## DEFENCE DEPARTMENT.—FINANCIAL AND STORE REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to order the following alterations in the Financial and Store Regulations of the Defence Department, made on the 9th day of February, 1892:—

## VICTORIAN ARTILLERY.

## Part I., Section II., Sub-section I.

Paragraph 22.—This paragraph is altered to read:—

"Working pay may be issued to officers on the approval of the Minister when they are employed in superintending working parties for which the issue of working pay is authorized."

## GENERAL REGULATIONS, ORDNANCE STORES.

## Part VII., Section I.

Paragraph 157 is cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—

"In all cases where stores are lost, damaged, or have become unserviceable from any cause, the commanding officer in charge of the stores will assemble a Board to report on them, unless the value is under £1 or they come within the scope of paragraph 155. These Boards should only be held at quarterly intervals, viz., on the 1st of March, 1st of June, 1st of September, and 1st of December, except in cases of urgency, when they may be assembled at any time, special explanation being given of the necessity for such a course."

"When the total quarterly value of the articles to be struck off charge does not exceed £1, or when they come within the scope of paragraph 155, the certificate of the commanding officer of the corps will be sufficient."

"In cases of loss or damage it will be the duty of the Board to express an opinion by whom the loss should be borne."

## ALLOWANCE OF AMMUNITION AND STORES FOR INSTRUCTIONAL PURPOSES.

## Part VII., Section III.

Paragraph 190 (Small-arms Ammunition):—

Rifle Clubs, M.-H. ball.—The number of rounds is reduced from 100 to 50.

Victorian Artillery.—The number of rounds of M.-H. blank per man is reduced from 120 to 100.

Infantry.—The number of rounds of M.-H. blank per man is reduced from 150 to 100.

The foregoing alteration shall take effect from the 1st day of July, 1892.

## VICTORIAN NAVAL BRIGADE.—ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to order the following alterations in the Regulations for the Victorian Naval Brigade, made on the 8th day of October, 1888:—

## SECTION III.—DISCIPLINE.

After paragraph 8, the following new paragraph is added:—

8A. It is strictly forbidden for any member of the Force to make any application for promotion, leave of absence, change of quarters, or upon any other matter affecting his position in the service, except through his commanding officer.

The following paragraphs are cancelled, provision for the same being made in the Financial Regulations of 9th February, 1892:—

In section IV., paragraphs 18 to 25 inclusive (Effective Allowance), and paragraph 30 (Hire of Drill-rooms).

In section VIII., the following part of paragraph 2:—  
"Commissioned Officers so attached to the Permanent Force shall receive 10s. per diem, and Warrant Officers 8s. per diem, and rations to scale."

In section IX., paragraphs 6 and 7 (Allowance for Uniform to Officers).

In paragraph 8, "M.H. rifle ammunition, rolled, per 100 rounds, 5s.," the price is altered from 5s. to 7s. 6d. per 100 rounds. This alteration shall take effect from the 1st day of July, 1892.

Paragraph 12.—In the first line, for "100 rounds of ammunition will be issued free," read "50 rounds of ammunition will be issued free." To take effect from the 1st day of July, 1892.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW NO. 97.

FOR HIRING OF TRUCKS FOR LIVE STOCK.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS DEPUTY COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts 1890 and 1891, do hereby make the following By-law for the hiring of trucks for the conveyance of live stock, and fixing the charges relating thereto, that is to say:—

1. All orders for the conveyance of live stock per goods or stock trains are to be made to the Traffic Manager on the printed form provided for that purpose. Those sent by telegram, letter, or through a station-master or other railway officer, will be subject to the same conditions as if made on the printed form.
2. Every order must be accompanied with a deposit of Twenty shillings for each truck. Recognised agents can lodge a sufficient sum to cover the extent of their orders in hand at any one time, or give a written guarantee that they will be answerable for any penalties that may be imposed if these conditions are not complied with.
3. No order can be accepted or taken till within twenty-one days of the date on which the stock is to be conveyed.
4. An order once lodged and accepted can only be withdrawn, or number of trucks reduced at any time, not being less than three clear days before the date of conveyance, by forfeiting the deposit of Twenty shillings for each truck so withdrawn.
5. No order can be withdrawn or reduced or altered within three clear days of date of conveyance, except on payment of full freight of trucks from station to station shown on the order.
6. All trucks ordered under fourteen in one order, and not used on the date and at the station specified in the order, will be charged for as if used. In orders of fourteen trucks and upwards a margin of one truck to every fourteen will be allowed.
7. Live stock must be yarded in ample time to be loaded and despatched by trains specified by Traffic Manager. If not loaded as arranged, the Commissioners reserve the right to remove the trucks and charge full rate for them.
8. The Commissioners do not guarantee to deliver live stock at any particular time or for any particular market.
9. Sundays are not included in the number of days to be reckoned.

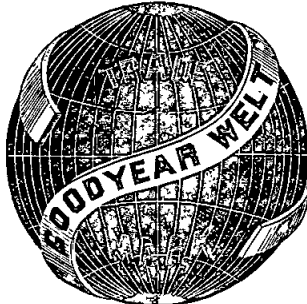

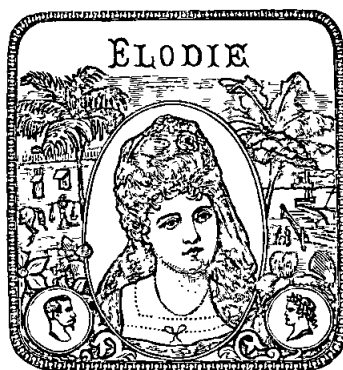

## ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of June, 1892.*

## PRESENT :

WHEREAS by Section 142, Part I., of the *Land Act 1890*, it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions therein contained, the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations for the better carrying into effect of that part of the said Act, and may at any time alter or repeal any such regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby repeal Schedule 6A to the Regulations under the aforesaid Act, made by Order in Council dated the 13th day of June, 1892, and doth order that the following shall be Schedule 6A to the said Regulations in lieu thereof, viz. :—

## LEASE OF PASTORAL ALLOTMENTS.

## SCHEDULE 6A.

LEASE UNDER SECTION 21 OF THE "LAND ACT 1890" AS AMENDED BY THE "LAND ACT 1891."

THIS Indenture made the first day of \_\_\_\_\_ in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-\_\_\_\_\_ between His Excellency The Right Honorable John Adrian Louis Earl of Hopetoun Viscount Aithrie and Baron Hope in the Peerage of Scotland Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle in the Peerage of the United Kingdom Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies in the name and on behalf of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria of the first part the Board of Land and Works (hereafter referred to as "the Board") of the second part and of \_\_\_\_\_ Victoria (hereinafter called the "Lessee") of the third part.

premises hereby demised with or without horses cattle and other animals carts waggons and carriages to or from such pastoral allotment grazing area or part thereof or to or from any claim or mine from and to any public road or track subject to such regulation to be made by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council as may for the time being be in force. And also excepting and reserving unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors by the Governor with the advice aforesaid to grant in manner and on the conditions prescribed in Part I. Division VIII. of the *Land Act 1890* licences to any person to enter upon any of the land comprised in this lease and search for cut dig and take away live or dead timber coal and other mineral gravel salt guano sand and resin stone or limestone loam brick or other earth. To have and to hold the premises hereinbefore expressed to be hereby demised unto the lessee his executors administrators and assigns for the term of years and calendar months from the day of the date of this lease. Yielding and paying therefor during the said term the yearly rent of by two equal half-yearly payments in advance on the first day of and the first day of in every year clear of all deductions the first of the said half-yearly payments having been made as aforesaid the next of the said half-yearly payments to be made on the first day of next and the last of the said half-yearly payments to be made on the first day of next preceding the expiration of the said term. And the lessee doth hereby for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns covenant and agree with Her Majesty her heirs and successors that he the lessee his executors administrators or assigns will during the said term observe perform and be bound by the several covenants conditions provisos agreements acts matters and things hereinafter contained (that is to say):—

1. That he or they will pay the said rent hereinbefore reserved at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions:

2. That he or they will during the said term pay all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time being payable either by landlord or tenant in respect of the said premises:

3. That he or they will not assign sublet or subdivide or part with the possession of the land hereby demised or any portion thereof without the previous consent of the Board of Land and Works signified in writing:

*Nota.*—The lengths of the boundaries are approximately given in this plan in chains.

4. That he or they will at once after the granting of this lease commence and continue to destroy and will within three years after the granting of this lease have destroyed to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works the animals and birds by the *Land Act 1890* included in the term "vermin" or which the Governor with the advice aforesaid may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to be vermin for the purposes of the said Act upon such land and will keep the same free of such animals and birds Bathurst burr wild briar and gorse to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works during the currency of the term hereby granted:

10. That these presents shall become absolutely void on any assignment thereof save under the provisions of the *Land Act 1890*:

11. That he or they shall and will observe perform fulfil and be bound by the stipulations conditions covenants and provisos contained in the Schedule hereto:

Provided always and it is hereby agreed and declared—

12. That Her Majesty her heirs and successors may at any time and from time to time during the said term resume possession of the whole or any part or parts of the land hereby demised which may in the opinion of the Governor with the advice aforesaid be required for the purposes of water supply irrigation works races dams and ditches forest or timber reserves or for public railways roads canals or for tramways or other internal communication through such lands or for mining purposes or for the purpose of obtaining or removing therefrom guano or other manure stone or earth or for sites of inns stores smithies bakeries or similar buildings or of bathing-houses bathing-places fishermen's residences drying grounds fellmongering establishments slaughter-houses lime-kilns bridges

13. That Her Majesty her heirs and successors may at any time and from time to time during the term hereby granted in accordance with the Regulations aforesaid resume as sites for townships or villages or for mining purposes and re-enter upon any lands forming the whole or any part of the land hereby demised upon payment to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns of the full value of all houses fences (being fences within the meaning assigned to the word "fence" by the *Land Act 1890*) wells reservoirs tanks dams and of all substantial and permanent improvements made erected or constructed by such lessee his executors administrators or assigns on the lands so resumed but nothing herein or in the said Act contained shall be construed to give a better tenure to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns in regard to the right of miners to enter upon the land hereby demised in search of gold than was possessed by pastoral tenants under *The Land Act 1869* :

That in case possession of any part or parts of the said land being resumed under either of the preceding provisions the covenants provisions and agreements herein contained with reference to the whole of the premises shall continue in force and apply to such part of the same as shall be left in the possession of the lessee his executors administrators or assigns.

17. That the term hereby granted may be determined by Her Majesty her heirs or successors at any time by not less than three years' previous notice in writing of such intention addressed to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns being served upon him or them or left upon any part of the lands comprised in this lease and published in three consecutive ordinary numbers of the *Government Gazette* and upon payment to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns for his interest in this lease together with the value of houses fences (being fences within the meaning aforesaid) wells reservoirs tanks dams and of all substantial and permanent improvements made erected or constructed by the lessee prior to the date of such notice and during the currency of this lease on the lands so resumed provided that the sum paid in respect of such improvements by the Board of Land and Works shall not exceed the sum expended thereon by the lessee his executors administrators or assigns and that such sum shall be determined in accordance with the regulations aforesaid and every such determination shall be binding and conclusive and the compensation to be paid to the lessee in respect of his interest in this lease shall be determined in manner by law required.

18. That these presents are upon this condition that if and whenever there shall be a breach of or non-compliance with any of the covenants by the lessee herein contained and the Governor with the advice aforesaid shall determine that this lease shall in consequence be avoided (and the production of the minute of the proceedings of the Executive Council whereat such determination was arrived at shall be conclusive evidence thereof) or if the land hereby demised or any part thereof is assigned whether by operation of law or otherwise except as hereinbefore mentioned or as in the Land Acts otherwise expressly provided then these presents and the term hereby created shall be void and of no effect and immediately thereupon it shall be lawful for any bailiffs of Crown lands or for any other agents or officers authorized in that behalf by Her Majesty or by the Governor with the advice aforesaid without any demand whatsoever to enter upon the land hereby demised and the lessee his executors administrators and assigns and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectively as any sheriff might do in case Her Majesty had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land or in an action for the recovery of land and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or writ of possession or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law. ## BENDIGO DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

**A** MENDED By-laws of the Bendigo Gold District General Hospital, incorporated.

## INTRODUCTORY.

I. All by-laws made prior to the date of the making of these by-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

II. In these by-laws the word "governor" shall mean and be equivalent to the word "contributor" in the Act of Parliament of Victoria No. 1099.

## OBJECT.

III. The object of this institution shall be to afford medical and surgical aid to the sick poor, and to relieve casualties.

IV. Medical and surgical aid may also be afforded to persons able and willing to pay for such aid at such rates as the board of management may determine upon.

V. Should at any time the applications for admission be in excess of the means for accommodation the poor shall be admitted in preference to those who are able to pay.

## COMMON SEAL.

VI. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept by the treasurer, and shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing except by order of the committee at a meeting at which five members at least are present at the time of making such order, and for which meeting notice to make such order has been given.

## GOVERNORS AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

VII. Contributors to the maintenance fund of £1 and upwards shall be annual governors, and as such entitled to recommend one in-patient during the year for every £1 contributed, the year to be computed from the date of contribution.

VIII. Every contributor of £10 (ten pounds) or upwards of his own money shall be a life governor; and every person who shall raise by one or more collections in one year the sum of £20 (twenty pounds) or upwards from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions toward such sum shall also be a life governor; but no person shall be considered to have raised £20 unless he has obtained such sum by his own voluntary exertions. Any registered friendly society, trading or mining company, club, or other association donating £10 (ten pounds) or upwards in one sum may nominate any member of such society, company, club, or association as an honorary life governor in return for such donation. Honorary life governors shall not be entitled to a vote at any meeting of contributors, or to a seat on the board of management, but shall be entitled to recommend for admission to the hospital for out-door relief one case every year. No proceeds of any public entertainment of any kind originated or carried out in aid of the charities shall entitle any person to be enrolled as a life governor.

IX. Every governor shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and every life governor shall be entitled to vote by proxy.

X. Every yearly subscription shall be paid in advance, and every first yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of such payment, but no such first yearly payment shall entitle to a vote at a general meeting within one month from the date of such payment.

XI. The privileges of annual governors shall be suspended until all arrears are paid.

## BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.

XII. The board of management shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, and treasurer, and nine members of committee, who shall be elected by the governors.

XIII. The president, vice-presidents, and treasurer respectively shall hold office for one year and thereafter until the election of their successors, but shall be capable of re-election.

XIV. Except as hereinafter provided all governors of hospital shall be capable of being elected as officers of the corporation, or as members of the committee, but no paid or honorary officer of the institution shall be capable of being elected on the committee.

XV. No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation or be concerned or participate in anywise in any contract with the committee or in the profit thereof, or of any work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such committee, provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than ten persons, when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association. But no member of the committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the committee in which he shall, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

XVI. The board of management shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the hospital—the same not being repugnant to the general rules—present a report to the annual meetings, and manage the affairs of the institution generally.

XVII. Five members shall form a quorum.

XVIII. All accounts for payment shall be passed by the board and signed at the meeting by the chairman.

XIX. Should vacancies occur in the office of members of the board of management, honorary medical officers, or auditors, the board shall supply such vacancies for the remainder of that year.

## VISITING COMMITTEE.

XX. The house visiting committee, consisting of three members, shall be elected every three months, by and from the committee of management.

XXI. It shall be the duty of the visiting committee, or one of its members, to visit the hospital at least once a week, to inspect the several wards and offices, and report thereon at the monthly meeting of committee; also to offer any suggestion as to necessary repairs, alterations, and improvements, or general management of the institution.

## TREASURER.

XXII. The treasurer shall receive all moneys on behalf of the institution, and deposit the same in such bank as the committee shall direct, to the credit of the Bendigo Hospital. He shall pay all accounts passed by the committee by drafts on the bank, which shall be countersigned at the meeting by the chairman. He shall keep an account of all money received and paid, and report the same to each monthly meeting of the committee, and shall present a financial report to the annual general meeting of governors, the same being previously examined and signed by the auditors.

## AUDITORS.

XXIII. The annual general meeting in July shall elect two governors, not members of the board of management, as auditors for that year.

XXIV. The auditors shall, at the end of each year, examine the treasurer's annual financial report, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual general meeting.

## HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

XXV. The honorary medical staff shall consist of six medical practitioners, who must be legally qualified and who shall be elected at the annual meeting in July, 1892. The two lowest on the poll respectively at such election shall go out of office in July, 1893, and the two next lowest on the poll at such election shall go out of office in July, 1894, and the two highest on the poll at such election shall go out of office in July, 1895. In case the number of candidates in July, 1892, do not exceed the number to be elected, the committee shall decide by lot which officers shall retire in July, 1893, and July, 1894, respectively. In the month of July, 1893, and in the same month in each succeeding year two medical practitioners shall be elected for a period of three years. The retiring officers shall be eligible for re-election.

XXVI. The honorary medical staff shall have the care and be responsible for the treatment of patients under their care, and they shall visit the hospital at least three (3) times a week each, and at such other times when called upon by the resident surgeon.

XXVII. The beds in the hospital shall be equally divided amongst the honorary staff by the resident surgeon, each of whom shall have a receiving week in turn, and shall visit the hospital daily during such week, and they shall meet for consultation whenever considered necessary by any member of the staff; such meetings shall be convened by the resident surgeon. Patients shall remain under the care of the honorary officer under whom admitted.

XXVIII. If any member of the honorary staff, in the opinion of the committee, neglect to perform or fulfil his duties, the committee shall have the power to cancel his appointment, and appoint a substitute in his place for the remainder of the year.

## RESIDENT SURGEON.

XXIX. The resident surgeon shall be a legally qualified medical practitioner; he shall not engage in private practice, nor in any other occupation, but shall devote his whole time and attention to the duties of his office.

XXX. He shall receive the recommendation and applicants for surgical and medical aid, examine the nature of each case, and decide upon its fitness for admission, and shall discharge patients when instructed to do so by any member of the honorary staff, under whose care the patient may be.

XXXI. He shall be responsible for the treatment of patients after admission, until seen by a member of the honorary staff, and in all cases of emergency shall act to the best of his judgment, having power in the absence of the honorary officer to alter or vary the treatment when deemed necessary, and in every case of difficulty or danger shall request the attendance of the honorary officer having charge of such patient, failing his attendance, such other honorary officer as may be obtainable.

XXXII. He shall superintend and control the nursing staff in the hospital, and have power, in case of insubordination or neglect of duty, to suspend any of them until the decision of the board, and if necessary, to engage temporary substitutes for officers thus suspended. He shall also supervise all matters connected with the care of the patients, and the sanitary arrangements of the hospital, and to carry out the instructions of the honorary staff, and to attend to out-patients.

## ASSISTANT SURGEON.

XXXIII. The assistant surgeon shall be a legally qualified medical practitioner, and shall live on the premises. He shall not engage in private practice nor in any other occupation, but shall devote his whole attention to the duties of his office.

XXXIV. He shall be under the direction of the resident surgeon, whose instructions he shall strictly carry out. He shall perform the duties of the resident surgeon during his absence.

XXXV. In all accidents and other cases he shall without delay send for the resident surgeon, and shall adopt such preliminary remedies as he may consider necessary.

XXXVI. He shall perform the night dispensing during the absence of the dispenser, and shall make such arrangements as will insure that he and the dispenser shall not be absent at the same time.

## SECRETARY AND HOUSE STEWARD.

XXXVII. He shall attend all special, general, and committee meetings; he shall take minutes of the proceedings and transcribe them carefully into books kept for that purpose; and he shall carry out the directions of each meeting in the particulars incident to his department.

XXXVIII. Subject to the authority of the board he shall direct and control all servants, exclusive of the nursing staff, and have power, in cases of insubordination or neglect of duty, to suspend any of them until the decision of the board, and, if necessary, to hire temporary substitutes for servants thus suspended.

XXXIX. He shall order, receive, examine, take charge of, and distribute all articles supplied for use in the hospital, excepting those belonging to the dispenser.

XL. He shall carry out all regulations made by the board for the domestic management of the hospital, and be responsible for the cleanliness and good order of the wards and rooms, and of the out-buildings and grounds.

XLI. He shall keep all such books and accounts as are required, and render such reports as may be ordered by the board.

XLII. He shall conduct the correspondence and other clerical business of the institution.

#### ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

XLIII. Cases of accident shall be received without recommendation, those requiring treatment in the hospital being admitted at once, and those suitable for out-door treatment receiving aid, as may be necessary, but in either class of cases the aid shall not be continued when the patients may be able to obtain professional attendance at their own expense.

XLIV. Cases of disease combined with destitution may be admitted on the recommendation of a governor, *vide* Rules 7 and 8, or, when recommendations from governors cannot be obtained, on written reports of the circumstances from the officer in charge of the police, from ministers of religion, or the mayors of Bendigo and Eaglehawk.

XLV. The fitness of applicants for admission shall be decided by the resident surgeon, and those approved of by him will be admitted when there are beds vacant to receive them.

XLVI. All property found on persons who may die in the hospital shall be appropriated to defray the expenses of their maintenance and burial, the residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

XLVII. In the event of any person able to pay for medical or surgical treatment being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such patient shall be held accountable for all expenses incurred in his or her behalf.

#### VISITORS.

XLVIII. Persons wishing to visit patients, or to inspect the hospital, shall be admitted subject to such regulations as may be made by the board, and officiating ministers of religion shall have access to the hospital to visit patients at all times.

#### REGULATIONS FOR OUT-DOOR PATIENTS.

XLIX. The written certificate of an annual or life governor will be required to be produced by each applicant for out-door relief. Contributors will be expected to use every care before giving such certificates, that the persons to whom they are given are really in destitute circumstances.

L. Applicants shall in future be received on each Tuesday, at Two o'clock p.m., when the visiting committee will decide upon each case as part of the business of their weekly visit.

#### MEETINGS IN GENERAL.

LI. At all meetings of governors or of committee, the president, or in his absence, one of the vice-presidents shall take the chair, but in the absence of all these officers, the meeting shall choose its own chairman.

LII. At all meetings of the governors or of the committee, the chairman shall have a deliberate vote, and also a casting vote whenever the numbers are equal.

LIII. All questions other than elections at meetings of governors, and all questions at meetings of the committee, shall be decided by a show of hands, and, if it be demanded by any member, by a division.

LIV. When any vacancy is by effluxion of time about to occur in any office of the corporation, other than the committee, the committee shall give public notice by advertisement that such vacancy is about to occur, and shall fix therein a time, not less than three clear days from the date of such notice, within which candidates for any such vacancy shall send to the secretary their notice of candidature, and a day on which, in the event of a contest, the election shall be held.

LV. No person shall be admitted as a candidate at any such election unless he has notified his candidature to the secretary in writing under his hand within the time so limited.

LVI. Where, at the expiration of the time fixed for receiving notice of candidature, there is the same number of candidates as there are vacancies in each office respectively, the committee shall declare such candidates duly elected.

LVII. Where, at the expiration of the time so fixed, there are more candidates than vacancies, the committee shall, in some daily paper published in Bendigo, give not less than three days' notice of the names of such candidates, and the governors shall, upon the day appointed for the election, elect by ballot some or more of such candidates to fill the vacant office or offices, as the case may be.

LVIII. All vacancies in the committee caused by the annual retirement of members thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of Parliament of Victoria, 1899, shall be filled in the same manner as is hereinbefore provided in the case of officers of the corporation other than the committee.

#### MEETINGS OF GOVERNORS.

LIX. In the month of July in every year a meeting of the governors shall be held for the reception and the adoption of the annual report and balance-sheet, and for the transaction of any other business of which notice has been given in the advertisement convening such meeting.

LX. At all general meetings of the governors, twelve shall constitute a quorum; but if no quorum be present within half-an-hour of the time named such meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week, at the same day and hour.

LXI. The committee at their discretion, may, and upon the written request of twelve or more governors under their hands stating the purpose of such meeting, shall summon a special meeting, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

LXII. Every meeting of governors shall be called by advertisement, in two at least of the public newspapers published in Bendigo, at least one week before the day of meeting.

#### MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.

LXIII. The board shall meet for general business on the second Wednesday in each month, and for special purposes at such times as may be requisite.

LXIV. The president, vice-presidents, and treasurer shall be *ex officio* members of all sub-committees.

LXV. The committee shall commence business as soon after the time notified as there is a sufficient number of members present to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiry of twenty minutes from the time specified there is not a quorum present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to such day as the members then present shall direct, not more than seven days from the day of meeting.

LXVI. No business shall be entered upon until the minutes of the previous meeting have been confirmed, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.

LXVII. No proposition to enact or amend a by-law, or make or vary any rule, shall be entertained, unless one month's previous notice has been given; and no resolution of the committee shall be varied or rescinded for one month after such resolution has been passed, except at a special meeting of the committee or by an absolute majority of the whole committee.
