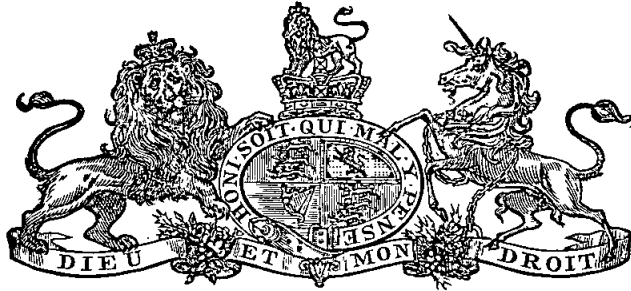

SUNKEN WRECK IN THE VICINITY OF NO. 3 BUOY, WEST CHANNEL, PORT PHILLIP BAY.

Leading Lights at Macquarie Harbor, West Coast, Tasmania.

It is hereby notified for general information that, on and after Wednesday, the 1st of June, 1892, two lights will be exhibited at the entrance of Macquarie Harbor, the position and characteristics of which are as follows:—A white fixed light of the fourth order dioptric will be exhibited from a tower erected on Entrance Island, 34 feet above the sea level, in lat. 42° 12' S. long. 145° 13' 30" E. (approximate), and will be visible in clear weather (where not intercepted by land) 11 miles, and a fixed green light of the fifth order dioptric will be exhibited from a tower erected on Bushy (Cap and Bonnet) Islets, 45 feet in height. These towers are on the site formerly occupied by the leading beacons.

SPECIAL WARNING TO MARINERS.

Compasses.—Heeling Error.

THE attention of mariners has been directed by the Board of Trade "To the necessity of exercising a constant watchfulness in regard to the error of their navigating compasses, more particularly to the heeling error, the neglect of which is doubtless a common, though often unsuspected, cause of the stranding of many vessels.

"Serious changes frequently take place in the character and amount of the heeling error as the ship changes her magnetic latitude from (1) the vertical force arising from the permanent magnetism of the ship, the error from which is greatest in high latitudes, diminishes until the equator is reached, where it is least, and increases again in the opposite hemisphere, but still retaining the same name; (2) from vertical induction in vertical and transverse soft iron, generally (such as beams, &c.), the error from which is greatest in high latitudes, diminishes until the equator is reached, where it becomes nil, and increases again (but of an opposite name) as the vessel recedes from the equator in the opposite hemisphere. It is difficult, therefore, to predict, with any great accuracy, the change that will take place, observations at every possible opportunity being the only reliable safeguard.

"In the northern hemisphere in ships built with their heads from about south-east, through north, to south-west (the usual effect of the permanent magnetism of the ship, then conspiring with that of her vertical and transverse soft iron), the north point of her compass needle, assuming the compass to be on the upper deck and on the after portion of the ship as usual, will, as a general rule, be drawn to windward or to the high side of the ship, the nearer the ship's head was to north whilst building the greater the error that may be expected; the effect being to throw the ship to windward of her supposed position when steering on northerly courses, and to leeward on southerly courses, the error decreasing as the equator is approached, and small, perhaps of a contrary name, in the southern hemisphere.

"In ships built with their heads from about south-east, through south, to south-west (the usual effect of the permanent magnetism, and that of the transverse, &c., iron, being then contrary to each other), the north end of the compass needle may be drawn to leeward, depending upon whether the vertical force of the permanent magnetism or that of the induced magnetism of transverse iron predominates, but the error would then, as a general rule, be small in these latitudes and large in the southern hemisphere.

"It has been established as a rule, however, that in the northern hemisphere (in compasses above the upper deck) in the majority of iron ships, the north point of the compass needle is drawn to windward, the consequence being that, if this is not allowed for, a ship will go to windward of her supposed position on northerly courses and to leeward on southerly courses.

"The heeling error is always greatest with the ship's head at or near north or south by the disturbed compass, and least, or nil, with the ship's head east or west. It is particularly important, therefore, should the vessel heel over, either from the effect of the wind, or the cargo, when steering in a northerly or southerly direction, that the mariner should use every precaution, and never lose an opportunity of ascertaining the errors of his compass.

"The heeling error may be small or large, depending greatly upon the position of the compass—it has been known to exceed 2° for every degree heel of the ship—and is directly proportional to the amount of heel; consequently, if the error at north or south for 1° of heel is known, the error for any other direction of the ship's head, and amount of heel, can be found by the usual methods.

"Mariners are further warned that the adjustment of compasses by magnets, soft iron, &c., is for bringing the error within manageable limits, and for equalizing the directive force of the needle, and must only be considered approximate for the latitude in which the adjustment was made; and that they should lose no opportunity of verifying the error both in port and at sea, as it is constantly changing from numerous causes, the chief amongst which are heeling, change of latitude, change of cargo, collision, after repairs, and from the ship remaining with her head in one direction for a length of time, &c."

Section 125 of Act 1093.

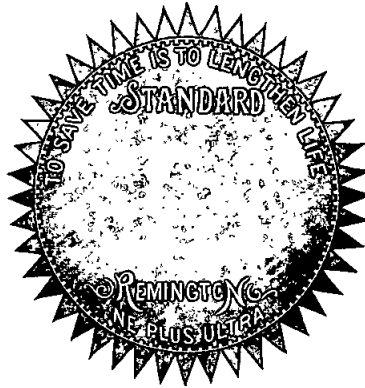

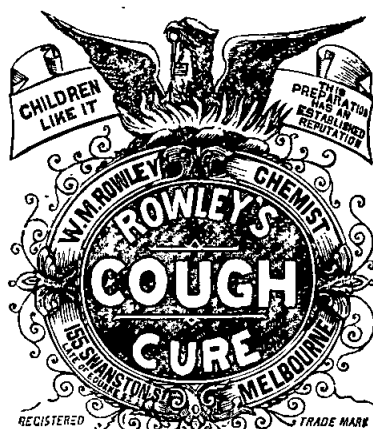

3. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. 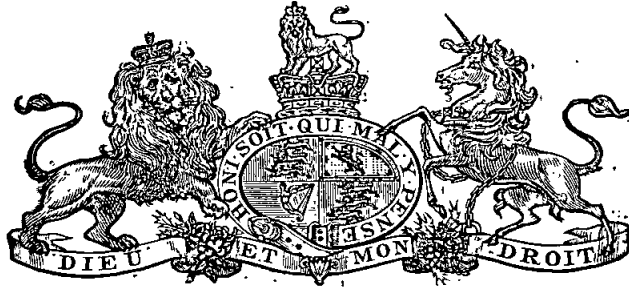

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS:

BY-LAW No. 93.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS DEPUTY COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts 1890 and 1891, do hereby make the following by-law, and all previous by-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

FARES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. The Passenger Fares, Ordinary, Holiday Excursion, and Periodical (Suburban Lines excepted) as shown in By-law No. 90 are hereby increased by $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.
2. The percentages allowed on Quarterly, Half-yearly, and Yearly tickets, on Country Lines, are fixed as follows:—Quarterly, 10 per cent. off three monthlies; Half-yearly, 5 per cent. off two quarterlies; Yearly, $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. off two Half-yearlies.

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

3. The Mileage Rates for Goods as shown in By-law No. 89 are hereby increased as follows:—On Special A, Special B, Miscellaneous, First, Second, Third, and Fourth Class goods an increase of 10 per cent. is made. The special rates on Goods between Melbourne and Geelong, the Rates on Goods for Riverina on which rebates are now granted, and the Agricultural Implements and Machines specified in clauses 4 and 5 of this by-law are exempt from this increase.
4. Agricultural Implements not specified in the Goods Tariff, also Winnowing, Chaff-cutting, Smut Flour-dressing, Hay-raking, Elevating, Cheese-pressing, and Steam-ploughing Machines, Portable, Donkey, and Traction Engines, with or without steam-rollers, to be charged Second Class Rates and be carried at owner's risk.
5. Machines.—Stripping, Threshing, Reaping, Clod-crushing, Horse-working, Hay and Wine pressing, Reaping and Binding, and Harvesting to be charged First Class Rates and be carried at owner's risk.
6. The Wool Rates as shown in By-Law No. 89 are hereby increased by 10 per cent.—the Special Rates on Riverine Wool and the Rates on the Williamstown and Port Melbourne lines being exempt.

7. The Live Stock Rates as shown in By-law No. 89 are hereby increased by 5 per cent. Single animals, horses not in goods trucks, race-horses, horses between Melbourne and Sydney, and Melbourne and Adelaide, and dogs to be exempt from this increase.

8. The rate for sheep on "Off-days" to be a reduction of 10 per cent. on the ordinary rates.

9. Store cattle or horses carried in accordance with the conditions in By-Law No. 89 to be charged two-thirds of the ordinary rates.

10. Agricultural Machines and Implements, Live Stock, and Produce returned from Agricultural Shows will be conveyed free if the conditions in By-Law No. 89 are complied with, but no refund of any part of the freight to the Show will be made.
