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## EXTRADITION TREATY BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND MONACO.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.—EXTRADITION TREATY BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND MONACO.

Windsor, 9th May, 1892.

At the Court at Windsor, the 9th day of May, 1892.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870 by the Legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Acts, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the seventeenth day of November, One thousand eight

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hundred and eighty-eight, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 should be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as the provision of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force and no longer:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the seventeenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, between Her Majesty and His Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

"Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up; the said High Contracting Parties have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:

"Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, Edwin Henry Egerton, Esquire, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Her Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at Paris;

"And His Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco, Louis Fernand de Bonnefoy, Baron du Charmel, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of Monaco in France;

"Who, having communicated to each other their respective Full Powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

### "ARTICLE I.

"The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other those persons who, being accused or convicted of a crime or offence committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty.

### "ARTICLE II.

"The crimes or offences for which the extradition is to be granted are the following:—

- "1. Murder, or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
- "2. Manslaughter.
- "3. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm. Malicious wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
- "4. Counterfeiting or altering money, or uttering counterfeit or altered money.
- "5. Knowingly making any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for counterfeiting coin.
- "6. Forgery, counterfeiting, or altering or uttering what is forged, or counterfeited, or altered.
- "7. Embezzlement or larceny.
- "8. Malicious injury to property if the offence be indictable.
- "9. Obtaining money, goods, or valuable securities by false pretences.
- "10. Receiving money, valuable security, or other property knowing the same to have been stolen, embezzled, or unlawfully obtained.
- "11. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
- "12. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, or director, or member or public officer of any company.
- "13. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
- "14. Rape.
- "15. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge, of a girl under sixteen years of age, so far as such acts are punishable by the law of the State upon which the demand is made.
- "16. Indecent assault. Indecent assault without violence upon children of either sex under thirteen years of age.

"17. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of a woman.

"18. Abduction.

"19. Child stealing.

"20. Abandoning children, exposing or unlawfully detaining them.

"21. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.

"22. Burglary or housebreaking.

"23. Arson.

"24. Robbery with violence.

"25. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person in a railway train.

"26. Threats by letter, or otherwise, with intent to extort.

"27. Piracy by law of nations.

"28. Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.

"29. Assaults on board a ship on the high seas, with intent to destroy life or to do grievous bodily harm.

"30. Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.

"31. Dealing in slaves in such a manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

"Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both the Contracting Parties.

"Extradition may also be granted, at the discretion of the State applied to, in respect of any other crime for which, according to the laws of both the Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

#### "ARTICLE III.

"Either Government may, in its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up its own subjects to the other Government.

#### "ARTICLE IV.

"The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of the British Government, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of Monaco, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial, within the territories of the two High Contracting Parties respectively, for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

"If the person claimed on the part of the British Government, or if the person claimed on the part of the Government of Monaco, should be under examination, or is undergoing sentence under a conviction, for any other crime within the territories of the two High Contracting Parties respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until after he has been discharged, whether by acquittal or on expiration of his sentence, or otherwise.

#### "ARTICLE V.

"The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution, or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

#### "ARTICLE VI.

"A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

#### "ARTICLE VII.

"A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison, or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored or had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

"This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

#### "ARTICLE VIII.

"The requisition for extradition shall be made in the following manner:—

"Applications on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty's Government for the surrender of a fugitive criminal in Monaco shall be made by Her Majesty's Consul in the Principality.

"Application on behalf of the Principality of Monaco for the surrender of a fugitive criminal in the United Kingdom shall be made by the Consul-General of Monaco in London.

"The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

"If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

"A sentence passed *in contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

#### "ARTICLE IX.

"If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

#### "ARTICLE X.

"If the fugitive has been arrested in the British dominions, he shall forthwith be brought before a competent magistrate, who is to examine him and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the British dominions.

"In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the British dominions shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in Monaco, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of, a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

"1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the Principality of Monaco.

"2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of the Principality of Monaco, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be the true copies thereof, as the case may require.

"3. A certificate of, or judicial document stating the fact of, a conviction must purport to be certified by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the Principality of Monaco.

"4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal and legalization of the Governor-General of the Principality of Monaco; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law in that part of the British dominions where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

#### "ARTICLE XI.

"If the fugitive has been arrested in the Principality of Monaco his surrender shall be granted if, upon examination by a competent authority, it appears that the documents furnished by the British Government contain sufficient *prima facie* evidence to justify the extradition.

"The authorities of the Principality shall admit as valid evidence records drawn up by the British authorities of the depositions of witnesses, or copies thereof, and records of conviction or other judicial documents, or copies thereof: Provided that the said documents be signed or authenticated by an authority whose competence shall be certified by the seal of a Minister of State of Her Britannic Majesty.

#### "ARTICLE XII.

"The extradition shall not take place unless the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the said State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could at the time of such conviction have been granted by the State applied to. In Her Britannic Majesty's dominions the fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered until the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his being committed to prison to await his surrender.

#### "ARTICLE XIII.

"If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

#### "ARTICLE XIV.

"If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to or the proper Tribunal thereof shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

#### "ARTICLE XV.

"All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery thereof, be given up when the extradition takes place, and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

#### "ARTICLE XVI.

"All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

#### "ARTICLE XVII.

"Either of the High Contracting Parties who may wish to have recourse, for purposes of extradition, to transit through the territory of a third Power, shall be bound to arrange the condition of transit with such third Power.

#### "ARTICLE XVIII.

"When in a criminal case of a non-political character either of the High Contracting Parties should think it necessary to take the evidence of witnesses residing in the dominion of the other, or to obtain any other legal evidence, a 'Commission Rogatoire' to that effect shall be sent through the channel indicated in Article VIII., and effect shall be given thereto conformably to the laws in force in the place where the evidence is to be taken.

#### "ARTICLE XIX.

"All documents which shall be reciprocally communicated in execution of the present Treaty shall be accompanied by a French or English translation (certified to be correct by the Consul who transmits the document in accordance with Article VIII.), when they are not drawn up in the language of the country upon which the demand is made.

"The expense of such translations shall be borne by the Demanding State.

## "ARTICLE XX.

"The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

"The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such colonies or foreign possessions may be made to the Governor or chief authority of such colony or possession by any person authorized to act in such colony or possession as a Consular officer of the Principality of Monaco.

"Such requisitions may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

"Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of criminals from Monaco who may take refuge within such colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such colony or foreign possession will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

"Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

## "ARTICLE XXI.

"The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties at any time on giving to the other six months' notice of its intention to do so.

"The Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Paris, as soon as possible.

"In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

"Done at Paris the 17th day of December, 1891.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Treaty were exchanged at Paris on the seventeenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the twenty-third day of May, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Monaco and of the said Treaty with His Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco.

Provided always, and it is hereby further ordered that the operation of the said Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873 shall be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so far as relates to Monaco and to the said Treaty, and so long as the provisions of the Canadian Act aforesaid of 1886 continue in force and no longer.

**GRANT OF £185 AS A REWARD FOR AN IMPROVED MACHINE FOR DIGGING POTATOES.**

**R**EGULATIONS for the distribution of the grant of One hundred and eighty-five pounds as a reward for an improved machine for digging potatoes.

1. A sum not exceeding One hundred and eighty-five pounds (£185) may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce an improved machine for digging potatoes.

2. The reward shall be payable only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall more efficiently, cheaply, and rapidly perform the work of digging, lifting from the ground without bruising or cutting, and place in rows or heaps potatoes ready for bagging.

3. Such machine must be an improvement on any machine for the same purpose which has been used in Australia. It must also be of easy draught and the construction sufficiently simple to readily admit of adjustment and repairs. The cost must be within the means of any ordinary farmer.

4. One or more trials shall be made of the machine at such place or places, and at such times, as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister of Agriculture may appoint two or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and eighty-five pounds (£185), to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amount or amounts to be apportioned according to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

8. Persons intending to compete must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture not later than the 30th November, 1892.

**AMENDED REGULATION FOR THE PAYMENT OF FEES FOR EXEMPTION CERTIFICATES.**

**W**HERRAS by section 60 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may, from time to time, make, alter, or repeal regulations for the granting of Pilotage Exemption Certificates; and further, by section 59 of the said Act, the Board may make regulations for fixing the fees or charges to be taken or made in respect of the various matters under the jurisdiction of the Board and authorized by the said Act:

And whereas it is desirable to repeal Regulation No. 68 of the Pilot Regulations now in force, which said regulation was published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th August, 1886:

Now therefore the said Board doth hereby with the consent of the Governor in Council repeal the aforesaid regulation, and in substitution therefor, doth hereby make the following amended regulation, that is to say:—

*Fee to be paid for Certificate.*

With the application for examination for an original certificate, the applicant shall lodge with the Secretary to the Board the sum of Five pounds (£5) which fee shall be paid into the General Revenue in the event of the applicant passing the prescribed examination; but should the candidate fail to pass such examination, the sum of Two pounds shall be retained by the Board and thereafter paid into the General Revenue, and the balance of Three pounds shall be returned to the said candidate.

This regulation shall form portion of, and be read with, the Pilot Regulations now in force, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1892.

The foregoing regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this first day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

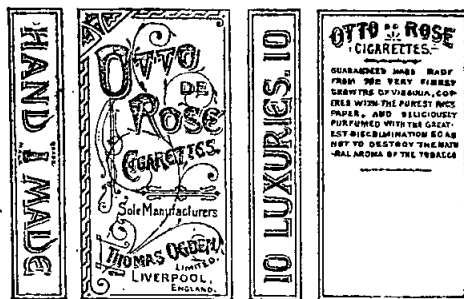

*Health Act 1890.*  
SHIRE OF LAWOIT.  
BY-LAW No. 1.

BY virtue of the powers contained in the *Public Health Act 1890*, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Lawloit, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, doth hereby make the following by-law (that is to say):—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall come into full force and operation in the whole of the Shire of Lawloit, excepting clause seventeen, which shall apply to, and have operation in, all portions of the said shire not included in a proclaimed or surveyed township.

*Definitions.*

4. In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms:—house, abattoirs (land not within the precincts of a surveyed township), cesspool, earth-closet, land, street, shall, if not inconsistent with the text or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them in the *Health Act 1890*.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and person shall include a corporation.

5. The occupier of every land and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Council of the said shire (hereinafter called the Council) may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any yard on which is erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises, as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated therein shall amount to 1 cubic yard, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom, as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the Council at the expense of such occupier.

7. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process of manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, to be removed therefrom once in every 24 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said Council at the expense of such occupier.

8. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed 3 cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

9. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

10. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet, and every occupier shall provide two closet pans for every closet (hereinafter called the double-pan service or Hesse pan system) to be provided with one tight-fitting lid to two pans, so that night-soil may be removed in the day-time if necessary in a suitable cart for the purpose according to the provisions contained in the *Health Act 1890*, section 253.

11. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 12 feet in width.

12. Every occupier and every person having management and control of any premises shall (unless otherwise permitted, as

hereinafter mentioned) once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil, on or belonging to such premises. Where such premises are situated in sparsely-populated districts of the shire, it shall be sufficient if such earth-closet, privy, or place is emptied once in every fortnight, provided the written permission of the Council is obtained at such times and for such periods as the Council may direct.

13. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

14. Where any nightman is duly licensed by the Council, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same; and the said licensee shall be entitled to demand and receive for such service such sum of money for each pan or service as above named as the Council may from time to time fix or determine.

15. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall (unless otherwise expressly permitted in accordance with law) be removed to, and finally deposited in, such place or places only as may be appointed by the Council for the final reception of the same.

16. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, so that the contents thereof may find their way or be likely to find their way into any drain or sewer.

17. Every person placing, depositing, or spreading, causing or suffering to be placed, deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing, depositing, or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the depositing or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, with a layer of earth not less than 6 inches in thickness. But nothing in this clause shall authorize the placing, depositing, or spreading, or causing or suffering to be placed, deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing, depositing, or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter on any land within the limits of a proclaimed or surveyed township or contrary to the provisions of this by-law.

*Penalties.*

18. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid, and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid waterworks district, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1892 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July:—

- (1) On every house and tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house and tenement during the said year, the sum of Twenty shillings.
- (2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

- (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every one thousand gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon): The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where so supplied shall be twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of the water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or in the event of there not being any contract, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, and plastering; the same to be paid for before the pipes are connected.

3. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-half the assessed rate.

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter but not exceeding one-half of a mile distant from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement, or by measure, shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATION No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach.
4. When water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter or under special agreement, the supply shall be through service-pipes of the following diameter, viz., all pipes three-quarters of an inch, except where a special agreement is made.
5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for any livery stables or carriers' stables, or for manufacturing purposes.
6. No person shall apply a hose or pipe to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees or plants, or washing the house-walls or a carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless where the water is charged for by meter, except by the written authority of the Trust; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes, or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
8. Before any such licence being granted by the Trust, the person applying shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.
9. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (excepting those connecting the service-pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.
- (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(4) The whole of pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high-pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

10. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

13. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of a hydrant and hose attached to fixed plugs. Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall, at all times, be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

15. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any land or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

16. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from an officer of the Trust that such pipes require repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

18. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of supplying or feeding the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

19. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

20. The service-pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumers shall each have a stop-cock at the main.

21. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

22. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. The water supply in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

24. In the construction of these Regulations, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Longwood Waterworks Trust.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. XII. (School Hours and Time-table) of the Regulations made under the

provisions of the Act aforesaid, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz.:—

## XII.—SCHOOL HOURS AND TIME-TABLE.

1. Subject to the provisions of the *Education Act 1890*, the hours of work to be observed in each school shall be such as may from time to time be determined by the Minister; but in no case shall the whole time set apart for instruction be of less than four and a half hours' duration on each school day.

2. In every school with an average attendance exceeding 250, the head teacher shall devote not less than fifteen hours weekly to the work of actual class-teaching, independently of the general work of supervision and management.

3. Between the morning and afternoon school meetings there shall be an interval of not less than one hour, except on days of heavy rain, when the interval may, at the discretion of the head teacher, be reduced to half-an-hour. Whenever this is done—and it should rarely be necessary—the times of opening and of closing the afternoon school meeting must be specially noted on the roll sheets in the column for "Remarks."

4. The time-table must be kept hung up in a conspicuous place in the school-room, and shall set forth the hours of opening and closing school, the employment of the several classes at any time, the teachers in charge thereof respectively, the time set apart for the instruction of the pupil teachers and for instruction in extra subjects, and the arrangements made for the supervision of children in the play-ground.

5. The time-table should be so arranged that female teachers and pupil teachers may not be required to stand continuously for a longer period than one hour and a half.

6. When any entertainment is given to a school, as such, or to two or more schools in combination, with the sanction of the board of advice or of the Department, all members of the teaching staffs of the schools entertained will attend for the purpose of aiding in the maintenance of order, and will give such other assistance as may be required of them.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE ORBOST PUBLIC CEMETERY FOR THE GENERAL MANAGEMENT THEREOF.

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. Any person wishing to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, tombstone, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars, for approval.
3. That any order for interment shall be given to the secretary at least twelve hours prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge will be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
4. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
5. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy-registrar of deaths or a coroner, and such certificate shall be delivered to the secretary or person in charge before the funeral enters the cemetery.
6. That the hours fixed for burials shall be from Eight a.m. till Five p.m.; and that the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
7. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance of the cemetery, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter or to stand opposite the entrance gates. Breaking out of the procession after passing the gates is forbidden.
8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under

twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery, or another grave, will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. Every grave, vault, tomb, tombstone, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

12. That no tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery unless approved by the trustees.

13. No wooden fence shall be allowed to exceed 3 feet in height, and every such fence shall be constructed of sawn timber.

14. That no dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

15. That no person shall be allowed to remove any plants or flowers out of the cemetery.

16. That the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control under the trustees over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

17. That any application for ground exceeding 12 feet in width shall be reserved for special consideration of the trustees.

18. That any public grave may be converted into a private grave on application to the trustees and on payment of fees or balance of fees.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor cut or remove therefrom any live or dead timber or trees growing, standing, lying, or being on the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall cut or pull down any gate or any fence on or around the reserve.
6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management; and any cattle, goats, or pigs found or put in the reserve

without such consent shall be liable to be impounded. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

9. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

**PENTRIDGE PENAL ESTABLISHMENT.—BOUNDARIES RE-DEFINED.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Gaols Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1096) it is amongst other things enacted that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which are from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, shall, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (thereinafter called "gaols") respectively of the place or district where the same are situated, and shall be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also thereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same: And whereas it is also enacted that, except where it is otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol shall be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction shall be taken to be a prison: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the nineteenth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, the buildings and premises therein described as the Pentridge Penal Establishment were proclaimed a public gaol or penal establishment within the meaning of and in accordance with the provisions of the *Statute of Gaols 1864*: And whereas it is expedient to re-define the site on which such penal establishment is situated, and to re-proclaim the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the *Gaols Act 1890* aforesaid and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, and do by this notice proclaim, declare, and notify that the buildings and premises hereinafter described are and shall be a public gaol or penal establishment within the meaning of and in accordance with the provisions of the last cited Act, that is to say:—

  - Regulation No. 12.—For appointing the several sums to be paid for licences for carts, and to repeal Regulation No. 4.

Part X. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1890*.

CARRIAGE OF PERSONS AND GOODS.

Subdivision 1.—Passenger Vehicles.

Clauses 1 to 13 both inclusive are hereby adopted.  
Clauses 19, 20, 21, 23, 25, 29, 30, 31, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 43, 44, 45, 47, 48 are hereby adopted.

Hospitals and Charities Act 1890.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following code of by-laws was adopted by the contributors to the Austin Hospital for Incurables, at a meeting specially called for the purpose, and held at the Melbourne Town Hall, on Monday, 18th day of July, 1892, such adoption being duly confirmed by said contributors at a subsequent meeting specially called for the purpose, and held at the same place on Thursday, 21st day of July, 1892:—

BY-LAWS ABOVE REFERRED TO.

INTRODUCTORY.

1. *Repeal of former by-laws.*—All by-laws made prior to the date of making these by-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed, saving all existing rights.
2. *Meaning of governor.*—In these by-laws the word "governor" shall mean and be equivalent to the word "contributor" in the Act of the Parliament of Victoria, No. 220.

NAME.

3. *Name.*—The name of the institution shall be "The Austin Hospital for Incurables."

## OBJECT

4. *Object of the institution.*—The object of the institution is to form an establishment for the benefit of persons suffering from incurable diseases which require medical treatment and nursing, duly certified as such by at least one of the honorary medical advisers to the institution. (See Appendix.)

## COMMON SEAL.

5. *Custody of the seal.*—The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the office of the institution, in a box having two different locks; one key shall be kept by the president and the other by the secretary.

6. *Affixing of seal.*—The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing, except by order of the committee, and shall be verified by the signature of the president or vice-president or the chairman for the time being, and the treasurer or secretary.

## GOVERNORS AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

7. *Annual governors and life governors.*—Any person who shall contribute the sum of £1 per annum shall be an annual governor, or not less than £20 in one donation shall be a life governor of the hospital, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings; any person who shall contribute the sum of £2 per annum shall be an annual governor, or not less than £50 in one donation shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to two votes at all general meetings; and any person who shall contribute the sum of £5 per annum shall be an annual governor, or not less than £100 in one donation shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings.

8. *Life governors on collections.*—Any person who shall pay to the hospital in one year in one sum collections, from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum, amounting to not less than £1, shall be an annual governor, or not less than £20, shall be a life governor of the hospital, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings; and any person who shall pay to the hospital in one year in one sum collections from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum, amounting to not less than £5, shall be an annual governor, or not less than £100, shall be a life governor of the hospital, and shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings.

9. *Contributions by corporations.*—Any public or corporate body which shall contribute the sum of £1 annually shall be authorized to nominate some one person to be enrolled an annual governor, or not less than £20 in one sum, such nominee shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings. And any public or corporate body which shall contribute the sum of £2 annually shall be authorized to nominate some one person to be enrolled an annual governor, or not less than £50 in one sum, such nominee shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to two votes at all general meetings. And any public or corporate body which shall contribute the sum of £5 annually shall be authorized to nominate some one person to be enrolled an annual governor, or not less than £100 in one sum, such nominee shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings.

10. *Life governors under bequests.*—The acting-executor, or, if more than one, then the first-named acting executor under any will through which the hospital shall receive the sum of not less than £20, shall be enrolled a life governor, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings. Where the bequest shall be not less than £100, the executor shall be enrolled a life governor, and shall be entitled to two votes at all general meetings. And where the bequest shall be £500 and upwards, the executor shall be enrolled a life governor, and shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings.

11. *Governor not to have more than three votes.*—No one governor shall be entitled to more than three votes at any general meeting.

12. *Absent governors may act by attorney.*—Any governor being absent from the colony of Victoria may, by power of attorney containing the necessary powers, exercise all the privileges to which he or she would be entitled if personally present, but such power of attorney shall be deposited with the secretary of the hospital for examination and record at least three clear days before the same can be used in exercise of such privileges.

13. *How votes to be given.*—Governors may vote at general meetings either personally or by attorney as hereinbefore mentioned.

14. *Contributions by firms.*—Every firm or partnership subscribing to the funds of the hospital may exercise their privilege through some person nominated by the firm or partnership to act as representative on their behalf, all such nominations to be in writing, and lodged with the secretary of the hospital.

15. *Payment of subscriptions.*—Every yearly subscription shall be paid in advance, and every first yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of such payment, but no such first yearly payment shall entitle to a vote at a general meeting within two months from the date of such payment.

16. *Honorary life governors.*—Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the hospital, irrespective of subscriptions, may be elected honorary life governors at any general meeting on the recommendation of the committee, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

## APPLICANTS FOR ADMISSION TO THE HOSPITAL.

17. *As to admission.*—Applicants for admission as inmates shall produce satisfactory proof that they are suitable and worthy objects for admission to the institution, and shall be certified as incurable as hereinbefore provided in clause 4.

## OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE.

18. *Officers of the corporation and their tenure.*—There shall be a president, vice-president, treasurer, and two auditors, who shall hold office for a year, and until their successors are appointed, and who shall be eligible for re-election, and who respectively shall be elected by the governors at the annual general meeting of the institution, and the president for the time being shall be *ex officio* a member of all sub-committees.

19. *Election of committee of management and their number.*—*Quorum.*—The members of the committee of management shall also be elected at an annual general meeting of the hospital, and shall consist of not more than fifteen governors (inclusive of the honorary officers, viz., the president, vice-president, and treasurer), of whom four shall form a quorum.

20. *Time and filling up vacancies.*—At the annual general meeting of governors, to be held in the month of July in year, one-third part of the elected members of committee shall retire from office, but may nevertheless be eligible for re-election, and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot. Any vacancies occurring during the year may be filled up by the committee, who shall have power to temporarily appoint some governor or governors as member or members of the committee until the next general meeting for the election of the committee, when the person or persons thus temporarily appointed shall retire, but such person or persons are eligible for election by the governors at such meeting as member or members of the committee either for the full period of three years, or for the unexpired term of the occupant of office whose place they were temporarily appointed to fill. This provision shall extend to and apply to all officers of the institution.

21. *Powers of committee.*—The committee shall direct all business of the hospital, shall provide all requisites for its use, shall appoint, hire, and discharge or dismiss all paid officers and servants, and fix and pay all salaries and wages; may from time to time enter into contracts, and may make rules not inconsistent with these by-laws for the regulation of the hospital, and of such paid officers and servants; shall have power to order the discharge of any patient; and, generally, in all matters whether of the same kind as those hereinbefore mentioned, or of a different kind not provided for by law or by these by-laws that they think proper.

22. *Rotation of business by committee.*—The general committee shall meet once a fortnight, or oftener if necessary, on such day and at such hour and place as they may appoint, four to form a quorum. The business shall be as follows:—

- (1) To confirm the minutes of the previous meeting.
- (2) To receive the reports of sub-committees, officers, and visitors.
- (3) To decide on admission and discharge of patients.
- (4) To ascertain that the duties of officers and servants are duly performed.
- (5) To attend generally to the business requirements of the institution.
- (6) To inquire into complaints received through the medical superintendent or person in charge, and to consider reports.

23. *Election of officers and members of committee.*—All governors of the hospital shall be capable of being elected as officers of the hospital, or as members of the committee, except such as may hold any office or place of profit under the corporation, or as shall be concerned or participate in anywise in any contract with the committee or in the profit thereof.

24. *Absent members of committee.*—Any member of the committee who shall be absent from four consecutive meetings of the committee shall cease to be a member, and the remaining members of the committee may declare the seat of such absent member vacant, and may fill such vacancy as hereinbefore provided under clause 20.

## MEETINGS IN GENERAL.

25. *Presidency at meetings.*—At all meetings of governors or of committee the president, or in his absence the vice-president, shall take the chair, but in the absence of both officers the meeting shall choose its own chairman.

26. *Chairman to have a double vote.*—At all meetings of the governors or of the committee the chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and also a casting vote whenever the numbers are equal.

27. *As to calling of special meetings of governors.*—The general committee may convene a special general meeting of governors at any time upon giving notice at least seven days previously in two or more of the Melbourne newspapers; which notice shall be advertised three times in each of such papers, and shall contain the time and place of meeting and the particular subjects to be brought before such general meeting, and none other shall be discussed thereat. Any twelve governors may require the committee to call a special meeting at any time, and should the committee, after receiving such requisition, signed by twelve or more governors, neglect to call such meeting within seven days after the next ordinary meeting of the committee, then any twelve governors shall have power to convene such meeting upon giving notice as directed above, to discuss the business of which notice has been given to the committee, and no other. In that case the calling of the meeting shall devolve on the requisitionists.

28. *Decision of questions.*—All questions at general meetings or at meetings of the committee shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a ballot is demanded by any member.

## ELECTIONS.

29. *Election of members of committee.*—Any candidate for election as member of committee shall furnish to the secretary in writing, three clear days prior to the day of election, a notification of his intention to become a candidate for election; if less

than the number to be elected be nominated, the meeting shall have power to nominate governors, and if more than those required to fill the vacancies be nominated, the election shall be by show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded on behalf of any candidate, to be taken on such day and at such place as may be appointed by the chairman, between the hours of two p.m. and five p.m., such ballot to be conducted by a member of the committee, and two scrutineers appointed by the meeting. In all cases of equal voting, the member of committee conducting the ballot shall have the casting vote.

**HOUSE COMMITTEE.**

30. *House committee.*—A house committee, consisting of not more than five members, shall be appointed from the general committee, and shall hold office for four months, three to form a quorum.

**RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION.**

31. *Religious instruction.*—The inmates of the institution shall be at liberty to receive religious instruction and consolation from the ministers or authorized religious instructors of the denominations to which they respectively belong, who shall (unless their services are specially requested by any inmate of another communion) confine their ministrations to the members of their own denomination, and shall not speak or read loudly, but perform the duties of their office in such a way as to be as little overheard as possible by the other inmates. No person shall conduct any public religious service except in the place set apart for the purpose by the committee, and for extra religious services the permission of the superintendent must be obtained beforehand. Unless in cases of urgency the visits of authorized religious instructors, excepting ministers, shall be paid between the hours of ten a.m. and six p.m.

**MEETINGS OF GOVERNORS.**

32. *Annual meeting of governors.*—The annual general meeting of governors shall be held in the city of Melbourne in the month of July in every year, at such time and place as the committee shall appoint, of which notice shall be given in two or more Melbourne newspapers seven clear days before the day of meeting. At such meeting the business shall be to confirm the minutes of previous general meeting, to receive a report from the committee, to receive and adopt the balance-sheet of the institution, to elect officers and members of committee, and to transact any other business of which due notice shall have been given.

33. *Quorum of governors.*—At all general meetings of the governors twelve shall constitute a quorum; but if no quorum be present within half-an-hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week, at the same day and hour.

**APPENDIX.**

The following definition of the term "incurable" has been kindly supplied by Professor Allen:—

In order to define the scope of the institution, the term "incurables" shall be held to denote patients who suffer from chronic disease progressing to a fatal termination, and who require above all things careful nursing, with more or less frequent medical aid for the relief of symptoms. In other words, the charity is in scope and in cost per occupied bed to occupy a place midway between a general hospital and a benevolent asylum. It is not intended for cases of acute disease, nor for cases of chronic disease in which medical aid is the first essential. On the other hand, it is not intended for cases of senility, permanent disablement, &c., for which a home is the requirement, with a minimum of attendance or nursing.
