Public Service Act 1890, Section 136.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 136 of the *Public Service Act 1890*, the Public Service Board hereby fixes the amount of the sum to be deducted from the salary of any officer as rent for the use, for the purpose of residence, of any building belonging to the Government, at one-sixth portion of such officer's salary or wage, except in the cases of officers employed in the Penal and Gaols and in the Hospitals for the Insane Branches of the Chief Secretary's Department, and as Lighthouse-keepers or Assistant Lighthouse-keepers, in the Department of Trade and Customs. In these excepted cases the Board fixes the amount to be deducted as rent for the use, for the purpose of residence, of any building belonging to the Government, at one-eighth portion of such officer's salary or wage.

The above fixture is to apply only when the estimated annual value of any building occupied by any such officer for residence as aforesaid shall exceed the proportionate amount of his salary or wage above described.

No. 1106, Part I., section 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind Schedule IX. to the Regulations made under the provisions of section 142 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, and bearing date the 4th day of August, 1890, and doth order that the following shall be and be deemed to be Schedule IX. to the said Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

Lease under Section 32 of the "Land Act 1890."

THIS INDENTURE made the first day of _____ in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-_____ between His Excellency _____ Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies in the name and on behalf of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria of the one part and _____ of _____ in the colony of Victoria (hereinafter called the "Lessee") of the other part.

Whereas the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council has agreed to grant this lease of the grazing area hereinafter described for the term of _____ years and _____ calendar months less three days at the annual rent of _____ being the rent fixed and reserved in accordance with the provisions of the 37th section of the *Land Act 1890* to the lessee who is entitled thereto under the provisions of the said Act and the lessee has paid half a year's rent in advance And whereas the Governor with the advice aforesaid has approved of and directed the conditions and provisions hereinafter contained to be inserted in this lease framed in accordance with the regulations made in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act Now this Indenture witnesseth that in consideration of such payment aforesaid and of the rent hereby reserved and of the covenants by the lessee hereinafter contained Her Majesty doth by these presents grant and demise unto the lessee his executors administrators and assigns all that grazing area situate in the parish of _____ county of _____ in the colony of Victoria containing _____ acres more or less and delineated on the plan prepared in accordance with the provisions of the 30th section of the said Act and thereon numbered _____ in the said parish and also delineated on the plan drawn in the margin of these presents and therein coloured yellow together with the appurtenances excepting and reserving unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors all gold and silver and auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone and all copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals whatsoever and all mines seams veins lodes and deposits containing gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals in upon and under the said demised premises together with liberty for Her Majesty her heirs and successors and her and their agents servants lessees licensees and assigns at any time or times during the said term to enter upon the said land and to search and mine therein for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals or to remove therefrom any gold silver auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and for the purposes aforesaid to sink shafts make drives and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining And also excepting and reserving to Her Majesty her heirs and successors and each and every other lessee of any grazing area and the holder of a miner's right or of a gold mining or mineral lease and her heirs and their agents and servants tenants and workmen liberty and right of ingress egress and regress at all times through over and across the premises hereby demised with or without horses cattle and other animals carts waggons and carriages to or from such grazing area or part thereof or to or from any claim or mine from and to any public road or track subject to such regulation to be made by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council as may for the time being be in force And also excepting and reserving unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors and all persons duly licensed under section 99 of the *Land Act 1890* to cut and take away any live or dead timber on Crown lands and all persons specially licensed in that behalf by the Governor in Council full and free liberty at all times to enter upon the said demised lands and therefrom to cut and take away live or dead timber To have and to hold the premises hereinafter expressed to be hereby demised unto the lessee his executors administrators and assigns for the term of _____ years and _____ calendar months less three days from the day of the date hereof Yielding and paying therefor during the said term the yearly rent of _____ by two equal half-yearly payments in advance on the first day of _____ and the first day of _____ in every year clear of all deductions the first of the said half-yearly payments having been made as aforesaid the next

NOTE.—The lengths of the said half-yearly payments to be made on the boundaries of the first day of next and the last of the said half-yearly payments to be made on the first day of next preceding the expiration of the said term. And the lessee doth hereby for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns covenant with Her Majesty her heirs and successors that he the lessee his executors administrators and assigns will during the said term pay the said rent hereinbefore reserved in advance at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions. And also will during the said term pay all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time being payable either by landlord or tenant in respect of the said premises. And also will not assign sublet subdivide or part with the possession of the land hereby demised or any portion thereof without the previous consent of the Board of Land and Works signified in writing. And also will at once after the granting of this lease to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works commence and continue to destroy and will within three years after the granting of this lease have destroyed to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works the animals and birds by the said Act included in the term "vermin" or which the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to be vermin for the purposes of the said Act upon such land and will keep the same free of such animals and birds Bathurst burr wild briar and gorse to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works during the currency of this lease. And also will repair and keep in good condition and repair during the continuance of the term hereby granted all houses fences wells reservoirs tanks dams and all substantial and permanent improvements situated on the premises hereby demised whether made erected or constructed by the said lessee his executors administrators or assigns or not reasonable wear and tear and damage by fire storm and tempest alone excepted and that the lessee his executors administrators or assigns will not remove fill up or render useless or cause to be removed filled up or rendered useless any of the same without first obtaining the permission of the Board of Land and Works signified in writing. And also will not during the continuance of the term hereby granted ring or destroy or except for the purpose of fencing or building or domestic use on the land hereby demised cut down any timber in or upon the land hereby demised unless with the sanction of the Board of Land and Works signified in writing and then only under the supervision of an officer appointed in that behalf by the said Board. And also will if not sooner called upon under the provisions of the *Fences Act 1890* within three years from the date of these presents enclose the land hereby demised with a fence of such kind as shall come within the meaning aforesaid and keep the same in repair during the continuance of the term hereby granted. And also will at the expiration or sooner determination of the said term hereby granted peaceably deliver up to Her Majesty her heirs or successors the premises hereby demised together with all houses fences wells reservoirs tanks dams and all improvements that now are or may be made erected or constructed thereon in such good or sufficient repair and condition as aforesaid and in all respects in such state and condition as shall be consistent with the due performance of the several covenants hereinbefore contained. And also will permit any person appointed in that behalf by the Board of Land and Works at any time to enter upon the premises hereby demised to ascertain if the conditions and covenants of this lease are being performed by the lessee. And also that every holder of a miner's right or of a gold mining or mineral lease shall have the right and be allowed by the lessee his executors administrators and assigns to enter upon the area hereby demised and search for gold silver copper tin antimony or any other metals and minerals and to mine thereon and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery without making any compensation to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns for surface or other damage. And also that these presents shall become absolutely void on any assignment thereof save under the provisions of the *Land Act 1890*. Provided always and it is hereby agreed and declared that Her Majesty her heirs and successors may at any time and from time to time during the said term resume possession of any part or parts of the land hereby demised which may in the opinion of the Governor with the advice aforesaid be required for the purposes of water supply irrigation works races dams and ditches or for public railways roads canals or for tramways or other internal communication through such lands or for mining purposes or for the purpose of obtaining or removing therefrom guano or other manure stone or earth or for sites of inns stores smithies bakeries or similar buildings or of bathing-houses bathing-places fishermen's residences drying grounds fellmongering establishments slaughter-houses lims-kilns bridges ferries toll or punt houses tanneries factories saw or paper mills quays docks landing-places or the deposit of materials ship-building and repairing boat-building and repairing or for the working of mineral springs or for the manufacture of salt or for the purpose of erecting pumps or for the purpose of cutting digging and taking away any live or dead timber gravel stone ballast limestone salt shell seaweed and loam brick or other earth upon payment to the lessee or his executors administrators or assigns for his interest in such lease together with the value of houses fences (within the meaning aforesaid) wells reservoirs tanks dams and of all substantial and permanent improvements made erected or constructed by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns during the currency of this lease on the land resumed. Provided always that the sum paid in respect of such improvements by the Board of Land and Works shall not exceed the sum expended thereon by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns. And that such sum shall be determined in accordance with regulations in that behalf made by the Governor with the advice aforesaid. And that the compensation to be paid to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns in respect of his interest in this lease shall be determined in manner provided by the *Lands Compensation Act 1890* or any Act amending the same. Provided always and it is hereby also agreed and declared that Her

Majesty her heirs and successors may at any time and from time to time during the term hereby granted in accordance with the regulations to be made by the Governor with the advice aforesaid in that behalf resume as sites for townships or villages or for mining purposes and re-enter upon any lands forming part of the land hereby demised upon payment to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns of the full value of all houses fences (within the meaning aforesaid) wells reservoirs tanks dams and of all substantial and permanent improvements made erected or constructed by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns on the lands so resumed but nothing in this lease contained shall be construed to give a better tenure to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns in regard to the right of miners authorized by the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Land Act 1890* or Part I. Division 3 thereof subject to any conditions he may think fit to impose to enter upon any portion specified by the said Minister of the land hereby demised in search of gold than was possessed by pastoral tenants under *The Land Act 1869* with regard to the right of miners to enter upon the lands occupied by such pastoral tenants. Provided always and it is hereby expressly agreed and declared that neither of the preceding provisions shall prejudice or be construed as restricting the generality of the covenant on the part of the lessee hereinbefore contained conferring on the holder of a miner's right or of a gold mining or mineral lease the right to enter upon the demised land and exercise the other rights in such covenant mentioned. And in case of any land being required to be resumed for mining purposes the Governor with the advice aforesaid shall determine and have the election whether it shall be resumed under the provisions of the 68th section of the said Act or under the provisions hereinbefore contained and if so under which of the provisions hereinbefore contained it shall be so resumed or taken. And it is hereby declared that in case possession of any part or parts of the said land shall be resumed as aforesaid the covenants provisions and agreements herein contained with reference to the whole of the premises shall continue in force and apply to such part of the same as shall be left in the possession of the lessee his executors administrators or assigns aforesaid. Provided always and it is hereby also agreed and declared that the term hereby granted may be determined by Her Majesty her heirs or successors at any time by not less than three years' previous notice in writing of such intention addressed to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns being served upon him or them or left upon and part of the lands comprised in this lease and published in three consecutive ordinary numbers of the *Government Gazette* and upon payment to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns for his interest in this lease together with the value of houses fences (within the meaning aforesaid) wells reservoirs tanks dams and of all substantial and permanent improvements made erected or constructed by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns prior to the date of such notice and during the currency of this lease on the land so resumed provided that the sum paid in respect of such improvements by the Board of Land and Works shall not exceed the sum expended thereon by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns and that such sum shall be determined in accordance with the regulations aforesaid and that the compensation to be paid to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns in respect of his or their interest in the lease shall be determined in manner provided by the *Lands Compensation Act 1890* or any Act amending the same. Provided always and it is hereby agreed and declared and these presents are upon this condition that in the event of the lessee his executors administrators or assigns becoming the licensee or licensee of any portions of the land hereby demised as an agricultural allotment and his or their licence thereafter being annulled for any breach of the provisions of the *Land Act 1890* or of the conditions of such licence or if and whenever there shall be a breach of or non-compliance with any of the covenants by the lessee herein contained and the Governor with the advice aforesaid shall determine that this lease shall in consequence be avoided (and the production of the minute of the proceedings of the Executive Council whereat such determination was arrived at shall be conclusive evidence thereof) or if the land hereby demised or any part thereof is assigned whether by operation of law or otherwise except as hereinbefore mentioned or as in the *Land Act 1890* otherwise expressly provided then these presents and the term hereby created shall be void and of no effect. And immediately thereupon it shall be lawful for any bailiffs of Crown lands or for any other agents or officers authorized in that behalf by Her Majesty or by the Governor with the advice aforesaid without any demand whatsoever to enter upon the land hereby demised and the lessee his executors administrators and assigns and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case Her Majesty had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of ment for recovery of possession of the said land or in an action for the recovery of land and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or writ of possession or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law. THE Commissioners of the Boort Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

NO. 1. REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS AT MEETINGS OF THE BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall be signed by the chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.
- (xi.) Reading of rough minutes (if required).

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

5. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or delivered to him at his office personally or by post, provided that he receive them at least four days before the meeting at which they are to be proposed; and such secretary shall number and enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

6. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating any subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

7. *Petitions.*—No motion except that for receiving same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

8. *Motions to be moved in order in the motion book.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, or they may be postponed by vote of the Trust, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

9. *Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

10. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

11. *Orders, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

12. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

13. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

14. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

15. *Mover of motion.*—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

16. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners in meeting of the Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

17. *Priority of commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

18. *Chairman to rise in addressing the Trust.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

19. *Commissioner not to speak a second time on the same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

20. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final, except when an appeal is made to the Trust immediately upon the chairman giving his decision. On such an appeal no commissioner shall speak more than once, and the question shall be put thus:—"Shall the decision of the chair be maintained?"

21. *Commissioners not to digress, &c.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

22. *Commissioner to apologize for disorderly, &c., expressions.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

23. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

24. *Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

25. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

26. *Committees of the whole.*—Whenever a majority of the Trust determine, any matter before the Trust may be referred to a committee of the whole for consideration and report to the Trust, and such report may be received and adopted, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit. When the Trust resolves itself into a committee of the whole, the public shall be ordered to withdraw by the chairman, and the doors shall be closed, unless a majority of the committee determine otherwise.

27. *Commissioners not attending order for call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for call of the Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

28. *Commissioner may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any documents of the whole Trust applying to the question under discussion, and he may, at any time during business hours, require the officers of the Trust to produce for his inspection or examination any books or documents belonging to the Trust; but such books or documents shall not be removed from the offices without the permission of the chairman, and then only for short and limited periods.

29. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by a show of hands, and any commissioner present and not voting, and not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation. Divisions shall be taken upon any question submitted to the vote of the Trust, provided any commissioner demand it, before the next business has been proceeded with. When division is taken, the secretary shall call the names of those commissioners who are present, and enter in his minute book how each vote, whether affirmatively or negatively, and the result shall be declared by the chairman.

30. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the results thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. *Amendments.*—(1) No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of. (2) An amendment destroying or altering the intention of a motion shall be in order, but an amendment relating to a different subject shall not be in order. (3) On an amendment to "strike out and insert," the paragraph to be amended shall first be read as it stands, then the words proposed to be struck out and inserted, and, finally, the paragraph as it would stand if so amended.

33. *Effect of rejection of original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second amendment may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

35. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner, with the above exception, shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. *Adjournment.*—(1) No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made. (2) A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, except—1st, when a commissioner is in possession of the floor; 2nd, when the commissioners are voting; 3rd, when adjournment was the last preceding motion; 4th, when it has been decided that the previous question shall be taken. (3) A motion simply to adjourn cannot be amended, but a motion to adjourn may be and is open to debate.

37. *Protests.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. *Explanations.*—While a member is speaking no one shall interrupt, except for the purpose of calling to order or asking of the chairman leave to explain or to call the previous question. A commissioner allowed to explain shall only have the right to explain an actual misunderstanding of language and shall be strictly prohibited from going into debate on the merits of the case.

40. *Privileged questions.*—(1) When a question is before the Trust the only motion in order shall be—1st, to adjourn; 2nd, the previous question; 3rd, to lay on the table; 4th, to postpone indefinitely; 5th, to postpone to a definite period; 6th, to refer; 7th, to divide if the sense will permit of it; 8th, to amend; to take precedence as herein arranged, and the first three to be decided without debate. (2) When the previous question is moved and seconded it shall be put in this form—"Shall the main question now be put?" If this is carried all further amendments and debates shall be excluded and the question be put without delay. If the question has been amended the question shall be taken on the amendment first. It shall not be in order to reconsider the agreement to take the previous question. (3) When a motion and amendment are under discussion it will be in order for any member to give notice of another amendment which he intends to move in the event of the amendment being lost. Upon such notice no debate will be allowed at that stage. (4) When a motion is postponed indefinitely it shall not come up again during that meeting.

41. *Resolutions, how revoked or altered.*—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice of the intention to propose such resolution or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

42. *Special meetings.*—The Trust may hold special meetings, and the chairman or any three or more of the commissioners may call a special meeting, but no such meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given.

43. *Notices of meetings.*—All notices of any meeting or adjourned meeting of the Trust shall be in writing, and shall be delivered or sent by the post or otherwise to the place of abode or place of business of each of the commissioners two clear days at least previous to such meeting; and every such notice shall specify the time of meeting; and in case of a special meeting shall specify the object thereof; and no business shall be transacted at any special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

44. *Power to suspend officers.*—The Trust may, at any ordinary or special meeting, resolve that a special meeting be called to consider the removal from his office of any officer appointed by the Trust, and may direct that notice of such special meeting be given, and thereupon may suspend such officer from his office pending the holding of such meeting, and may appoint some other person to perform the duties of such office in the meanwhile.

45. *Committees of trust and quorum.*—The Trust may from time to time, as they may see fit, appoint occasional or standing committees, and may fix the quorum of every such committee, and every such committee shall appoint one of the commissioners thereof to be chairman of such committee; and the Trust may from time to time continue, alter, or discontinue such committee, and such committee may from time to time remove such chairman; and every such committee shall report to the Trust. The chairman of the Trust shall be *ex officio* member of all committees, and shall preside at all meetings at which he is present.

46. *Meetings, chairman, &c. of committee.*—Every committee so appointed may meet from time to time, and may adjourn from place to place as they may think proper, but no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the committee unless the quorum of members (if any) fixed by the Trust, and, if no quorum be fixed, three members be present; and at all meetings of the committee, if the chairman be not present, one of the commissioners present shall be appointed chairman; and all questions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the commissioners present, and, in case of an equal division of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the committee.

47. *Seal.*—The seal of the Trust shall be in the custody of the secretary, and shall not be impressed except by direction of the Trust, and in the presence of at least three commissioners.

48. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

49. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the committee.

50. *Meetings of committees.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

51. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

52. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

53. *Commissioners to affix their names.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

54. *Petition to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof; and the petition shall be prepared in a way similar to that adopted with regard to petitions presented to Parliament.

55. *To be signed by the petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

56. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

57. *No letters or memorials to be dealt with.*—No letters or memorials shall be dealt with at any meeting of the commissioners unless received at the offices of the Trust, or the office of the chairman, not later than the day preceding the day of meeting.

58. *Deputations to signify intention.*—Deputations can only be received by the Trust when they have signified their intention of waiting upon the Trust, and stated their object at least one day beforehand.

59. *Letters or memorials returned for amendment.*—When letters or memorials do not accurately indicate the localities by giving the number of the allotment, and section, and name of the parish, or other technical description, it shall be in order to return the documents for amendment.

60. *Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

61. *Appointment, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the irrigation district, and such other newspapers, if any, as the Trust may determine, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

62. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall, in all cases, be fixed, before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, by advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement, except when the Trust by special resolution, which may be moved without notice, orders otherwise.

63. *No commissioner, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No commissioner or officer of the Trust, and no assessor or auditor of the Trust, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Trust, or for any work to be done for the Trust.

64. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

65. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules and regulations contained herein may be suspended for a special purpose on motion, upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by a unanimous vote of the Trust.

66. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation, he or she shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing Regulation, number one, was made by the Commissioners of the Boort Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the *Water Act 1890*, this 26th day of May, 1891.

Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
5. No person shall be permitted to discharge firearms within the reserve unless the written permission of the committee of management be first obtained.

BY-LAW No. 21, FOR SUPPRESSING "NUISANCES OF VARIOUS KINDS."

A By-law of the Shire of Coburg, made under Section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, for the purpose of adopting Sections 1 to 8 (inclusive) of Part VIII. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the provisions conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Coburg order as follows:—

That Sections 1 to 8 (inclusive) of Subdivision 1, Part VIII. of the *Local Government Act* be adopted, viz.—

(1.) Nuisances of Various Kinds.

1. Every owner or keeper of any goat usually kept within the municipal district shall register with the municipal clerk his name and address as a keeper of goats, and shall at the time of such registration pay to such clerk the sum of Sixpence, and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a collar bearing the name and address so registered; and if any person, without lawful excuse, offend in any respect against this section he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

2. If any goat be found having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall, *prima facie*, be presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

3. The council from time to time shall provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purposes of this subdivision, and forthwith, when any such enclosure has been provided, shall notify the same and the situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood.

4. Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place may, by the proper officer of the council, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

5. Whenever a goat having on the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the municipal district registered as aforesaid is seized hereunder, the proper officer of the council shall forthwith cause notice of such seizure to be given to such person, or left at the place of such address.

6. Subject to the provisions hereinafter in this by-law contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid which has not upon the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid, may by the proper officer of the council be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure, and every such goat which has on the neck such a collar as aforesaid may by the said officer be destroyed at or after noon of the day following next but one the day of such seizure.

7. The owner of any goat which has been seized as aforesaid may apply *ex parte* to any justice that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if a justice shall so order and not otherwise, be, unless the same has been destroyed, restored to such owner accordingly, and such order of a justice or any minute thereof under the hand of such justice shall for all purposes of this subdivision be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

8. The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place, whether such goat be destroyed or not, or be restored or not, shall forfeit and pay a penalty of Five shillings.

The foregoing By-law was adopted by the Council of the Shire of Coburg on the 11th day of May, 1891, and confirmed on the 6th day of July, 1891.
