MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.
REGULATION No. 11.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz. :—

REGULATION No. 11.
General Conditions.

1. That Regulation No. 7 of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust be repealed, and the same is hereby repealed.
2. The Trust shall not be liable to any penalty or damages for not supplying water if the want of such supply arises from unavoidable cause or accident.
3. Every person who shall have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Trust, and in the event of any repairs thereto being required, notice, in writing, shall be immediately given by such person to the Trust. If any person who has provided any meter as aforesaid shall fail to give the notice hereinbefore mentioned of any repairs required for such meter, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
4. If any person who, under the provisions herein contained or under the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, ought to provide any meter neglect or refuse, after having been required by the Trust so to do, to provide such meter, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day during which such neglect or refusal continues.
5. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same shall be capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons and unless the same is approved, in writing, by the duly authorized officer of the Trust. If any meter should cease registering, or be found or reported to be out of repair or registering incorrectly, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it shall have been repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous half-year or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.
6. No person shall remove or alter the position of any meter when fixed without the written consent of the duly authorized officer of the Trust.
7. Every meter shall be placed according to the direction of the duly authorized officer of the Trust, and so as to be open to inspection at all times, and as far as practicable, in a situation where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto. A meter shall not be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe or other pipe of the Trust unless permitted by a memorandum, in writing, under the hand of a duly authorized officer of the Trust. A meter shall not continue to be used if it is found, on being tested by the Trust's officer, to be inaccurate.
8. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order, after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.
9. If any plumber fix or refix any meter upon any premises supplied with water by the Trust without having first obtained a certificate from the Trust that the said meter has been examined and found in correct working condition, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
10. If any person remove or alter the position of, or in any way interfere with, any meter without giving six days' notice, in writing, to the Trust, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds over and above the damage which he may be found liable to pay in any action at law at the suit of the Trust, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.
11. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them be allowed, in writing, by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.
12. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for livery or carriers' stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation, or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purposes; and the supply of water for other than domestic purposes solely shall in all cases be by measure, unless by the special consent of the Trust. The Trust may supply any person with water for domestic or for other than domestic purposes by measure, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.
13. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One pound, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty not exceeding One pound for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.
14. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipes, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
15. Licences to affix, and lay on, alter, or repair service-pipes, to tap mains and sub-mains, and to do and execute generally the plumbing and other work necessary for laying on and maintaining water services, may be granted to persons who shall satisfy the Trust of their competency to perform such plumbing and other work upon payment of an annual fee of One pound.
16. It shall not be compulsory on the Trust to grant a licence to every or any applicant who shall prove his competency.
17. In all and every case a licensee shall be responsible for the acts of himself and his employes, and the Trust shall have the power to cancel the licence of any person at any time should a breach of these regulations be committed.
18. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty not exceeding One pound for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.
19. Applications to tap mains and sub-mains must in every case be accompanied by the proportion of rate due from time of tapping to the 30th of June or the 31st December of one year, as required.
20. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the Trust.
21. Wrought galvanized iron or lead piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services; ordinary connexions with mains and sub-mains must be made with approved brass stop-cock ferrules, all connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with approved brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be wiped joints, and in no

case will bolt or copper bit joints be allowed, either in the interior or exterior of any building. One service-pipe only to each house, tenement, or land will be permitted, unless by the special consent of the Trust.

22. No service-pipe of a larger bore than half-an-inch will be permitted, unless by the special consent of the Trust.

23. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the said Trust may deem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier (if any) and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty not exceeding One pound for each day such offence is continued after notice thereof from the Trust.

24. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing such offence, to a further penalty not exceeding One pound for each day the offence is continued after notice thereof from the Trust.

25. To prevent overflow all water troughs and cisterns must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, which shall at all times be maintained in good working order.

26. All boilers or hot-water apparatus must be supplied from cisterns, as in no case will they be permitted to be fed directly from the pipes of the Trust.

27. In every bath the inlet must be distinct from and unconnected with the outlet, and the inlet pipes must be visible and accessible, and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and such bath shall be provided with a proper well-fitted and perfectly water-tight ground outlet, plug, or cock. Overflow pipes to private baths or other vessels will not be permitted except where the supply is taken by measure.

28. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

29. Any officer appointed by the Trust for the purpose may, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

30. Any officer appointed by the Trust for the purpose may, between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, enter into any house or premises supplied with water by the Trust, in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if such officer at any such time be refused admittance into such dwelling-house or premises for the purpose aforesaid, or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises.

31. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this regulation, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which, under this regulation, ought to be done, or wrongfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied; but no such cutting off of the water supply shall exempt the offender from payment of the water rate during such suspension of the supply, nor from any fine or penalty provided for such offence by the *Water Act 1890* or these regulations.

32. The following regulations shall be observed by all persons in connexion with the supplying and laying of services, and the necessary fittings:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, or other fittings shall be sound and free from all defects, and all ends of pipes, tees, bends, or other fittings shall be properly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, pipes, bends, or other fittings; all delivery cocks shall be high pressure, and of the best quality in workmanship; all jointing between pipes, thimbles, bends, couplings, elbows, meters, and cocks shall be made with red lead and flux.

(2) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground of less than 10 inches. After service-pipes have been laid, the trench or trenches shall be properly filled in and thoroughly rammed, and any subsidence therein which may appear within three months shall be immediately made good by the owner or occupier of the premises supplied by such service-pipe. No trench made for the purpose of receiving, altering, repairing, or extending a service-pipe shall be left open after sunset.

(3) Every person previous to being licensed to lay services shall deposit with the Trust Secretary the sum of Two pounds sterling as security for the strict observance and performance of the regulations and conditions contained in

this regulation, and, in the case of the non-observance or non-performance of any such stipulations and conditions at any time by such licensed person, the Trust shall be entitled to declare his deposit absolutely forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become and be absolutely forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such persons shall at once be struck off the roll of licensed plumbers. On the surrender of licence to the Trust, the Two pounds deposit (if not forfeited) shall be refunded.

(4) No private services whatsoever shall be laid or extension made by any licensed person, unless he has ascertained at the Trust's office that the person for whom such work is intended has received the consent of the proper officers of the Trust to have such work executed.

(5) Within 24 hours after the completion of each service the licensed person by whom such service shall have been laid shall report at the office of the Trust the completion of such service.

(6) If at any time any such licensed person wilfully acts contrary to any of the provisions of this regulation, either by himself or his workmen, or refuses to communicate any needful and proper information required of him in regard to any work connected with the works of the Trust done by him or his workmen, or under his superintendence, or upon his responsibility, his name may be erased by the Trust from the licensed plumbers.

(7) Each licensed person shall be held responsible for any injury occasioned by him or his workmen to the streets and mains, or any property of the Trust, or to private services already laid and connected with the Trust's water supply; and full compensation for such injury, including cost of all repairs necessitated thereby, shall be paid by such licensed person to the Trust within 24 hours of the time such injury was occasioned.

In the construction of this regulation, the word "Trust" shall mean the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, and the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole; and wherever the word "officer" appears the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

The above regulation was passed by the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust on the 25th day of June, 1891, under and by virtue of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and the corporate seal of the Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

All items to sample.

All material to be dyed in the wool, and no piece-dyed goods will be accepted.

The blue tartan is to be indigo dyed, and the scarlet tartan cochineal dyed.

Trade system of measurement will be followed, viz., 36 inches to the yard, with the thumb measurement given in.

All cloth must be supplied at the rate of 100 yards per week, except Khaki tweed, which must be supplied at the rate of 300 yards per week, if required.

Should any portion of a delivery be found to be inferior to the samples either in weight, strength, quality, colour, or texture, the whole delivery may be rejected.

BIRCHIP CEMETERY.—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. The rules and regulations, numbered 1 to 13, shall be the rules and regulations of the Birchip Cemetery.
2. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.
3. Application for permission to make a vault or grave, or to erect a tombstone or monument, must be made at the office of the trustees, and if approved a certificate will be granted on payment of the proper charges.
4. Orders for interments are to be given at the office of the trustees, and notice must be given between the hours of Eight a.m. and Six p.m. on the previous day.
5. Every grave shall be 6 feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults, unless the grave be of greater depth or extra width, shall be interred in each, two infants being considered equal to an adult.
6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug if requested, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault will be required to construct it under the direction of the trustees. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the person entitled thereto must be left with the order.
7. The name, age, and late place of residence of the deceased must be stated at the time of applying for order; and no order will be granted until a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been produced.
8. The time fixed for the funeral shall be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
9. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours for burials shall be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. during the other four months.
10. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of, the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
11. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.
12. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office and may be inspected. Registers of all graves are kept by the secretary.
13. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in their charges and regulations, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year:—

- For every horse, Sixteen shillings per annum.
- For every head of other large cattle, Ten shillings per annum.
- For every sheep, Five shillings per annum.
- For every goat, Four shillings per annum.
- Progeny under the age of six (6) months of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

Owners of all stock placed on the common during the currency of a quarter shall pay the full fee prescribed.

4. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

5. The managers of the common shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to stock depasturing on the common.

6. Every person claiming to depasture stock on the common shall, if required, furnish a statement showing that he is legally entitled to commonage, and setting forth the extent of land (if any) occupied by him and the proportion thereof (if any) under cultivation.

7. The herdsman shall attend at the common yards, or other convenient place appointed by the managers of which due notice shall be given, on every Tuesday between Ten o'clock a.m. and Three o'clock p.m., to receive stock; and every person desiring to depasture stock on the common shall deliver them to the herdsman, together with a written memorandum of the number, brands, and description of such stock; and showing the total amount of fees payable thereon, for which he shall receive a receipt, and an entry shall be made of such stock in a book to be kept for the purpose.

8. All stock placed upon the common shall be branded with the owner's fire brand and with the common brand in pitch or tar. Every goat shall wear around its neck a triangular yoke with the owner's name painted or carved thereon.

9. No entire horse shall be allowed to run upon the common, nor any bull, except such as shall be approved by the managers.

10. Stock shall not be removed from the common after delivery to the herdsman without giving due notice thereof, except as hereinafter provided; and after such notice the herdsman shall not be considered to have charge over any such stock until they shall again be handed over to him. In cases where stock may be frequently required, the owner may, upon application, receive permission from the managers to remove and replace such stock at pleasure, in a quiet manner so as not to interfere with or disturb other stock unnecessarily, but the herdsman shall not be considered to have any supervision whatever over such stock.

11. Any person, or the managers of neighbouring commons, shall be at liberty to register with the herdsman in a book to be kept for the purpose, the brands and description of missing stock, upon payment of a fee of One shilling for every head of stock so registered, and such stock, if found upon the common, shall not be impounded till notice shall be sent to the person or managers registering, who shall be required to remove the same within fourteen days from the time of service of notice.

12. No stock affected with any contagious disease shall be placed upon the common, and stock thereon becoming so affected shall be removed by the owner within one day after notice to him by the herdsman, and in the event of such stock not being removed within the time specified, they shall be removed or destroyed at the owner's expense.

13. The herdsman shall, on missing any stock from the common, immediately inform the owners thereof, and he shall attend at the common yard or other place appointed by the managers, at times to be fixed by them for the purpose of giving persons information respecting their stock, and shall assist in finding and removing the same if required.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

The births of 1,628 children, viz., 842 boys and 786 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. In the month of May, 1,641 births were registered, or 13 more than in the month under review. The births were 493 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 187 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 649, viz., 372 of males and 277 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 979, or 151 per cent. The deaths were less than those in May, but exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 100; if, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 48.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.31, and of deaths registered 1.32.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 60.5° on the 23rd, and the lowest was 35.2° on the 9th. The mean temperature of the month (51.1°) was about one degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (20.7°) took place on the 4th, and the least (4.5°) on the 25th. The mean daily range was 10.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.486 inches on the 6th, and the lowest was 29.538 inches on the 28th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.980 inches) differed from the average by a small fraction only.

Rain fell on 15 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.54 inches. The average rainfall in June during the previous ten years was 1.96 inches, or not quite two-thirds of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on six days during the month.

Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 34 per cent. to that mortality, as against 33 per cent. in June, 1890; 37 per cent. in June, 1889; 34 per cent. in June, 1888; 33 per cent. in June, 1887; 30 per cent. in June, 1886; and 31 per cent. in June, 1885.

Thirty-four deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a widow, aged 75, died of apoplexy; a teacher of drawing, aged 75, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 75, of heart disease and pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 75, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 75, a farmer, a miner, and a female servant, each aged 77, of pneumonia; a female teacher, aged 79, of cancer of the breast; a female, aged 79, of heart disease; a widow, aged 79, of bronchitis; a male cook, aged 80, of apoplexy; a farmer, aged 81, of cancer on the face; a gentleman and a farmer, each aged 84, of paralysis;

a bootmaker, aged 84, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 85, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a gardener, aged 86, of apoplexy; a labourer, aged 87, of syncope; a cabinetmaker, aged 87, of gastric catarrh; a labourer, aged 93, of apoplexy; a female, aged 91, of pneumonia; a female, aged 78, a clerk, aged 79, a brickmaker, aged 80, a male of occupation unknown, aged 82, a soapmaker and a female, each aged 83, a farmer, aged 84, a male servant and a female, each aged 89, two females, aged 90 and 92 respectively, and a female servant, aged 102, of old age.

Thirty-five violent deaths took place during the month, of which 28 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A labourer, aged 25, a stonebreaker, aged 59, and a platelayer, aged 63, a railway porter, aged 24, and a shunter, aged 26, were passed over by railway trains or trucks; an engineer, aged 19, was crushed to death by an engine; a selector, aged 70, was killed by a cab-wheel passing over him; a compositor, aged 21, died of fracture of the skull, consequent on being thrown from a cart in a collision; a night porter, aged 32, was killed in a lift; a male of occupation unstated, aged 15, died of fracture of the spine, the result of falling down a lift-shaft; a boy, aged 11, of a gunshot wound, accidentally inflicted; a labourer, aged 35, was killed by a bale falling on him; a labourer, aged 28, and a watchman, aged 55, died of fracture of the spine, the result of falls; a slater, aged 19, and a male of occupation unknown, aged 56, of fracture of the skull, and a female, aged 68, of concussion of the brain, the latter supposed to have been caused by a fall; a pork butcher, aged 49, of scalds, the result of falling into a vat of hot water; a farmer, aged 16, was killed by an explosion of dynamite; a labourer, aged 50, was drowned in Hobson's Bay, and a carter, aged 51, in the Saltwater River; a new-born female infant was suffocated immediately after birth; a male child, aged 4 months, in bed; a new-born male infant and two male children, aged 4 months and 1 year respectively, were suffocated; a new-born male infant died of undue pressure on the umbilical cord; and a new-born male infant, of want of proper attention at birth. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male infant who was suffocated—a verdict of wilful murder being returned; and of a new-born female infant, who died of fracture of the skull, presumed to have been purposely inflicted. The suicidal deaths were those of an ironmoulder, aged 45, who cut his throat; a chairman, aged 40, who poisoned himself by taking a dose of chlorodyne; a bootmaker, aged 48, who drowned himself; a groom, aged 56, and a labourer, aged 59, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and fifty-one deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—70 in the Melbourne Hospital, 17 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Women's Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 8 in the Austin Hospital, 13 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Infirmi-grants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Infant Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 218, of which 129, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 89, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 148 were under one year of age, 39 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 431. Of these, 243, or 56 per cent., were males, and 188, or 44 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 21 were between fifteen and twenty, 26 were between twenty and twenty-five, 30 were between twenty-five and thirty, 39 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 39 were between forty and forty-five, 34 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 34 were between fifty-five and sixty, 42 were between sixty and sixty-five, 34 were between sixty-five and seventy, 30 were between seventy and seventy-five, 13 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 21 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from typhoid fever, which have been decreasing in number since March, fell from 20 in May to 11 in June, the latter being the smallest number in any month since November, 1890; and deaths from diphtheria fell from 23 to 16. The mortality from both these complaints since the beginning of the year was much lower than in the same period of the two previous years. Deaths from cancer rose from 22 in May to 30 in the month under notice, but, under most other heads, the mortality was below the average.
