WHEREAS by the *Neglected Children's Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, make, alter, and repeal Regulations for the purposes set forth in section 88 of the said Act: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the Regulations made on the fourth day of August, 1890, under the Act aforesaid, be altered by adding to the 54th clause thereof the words—

“Provisions shall be issued in the Probationary School for Boys at Ballarat in accordance with the dietary scale set forth in the Sixth Schedule to the Regulations made under Part II., Division 2, of the *Crimes Act 1890*.”

PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.—ST. KILDA.—BATHING OF HORSES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John-Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations, and any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following addition to the General Rules for the Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

Bathing of horses is prohibited from any part of the fore-shore extending from St. Kilda Jetty to Point Ormond, except on that portion of the beach lying between the north side of Blessington-street and the outlet of the main drain near Brook's Boathouse, where horses may be bathed between the hours of Six o'clock p.m. and Eleven o'clock a.m.

Eagle Nest or Split Point Light.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners published 26th June, 1891, notice is hereby given that on and after the 30th August, 1892, the arc of the red or principal light will be reduced and will illuminate an arc of 150° seaward, or from one mile and a half off Point Addis round seaward to one mile off Cape Patton, while the arc of white light shown from the principal light towards Point Addis will be increased about 3° thereby illuminating an arc of white light extending from the shore to one mile and a half off Point Addis.

The white lights are to warn mariners of their too close proximity to the shore or lighthouse, and care should be taken to round Split Point or Eagle Nest at a distance of not less than three miles from the lighthouse.

Upon the Split Point light being altered as herein notified, masters of sailing vessels bound for Port Phillip from the westward, when abreast of such lighthouse by night, may proceed on to the outer pilot cruising station until the high white light on Shortland's Bluff is sighted, and, in cases where the master has not an exempt pilot's certificate, the requisite pilot is on board. Mariners should not lose sight of the Split Point red light until they sight the high white light on Shortland's Bluff, which should be seen in ordinary weather after they have proceeded a distance of thirteen (13) miles from Split Point towards Port Phillip Heads.

The pilot station has been extended three (3) miles beyond the former boundary, and two pilot schooners are constantly cruising outside when there is a possibility of keeping the sea.

The middle cruising station is comprised within a radius of seven (7) miles from the centre of Port Phillip Heads to seaward.

The outer cruising station extends from the outer boundary of the middle cruising station to a point distant fifteen (15) miles from the centre of Port Phillip Heads upon a line bearing north-east by north and south-west by south.

The western boundary extends from the aforesaid point towards the shore, Zealey Point bearing north-west by north.

The southern boundary extends from the same point towards Cape Schanck, bearing east three-quarters north until Arthur's Seat bears north-east one quarter north; and thence on the same bearing towards the shore which forms the eastern boundary.

SHIRE OF BOROONDARA.

BY-LAW No. 8.

A By-law of the Shire of Boroondara made under section 35 of the Health Act 1890 to prevent the carriage of fruit or other food and fruit cases on vehicles laden with manure.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the Council of the Shire of Boroondara, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, do hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 8 of the said shire, that is to say—

No person shall place, carry, or have in or on any vehicle containing manure or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, or other food, in such manner that such fruit, vegetables, or other food, or such case or receptacle, shall be in contact with or be liable to be in contact with such manure or offensive matter, or to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom.

Any person guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings nor less than Five shillings.

A Regulation of the Town of Essendon, made under the 1st section of Part IV. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1890*, in force in the said town by virtue of a by-law of the said town, numbered Twelve, for regulating the management and control of the Essendon Public Library.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Essendon make the following Regulation:-

Regulation, dated 1st February, 1892, and erroneously numbered as No. 9 of the Town of Essendon, made under the first section of Part IV. of the 13th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1890*, in force in the town by virtue of a by-law of the said town, and numbered 12, for regulating the management and control of the lending branch of the Essendon Public Library, and gazetted in the *Government Gazette* of 5th February, 1892, and the Regulation No. 1 of the said town, are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be substituted:-

1. The Essendon Public Library shall be governed by a committee consisting of not less than three members of the council of the town of Essendon, such committee to be appointed in the same manner as that provided in section 182 of the *Local Government Act 1890*.

2. The objects of the said library shall be the diffusion of literary, scientific, and useful knowledge, by means of a free and circulating library, the delivery of lectures, and the formation of classes for the advancement of art, science, and literature.

3. The librarian or officer of the council shall have full control under the direction of the committee of the library, and be the custodian of all books, papers, and property appertaining thereto.

4. The said library shall be open from Two to Five, and Seven to Nine p.m. every day, except Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, or such other days and hours as the town council or the said committee may by order appoint.

5. Any person satisfying the librarian that he is a resident ratepayer of the town, and on depositing Five shillings, may borrow books from the said library, upon signing the application contained in the First Schedule hereto, or an application made in accordance with clause 6 of this Regulation.

6. Every application for the loan of books shall be in the form provided from time to time by the town council.

7. The librarian may issue to any person who may borrow on his or her personal application a borrower's ticket, in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, which shall entitle its holder for twelve months to borrow books subject to the regulations of the library.

8. All books borrowed must be returned to the librarian within a fortnight, and for every failure to comply with this condition the borrower shall incur a fine, to be paid to the librarian, of Threepence a day.

9. No book can be obtained from the said library by a borrower who has not paid all fines incurred.

10. There shall be no obligation to send notice of any fine incurred by a borrower, and failure to send such notice shall be no excuse for non-payment of fines.

11. The librarian shall cause each book returned to be examined, and if it shall be found to have been injured, the borrower shall within one week of the date on which the injury has been notified to him, replace or pay to the librarian the value of any book, set, or series injured. The borrower shall be entitled to the injured book, set, or series on depositing with the librarian its full value or a new copy. The librarian shall be sole judge of the value of any book, set, or series, and of the injury done to them.

12. Borrowers ceasing to use the library are required to return their tickets to the librarian in order to have them cancelled, as until the tickets are returned borrowers remain responsible for any book taken out in their names.

13. Borrowers changing their residence are required to notify the change to the librarian, and to have their addresses entered on their tickets. The right to borrow may be forfeited for failure to comply with this condition.

14. If a borrower's ticket be lost, a second ticket may be issued in the manner provided in the case of the issue of the ticket in the first instance. If the second ticket be lost, three months must elapse from the time of the notification of the fact to the librarian before a third ticket shall be issued.

15. Borrowers losing their tickets are required to give immediate notice in writing to the librarian, and until they have done so shall be liable for any books taken out in their names.

16. Borrowers must under no circumstances transfer their tickets for use to any other person.

17. Borrowers must not lend books taken from the library, nor exchange them with each other.

18. No borrower shall be allowed to have more than one volume at the same time. When, however, the connexion of two or more volumes of one work makes the use of the whole of the works necessary, several volumes may be issued together, the number of volumes to be plainly written on the application card in such cases.

19. In applying for books at the delivery-desk borrowers, after ascertaining that the book is in, must write on the cards supplied for the purpose.

(1) The same name and address as on the borrower's ticket.
(2) The shelf-number and title of the book desired in the proper columns, and hand in the card and ticket together at the desk.

20. Borrowers must ascertain from the catalogues, and not from the library officers, the shelf-number of the book desired.

21. Borrowers finding any book written on, defaced, or mutilated, are required to report the fact to the librarian.

22. No person other than an officer of the library can be admitted to the shelves.

23. No loan of a book will be renewed if the book be required by another borrower.

24. If a borrower finds a book wanted by him out, on deposit of an addressed post card with the librarian the return of the book will be notified to him, and the book kept two days for him.

25. The librarian has power to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the rules of the library, or who is, in his opinion, for other reasons not to be intrusted with books.

26. Every book must, under a penalty of 5s., be returned to the librarian at such times as shall be publicly announced.
