WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Gordon.

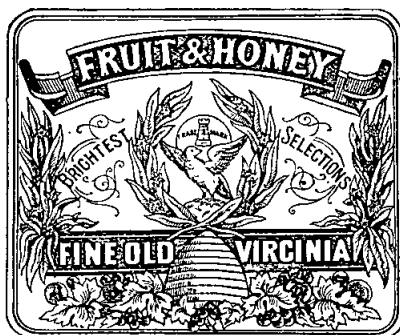

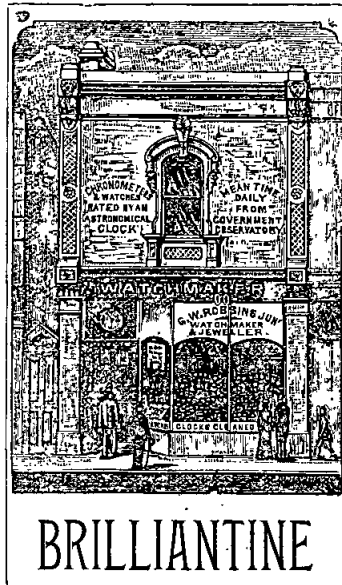

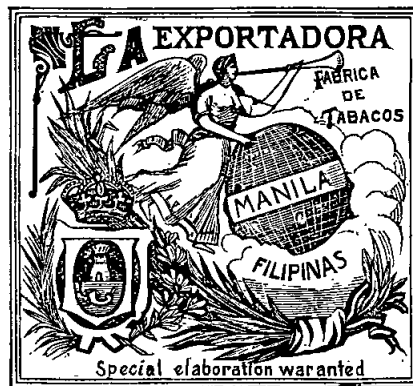

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

4. Benefactors of Thirty pounds or contributors of Twenty pounds shall be entitled to be enrolled on the list of life governors. The word "benefactor" shall mean a sum of money raised from the public by church or other collections, by fêtes and entertainments, or contributed by mining or other companies, societies, or associations, and the bodies under the Local Government Act. The nomination of benefactors as life governors to be made by the minister or governing body of churches, the collector or collectors, the committee of the said fêtes or entertainments, or the giver or givers thereof, the directors of mining or other companies, societies and associations, and the councils of the local government bodies respectively. The word "contribution" shall mean a personal gift. Life governors shall have the same privileges in respect of recommending patients as annual subscribers of Three pounds, and be eligible for election as members of committee or any honorary office.

32. Cases of emergency or severe accidents shall be admitted without requiring a recommendation, and the sub-committee or resident surgeon have the power of dispensing with the recommendation paper in special cases. Any member of the committee of management may at any time recommend patients for admission, provided that the accommodation of the hospital will permit of the reception and treatment of such patients. No pregnant female, for the purpose of confinement, no person afflicted with any infectious disease or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor any person who, in the opinion of the medical or surgical officers and resident surgeon or house committee, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as in-patient under any circumstances, and the cause of the refusal of any applicant so refused admittance shall be stated by the resident surgeon in his report to the next meeting of the general committee.

VICTORIAN DEAF AND DUMB INSTITUTION (INCORPORATED).

THE VICTORIAN DEAF AND DUMB INSTITUTION (INCORPORATED).
BY-LAWS.

Section I.—Constitution.

1. The name of the institution is The Victorian Deaf and Dumb Institution.

2. The objects of this institution are—

(a) To provide a home and instruction for the deaf and dumb.

(b) To assist in the maintenance of those deaf and dumb whose parents or friends may be unable to pay the required fees.

Section II.—Management.

3. The business of the institution shall be conducted by a board of management consisting of twelve members, elected from life members or annual subscribers. The board of management shall have power to elect a president, one or more vice-presidents, an honorary secretary, and honorary treasurer. Four members shall constitute a quorum.

4. The board of management shall have power to appoint such sub-committees from its own members, and to employ and appoint a superintendent and such other officers and agents as may be required for carrying out the objects of the institution and for managing its affairs, and to fix, and from time to time alter, the remuneration to be paid to such officers and agents.

5. The annual meeting of the institution shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in each year. At such meeting one-third part of the elected members of the board of management shall go out of office, but may, nevertheless, be re-elected; and the persons who go out of office shall be those who have been longest in office without re-election; or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

6. If any member of the board of management shall die or resign, or be convicted of any indictable offence, or be absent without permission from six consecutive meetings of the board,

his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the board shall declare his office vacant, and appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the board of management, when the person so appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of By-law No. 5, are required to go out of office.

Section III.—Admission and Instruction.

7. No child deficient in intellect, subject to fits or contagious or offensive diseases, shall be considered a suitable subject for admission into the institution, and in ordinary cases the candidate must not be under seven years of age. In all cases application shall be made in manner prescribed by the board of management.

8. In addition to the provisions of By-law No. 1, instruction shall be provided in the truths of the Gospel, under the direction of the board, but mutes shall be admitted to the full benefits of the institution, irrespective of creed or nation.

Section IV.—Rules and Regulations.

9. The board of management may make such rules or regulations for the conduct of its own business, for the appointment and government of the sub-committees and officers of the institution, for the management and control of its funds and property, and for the proper and effective carrying out of the objects of the institution as may from time to time be deemed necessary; provided that no such rule or regulation shall be inconsistent with these by-laws.

Section V.—Common Seal.

10. The common seal of the institution shall be in the custody of the honorary treasurer, and shall only be affixed to documents by him with the sanction of the board, and shall be attested by the said honorary treasurer and one member of the board.

Section VI.—Life Members.

11. Every donor and every collector of £20 and upwards in one payment shall be a life member of the institution.

12. Every person making a bequest of One hundred pounds (£100) and upwards, may nominate a life member. In the event of no such nomination being made, the executor first named in the will shall be entitled to the privilege.

13. Every gentleman who shall serve on the board, or hold any honorary office for ten years continuously, shall be entitled to life membership.

14. The board of management shall also have the power to confer a life membership on any person for very special services rendered.

15. No contributor shall have more than one vote.
