To His Excellency the Governor in Council.

MAY it please Your Excellency, the humble petition of the under-signed sheweth—

1. That an association called The Young Men's Christian Association of Melbourne has been established in the city of Melbourne since the year 1871.
2. That the objects of such Association include, amongst other things, the promotion of health, temperance, and morality, the prevention of cruelty and vice and other cognate objects of a philanthropic and humane nature, as set out in section 19 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.
3. That the said Association is supported almost entirely by the voluntary contributions of not less than five hundred persons, each of whom has paid and pays not less than One pound per annum.
4. That your petitioners are annual voluntary contributors to such Association, and have each paid not less than One pound towards the support of such Association.

Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890.

REGULATION FOR DELIVERY OF SAMPLES OF COLONIAL SPIRITS FOR THE PURPOSE OF EFFECTING SALES.

THE following regulations are hereby approved:—

1. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1892.

2. On application by the distiller the Chief Inspector of Distilleries may cause to be issued to the distiller without payment of duty samples of spirits manufactured in order to facilitate sales, subject to the following conditions:—

From the Spirit Store or Compounding House.

(a) Samples not to exceed one imperial pint per vat of spirits prepared for casking, to be drawn into labelled bottles, each bearing the particulars of the bulk spirits from which the sample has been taken.

(b) When spirits prepared in any vat are bonded off one imperial pint sample to every five hogsheads or ten quarter-casks filled may, if required, be granted to the distiller, to be drawn into bottles labelled for the purpose from any of the vessels being filled. When the contents of any vessel filled are to be re-vatted or compounded no samples are to be allowed. Should the contents of any vessel which has been sampled be re-vatted or compounded one imperial pint only to be allowed from the spirits when re-vatted or compounded, in accordance with sub-section (a).

From the Bonded Warehouse.

(c) Samples if not drawn when the vessels are filled may be taken therefrom at any time after such vessels have been placed in the bonded warehouse in the same quantity as provided for in sub-section (b).

(d) No second sample shall be issued from any cask except by special permission of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries.

The samples drawn under these regulations shall be included in the allowance for waste provided for by the Act.

(f) The officer in charge of any distillery shall keep an account of the number and quantity of samples issued.

(g) Should the distiller wish to examine the spirits in any vessels for the purpose of ascertaining if they are marketable the officer in charge may permit samples to be drawn in his presence, such samples to be returned to the vessels from which they were taken, and the vessels afterwards properly bunged up or closed.

(h) All samples when removed from the distillery premises must be accompanied by a permit signed by the officer on duty and similar to that issued with duty-paid spirits.

3. All previous regulations regarding samples are hereby cancelled.

Also a beacon surmounted by a ball is placed westward the entrance of Kween Besar River, and a beacon surmounted by a cross in the south side of the bank eastward of Poenggoek River; and one cross beacon on the western extreme of the bank before the southern mouth of Martapoera River.

In difference with formerly the beacons surmounted by a ball are now placed on the eastern and the beacons surmounted by a cross on the western side.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1200) it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan district or any country district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Board or the Country Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare that any such municipal district, or any portion thereof, shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the Country Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation declare that the Borough of Sebastopol shall be added to and form part of the Central Fire District; that so much of the Shire of Euroa as lies within the boundaries of the township of Euroa, so much of the Shire of Mansfield as lies within the boundaries of the township of Mansfield, and so much of the Shire of Bright as lies within the boundaries of the township of Bright, shall be added to and form part of the North-Eastern Fire District; and that so much of the Shire of Omeo as lies within the boundaries of the township of Omeo, so much of the Shire of Traralgon as lies within the boundaries of the township of Morwell, and so much of the Shire of Warragul as lies within the boundaries of the township of Warragul, shall be added to and form part of the Eastern Fire District.

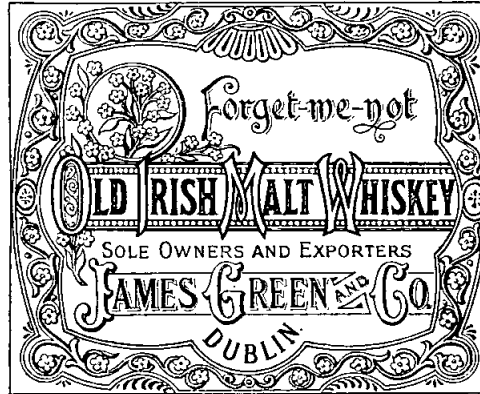

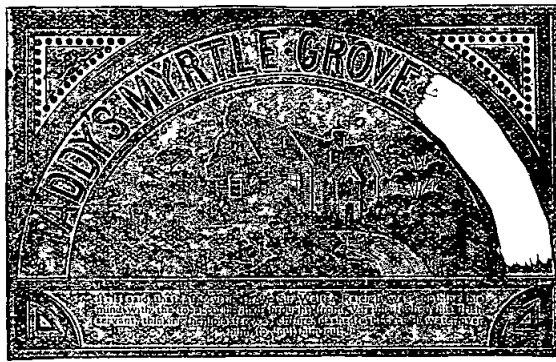
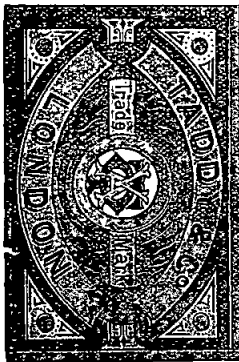

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (51 Vict. No. 1112, section 388) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Councils of the City of Hawthorn and the Shire of Boroondara have requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Councils for the purpose of making streets within the said City of Hawthorn and Shire of Boroondara respectively, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the City of Hawthorn and Shire of Boroondara aforesaid respectively, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890.—Part II., Division 2.
ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of January, 1892.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1032) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind such regulations as may be necessary or expedient for the carrying out of the provisions of Division 2 of the said Part of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations made under the said Part of the said Act, and bearing date the 3rd day of February, 1891, and doth order that such alterations shall have effect on and after the 29th day of January, 1892, that is to say:—

The following clause shall be added to and form portion of the second section of the Regulations of the 3rd February, 1891:—

“Provided that any one person may be licensed to manufacture, on his own premises only, not more than 2,500 cigars or 10,000 cigarettes per week on payment of a reduced fee of Five pounds (£5) per annum, payable quarterly in advance, and on entering into a bond himself in the sum of One hundred pounds (£100) with one or more sureties (not to exceed four) approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs for a further sum of One hundred pounds for the security of the duty which may become due on any cigars or cigarettes (as the case may be) which may have been manufactured in or upon such premises, and for the due and faithful observance of the terms, conditions, and requirements of the *Customs and Excise Duties Act 1890*, and of the regulations made or hereafter to be made thereunder. Any licence granted to such person may at any time be revoked by the said Commissioner if he think fit so to do without assigning any cause for so doing.

The following words shall be added to clause 6 of the Regulations above quoted:—

“A return showing the quantity of cigars or cigarettes (as the case may be) manufactured during the previous week shall be forwarded every Monday to the Chief Inspector of Excise.”

Section 11 of the above quoted Regulations is hereby cancelled, and the following shall be made and read in lieu thereof:—

“Every cigar or cigarette manufacturer shall give at least twenty-four hours' notice if his premises be in Melbourne or suburbs, and forty-eight hours' notice if his premises be in the country districts, in writing, to the Chief Inspector of Excise when he wishes to deliver his goods.”

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1892.

REGULATION No. 7.

REGULATIONS for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Borough Echuca Water Trust District, the same being duly supplied with water for the year 1892.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough Echuca Water Trust District shall pay for the year 1892, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty-five pounds or less, the sum of Twenty-five shillings.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty-five pounds, in addition to the Twenty-five shillings named in the last clause, a sum of Four pounds per centum for every pound from Twenty-six pounds to One hundred pounds inclusive, and a sum of Three pounds per centum on every pound from One hundred pounds upwards.

4. On every cordial or aerated-water factory, or other factory, a charge of Ten pounds per centum, and on every flour-mill a charge of Fifteen pounds per annum.

5. On every steam-engine a charge of Twenty shillings, not to include any engine working any factory or mill named in clause 4.

6. On every livery-stable a charge of Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

7. On every hotel a charge of Five pounds per centum on the valuation up to One hundred and fifty pounds, and for every pound from One hundred and fifty pounds upwards a charge of Three pounds per centum, including eight stalls, every extra stall One shilling.

8. On every horse-trough a charge of Twenty shillings.

9. On houses, lands, hotels, &c., &c., using a hose, in addition to the foregoing charges named, for each respectively a charge of Twenty shillings.

10. The charge for every private house shall include one quarter acre of land; should any larger quantity of land be attached to a private house, and water laid thereon, an extra charge of Ten shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre shall be paid.

11. In cases where parties have gardens from any part of which produce is sold, in addition to the ordinary charge for domestic purposes, they shall pay an additional charge of Fifty shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre cultivated or watered.

Cases where water is not laid on.

12. WHEREAS by a mortgage dated the 10th July, 1891, made under the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, by the Omeo Waterworks Trust, the interest on the loan of Three thousand pounds sterling (£3,000) obtained by such Waterworks Trust from the Government is made payable from the 14th February, 1891: And whereas by section 90 of the aforesaid *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, the Governor in Council is empowered to direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in any such mortgage, the interest on money so secured shall be charged from a date not more than two years subsequent to the date in that behalf specified in such mortgage: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the aforesaid section 90, doth hereby direct that the interest on the money secured by the above-mentioned mortgage shall be charged from the 1st day of January, 1892.

13. On each allotment or piece of land rated separately from any tenement, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of same, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings and sixpence.

Meters.

14. The charge of water supplied by meter shall be Three shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the amount shall not in any case be less than the charges hereinbefore made.

15. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Three shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons.

16. The foregoing Regulations were duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, at their office, Echuca, on the 18th day of November, 1891, and the seal of the Trust was affixed hereto this 20th day of November, 1891.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Eastern Vermin District shall be Ten shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District shall be Four shillings per square mile.

The annual fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Eastern Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence shall be Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing.

The annual fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence shall be Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing.

TOWN OF ESSENDON.

REGULATION No. 9.

A Regulation of the Town of Essendon, made under the first section of Part IV. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1890*, in force in the town by virtue of a By-law of the said town, and numbered 12, for regulating the management and control of the lending branch of the Essendon Public Library.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890* the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Essendon order as follows:—

1. The lending branch shall be open from 2 to 5 and 7 to 9 p.m. every day except Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, or such other days as the town council or the committee may by order appoint.
2. Any person satisfying the librarian that he is a resident ratepayer of the town, and on depositing 5s., may borrow books from the lending branch.
3. Every application for the loan of books shall be in the form provided from time to time by the town council.
4. The librarian may issue to any person who may borrow, on his or her personal application, a borrower's ticket, which shall entitle its holder for twelve months to borrow books subject to the regulations of the lending branch.
5. All books borrowed must be returned to the librarian within a fortnight, and for every failure to comply with this condition the borrower shall incur a fine, to be paid to the librarian, of 3d. a day.
6. No book can be obtained from the lending branch by a borrower who has not paid all fines incurred.
7. There shall be no obligation to send notice of any fine incurred by a borrower, and failure to send such notice shall be no excuse for non-payment of fines.
8. The librarian shall cause each book returned to be examined, and if it shall be found to have been injured, the borrower shall within one week of the date on which the injury has been notified to him, replace or pay to the librarian the value of any book, set, or series injured. The borrower shall be entitled to the injured book, set, or series, on depositing with the librarian its full value or a new copy. The librarian shall be sole judge of the value of any book, set, or series, and of the injury done to them.
9. Borrowers ceasing to use the library are required to return their tickets to the librarian in order to have them cancelled, as until the tickets are returned borrowers remain responsible for any book taken out in their names.
10. Borrowers changing their residence are required to notify the change to the librarian, and to have their addresses entered on their tickets. The right to borrow may be forfeited for failure to comply with this condition.

11. If a borrower's ticket be lost, a second ticket may be issued in the manner provided in the case of the issue of the ticket in the first instance. If the second ticket be lost, three months must elapse from the time of the notification of the fact to the librarian before a third ticket shall be issued.

12. Borrowers losing their tickets are required to give immediate notice in writing to the librarian, and until they have done so shall be liable for any books taken out in their names.

13. Borrowers must under no circumstances transfer their tickets for use to any other person.

14. Borrowers must not lend books taken from the library, nor exchange them with each other.

15. No borrower shall be allowed to have more than one volume at the same time. When, however, the connexion of two or more volumes of one work makes the use of the whole of the works necessary, several volumes may be issued together, the number of volumes to be plainly written on the application card in such cases.

16. In applying for books at the delivery desk, borrowers, after ascertaining that the book is in, must write on the cards supplied for the purpose—

- (1) The same name and address as on the borrower's ticket.
- (2) The shelf number and title of the book desired, in the proper columns; and hand in the card and ticket together at the desk.

17. Borrowers must ascertain from the catalogues, and not from the library officers, the shelf number of the book desired.

18. Borrowers finding any book written on, defaced, or mutilated are required to report the fact to the librarian.

19. No person other than an officer of the library can be admitted to the shelves.

20. No loan of a book will be renewed if the book be required by another borrower.

21. If a borrower find a book wanted by him out, on deposit of an addressed post-card with the librarian the return of the book will be notified to him, and the book kept two days for him.

22. The librarian has power to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the rules of the library, or who is, in his opinion, for other reasons, not to be intrusted with books.

23. Every book must, under a penalty of 5s., be returned to the librarian at such times as shall be publicly announced.
