THE subjoined Notice, inviting Tenders for a Mail Service between British New Guinea and one of the Northern Ports of Queensland, is published for general information.

TENDERS are invited for running a Mail Service between British New Guinea and one of the Northern Ports of Queensland on the terms and conditions hereunder specified:—

1. One trip of the service shall be performed every six weeks, or every eight weeks, as may be expressed in the tender.

2. The port to be touched at in Queensland may be Cooktown, Thursday Island, or Cairns, as may be agreed from time to time by the contracting parties. But it shall be Cooktown unless otherwise arranged.

  - (9) At some place in the middle or west end of the Gulf of Papuan, should any settlement or Government station be formed there; but there would be no place of call there at present.
- 5. By previous arrangement with the Government, Samarai may be made the first or last place of call, to suit the prevailing winds of the season; but, utdes it is first otherwise sanctioned by the Government, Samarai shall be the first port of call.

(2) Preparing regulations, circulars, and memoranda for publication on all sanitary and medical subjects connected with the health of the people.

(3) Perusing, minuting, and advising on the reports of the local health officers.

(4) Watching the returns and notifications of infectious diseases, and advising when special inquiries are needed, or when special action by the Board is required.

(5) Investigating the causes and conditions attending outbreaks of infectious or contagious diseases in particular localities, making recommendations for the prevention of the spread and for the abatement of such outbreaks, and guarding against their recurrence.

(6) Making periodical inspections of, and reporting on the sanitary condition and sanitary administration of, the various municipal districts of the colony.

(7) Studying and advising the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them

(8) Inspecting, reporting on, and directing the work of public vaccination throughout the colony.

(9) Advising the Board in regard to matters relating to quarantine.

## EXPLOSIVE SIGNALS.

THE accompanying Memorandum, prepared by H.M. Chief Inspector of Explosives, with respect to the precautions necessary for the safe custody and handling of certain kinds of explosive signals intended for use at sea, has been printed for the information of the owners and officers of British ships. Serious and fatal casualties arising from the accidental explosion of signals of this description having from time to time been brought to the notice of this Department, the Board of Trade think it desirable to call special attention to the recommendations and suggestions made in Colonel Majendie's report, and to urge upon all persons responsible for the care and use of explosive signals the necessity for exercising the greatest precaution, both as regards the quality and construction of the signals supplied, and also in the mode of stowing them for use.

When defective signals are to be destroyed they should invariably be thrown overboard in the open sea, and at such a distance from shore as to render their recovery highly improbable.

#### FRICTIONAL SIGNAL LIGHTS.

PRICTIONAL SIGNAL LIGHTS.

Memorandum.

The destruction by fire and explosion of a floating magazine for fireworks near Gravesend, on the 11th January, 1892, brings into prominence the risk attending the storing and handling of certain signal lights in common use on board ship.

The result of the official inquiry which I carried out into the explosion above referred to leaves no doubt that the accident was due to the ignition of a frictional signal light or Roman candle, contained in a small case or "magazine," which had been brought from a vessel just returned from a foreign voyage, and which had probably fallen or been roughly deposited in the hold of the floating magazine.\*

Other accidents have occurred with this class of light, notably a disastrous explosion on the \*\*s. Aberdeen off Gravesend, on 1st

Other accidents have occurred with this class of light, notably a disastrous explosion on the s.s. Aberdeen off Gravesend, on 1st March, 1884, by which three lives were lost.†

It is therefore most desirable that the attention of ship-owners should be specially directed to the fact that lights of this character, the ignition of which depends upon what may be broadly described as the well-known "safety-match" frictional arrangement (i.e., the bringing into contact of two substances, such as chlorate of potash and amorphous phosphorus, disposed one on the upper surface of the light and the other on a removable cap or, in some cases, on the tip of a removable wooden plug), may, even when carefully made in the first instance, become dangerous by rough or careless handling.

Among the sources of risk may be mentioned the detachment or fracture of the protecting cap, the exposure of the compositions in such manner that their accidental contact becomes possible, the detachment of particles of one of the compositions and the working of the same through interstices within the cap into contact with the composition by which the frictional action is completed, or the accidental ignition by means of a sharp blow

or friction of some of the amorphous phosphorus itself, whether detached from the cap or plug or existing on a plug which has itself become detached.\(^1\) Accordingly, it is desirable that special directions should in all cases be given to those who are responsible for the custody and handling of these lights that the greatest care be exercised in dealing with them, and with the boxes containing them, to prevent the lights sustaining such injury as might establish one or more of the sources of risk indicated above.

If a light is taken out of a box and not used, care should be taken, before the light is replaced, that the cap is securely fixed and uninjured, and in the case of lights provided with phosphorus-tipped plugs that the plugs are not loose or detached. Any light, the cap or plug of which has become detatched or is insecure or apparently defective, should be thrown overboard. Frictional lights should always be kept in a box or case by themselves, and the boxes or cases should be required to be of a construction which allows as little play as possible to the light. From time to time the lights should be examined as to the security and condition of these caps (and plugs).

It is needless to remark that, before any lights of this description are received on board ship, they should, before being stowed away, be carefully examined as to the points mentioned above, and ship-owners are advised to refuse to receive any frictional lights as to the quality or manufacturing excellence of which there is any room for doubt, or which appear to present any special or novel elements of risk, or which are not provided with a metallic cap, those furnished with a paper cap being obviously more liable to injury by damp, by knocking about during a rough voyage and by rough handling.

UPPER MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION, 1893.

In pursuance of the powers granted or conferred by the Water Act 1890, the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust do make the following Regulation:—

1st. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situate.

2nd. All water supplied by the said Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for one thousand gallons, or at such price as shall be specially agreed upon.

3rd. Tho above named rate is for one year, commencing on the 1st of January, 1893, and ending on the 31st of December, 1893, and shall be payable in two equal instalments, on the 1st of April and the 1st of October.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

# Water Act 1890, Part II., Division 9. THE BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations are made by the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, pursuant to the provisions of the above Act:—

1. Water will, subject to the provisions of the Water Act 1890, Part II., be supplied within the district of the Trust for purposes other than domestic solely by measurement through a meter.

The charge for water so supplied shall, subject to clause 7 of these Regulations, be is. 3d. per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon between the Trust and the person requesting the supply, provided that the minimum charge shall be as follows:—

- (a) For irrigation, £1 per annum.
- (b) For carriers' and livery stables, 5s. per stall, or in open sheds 5s. per 5 feet of accommodation per annum.
- (c) For a trough in a paddock, £2 per annum.
- (d) For steam-engine, £1 per inch cylinder diameter per
- (e) For syphon, £1 per annum.

The Trust year begins on the 1st day of January in each year, and all payments and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

- 2. (a) On and from the 1st day of January. 1893, the supply of water to tenements not having meters affixed to the service-pipe as hereinafter provided shall be for domestic purposes solely. And all persons who shall use water of the Trust so supplied for domestic purposes for purposes other than domestic solely will be prosecuted according to law.
- according to law.

  (b) All persons requiring water for other than domestic purposes solely on and after the said 1st day of January, 1893, shall deliver to the Trust engineer personally a notice in the form in the Schedule hereto, and upon acceptance by the secretary of such notice the person delivering the same shall be deemed to have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure.

  (c) Every person having delivered such notice, if the same be accepted by the secretary, shall be entitled forthwith to use water for the purposes in the said notice set forth, and the quantity of water used before a meter be affixed shall be ascertained by the average consumption during such number of days following the fixing of the meter as the secretary may deem right.

  (d) No meter or apparatus for measuring water shall be
- No meter or apparatus for measuring water shall be deemed to be a meter within the meaning of clause 1 of this Regulation unless the pattern or type be of a kind approved of by the Trust.
- All meters shall be affixed in such position as the engineer or secretary to the Trust may direct, and the keys shall be kept by such engineer or secretary.
- when a meter shall be out of repair, the water consumed during the period of disrepair shall be ascertained according to the consumption during such number of days following repair as the secretary may think right.
- No person shall connect any service-pips or branch service-pips with any steam-engine without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.
- 3. (a) Any person who shall waste or misuse, or allow to be wasted or misused, the water supplied to him by the Trust, shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- (b) A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include watering horses in free stables, or hoseing down or washing horses or vehicles.
- Unless a meter shall be affixed to the service-pipe, no person shall have fitted to the pipes or apparatus through which he receives the water of the Trust any tap with a thread union or other attachment for the purpose of attaching thereto hoso.
- (d) No person shall have fitted to any bath supplied by water from the Trust any overflow pipe.
- from the Trust any overflow pipe.

  4. Every person supplied with water by the Trust shall keep his pipes and other apparatus in repair, and if any pipes or apparatus become out of repair the Trust may, by notice, require the same to be placed in proper order, or it may by its employes enter on the premises whereon repairs may be required and repair or replace, or refit and cleanse, such of the pipes or apparatus as may so require to be dealt with, and the costs, charges, and expenses of so doing shall be paid by the owner or occupier of such premises; and, in default of payment, in addition to any penalties incurred, the Trust may recover the amount of such costs, charges, and expenses from the owner or occupier of such premises in any court of competent jurisdiction, as money paid for the owner or occupier, as the case may be; and in such proceeding the Trust may proceed against the owner or occupier individually or as co-defendants.

  5. Any person supplied with water by the Trust shall not
- 5. Any person supplied with water by the Trust shall not allow any other person to use such water, unless by special authority of the Trust; and any person who shall use without such authority the water supplied to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 6. The Trust will, upon the application of an intending consumer, supply to him a meter at cost price, for each on delivery, or on time payment on the following terms:—£I cash deposit, and the balance bearing interest at 10 per cent. per annum by annual payments of £I.

- 7. Any person having agreed to be supplied with water by measure may take the water supplied for domestic purposes through the meter service on the following terms:—He shall be entitled to a supply per annuum, for domestic purposes, at 2s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, until at such rate the charge for the quantity consumed would equal the current water rate on the tenement; and thereafter all the water consumed shall be deemed to be taken for the purposes for which water is supplied to such consumers by measure.
- 8. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations he shall, where not otherwise expressly provided, incur a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and if such breach shall continue after notice by the Trust he shall incur a further penalty not exceeding Three pounds for every day that such breach continues.

If any person acts in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay when due or on demand any rates or charges, the water may be cut off by stop-valve, or cutting through the service-pipe, or otherwise as the Trust may determine.

In acting under or giving effect to the foregoing Regulations, the secretary, instructed by resolution of the Trust, may do, and in his name sign for the Trust, all things and documents required to be done or executed by the Trust: and in construing the Regulations, "The Trust" means "The Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust," the singular imports the plural, the masculine imports the feminine, and persons imports a corporation.

# BY-LAW No. 2.

BT-LAW No. 2.

A By-law of the Borough of Oakleigh, made under the Health Act 1890, and numbered 2, for regulating the times and manner of cleansing, omptying, and managing of earth-closets, privies, cesspools, and places for deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, and other refuse matter contained therein or removed therefrom, and for the prevention of injury to health from the transport, deposit, or use as manure of night-soil; for providing for the removal by the occupier, or in case of his default by the Council, of dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pig-sty, lane, yard, street, or place whatsoever; for requiring the occupiers of houses or premises to provide boxes or other specified receptacles for the temporary deposit of house refuse; for the prevention of the keeping of animals so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health; for fixing a fee for the registration of cow-keepers; for providing for the compulsory use of disinfectants; for providing for the drainage of buildings, and the prevention of damp foundations, and generally for the abatement and prevention of nuisances, and for securing the health thiness of the district and its inhabitants.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890,

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the Act into execution, and in the interests of public health, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Oakleigh order as follows:—

# REGULATION OF CARTAGE OF NIGHT-SOIL.

REGULATION OF CARTAGE OF NIGHT-SOIL.

1. Every person, other than a person duly licensed by the Council of the Borough for the removal of night-soil, and acting within the terms of such licence, carting or bringing or causing to be carted or brought any night-soil, offol, blood, or other offensive matter into through or within the Borough shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, unless he prove to the satisfaction of the justices that such night-soil, offal, blood, or offensive matter was in course of actual bond fide transport between the hours of Eleven o'clock at night and Two o'clock in the morning, from some place outside to another place outside the Borough.

CERTAIN CLOSETS TO BE EMPTIED ONLY BY LICENSED NIGHTMEN.

2. No closet, privy, or cesspool within the Borough on premises of less than five acres in area shall be emptied or the contents thereof removed, except by a nightman, carter, or other person duly licensed for that purpose by the Council of the Borough, and every porson who shall without being so licensed, empty any such closet, privy, or cesspool, or remove the contents thereof, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

## TIME OF REMOVAL, ETC., OF NIGHT-SOIL.

TIME OF REMOVAL, ETC., OF NICHT-SOIL.

3. Every person who shall empty any closet, privy, or cesspool, or load any cart, carry, remove, or deposit any night-soil, offal, blood, or other offensive matter, save between the hours of Eleven o'clock in the morning, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, but nothing herein contained shall be construed to allow any night-soil, offal, blood, or other offensive matter to be brought into the Borough, or to be carried through the Borough except between Eleven o'clock

at night and Two o'clock in the morning, or to prevent the removal at any time by persons licensed by the Council of the Borough for that purpose, of night-soil, offal, blood, or other offensive matter in hernetically-se

#### Use of Night-soil in Certain Premises Prohibited.

Use of Night-soil in Certain Premises Prohibited.

4. Every occupier of premises being less than five acres in area, and every occupier of premises between the Waverly-road in the north, and the North or Wellington-road on the South, who shall bury, deposit, or use any night-soil, offal, blood, or other offensive matter in or upon such premises, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and every person who shall bury, deposit, or use as manure, or cause to be so buried, deposited or used, any night-soil, offal, blood or other offensive matter, within 150 feet of any building or any adjoining premises, or without the same being covered with at least 18 inches of clean dry earth, shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law, provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the use in manner aforesaid on premises between the said roads, of not less than five acres in area, of the night-soil produced on such premises.

#### CHARGE FOR REMOVAL OF NIGHT-SOIL.

5. The annual charge to be paid for the removal of night-soil by the licensed nightman of the Borough shall be such sum as may from time to time be fixed by the Council of the Borough.

#### FRUIT CASES ON MANURE CARTS.

6. No person shall place, carry, or have in any vehicle, containing manure or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, or other, food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, or other food, in such manner that such fruit, vegetables, or other food, or such case or receptacle shall be in contact with such manure or offensive matter, or be liable to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom. RECEPTACLE FOR HOUSE REFUSE.

RECEPTACLE FOR HOUSE REFUSE.

7. Every occupier of a bouse or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, he readily and conveniently movable by one man or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

## REMOVAL OF REFUSE FROM. PLACES WHERE ANIMALS ARE KEPT.

8. Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time, remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon, as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards—or once at least in every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Council may remove the same.

#### Use of Refuse as Manure.

9. Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter (other than night-soil) produced or accumulated on any premises, to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure, so that the same be not removed or used so as to contravene any Act of Parliament or by-law, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

#### Construction of Privies.

Construction of Privies.

10. No person shall construct, or cause to be constructed, any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building—the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with the proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable water-tight pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil—the contents whereof do not exceed three onbic feet, and with requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth, or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford casy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle, and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public house, factory, work-room, or common lodging house, and every piblic privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material inaving a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening, of at least \( \frac{1}{2} \) an inch to the foot.

SUPILY OF DEGDORIZING ALATERIAL TO LARTH-CLOSETS.

11. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

## EMPTYING RECEPTACLES FOR NIGHT-SOIL.

12. Every occupier of, and every person having the management or control of, premises of five acres and upwards in area, shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises

#### REMOVAL OF NIGHT-SOIL BY PROPER CONVEYANCES.

13. No person shall empty, or cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for deposit of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or

other means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, and of effluvia therefrom.

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# EARTH-CLOSETS, ETC., NOT TO BE EMPTIED INTO DRAINS OR SEWERS.

14. No person shall empty, or cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way, or be likely to find their way, into any drain or

#### PREVENTION OF POLLUTION OF WATER.

15. No person shall place, or assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endangor the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or the milk or other produce of such dairy.

CESSFOOLS NOT TO BE EMPTIED INTO WATER USED FOR DRINKING OR DOMESTIC PURPOSES.

OR DOMESTIC PURPOSES.

16. No person shall empty or cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents be likely to find their way into such water.

#### ACCUMULATED DEPOSITS.

ACCUMULATED DEPOSITS.

17. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deedorized and removed by the owner or occupier of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated, within one week of notice given by the Council or by one of its officers so to de.

#### KEEPING OF ANIMALS.

18. No person shall keep any animal of any kind, or any geese, ducks, or poultry, so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

health.

Animals, Eric. Nor to be kert so as to Pollute Water.

19. No person shall keep any animal, or any geese, ducks, or poultry, in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or the milk, or other produce of such dairy.

#### DRAINAGE OF NEW BUILDINGS

20. Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof and the ground over which such building is to be placed to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water scakage or damp shall lodge

#### DRAINAGE OF EXISTING BUILDINGS.

21. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the immates of such building.

# · PENALTIES.

PENALTIES.

22. Every person found guilty of any offence against this Bylaw, or of committing any breach thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence or breach, or in case of any continuing breach to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued well-royided that, the justices before whom any penalty is sought to be recovered, may order the whole or part only (not being less than 5s.) of such penalty to be paid, and every person so found guilty shall be liable to the respective penalties aforesaid, notwithstanding that the Council of the Borough may be empowered to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not exercised such power.

## REPEAL.

23. Sections 11, 15, 16, and 19, of By-law No. 1 of the Local Board of Health of the Shire of Oakleigh, are hereby repealed as to premises and offences within the borough.

24. The fee to be paid by every owner or occupier of a dairy farm or milk store within the borough, on registering himself in accordance with any Act or By-law, shall be and is hereby fixed at the sum of 10s.

## Health Act 1890.

## . SHIRE OF CAULFIELD.

### BY-LAW No. 20.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Caulfield, made under the Health Act 1890.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, and of every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Caul-field, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Caulfield, doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

#### Repeal 1.

By-law No. 1.—Regulating the deposit of rubbish, manure, &c., made and passed by the Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Caulfield, on the 25th day of January, 1872, shall be and is hereby repealed.

## Repeal 2.

By-law No. 2.—Regulating the deposit of rubbish, manure, &c., made and passed by the Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Caulfield, on the 9th day of March, 1876, shall be and is hereby repealed.

#### Repeal 3.

By-law No. 3.—Regulating the deposit of night-soil, &c., made and passed by the Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Caulfield, on the 19th day of December, 1885, shall be and is hereby repealed.

#### HOUSE AND OTHER REFUSE.

4. Interpretation of Terms.—In the construction, and for the purposes of this by-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have their respective meanings hereby assigned to them, viz:—

House shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, botels, licensed victuallers' premises, factories, workrooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

Street shall mean and include any highway, and any public 'bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Council shall mean the Council of the Shire of Caulfield.

Councer snain mean the Council of the Surre of Cautheid.

Döuble-pan Day Service shall mean the supplying of one clean and thoroughly disinfected pan immediately upon the one in use being removed—such removal being done between the hours hereinatter specified.

## RECEPTACLES FOR HOUSE REFUSE.

RECEPIACLES FOR HOUSE REFUSE.

5. (a) The occupier of every house, building, tenement, or premises within the Shire of Caulfield, shall provide and keep thereon a box, or some other covered receptacle, for the temporary deposit of house refuse, or so many of such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain such refuse during one week, and shall cause all dust, sahes, rubbish, or other refuse produced, collected, or accumulated on any such premises to be from time to time placed in such receptacle.

(b) Such box or receptacle shall be kept constantly covered, except at such times as the same may be or shall be opened for the deposit therein of dust, ashes, rubbish, or house refuse as aforesaid.

(c) Such box or receptacle shall be placed, on such days and at such times as shall be specified in any notice to that effect to be given by the council, in the yard of such tenement or premises, and close to the entrance thereof from the street or right-of-way, or in such other place as the council may approve of, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorized or appointed to collect and remove the same by the council of the said shire.

(d) Every such box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same can be readily and conveniently moved and emptied by one man.

## RUBBISH TO BE KEPT IN ONE PLACE.

6. (a) The occupier of any house, building, or other tenement or premises within the Shire of Caulfield shall cause the same, and the yard or ground occupied therewith, or adjacent or belonging thereto, to be kept in a cleanly condition, and so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to

condition, and so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

(b) Such occupier shall cause all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil on such premises to be collected in one place in such yard or ground, at a distance of not less than 4 feet from any street, and 6 feet from any dwelling-house, and to be kept there in an inoffensive condition, and so that the same shall not be productive of any nuisance.

(c) Such occupier shall cause all such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, bleed, offal, manure, dung, or soil to be from time to time removed from such yard, ground, or premises as often as it shall amount to in the case of horse manure to a quantity not exceeding 5 cubic yards, and in all other cases at least once a week, or when the same shall amount to a quantity equal to 1 cubic yard.

(d) If at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil so removed as aforesaid, the council of the said shire may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier, and such expense may be recovered from such occupier, and edition to the fine for which he shall be liable as hereinafter mentioned.

#### REFUSE WHERE ANIMALS ARE KEPT.

- 7. The occupier of any land within the Shire of Caulfield on which there shall be creeted any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.
  - (a) Such occupier shall cause all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil produced or accumulated upon such premises to be collected in one place in the yard of such premises, at a distance of not less than 4 feet from any street, and 6 feet from any dwelling-house, and to be there kept in an inoffensive condition and so as not to be productive of any prises.
  - (b) Such occupier shall cause all such dust, mud, ashes rubbish, fifth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil to be from time to time removed from such promises as often as the quantity of the same so collected or accumulated shall amount, in the case of horse manure, to 5 cubic yards, and in all other cases at least once a week, or when the same shall amount to 1 cubic yard.
  - when the same shall amount to I cubic yard.

    (c) If at any time the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the council at the expense of such occupier, and such expense may be recovered from such occupier in addition to the fine for which he shall be liable as hereinafter mentioned.

#### REFUSE, WHERE OFFENSIVE TRADES, ETC.

- REFUSE, WHERE OFFENSIVE TRADES, ETC.

  8. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever, or on which there may be any rubbish, blood, offal, filth, bones, liquid, or other refuse or offensive matter, shall cause all such rubbish, blood, offal, filth, bones, liquid, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, and all waste product of such manufacture, from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every 24 hours.
  - (a) Such person shall in the meanwhile keep all such rubbish, blood, offal, filth, bones, liquid, or other refuse or offensive matter, and such waste product of such manufacture as aforesaid, so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia shall arise therefrom.
- (b) If the occupier or such person having the management or control of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any such rubbish, blood, offal, filth, liquid, or other refuse or offensive matter, and such waste product of such manufacture as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the council or its officers at the expense of such occupier, and such expense may be recovered from such occupier, in addition to the fine for which he shall be liable, as hereinafter mentioned.

## CESSPOOLS FOR OFFAL, BLOOD, ETC.

9. Every cesspool or place for the deposit of rubbish, blood, offal, filth, bones, liquid, or other refuse or offensive matter, and such waste product of such manufacture shall be furnished with a watertight cover or roof, and every cesspool which shall be formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be constructed with watertight walls or sides which project on all sides at least 6 inches above the surface of the ground.

#### CESSPOOLS TO BE EMPTIED

10. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises on which there shall be any cesspool or place for the deposit of any such rubbish, blood, offal, filth, bones, liquid, or other refuse or offensive matter, or such waste product of such manufacture, shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every 48 hours.

## TIMES FOR EMPTYING CESSPOOL FOR OFFAL, BLOOD, ETC.

TIMES FOR EMPTING CESSFOOL FOR OFFAL, BLOOD, ETC.

11. No person shall empty or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any cesspool or place for the deposit of rubbish, blood, offal, filth, bones, liquid, or other refuse or offensive matter, or such waste product of such manufacture, except between the hours of Eleveno'clock p.m. on any day and Six a.m. of the next day, nor until the contents thereof shall have been properly deodorized with some efficient deodorant.

(a) Every person emptying or causing to be emptied any such cesspool or place shall remove or cause to be removed the contents thereof so soon as the same is emptied.

## KEEPING OF ANIMALS.

12. No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

#### DOUBLE-PAN DAY SERVICE.

13. On and after the 1st day of October, 1892, the ordinary system in use up to that date of removal of night soil from privy pans within the shire shall be abolished, and from and after the 1st day of October, 1892, overy closet within the said shire shall be furnished with a double pan service.

### WITHDRAWAL OF PERMITS TO DEPOSIT NIGHT-SOIL.

14. Each and every permit granted by the council to any person whomsoever to use or deposit night-soil upon laud within the Shire of Caulfield shall be and is hereby cancelled and with-

#### REMOVAL OF PANS.

REMOVAL OF PANS.

15. The council shall divide the municipality into blocks, and assign to each block a day upon which and the hours between which the pans of the tenements within the several blocks shall be removed, and notice of such day and hour shall be posted upon or within the closet or privy of each tenement; and the occupier and every person having the management or control of any house, premises, or tenement, shall permit and give every facility for the removal and substitution of the pan or pans in connexion with the closet or privy of such house, premises, or tenement, by the council's contractor or servants, and other persons authorized by the council so to do. And save upon the days, and within the hours aforesaid, no pan containing nightsoil shall be removed or emptied from any house or tenement by any person or persons.

#### DISINFECTANTS.

DISINFECTANTS.

16. The occupier, and every person having the management or control of any house or premises, shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of such suitable deodorant or disinfectant as the council may from time to time approve of, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorant or disinfectant sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize or disinfect the contents of such pan or receptacle.

(a) No person shall put any sand, earth, lime, or ashes in such pan or receptacle.

#### LICENSED PERSONS ONLY TO REMOVE PANS.

17. No person, unless duly authorized and licensed in that behalf by the Council of the Shire of Caulfield, shall remove or empty any privy-pan used in or belonging to any closet or privy within the Shire of Caulfield.

#### REMOVAL OF PANS.

18. No individual householder shall contract for the removal of either night-soil or any other refuse, except in accordance with the by-laws and regulations of the council.

#### EMPTYING OF CESSPOOLS FOR NIGHT-SOIL.

19. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises whereon or belonging to which there is any cesspool below the surface of the ground for the reception of night-soil shall cause the same to be emptied, from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents thereof shall have accumulated therein to within the distance of 1 foot from the top of the walls, sides, or lining of such cesspool.

## DRAINAGE OF CESSPOOLS.

20. No privy cesspool shall have connected therewith, or attached thereto, any pipe or other appliance capable of being used for the purpose of discharging any of the contents of such cesspool upon or under the surface of any adjoining ground, or into any drain or sewer.

#### SITUATION OF PRIVIES.

21. No person [shall place or build or cause or permit to be placed or built any privy or earth-closet or any urinal in front of any dwelling, or at a less distance than 4 feet from any public highway, or 6 feet from the door or window of any dwelling, or from any lane or street of a width at any parth thereof of 16 feet or upwards, or from any street channel, or at a less distance than 2 feet from any partition fence.

#### CONSTRUCTION OF PRIVIES.

22. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy or earth-closet except of the design, dimensions, and materials, and except it be provided in respect to the middenstead of such closet with a flooring of asphalte, concrete, or other impervious material, as is set forth in one or other of the specifications in the schedule hereto, except in cases where the council shall otherwise order or direct.

# REMOVAL OF BLOOD, OFFAL, ETC.

23. No offal, fat, bones, or blood, offal, fat, bross, or blood shall be removed or carried through or along any street in the Shire of Caulfield except in air-tight carts, and between the hours of Eleven o'clock post meridian and Eight o'clock ante meridian, except by the express permission of the council in writing.

#### DEPOSIT OF RUBBISH.

24. No person shall place, deposit, or cause or suffer to be placed or deposited in or upon any street, road, or right-of-way, lane, passage, water channel, or open unfenced ground, or in any creek, river, or reservoir, or in any public place (not being a manure depot duly appointed by the council as a place for the deposit of such manure, rubbish, or other such refuse matter) any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, offal, manure, dung, or soil, bones, liquid, or any refuse or offensive matter.

#### DISINFECTION OF BLOOD, OFFAL, ETC., BEFORE USE.

DISINFECTION OF BLOOD, OFFAL, ETC., BEFORE USE.

25. If any person shall desire or intend to deposit, or cause to suffer to be deposited on any land, field, farm, or garden, within the Shire of Caulfield, any blood, offal, or any offensive matter or thing, he shall cause the same, before the removal thereof, to be deodorized and disinfected by the mixture therewith of such deodorant and disinfectant, and in such proportions as the council shall prescribe, and previously notify his intention so to deposit the same to the inspector of the council, and shall immediately, on the deposit thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

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26. No person removing manure, rubbish, or filth, or other effensive matter, shall allow any cart containing the same to remain stationary in any street within the Shire of Caulfield.

#### CLOSET DOORS.

<sup>1</sup>27. No person shall permit any closet door or trap to abut or open upon a street or lane exceeding 16 feet in width.

#### CESSPOOLS NOT TO BE EMPTIED INTO DRAINS, ETC

CESSPOOLS NOT TO BE EXPETIED INTO DRAINS, ETC.

28. No person shall empty, or cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any drain or sewer, or into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any such water.

#### DRAINAGE OF SITES OF NEW BUILDINGS.

29. Every person erecting any new building within the Shire of Caulfield shall, upon receiving notice so to do from the council of the said shire, cover the surface of the ground upon which such building is to be erected with a sphalt pavement, of tar and stone screenings, according to the tenor of such notice, in such manner and so that the foundations of such buildings shall be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, and so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

#### DRAINS, SPOUTS, EIC., OF BUILDINGS.

Drains, Spotts, etc., or Buildings.

30. Whenever, in the opinion of the said council, it is necessary that any building or buildings within the said shire shall be provided with spouting and down-pipes and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water, the said council may, by notice in writing, require the owner of such building or buildings to forthwith construct, provide, and lay down such spouting, down-pipes, and drains as shall be specified by such notice; and the owner of such building or buildings shall forthwith, upon being served with such notice, construct, provide, and lay down such spouting, down-pipes, and drains within the time limited by such notice, and shall maintain the same in good order and condition.

## CARRIAGE OF MEAT.

31. No person shall convey in or through the Shire of Caulfield any meat intended for consumption as human food, except in a covered cart or waggon, with closed sides or curtains, in a cleanly condition, and so arranged and kept as that such cart or waggon, sides, or curtains, shall be in a cleanly condition, and shall protect such meat from sunshine, dust, mud, or fifth; and no person shall sit or lie upon any such meat; neither shall any dog or other animal be conveyed in such cart or waggon.

#### KEEPING OF FOWLS.

32. The occupier of premises on which any yard, pen, or other enclosure is used for the keeping of fowls, shall cause the same to be properly swept and cleansed from time to time, as may be necessary; and shall at all times keep the same in such a state as not to be a nuisance.

#### DISINFECTION OF RAGS, ETC.

33. All rags, flock, and cotton or woollen waste, or other like material, used or intended to be used in the manufacture of bedding or furniture, shall, before the same be so used, be disinfected by being thoroughly opened out and exposed for one hour in a chamber kept filled with superheated steam, or exposed for twelve hours in a chamber kept filled with steam and the fumes of burning sulphur, so as to prevent injury to health. No person shall within the said Shire of Caulfield use any such material as aforesaid until the same be so disinfected in the manner hereby directed.

## CHARGE FOR REMOVAL OF PANS.

34. The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied; the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty

# COUNCIL TO GRANT PERMITS UNDER SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES.

35. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, any occupier 35. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, any occupier of any tenement and premises containing not less than two acres of land within the shire may, upon obtaining from the shire secretary a permit in writing, deposit upon such land the night-soil produced thereon only, subject to and strictly upon such conditions and on such days and between such hours as shall be set forth in such permit, and subject to the provisions of any Act relating to the public health, and such permit may be revoked by the council at any time in its discretion.

## CARRIAGE OF FRUIT, ETC.

CARRIAGE OF FRUIT, FTC.

36. No person shall place, carry, or have in or on any vehicle containing manure or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, or other food, in such manner that such fruit, vegetables, or other food, or such case or receptacle, shall be in contact with, or be liable to be in contact with, such manure or offensive matter, or to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall, upon conviction, for every such breach forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

#### PENALTIES.

37. Every person committing a breach of, or who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of, any one of the provisions contained in this By-law, No. 20, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence, where not otherwise expressly provided for, a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed: Provided that the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid, and every person committing any such breach as a foresaid, or who shall by any act or default be guilty of any such breach as aforesaid, shall be liable to the foregoing penalty. Notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

38. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout

38. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Caulfield.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### SPECIFICATIONS OF PRIVIES.

Internal dimensions not less than 5 feet by 3 ft. 6 in., and 7 feet high from floor to upper plate or ceiling. Nothing herein contained shall prevent any person from building better-finished or more elaborately-fitted privies, provided that in the opinion of the council due provision has been made for all the requirements of the specifications.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE MINYIP COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 4th August, 1890, the Council of the Shire of Dunmunkle, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Minyip Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

#### REGULATIONS.

  1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

  2. No arean shall dayseture on the common stock of which he
- 2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.
- 3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common to be as follow, and shall be payable half yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of February and the 1st day of August in every year:—

For every head of large cattle, other than horses, ever six months and under two years old, 5s. per annum.

For every head of large cattle, other than horses, two years and under three years old, 7s. per annum.

For every head of large cattle, other than horses, two years and unwards, 1ls. per annum.

For every horse over six months and under two years old, 6s. per annum.

For every horse two years and under three years old, 8s. per annum.

For every horse three years old and upwards, 12s. per annum.

For every sheep or goat over six months old, 2s. per

Progeny under the age of six months of stock legally de-pasturing on the common, Free.

4. No bull or entire horse shall be depastured on the common without the written consent of the managers.

5. The brands of all licensed stock shall be registered with the managers, and all sheep shall, if registered, have the common brand affixed prior to depasturing. The owners or persons in charge shall, when required, assist in mustering and branding their stock.

6. All stock found upon the common upon which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid, or of which the brands have not been duly registered, or upon which, where required, the common brand has not been affixed, shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded.

7. The managers shall be at liberty to issue licences for any less period than six months at proportional amounts of the prescribed fees.

8. Wherein by these Regulations, or by the Regulations relating

rescribed fees.

8. Wherein by these Regulations, or by the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council, any act, matter, or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be deemed to be well and effectively done under the signatures of any two of them.

9. One clear month before the above-named half-yearly dates of the 1st February and 1st of August, all persons entitled to depasture stock, and desirous of obtaining licences, shall send in applications to the managers, who shall direct what licences shall issue for the ensuing six months.

10. The managers shall be at liberty to set apart a portion of the common for the depasturing of large cattle only, and in any such case any small cattle, although licensed, depasturing on such portion shall be deemed to be trespassing and shall be liable to be impounded.

11. In the event of any infectious disease appearing in the stock on the common, the herdsman shall forward an immediate report to the Inspector of Stock.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
