#### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melhourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

IV. Or homest have completed the full course in the Engineer.

IV. Or he must have completed the full course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

Note.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

#### CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination :-

A By-law of the City of Footscray, made under-section 244 of the Health Act 1899, and numbered 16, for prohibiting the discharge of offensive natter or drainage into the Saltwater River, &c.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the Council of the City of Footscray in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray do hereby make a By-law and do hereby order as follows:—

Footscray do hereby make a Dy-law and do hereby order as follows:

No person shall discharge or cause or allow to be discharged any offensive matter or drainage into any part of the following rivers and creeks within the municipal district of the said municipality, namely:—The Hobson's River, the Yarra River, the Saltwater River, and the Stony Creek.

The births of 1,489 children, viz., 736 boys and 753 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of December. In the month of November, 1,396 births were registered, or 93 less than in the month under review. The births were 152 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 174 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 897, viz., 467 of males and 430 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 592, or 66 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in November by 87, and than the average of December during the previous ten years by 114; if, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 96.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.03, and of deaths registered 1.83.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 101.2° on the 22nd, and the lowest was 44.9° on the 26th. The mean temperature of the month (62.4°) was nearly a degree and a half below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.0°) took place on the 22nd, and the least (7.0°) on the 6th. The mean daily range was 20.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.194 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.231 inches on the 12th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.753 inches) differed from the average by a small fraction only.

Rain fell on 8 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.06 inches. The average rainfall in December during the previous ten years was 2.67 inches, or  $\frac{\pi}{6}$  of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 52 per cent., and females 48 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 54 per cent. to that mortality, as against 44 per cent. in December, 1890; 54 per cent. in December, 1883; 55 per cent. in December, 1886; and 53 per cent. in December, 1885.

Thirty-six deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of diarrhea; a cab proprietor, aged 75, of heart disease; a female, aged 75, of pneumonia; a gardener, aged 75, of herma; a male, of unspecified occupation, aged 76, of apoplexy; a female, aged 76, of valvular heart disease; a gentleman, aged 76, of thrombosis; a female, aged 76, of hemiplegia; a bootmaker, aged 77, of rheumatism; a plasterer, aged 77, of rheumatic gout; a furrier, aged 77, of paralysis; a female, aged 77, of heart disease; a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; a fem

81, of heart disease; a constable and a female, each aged 81, of bronchitis; a clerk, aged 84, of diarrhœa; a hawker, aged 84, of apoplexy; a hawker and a female, aged 84 and 86 respectively, of heart disease; a gardener, aged 89, of sonile gangrene; a gardener, aged 89, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, a clergyman, aged 78, a shoemaker, aged 79, a farmer and two females, each aged 80, an engineer and a shoemaker, each aged 86, and a female, aged 87, of old age.

Thirty-eight violent deaths took place during the month, of which 35 were set down to accident and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A ganger, aged 40, and a female, aged 32, were passed over by railway trains; two labourers, aged 26 and 30 respectively, and two seamen, aged 40 and 42 respectively, died of injuries consequent on falls; a rag merchant, aged 53, and a shoemaker, aged 72, of injuries received from horses; a sailmaker, aged 45, of fracture of the skull, a gear falling on him; a boy, aged 7, and a labourer, aged 38, of injuries to the head, how caused not stated; a female, aged 38, of tetanus, caused by injury to the foot; a plumber, aged 20, of sunstroke; a boy, aged 22, was poisoned by eating tinned fish; a printer, aged 30, died of lead poisoning; a female, aged 35, under chloroform properly administered; two boys, aged 7 and 8 respectively, and a carpenter, aged 53, were drowned in the River Yarra, a boy, aged 9, in the Port Melbourne Lagoon, a female, aged 14, at the Red Bluff, St. Kilda, whilst bathing; four boys, aged respectively 5, 6, 10, and 12, were accidentally drowned; four men were found drowned, viz., an embosser, aged 23, in Hobson's Bay, a draper, aged 30, and a butcher, aged 35, in the River Yarra, and an engineer, aged 50, at Coburg; two new-born male infants and one new-born female infant were overlain, and two male infants were suffocated during birth. The suicidal deaths were those of a gentleman, aged 56, who shot himself, a female, aged 24, who poisoned herself, and an importer, aged 30, who hanged himself. importer, aged 36, who hanged himself.

One hundred and thirty-one deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 59 in the Melbourne Hospital, 15 in the Alfred Hospital, 6 in the Women's Hospital, 9 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 6 in the Austin Hospital, 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 483, of which 240, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 243, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 406 were under one year of age, 48 were between one and two, 14 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 414. Of these, 227, or 55 per cent., were males, and 187, or 45 per cent., were females; 22 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 34 were between therety, 34 were between the hirty-five, 24 were between the hirty-five and fitty-five, 26 were between forty, 21 were between forty and torty-five, 29 were between forty were between fifty-five and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 42 were between sixty and sixty-five, 22 were between sixty-five and seventy, 35 were between seventy and seventy-five, 20 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 16 were upwards of eighty.

In December, as compared with the previous month, a considerable increase took place in the mortality from diarrhoad diseases, the number of deaths being 82 and 54. Typhoid fever, moreover, caused 17 deaths against 3, and whooping-cough 16 against 12. On the other hand, deaths from influenza, combined with deaths from diseases of the organs of respiration, numbered only 80, as against 154 in November and 503 in October; and deaths from diphtheria numbered 10, as against 11 in November and 7 in

Fire Brigades Act 1890.

REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF LOCAL COMMITTEES.\*

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of December, 1891.

WHEREAS by section 39 of the Fire Brigades Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1200) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, as to the whole or any part of Victoria, make regulations for the purposes therein specified: And whereas by section 40 of the said Act it is further enacted that after the first meeting of the Country Fire Brigades Board all regulations as to any country fire district shall be prepared by such Board and submitted to the Minister for approval prior to being made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Regulations following have been prepared by the Country Fire Brigades Board and submitted to the Minister for approval in the manner provided by the now in part recited Act. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind such of the Regulations made under the provisions of the said Act, and dated the sixth day of July, 1891, as relate to the Powers and Duties of Local Committees, and doth make the Regulations following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

These Regulations shall apply to those parts of the colony of Wherein Secretary and forms.

REGULATIONS.

These Regulations shall apply to those parts of the colony of Victoria known as the nine Country Fire Districts, as set forth in the First Schedule of the Act, and in the Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor published in the Covernment Cazette of 5th June, 1891, whereby certain portions of Country Fire Districts were excised therefrom, and to any part of the colony of Victoria that may hereafter be added to or included in any Country Fire District.

For defining the powers and duties of Local Committees and the furnishing of the Boards with Reports and Returns by such Local Committees, both periodically and when required by the

Boards. 1. Committee may nominate a secretary.—Each local committee may from time to time nominate a person to be its secretary; such nomination to be submitted to the Country Board for approval or otherwise, and the Board may appoint the person so nominated or any other person it may decide upon to be the secretary to such local committee, and the Board shall determine the duties and remuneration of such secretary, and may at any time suspend or dismiss such secretary, either by its own determination or by the recommendation of such local committee.

own determination or by the recommendation of such local committee.

2. Duties of sceretary.—The secretary of each local committee shall attend all meetings of the local committee, and shall enter the minutes of resolutions and proceedings in a minute-book to be kept for that purpose. He shall perform, to the satisfaction of the local committee and of the County Board, all such duties as may be imposed upon him, and shall, subject to the control of the Board, have charge of all books, papers, and other property of the Board that may be in the custody of the local committee. He shall cause to be kept an accurate record, in convenient form for reference, of all business transacted by the local committee. He shall attend promptly to all communications received from and use despatch in forwarding reports and returns to the secretary of the Country Board. He shall be under the general direction of the secretary of the County Board in all matters relating to office routine and management.

3. Committee to requisition for supplies.—All supplies required for the conduct of the business of each local committee shall be directed by the Board from time to time, and the Board may allow, disallow, or amend such requisition, and may provide such supplies or authorize the purchase of same by any local committee.

- 4. Committees not to purchase supplies or incur liabilities.—Local committees shall not incur, accept, or in any way undertake any liability, or lend, lease, sell, acquire, or purchase any property or supplies whatsoever, unless with the consent of the Country Board previously obtained.
- 5. Duties of committees.-It shall be the duty of each local committee
  - (1) To report to the Country Board any irregularity in the working of the brigades that may come under its notice.

  - (2) To furnish such reports and returns as the Country Board may at any time and from time to time require.
    (3) And generally to do such things as the Country Board may direct from time to time for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Act.

6. Penalties.—If any local committee, or if any secretary of any local committee, makes default in transmitting any report or return within fourteen days after it shall have become due, or within fourteen days from notice sent by the secretary of the Country Board of the non-receipt of such report or return, such local connittee or secretary of local committee or secretary of local committee (as the case may be) shall be liable to a penalty of One pound, and to a further penalty of not more than One pound for each day such default is continued after any conviction thereof, the maximum penalty in any case not to exceed Five pounds.

WHEREAS by The Constitution Act it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Saturday, the thirtieth day of January, 1892, and it is expedient to further prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Saturday, the thirtieth day of January, 1892, until Monday, the twenty-ninth day of February, 1892.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and in the fifty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.
