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TREATY BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA RESPECTING MERCHANT SEAMEN DESERTERS.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its Enclosures, are published for general information.

MY LORD,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of a Treaty between the Governments of Great Britain and the United States of America relative to Merchant Seamen Deserters, signed at Washington on the 3rd of June, and of which the ratifications were exchanged at Washington on 1st August last, together with a copy of an Order of the Queen in Council, dated the 18th of August, extending the provisions of the *Foreign Deserters Act 1852* to the United States.

TREATY BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE UNITED STATES RESPECTING MERCHANT SEAMEN DESERTERS.

Signed at Washington, 3rd June, 1892.

[Ratifications exchanged at Washington, 1st August, 1892.]

WHEREAS the Governments of Great Britain and the United States of America are desirous to make provision for the apprehension, recovery, and restoration of persons who may desert from merchant vessels of their respective countries while in the ports of the other country, and to conclude a Treaty for the above purpose, the High Contracting Parties have accordingly appointed as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude the said Treaty, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland: Sir Julian Pauncefote, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to the United States; and

The President of the United States of America: James G. Blaine, Secretary of State of the United States;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective Full Powers, found in due and good form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents of either of the High Contracting Parties, residing in the dominions, possessions, or colonies of the other, shall have power to require from the proper authorities the assistance provided by law for the apprehension, recovery, and restoration of seamen who may desert from any ship belonging to a subject or citizen of their respective countries while in the ports of the other country. If, however, any such deserter shall have committed

any crime or offence in the country where he is found, his surrender or restoration may be delayed until the proper Tribunal before which the case shall be pending, or may be cognizable, shall have pronounced its sentence, and the sentence shall have been carried into effect.

It is understood that the preceding stipulations shall not apply to the subjects or citizens of the country where the desertion shall take place.

ARTICLE II.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London or at Washington without delay.

ARTICLE III.

The present Treaty shall come into operation at the expiration of thirty days from the date of the exchange of ratifications. It shall remain in force for five years after that date, and thereafter until terminated by a twelve months' notice to be given by either High Contracting Party to the other.

In faith whereof we, the respective Plenipotentiaries, have signed this Treaty, and have hereto affixed our seals.

SEAMEN DESERTERS (UNITED STATES).

Osborne House, Isle of Wight, 18th August, 1892.

At the Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, the 18th day of August, 1892.

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WHEREAS by the *Foreign Deserters Act 1852* it is provided that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty, may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such power when within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it hath been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen (not being citizens of the United States) who desert from British merchant ships in the territories belonging to the said United States will be given under a treaty between Her Majesty and the President of the United States signed at Washington on the 3rd day of June, 1892, the ratifications of which were exchanged on the 1st day of August, 1892:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and

it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who, within Her Majesty's dominions, desert from merchant ships belonging to citizens of the United States shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships: Provided always that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained till he has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence, if any, has been carried into effect.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PREPARATION OF ELECTORAL LISTS.

NOTICE.

IT is hereby notified that the General Lists of Non-rate-paying Electors for the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly must be prepared during the week ending the 1st December prox., and that persons who have not already enrolled may, if duly qualified, do so by obtaining Electors' Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

2. Intending applicants for Electors' Rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that those who so delay will be deprived of the opportunity for enrolment.

3. Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

4. Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining Electors' Rights when not qualified.

5. No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a Province may obtain an Elector's Right for such Province, and no person whose name is already on the new List of Ratepaying Electors, now being prepared, for any Division of an Electoral District may obtain an Elector's Right for such District.

6. Foreigners, who desire enrolment, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization before applying for Electors' Rights, or before the sitting of the Revision Courts appointed to be held during February next, if they desire enrolment as Ratepaying Electors.

7. Deputy Electoral Registrars are further directed to make up their Lists and send them to the Electoral Registrars for their Divisions immediately after 1st December.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of *visu voce* or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

The births of 1,506 children, viz., 753 boys and 753 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. In the month of August, 1,530 births were registered, or 24 more than in the month under review. The births were 287 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 51 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 527, viz., 286 of males and 241 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 979, or 186 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in August by 71, and were below the average of September during the previous ten years by 35. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 191.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.06, and of deaths registered 1.07.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 71.2° on the 13th, and the lowest was 34.1° on the 13th. The mean temperature of the month (52.9°) was four-fifths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.1°) took place on the 13th, and the least range (4.2°) on the 6th. The mean daily range was 14.5°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.172 inches on the 8th, and the lowest was 29.363 inches on the 6th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.856 inches) was nearly a tenth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.30 inches. The average rainfall in September during the previous ten years was 1.78 inches, or about half-an-inch less than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 29 per cent. to that mortality, as against 33 per cent. in September, 1891; 35 per cent. in September, 1890; 34 per cent. in September, 1889; 29 per cent. in September, 1888; 28 per cent. in September, 1887; and 34 per cent. in September, 1886.

Thirty-nine deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of aneurism; a labourer, aged 75, of bronchitis; a sawyer and a female, each aged 76, of cancer; a female, aged 76, of bronchitis; a sailor, aged 76, of apoplexy; a female, aged 77, of cancer; a cabinet-maker, aged 77, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of paralysis; a labourer, aged 78, of insanity; a female, aged 78, of valvular heart disease; a gentleman, aged 78, of disease of the bladder; a doctor, aged 79, of apoplexy; a male of unknown occupation, aged 79, of pneumonia; a mason, aged

80, of phthisis; a coach painter, aged 80, of paralysis; a steward, aged 80, of insanity; a gentleman, aged 80, of heart disease; a female, aged 80, of pneumonia; a gardener, aged 81, of cancer; a female, aged 81, of syncope; a fish hawk, aged 83, of erysipelas; a female, aged 80, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, a female, aged 77, three females, each aged 78, a retired gatekeeper, aged 80, a gentleman, aged 82, a cabinet-maker and a female, each aged 83, a weaver, aged 84, a female and a midwife, each aged 87, a squatter and a gentleman, each aged 88, a wheelwright and a male servant, each aged 92, of old age.

Thirty-five deaths were set down to external causes, of which 31 were ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 14, and a law clerk, aged 55, died of injuries consequent on falls; a railway porter, aged 30, was killed by a train, two boys, aged 5 and 8 respectively, by trams, and a girl, aged 10, by a waggonette; a ploughman, aged 60, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from his horse; a carver and gilder, aged 59, was crushed in a lift; a seaman, aged 28, died of fracture of the spine, two females, aged 40 and 45 respectively, of fracture of the skull, a female, aged 22, of rupture of uterus—how caused not stated; a female child, aged 4 months, was poisoned owing to an error in dispensing; a painter, aged 47, died of lead poisoning; a potato salesman, aged 28, a brassfinisher, aged 29, a bottle gatherer, aged 42, a butcher, aged 49, a male of unknown occupation, aged 50, and a bootmaker, aged 70, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a school boy, aged 5, and a carpenter, aged 59, were drowned in the Saltwater River, a female, aged 63, in the Merri Creek, a female, aged 55, in the Elwood Creek, and a laundress, aged 50, at Brunswick; a new-born male infant, and three female infants, aged 2, 3, and 4 months respectively, were overlain; a journalist, aged 55, was suffocated by a foreign body becoming impacted in his throat; a mariner, aged 55, was suffocated in a manner not described. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male and a new-born female infant, the former of whom was suffocated, and the latter drowned, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 46, who cut her throat, and a grocer, aged 68, who poisoned himself.

One hundred and sixteen deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 49 in the Melbourne Hospital, 16 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Women's Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 153, of which 80, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 73, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 108 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 374. Of these, 206, or 55 per cent., were males, and 168, or 45 per cent., were females; 13 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 37 were between twenty-five and thirty, 25 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 38 were between fifty and fifty-five, 39 were between fifty-five and sixty, 40 were between sixty and sixty-five, 22 were between sixty-five and seventy, 23 were between seventy and seventy-five, 19 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 20 were upwards of eighty.

Fifteen deaths, viz., 8 from puerperal fever and 7 from other circumstances consequent upon child-bearing, occurred during the month. As the births registered numbered 1,506, it follows that 1 death of a mother took place to every 100 children born alive, which is a very high proportion. The mortality from most other complaints was much below the average. Only 1 death was set down to typhoid fever, and only 4 deaths to diphtheria.

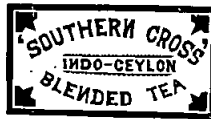

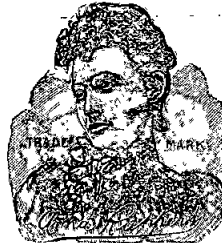

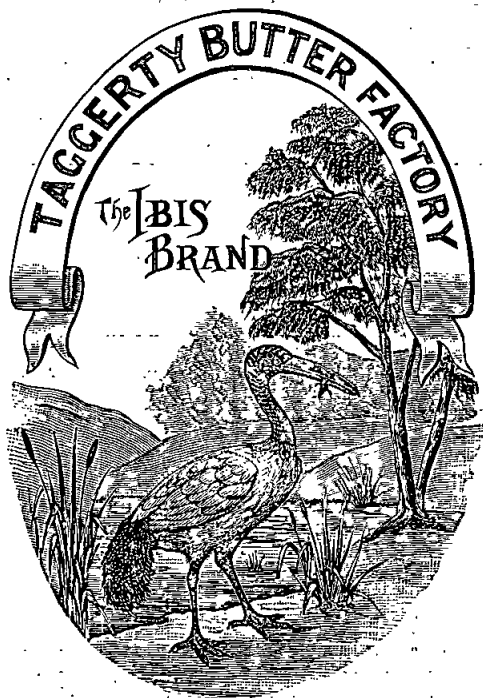

The Lancefield train on 29th October, 1st and 5th November will be detained at Lancefield junction to run in connexion with the 7.55 p.m. extra train from Melbourne. The ordinary trains leaving Melbourne for Bendigo on 29th October, 1st and 5th November at 12.15 and 5.10 p.m., and the 12.15 p.m. train on 3rd November, will start from the east side of the Williamstown platform at Spencer-street station.

Single fares to or from the course—first class, 2s.; second class, 1s. 6d. On and after 26th October tickets will be sold daily for any or all of the race days at Spencer-street, Prince's-bridge, and Flinders-street stations, and at Messrs. T. With the exception of those which leave Melbourne for Essendon at 10.11 a.m., 12.11, 1.11, 2.11, and 3.11 p.m., and Essendon for Melbourne at 10.41 a.m., 12.41, 1.41, 2.41, and 3.41 p.m., these trains will not stop at Newmarket. The ordinary time-table will be resumed as soon as the race traffic is over. On 29th October, 1st and 5th November, periodical and return ticket holders from Newmarket or Kensington to Melbourne may travel on the return journey to Ascot Vale station by trains which will not stop at Kensington or Newmarket. Periodical or return ticket holders between Kensington or Newmarket and Melbourne are allowed to travel on the return journey to or from Flemington-bridge and Macaulay-road by the Coburg, Preston, or Collingwood trains.

PASSENGERS FOR SYDNEY OR ADELAIDE.

GOODS SHEDS HOLIDAY—POWDER.

The 1st November (Cup Day) will be observed as a holiday in the Melbourne, Williamstown, and Port Melbourne goods sheds and at the piers and the Footscray powder siding. The powder which should be received at the latter place on Tuesday, 1st November, will be received on Wednesday, 2nd November.

ST. ALBANS LINE TRAINS.

On 1st November the trains usually leaving Melbourne at 4.45 and 5.20 p.m. and St. Albans at 5.25 and 5.56 p.m. will not run.

MOONEE VALLEY RACES.

On Saturday, 22nd October, special trains, not stopping at any intermediate station, will leave Spencer-street station (main line departure platform) for Moonee Ponds every 15 minutes between the hours of 12 noon and 1.30 p.m., and return from Moonee Ponds immediately the races are over. Race passengers are requested to travel by the race specials. Tickets will be issued at the main booking office, Spencer-street, and ordinary return fares (first class, 7d.; second class, 5d.) will be charged.

OAKLANDS HUNT CLUB RACES AT CAULFIELD.

On Tuesday, 25th October, special trains will leave Flinders-street station as often as may be required from 11.13 a.m. till 1.30 p.m., and return immediately the races are over. Return fares:—First class, 2s.; first class, including admission to the grand stand, 12s.; second class, 1s.; second class, including admission to the flat, 3s.

Mordiallo, Frankston, and Oakleigh lines.—On Tuesday, 25th October, with the exception of 11.15 a.m. train to Oakleigh, which will set down at Caulfield passengers who join the train at South Yarra, Hawksburn, Toorak, Armadale, and Malvern, none of the passenger trains leaving Prince's-bridge station for Mordiallo, Frankston, or Oakleigh, between the hours of 11 a.m. and 1.20 p.m., will stop to set down passengers at Caulfield. Caulfield periodical ticket-holders and holders of "Caulfield to Melbourne and return" tickets will be allowed to travel from Flinders-street station by the Caulfield race specials without extra payment.

Water Act 1890.

ST. ARNAUD SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulations:—

No. 7.

Regulation for determining rates to be paid for supply of water for domestic and other use, for preventing waste of water, and for other purposes in connexion with water supply for the Wycheproof Urban District, situated within the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust District, and which Urban District was proclaimed and defined on the 15th August, 1892.

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables or troughs, or a supply for steam boilers or for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees or plants, or washing the house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

2. The charges for water supplied by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

- One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
- Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding an acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.
- And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.
- In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust where water is supplied by measure, shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, or by meter or measure, shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed upon.

5. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, and who shall not be rated or liable to be rated for water in respect of property situated in any urban district, who shall take or carry away water from any private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. The commissioners may, if they see fit, allow persons not residing within any urban district to have water from any public service-pipe in such urban district at the rate of One shilling and sixpence for each tank of 400 gallons or for any less quantity.

8. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

9. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and no such pipe shall in any case exceed that known as a 4-in. pipe; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

10. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

12. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

13. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.
 14. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

15. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

16. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

17. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe, or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and, if none, the owner shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

18. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds, and in case he shall not, immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust may seem best.

19. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

20. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of the Regulations, or fail to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

21. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations and not otherwise, through pipes and meter laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said Regulations and not otherwise.

22. In the construction of these Regulations, the word "Trust" shall mean the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 7, was made by the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust this 5th day of October, 1892.

**SHIRE OF STAWELL WATERWORKS TRUST.—
 RATING REGULATION FOR 1893.**

THE Commissioners of the Shire of Stawell Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—
No. XII.—Regulation for the making of a Rate on all rateable property in the Shire of Stawell Waterworks District.

1. A rate of Tenpence in the pound sterling on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Shire of Stawell Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Stawell, is hereby made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1893, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1893.

2. Such rate is made payable on the 1st day of January, 1893.
 3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

The foregoing regulation No. XII. was made by the Commissioners of the Shire of Stawell Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 4th day of October, 1892.

**RIDDELL'S CREEK WATERWORKS TRUST.
 REGULATION No. 1.**

THE Commissioners of the Riddell's Creek Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach.

4. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes, or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

5. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to re-lay or re-fix the same, must satisfy the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workman-like manner, and shall pay a licence-fee of One pound per annum. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

6. Before any licensed person shall break up any road or footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Ten shillings, and in case he shall not immediately, after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said road or footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Ten shillings shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said road or footpath, or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.

7. The quality of the materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c. to be of the best galvanized iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.
- (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.
- (4) The whole of pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.
- (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high-pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.
- (6) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

8. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipe to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and water-tight ground outlet plug or cock.

9. All paddocks to which water is laid on must be provided with water-troughs fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

10. Buildings in the course of erection will be supplied with water at the rate of one per centum on the contract price of foundations, masonry, brickwork, and plastering, to be paid in advance before making any connexions. Buildings not being built by contract, at such a charge as shall be agreed to by the Trust. When a special connexion with the main has to be made the applicant must pay the cost of such connexion.

11. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except by permission of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

12. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all such times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

13. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where so supplied shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year.

14. The charge for street water-troughs shall be Twenty shillings per annum.

15. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—ADDITIONAL LOAN.

THE Governor in Council has, under the provisions of the *Water Act 1892* (No. 1156), approved the application of the Elmore Waterworks Trust for an additional loan of Five hundred pounds sterling (£500) for the purpose of constructing new works and extending the existing works of the said Waterworks Trust, in conformity with the detailed statement in that behalf dated the 23rd August, 1892.

The interest to be payable in respect of the sum of £500 granted as above to be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.
7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.
10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.
13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the trustees.
14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.
15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.
16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.
17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.
