, in such a manner that such marks, numbers, and brands may be readily distinguished. Should any mark, number, or brand on any cask or other vessel in the bonding warehouse have become defective and be likely to lead to a mistake, the distiller shall, without unnecessary delay, have the cask or other vessel re-marked, re-numbered, or re-branded according to the original mark, number, or brand; and no cask or other vessel of which the distinguishing mark, number, or brand has become illegible, shall be delivered until the excise officer on duty has examined the contents, and is satisfied that such cask or other vessel and its contents are those specified in the warrant for its removal.

10. No cask or other vessel having marks, numbers, or brands other than those belonging to the distiller, and the proper bonding mark, number, and tare, shall be admitted into such bonding warehouse.

11. Such bonding warehouse may be kept open for the reception or delivery of spirits between the hours of nine a.m. and five p.m. daily, except on Saturdays, when the hours shall be from nine a.m. till noon. The bonding warehouse shall not be opened on Sundays, nor on proclaimed holidays, unless under special permission in writing by the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, and upon payment for overtime at the rate of three shillings per hour.

12. Officers in charge of bonding warehouses approved under the 106th section of the above-quoted Act, may re-gauge, re-weigh, or re-take strengths of spirits under the following conditions:—

No cask or other vessel containing spirits, except in case of leakage or authorized re-packs, shall be re-gauged, re-weighed, or the strength thereof re-taken for payment of duty until such vessel shall have been at least seven clear days in such bonding warehouse.

A second re-gauge, re-weigh, or re-taking of strengths may be allowed after a period of two months from the first re-gauge, re-weigh, or re-taking of strengths.

A third re-gauge, re-weigh, or re-taking of strengths may be allowed after a period of nine months from the second re-gauge, re-weigh, or re-taking of strengths.

Any subsequent re-gauge, re-weigh, or re-taking of strengths must be specially applied for in writing to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries.

Officers in charge of distilleries may make allowances for *bond fide* waste which they have actually ascertained to have occurred in the bonding warehouse, not exceeding scale.

When the waste exceeds the above authorised scale of allowances the matter must be referred to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries.

PART II.—RECTIFYING AND COMPOUNDING SPIRITS.

13. The building within which rectifying and compounding of spirits is to be carried on shall be called the rectifying and compounding house, and shall be divided into two compartments or rooms, to be called the vat room and the rectifying room respectively.

14. The rectifying and compounding house shall be constructed of stone or brick, and shall be sufficiently safe, to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, for the storing of spirits while being rectified or compounded; and there shall be externally but one doorway leading into the rectifying and compounding house; and internally but one door leading from the rectifying room into the vat room.

15. The vat room shall be ceiled throughout with lath and plaster; the windows or openings for admitting light or air into the rectifying and compounding house shall be safely secured by stout iron bars bolted from inside, and the whole of the windows covered with strong wire netting, securely fastened; and the door shall be of solid construction, provided with secure fastenings to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, and shall have the means of being secured by three locks, of which two shall be furnished and the keys thereof kept by an officer appointed under the above-mentioned Act; and one lock furnished and the key thereof kept by the rectifier. The rectifying room shall be provided with proper fastenings for two locks, one of which shall be provided by the said officer, and the other by the rectifier.

On the external door shall be painted the words, "Rectifying and compounding house," and on the internal door the words, "Vat room."

16. Before any spirits distilled in Victoria, and lodged in any bonded warehouse, shall be delivered without payment of duty for the purpose of being rectified or compounded in bond, the rectifier shall enter into the recognisance required by the 118th section of the Act above mentioned.

17. No spirits shall be received into or discharged from the vat room or rectifying and compounding room except between the hours of nine a.m. and four p.m. on authorized working days except on Saturdays, when the hours shall be from nine a.m. till noon. In cases of emergency the Chief Inspector of Distilleries may, in writing, permit the vat room to be kept open for a longer period each working day on payment for overtime at the rate of three shillings per hour.

18. No spirits shall be admitted into or discharged from the rectifying and compounding house except under the supervision of the excise officer in charge, and unless accompanied by a proper warrant, entry, or permit, showing the liquid and proof quantity in each cask or other vessel; and no spirits on which the duty has been paid shall be mixed in any part of the rectifying and compounding-house with spirits upon which the duty has not been paid.

19. A debit and credit account shall be kept in such manner as the Chief Inspector of Distilleries may direct, showing the quantity of spirits, liquid, and proof quantities received, discharged, wasted, or deficient.

20. The Chief Inspector of Distilleries may authorize the officer in charge of the rectifying and compounding house to take and remove therefrom from time to time such reasonable samples of spirits as may be required for examination or for ascertaining the strength thereof; and no samples shall be taken therefrom except under the special authority of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries.

21. Under no circumstances shall any spirits, except duly authorized samples, be removed from the rectifying and compounding house to any other premises, except the bonding warehouse of the distillery from which the spirits were received.

22. Each vat and receiver in the vat room shall have painted thereon, in a conspicuous place, its distinguishing name and number, shall be placed at least 2 feet above the floor, and securely set in such a manner as the Chief Inspector of Distilleries may direct, and shall not be disturbed without his permission.

23. A statement or gauge, verified by two excise officers, showing the number of liquid gallons and tenths of a gallon at every inch and tenth of an inch from the inside of the bottom of each vat and receiver in the vat room which such vat and receiver is capable of containing, shall be furnished to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries by the rectifier.

24. The manhole door and discharge tap of each vat and receiver shall be furnished, at the expense of the rectifier, with such fastenings and locks as the Chief Inspector of Distilleries may think necessary.

25. For the purpose of ascertaining the liquid contents of each cask filled in the vat room of the compounding house, the rectifier shall provide and keep in good order a correct weighing machine. The tables referred to in the 104th section of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*, and the mode of ascertaining quantity of spirits by weighing therein described, shall be observed when computing the liquid quantity of spirits in each cask or other vessel.

26. The correct number, distinguishing mark, and true tare of each cask or other vessel intended for filling from the vat shall, before being filled, be marked with good paint on the head of each cask or other vessel, and all old brands thereon obliterated.

27. No cask or other vessel of less capacity than ten gallons shall be admitted into the vat room for filling.

28. Casks or other vessels containing sweetened spirits shall, in addition to the ordinary numbers or marks, be legibly marked with good paint, on either head, with the letters "S.S." of not less than two inches long; and all certificates or permits referring to vessels containing spirits sweetened at the compounding house shall have written or stamped on the face thereof, by the excise officer issuing the same, the letters "S.S."

29. No cask or other vessel discharged from the rectifying house shall be opened or re-packed on any portion of the rectifying and compounding premises.

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED BY PERSONS REQUIRING SPIRITS OF WINE FOR MEDICINAL OR MANUFACTURING PURPOSES UNDER SECTION 198 OF THE "LICENSING ACT 1890."

1. Any person requiring spirits of wine for medicinal or manufacturing purposes before six months shall have elapsed from the date of manufacture, shall make application, in writing, for permission to use the same to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and shall specify therein for what purpose he requires such spirits.

2. Before permission can be obtained the applicant must comply with the following conditions, viz.:-

(a) Enter into a bond with two good and sufficient sureties, in the sum of five hundred pounds, that he will only use the spirits of wine so obtained for the purposes specified in his application (and approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs).

(b) That he will keep on his premises a book, to be called "Spirits of wine receipt and delivery book," showing on the Dr. side the date of the receipt of all spirits of wine, and from whom received, in liquid gallons, strength, and proof gallons; and on the Cr. side the date and manner of disposal of such spirits of wine in liquid gallons, strength, and proof gallons; such book to be at all times available for inspection by the Collector of Customs, or such officers as he may appoint.

CITY OF SANDHURST.

BY-LAW NO. 3 UNDER THE "HEALTH ACT 1890."

A By-law of the City of Sandhurst made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 33, and 253 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 3, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet pans, house and yard refuse, and the other matters named therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandhurst make the following by-law:—

1. That By-law No. 2, made by the local board of health under the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and section 10 of part VI. of By-law No. 1 of the City of Sandhurst, made under section 213 of the *Local Government Act 1874*, be and are hereby repealed, except as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the City of Sandhurst.

4. The council may, upon the recommendation of the health officer and the inspector of nuisances, exempt any premises within the City of Sandhurst from the operation of this by-law.

5. That every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause all house or yard refuse to be rendered inoffensive until the same shall be dealt with by the city council; or that every such occupier and person shall cause all rubbish from their respective houses or premises to be placed without delay in covered non-absorbent receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be introduced when necessary.

6. That at least once a week, or so much more frequently as the city council may from time to time direct, the contents of these receptacles be removed, and either rendered inoffensive or removed to a destructor.

7. That every such occupier or person shall keep such receptacles in their yards, and shall not place them in streets or lanes, and they shall be removed and replaced by the scavengers employed by the city council from time to time as often as occasion shall require.

8. That every such occupier or person shall be responsible for the keeping of the receptacles in an inoffensive condition.

9. That the ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be and is hereby abolished.

10. That instead thereof every closet shall be furnished by the city council with a double pan service, and that such pans shall be and remain the property of the city council.

11. That at least once a week, or so much more frequently as the city council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed in the day time in a suitable cart; and that the council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for the said pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

12. That a pan cleansed by superheated steam, or some other equally efficient means approved by the city council, be left in its place.

13. Every closet within the municipality shall consist of a suitable privy building, constructed with proper openings or flues to provide due ventilation. The floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and be provided with requisite means for the application of any earth or some other deodorising material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

14. That the night-soil removed be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the city council, or be trenched or ploughed into land in such locality as may be provided by the city council.

15. That failing the use of a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, the contractor employed by the city council must obtain a receipt from the occupier of the land whereon deposit is made, or from the manager of some approved depot for night-soil, for the number of pans there emptied or delivered.

16. That stringent supervision shall be exercised by the city council over all such depots or places of deposit, and may be inspected by the city council or its officers from time to time.

17. That the proprietor of every such depot or place of deposit shall immediately on receipt of any night-soil or refuse bury the same in properly-constructed trenches to a depth of not less than 1 foot from the surface, and cover the same by a surface of earth of not less than 9 inches, such burial to be to the satisfaction of the health officer of the said city council.

18. The occupier of any land in the City of Sandhurst on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yards, cattle-shed, or pig-stye, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect to cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid the same may be removed by order of the city council at the expense of such occupier.

19. That no such occupier or person shall use a closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorising) other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan and lids in any manner whatsoever.

20. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, cinders, lime, saw-dust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorising night soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorising material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.

21. Every such occupier or persons shall not employ any other persons save those authorized by the city council for the removal of night-soil or other refuse, and no other person shall remove any night-soil or refuse, except in cases of exemption.

22. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, but the justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106, section 205) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind and publish any rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following alteration in the Regulations made under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and bearing date the 4th day of August, 1890, and doth order that such alteration shall have effect on and after the 1st day of July, 1891, that is to say:—

CHAPTER VII.—THE MALLEE BORDER.

Clause 2 is hereby rescinded, and the following is substituted in lieu thereof—

2. The annual rent in respect of an allotment payable in half-yearly moieties shall be at the rate of not less than Ten shillings per square mile, and not more than Eight pounds per square mile, but in no case shall the total annual rent be less than Twenty shillings in respect of any allotment.

And the Honorable Allan McLean, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SHIRE OF YEA.

A By-law of the Shire of Yea made under section 479 of the *Local Government Act 1874* and numbered 4 for establishing, controlling, and managing the Corporation Yards, and carrying out the purposes provided in Part 21 of said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1874*, the President and Councillors of the Shire of Yea order as follows:—

That the yards erected on the site reserved for such yards described in the *Government Gazette* shall be the Yea Corporation Yards, and shall be open every day (Sundays and holidays excepted) from Nine a.m. to Six p.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September, and to Seven p.m. during the rest of the year for the sale of cattle, subject to the payment of such tolls and dues as the council of the shire of Yea may from time to time by special order appoint. That the said council may if it shall think proper, upon applications, license yards and premises within the said shire for the sale of horses, pigs, and cattle, and may at any time revoke and cancel any such licence. That the council may appoint a market inspector and collector, whose duties shall be as follows:—1st. To see that the Market Regulations be observed. 2nd. To demand and receive all market tolls and dues, unless the same have been demised or let to any person or persons and pay same to shire treasurer within 48 hours after receiving same. 3rd. To allot the principal and drafting yards, pens, &c., to the use of the parties bringing stock to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient. 4th. To preserve order and to take proceedings against all persons causing a riot or disturbance, offending against decency, or in any manner or way provoking a breach of the peace within the precincts of the yards or market. 5th. That every person who shall obstruct the inspector or his assistants in the performance of his or their duty, or shall release any stock from the market or yards, or shall remove the same from one part of the market or yards, without the authority of the inspector, or shall wilfully damage any of the gates, fences, or premises of the market or yards, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and in addition thereto shall pay the cost of repairing or making good any such damage. That any person who shall be found drunk or abusive language, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2). That the person or persons placing stock in the yards for sale shall be responsible for all yard-marks, dues, and tolls accruing thereon, and in no case shall any cattle be taken out of the yards until all dues, tolls, and charges payable thereon under this by-law shall have been first fully paid and satisfied. That all cattle brought to the yards for sale shall be yarded and removed by the time before specified for the yarding and removing of cattle. That sales of cattle by auction in the market shall take place in order of priority, to be determined in such manner as the said council shall from time direct, and no auctioneer shall be entitled without the consent of the other auctioneers present to occupy the rostrum for a longer period than one hour at a time, but shall then, if required, give place to the next entitled to procedure, and any auctioneer failing to comply with this provision shall be deemed guilty of obstructing the inspector in the performance of his duties. That the following tolls and dues shall be payable by every person exposing or offering for sale, or selling any cattle in the said market, viz:—

Upon every horse, mare, or foal	6d.
Upon every sheep or lamb	4d.
Upon every bull, bullock, cow, heifer, steer, or calf	2d.
Upon every pig or goat	3d.

That the word cattle in this by-law shall include horses, mares, fillies, foals, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, sheep, lambs, goats, and swine.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda order as follows, viz., that it hereby adopts and confirms section 3, subdivision 2, part 1 of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1890*, that is to say:—

1. The owners or occupiers of houses or buildings in the streets hereunder mentioned, and such other streets as may from time to time be fixed by the council, shall mark such houses or buildings with such numbers and names for the purpose of distinguishing same as the council may direct or approve, and shall renew the numbers or names of such houses or buildings as often as they are removed, obliterated, or defaced.

2. And if any owner or occupier of any such house or building neglect for one week after notice from the council to mark such house or building with such number or name as the council may direct or approve, or to renew the number or name thereof as aforesaid, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings, and the council may cause such number or name to be so marked or renewed, and recover the expense thereof from the owner or occupier of such house or building before any justice.
