TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 1st December, 1892, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls.

The Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars will keep open their offices for the issue of rights until Ten o'clock p.m. each night from the 27th November to the 1st December inclusive.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that those who so delay will be deprived of the opportunity for enrolment.

Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province, and no person whose name is already on any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

## EXAMINATION OF APPLICANTS FOR LICENSE AS SHORTHAND WRITERS.—REGULATIONS.

THE Public Service Board, pursuant to the provisions of section 10 of the *Evidence Act 1890 (No. 2)*, hereby makes the following Regulations for determining the nature or character, standard, and requirements of the examinations or tests to be applied to applicants for license as shorthand writers, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council, in lieu of all Regulations hitherto made by the Public Service Board under the said Act, which are hereby revoked:—

1. Examinations shall be held at such times and places as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary to the Law department in the *Government Gazette* and in two newspapers.
2. Every applicant shall, prior to admission to examination, produce to the Public Service Board satisfactory evidence—
  - (a) Of having attained the age of 21 years.
  - (b) Of good moral character.
3. Every applicant who has produced the aforesaid evidence, and who shall, before such examination, pay to the presiding examiner a fee of Ten shillings and sixpence, may be admitted to examination.
4. Before an applicant can be registered as qualified for license he must pass, to the satisfaction of the examiners, examinations in—
  - (a) Rapidity and correctness in writing shorthand.
  - (b) Rapidity and correctness in transcribing shorthand notes.
  - (c) Rapidity and correctness in reading shorthand notes.
5. The standard required for passing shall be—
  - (a) To write correctly from the examiner's dictation 600 words, at the rate of 120 words a minute; five minutes in all.
  - (b) To transcribe at once in long hand, legibly and correctly, without abbreviations, in 24 minutes, the passage written from dictation under sub-clause (a).
  - (c) To write correctly in shorthand, from the examiner's dictation, 1,500 words, at the rate of 150 words a minute; ten minutes in all. The writings of all candidates shall be collected at once without revision.
  - (d) To read aloud correctly to the examiners, in not more than 30 minutes, the paper written in accordance with sub-clause (c).
 Both shorthand and transcript must in all cases be written in ink.
6. While candidates are under examination no communication between them will be allowed.
7. Immediately after each examination the presiding examiner shall report to the Public Service Board the names of those candidates who satisfied the examiners thereat.
8. Candidates who may have passed the examination to the satisfaction of the examiners shall be registered as qualified for license as shorthand writers in the law courts.
9. Notwithstanding the conditions imposed in the preceding Regulations, any applicant for license as a shorthand writer, who at the time of such application is the Government Shorthand Writer, or a member of his staff, or of the Victorian *Hansard* staff, and who may have served on either of such staffs as a shorthand writer for a period of five years, and who shall produce evidence of his fitness satisfactory to the examiners, may, on the certificate of such examiners, and without further examination or test, be registered as a person qualified for license as a shorthand writer in accordance with the *Evidence Act 1890 (No. 2)*.
10. The preceding Regulation shall also apply to any person who, at the time of his retirement from the Public Service, held the office of Government Shorthand Writer, or was a member of his staff, or of the Victorian *Hansard* staff, and who had served in such capacity as a shorthand writer for a period of five years, provided that he make application for license as a shorthand writer within a period of four months from the date of his retirement from the public service.

## SHIRES OF NARRACAN AND WOORAYL.

## PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:-

The petitioners purport to constitute majorities of the rate-payers in the portions of the Shires of Narracan and Woorayl which are described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shires of Narracan and Woorayl and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Mirboo."

Roul's selection, parish of Mirboo; thence south-westerly by that selection and southerly by that selection and the west boundary of allotments 5, 6, 7, 14, 15, and a line to the north-west angle of allotment 52; thence south by the west boundary of allotments 52 and 53 to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south by a road being the eastern boundary of allotments 69 and 70 to the main Mirboo and Boolara road; thence southerly by the road last named to the Tarwin River; thence south-westerly by that river to the south-east angle of allotment 5, parish of Dumbalk; thence west by the south boundary and north by the west boundary of said allotment to its north-west angle; thence westerly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 4A; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 1; thence west by the south boundary of said allotment to its south-west angle; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 71, parish of Mardian; thence west by the south boundary of allotment 71 and part of 70 to the north-east angle of allotment 119A; thence south-westerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 119A and 119B to the most southerly angle of the allotment last named; thence north-westerly to the northern angle of allotment 75; thence south-westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 118B; thence northerly by the western boundaries of allotments 118B, 118A, and 121 to the north-west angle of allotment last named; thence west by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 122; thence north by the west boundary of last-named allotment to its north-west angle; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 57; thence east by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 48; thence north by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 38; thence west by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 24; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 23; thence west by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 102; thence north-west by the western boundary of said allotment to the Tarwin River; thence by said river north-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 100, parish of Allambee East; thence north-westerly to the north-eastern angle of said allotment; thence westerly by a road to the south-western angle of allotment 120B; thence north-westerly to the north-western angle of the said allotment; thence north-easterly by a road to the south-western angle of allotment 46; thence north-westerly to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that their interests are in no way identical with those of Leongatha, the head-quarters and place of meeting of Woorayl Shire, nor with those of Moe, the head-quarters of the Shire of Narracan; that the said townships of Leongatha and Moe are not sufficiently accessible to permit of being properly represented, Leongatha being 18 miles and Moe 70 miles from the township of Mirboo North, the locality in which their interests altogether lie, as being the centre at which they transact their business; that there is a strong community of interests between the petitioners who reside in the areas sought to be severed, and they are therefore desirous of being placed in one and the same municipality, and consider that if this were done their revenue would be expended to much better advantage and more in accordance with their wishes than is the case at present.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said areas from the Shires of Narracan and Woorayl, and constitute them a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Shire of Mirboo."

2. The purchases will be made in Calcutta, Madras, and Bombay, by Remount Agents under the orders of the Director, Army Remount Department.

3. The Remount Depôts will be open for the reception of horses from the 1st November, 1893, to the end of the purchasing season.

4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, and, in the case of Australian horses, 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands high.

5. Greys will not be purchased for horse and field artillery.

6. The average price for an Australian or Cape remount has been changed, and is now fixed at Rs. 675, which will be paid at the Indian port of purchase. The average price for Arabs and Persians is Rs. 550. Each horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, under such rules as may be made by the Director of the Army Remount Department; but the average prices fixed above are not to be exceeded on the whole number purchased in any class.

## AMENDED REGULATIONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF SHEEP "UNDER BOND" FOR "BOILING DOWN."

1. Application must be made to the Secretary for Trade and Customs, and must state:—

- Premises where the work is to be carried on.
- Probable number of sheep per month to be dealt with.
- The names of two (2) persons jointly and severally willing to become sureties in a penal sum of One thousand pounds (£1,000) by a bond to her Majesty that all regulations shall be observed and duties on deficiencies (if any) paid.

2. The slaughtering and boiling-down premises shall be subject to approval, and for the purposes of these Regulations shall be deemed to be a bonded warehouse, and, as such, subject to all or any times to the supervision of an officer of Customs.

3. All sheep on importation shall be entered as "Under bond, for Boiling Down Works."

4. The sheep, when slaughtered, shall be placed in the boiling-down vats or other vessels under the supervision of an officer of Customs.

5. Any portion of the carcass not so boiled down, or otherwise destroyed, so as to render it unfit for human consumption, will be liable to duty at the rate of Seven shillings (7s.) per cental.

6. Each importation of sheep shall be balanced and duty paid on deficiencies (if any) within fourteen (14) days of importation, and the collector may disallow further importation under bond if there is any delay by the importer in balancing previous importations, or in paying the fees (if any) that may be due.

7. The proprietor or importer shall pay to the collector for the services of the officers employed the sum of Two shillings (2s.) per hour for the time so employed.

8. The Secretary for Trade and Customs may at any time direct that the works be closed, and that importations for the same cease, and the department gives no guarantee as to the length of time the concession will be allowed in any instance.

The Regulations of 5th December, 1892, as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th December, 1892, are hereby cancelled.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## EPSOM RACES AT MORDIALLOC.

On Friday, 13th October, a special train will leave Spencer-street station at 11.15 a.m. and Flinders-street station at 11.35 a.m. for Mordialloc, and return at 6 p.m. It will convey horses only from Spencer-street station, passengers only from Flinders-street station, and horses and passengers from Caulfield. Ordinary fares will be charged. Special trains, with passengers only, will leave Flinders-street station at 12.17, 12.38, and 12.51 p.m., and return from Mordialloc to Flinders-street station immediately the races are over. These trains will only stop at Caulfield going and returning. Return fares from Flinders-street station:—First class, including admission to the stand, 13s. Including admission to the hill—First class, 5s. 6d.; second class, 4s. 6d. To platform, from either Flinders-street station or Caulfield:—First class, 3s.; second class, 2s. Mordialloc periodical ticket-holders may travel by the special trains from Flinders-street station without extra payment.

## CAULFIELD RACES ON 14TH AND 21ST OCTOBER.

Return tickets, at Holiday Excursion fares, will be issued at all stations (suburban excepted) to Melbourne by all trains (express trains included) on the 13th and 20th October, and by all trains timed to reach Melbourne not later than 1.15 p.m. on the 14th and 21st October. Trains will only stop as per time-table. The tickets will be available for return till Monday, 23rd October, inclusive.

## CAULFIELD RACES.—GUINEAS DAY.

On Saturday, 14th October, race trains will commence running from Melbourne at 11.10 a.m., and thereafter at short intervals until 2 p.m., then at 2.30 and 3 p.m. Trains will return from Caulfield immediately the races are over. The first class trains will start from the new platform at Prince's-bridge station, and passengers can enter from either Flinders-street or Swanston-street. Return fares:—To Caulfield, first class, 2s.; first class, including admission to the stand, 12s. The second class trains will start from Flinders-street station (centre platform). Return fares:—To Caulfield, second class, 1s.; second class, including admission to the flat, 3s. For the convenience of intending passengers desiring to obtain their tickets before or on the 14th October, race tickets will be issued on the 12th, 13th, and 14th October at Prince's-bridge and Flinders-street stations, and at all stations on the St. Kilda and Port Melbourne lines, and also at Messrs. T. Cook and Son's, 82 Swanston-street, City. The tickets will only be available from Prince's-bridge station or Flinders-street station (as the case may be) on 14th October.

## SOUTH SUBURBAN, ETC., TRAINS.

On Saturday, 14th October, consequent on the number of special trains which will run to and from the Caulfield Races, the following alterations in the running of ordinary trains on the undermentioned suburban lines will be carried out, viz.:—

*Mordialloc and Oakleigh lines.*—The 11.50 a.m. train from Prince's-bridge station and the 12.49 p.m. train from Oakleigh

will not run. Passengers for the 12.41 p.m. mixed train from Oakleigh will require to travel to Oakleigh by the 11.15 a.m. train from Prince's-bridge station. The 12.30 and 1.10 p.m. trains from Prince's-bridge station will only stop at Hawksburn and Armadale, and will run past Caulfield. The 1.30 and 1.46 p.m. trains from Prince's-bridge station will only stop at Hawksburn, Toorak, Armadale, and Malvern, and will run past Caulfield. The 12.20, 12.45, 1.17, 2, and 5.10 p.m. trains from Prince's-bridge station, and the 12.47, 1.13, 1.45, 2.28, and 5.47 p.m. trains from Caulfield, will not run. The 1 p.m. train from Prince's-bridge station will only stop at Toorak and Malvern, and will run past Caulfield. Passengers from roadside stations on the Oakleigh line for the Mordialloc line can travel free to Prince's-bridge station by the 12.8 or 1.24 p.m. Oakleigh line trains, then by the 1.10 or 2.15 p.m. trains.

*Bairnsdale train.*—The 5.40 a.m. train from Bairnsdale will stop at Caulfield to set down passengers.

*Caulfield, &c.*—The 3.55 p.m. train from Officer, the 5.2 p.m. train from Mordialloc, and the 5.20 and 5.57 p.m. trains from Oakleigh will only stop between Glenhuntly or Rosstown (as the case may be) and Prince's-bridge stations at Hawksburn. Passengers by these trains to Caulfield, Malvern, Armadale, Toorak, South Yarra, or Richmond will be allowed to travel to Prince's-bridge station free, and return to their destinations by the ordinary trains. None of the Mordialloc, Frankston, or Oakleigh line trains timed to leave Prince's-bridge station between the hours of 11.15 a.m. and 2.50 p.m. will, on the outward journey, set down passengers at Caulfield. Caulfield periodical ticket-holders and those who hold remaining halves of return tickets issued at Caulfield will be allowed to travel from Flinders-street or Prince's-bridge stations by the race specials without extra payment. Members of the V. A. T. Club holding "Members' tickets," and ladies holding "Ladies' tickets" issued by the V. A. T. Club in connexion with the "Members' tickets," will be allowed to travel free to and from Caulfield by the race specials or the ordinary trains.

*Richmond, &c.*—After the passage of the 11.15 a.m. train, and until 2.50 p.m., no suburban trains from Prince's-bridge station to Oakleigh or Mordialloc will stop at Richmond or South Yarra.

The three or four last race specials in the evening will stop at all stations, Caulfield to Hawksburn inclusive, to pick up passengers.

Full details concerning the foregoing alterations will be found on the posters exhibited at all stations on the suburban lines.

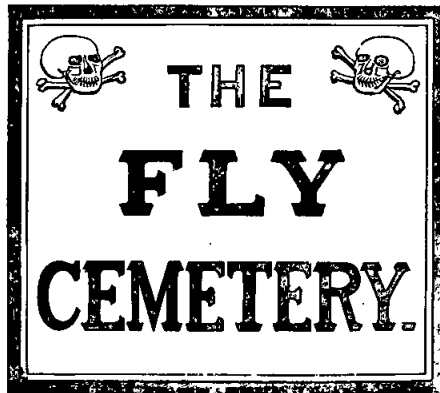

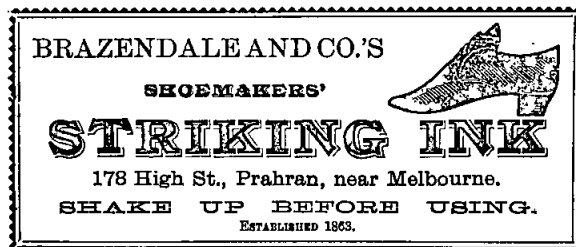

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the waterworks district of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust, according to the valuation for the year 1894, of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situate, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1894, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1894. Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1894, and the second instalment upon the 1st day of July, 1894. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1893.

THE Commissioners of the Macedon Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district, do hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following. The following rates are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1893 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust district, that is to say:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the Waterworks Trust area, according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Macedon Waterworks Trust on 16th September, 1893, and the seal of the Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Macedon Waterworks Trust, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust, when the supply is not by meter, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell such water to any person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take and carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, or cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not who shall lay any pipe or communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

6. Wrought galvanized-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No services of a longer bore than half-inch to properties valued under £25 per annum will be permitted, but those properties which are valued at £25 and over per annum will be allowed a three-quarter inch service.

7. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after receiving notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either, by cutting off such service-pipe or otherwise as the said Trust may deem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

8. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to be run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust. All water-troughs must be fixed with self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

9. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe of the Trust with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding, or supplying the same with water without first affixing such approved self-acting valves as may be directed by the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of offence from the Trust. All water-troughs must be fixed with self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

10. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except by permission of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

11. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all such times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

12. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied; but no such cutting off of the water supply shall exempt the offenders from the payment of the water rate during such suspension of the supply, nor from any fine or penalty provided for such offence by the *Water Act 1890* or these Regulations.

13. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wilfully or negligently causes or suffers any pipe, valve, cock, cistern, bath, soil pan, water-closet, or other apparatus or receptacle to be out of repair, or to be used or contrived, so that the water supplied to him by the Trust is, or is likely to be, wasted, misused, unduly consumed for irrigation or otherwise however, or contaminated, or so as to occasion or allow the return of foul air or other noisome or impure matter into any pipe belonging to or connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. No person shall be authorized to lay service-pipes or make any fittings or connexions and attach the same to any service-pipes of the Trust, or to any private service-pipe already laid and connected with the pipes of the Trust, unless he can be proved to be a competent person.

15. The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence and according to the directions of the Trust's officer, and any dispute between the parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done, or to the exact meaning of the general conditions of this Regulation, shall be referred to the Trust, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding on all parties.

16. In the event of the Trust permitting any person to use a hose for irrigation or other purposes, he shall be required to have a meter to determine the quantity of water used, and he shall pay the Trust at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons.

17. Any person guilty of any offence against these Regulations, not otherwise specifically provided for, shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, in addition to being liable to make good any damage or loss sustained by the Trust.

The above Regulations, from 1 to 17, were agreed to at a meeting of the Trust held this 10th day of September, 1893.

WHEREAS a Revision Court for the Municipality of the Borough of Wangaratta was duly held at Wangaratta on the 24th day of July, 1893, before Councillor William Meldrum, chairman, and Councillors Peter Stuart Thomson, Edward Flanagan, Alexander Clements, and Alfred David Harrison, being members of the Council of the said municipality, pursuant to the provisions of section 74 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, for the purpose of revising the Voters' List for the said municipality: And whereas the said list was at the said Court duly revised and settled as required by law, and the said Chairman then and there in open Court did write his initials against certain names struck out of the said list, and against certain names inserted in the same, and against every part of the said list in which mistakes had been corrected or omissions supplied, and did then and there sign his name to every page of the list so settled and revised, but omitted to cause to be written at the foot or end of the said list a certificate that the same had been revised and was correct, before the same was signed by himself and the other members of the Court: And whereas doubts have arisen as to the validity of such list in consequence of the omission of such certificate: And whereas it is desirable that such doubts should be removed and such omission cured, and the Governor in Council has been requested by the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Wangaratta to exercise the power conferred upon him by section 84 of the *Local Government Act 1890*: Now therefore the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of Victoria, doth by this Order in Council direct that the certificate required by section 79 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, that the said Voters' List has been revised and is correct, with the date thereof, be forthwith written at the foot or end of the said list, and that the Chairman of the said Revision Court, and not fewer than two other members of the said Court, do severally sign such certificate as of the date when the same would have been signed except for such oversight or omission as aforesaid, and the Governor with the advice aforesaid doth further by this his order validate and confirm the list so certified as at and from the date of the holding of the said Revision Court, and that the same shall be and be deemed to have been the Voters' Roll for the said borough of Wangaratta, and that all elections held and other matters and things done or proceedings taken under such list shall be validated and confirmed as fully and effectually as if such certificate properly signed and authenticated had been written at the foot or end thereof in due time.

No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. XXI. (Boards of Advice) of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz. :—

## NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES.

9. Twenty-one clear days before any election of members of any Board of Advice the returning officer shall give notice of such election, by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the school district, notifying the same to the Department by letter, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place to be named in such advertisement, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon on some day before the election, hereinafter called the day of nomination, being not less than four days from the time of giving such notice, and not less than fourteen days before the day of election; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered to the returning officer or his deputy a nomination paper in the form in the First Schedule or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than ten persons duly qualified to vote at such election, and also by the person named therein as a candidate.

10. The returning officer shall, between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, upon each day between the giving as hereinbefore provided for notice of any election and the day of nomination named therein, keep posted outside the place so as aforesaid named for the delivery of nomination papers the names of all persons who shall previously have become candidates for such election.

11. If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates the number of persons who shall have become candidates as aforesaid shall not exceed the number of members then to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and shall notify under his hand the same to the Minister of Public Instruction, and the names of the members so elected shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

## POLLING, ETC.

12. Any State school building in a school district, and any other place which may be fixed by the returning officer, shall be a polling place for such district.

13. If at the expiration of the time aforesaid the number of candidates shall exceed the number of members to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith transmit the names of such candidates to the Department, and the Department will cause ballot-papers to be printed with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form in the Second Schedule. The names of the persons so nominated, and notice that a poll will be taken for the election of such members on the day appointed for holding the election under the provisions thereof, and named in such notice, at the polling place or polling places, shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eight o'clock in the forenoon and close at Five o'clock in the afternoon.

14. If after a poll shall stand appointed as aforesaid at any election, any person who shall duly have become a candidate for such election and five of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid shall be desirous that he retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, may sign and deliver to the returning officer between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon a notice in the form in the Third Schedule, stating that such candidate so retires; and the returning officer, on such receipt of such notice, if the number of candidates shall by such retirement be reduced to the number of members to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates to be duly elected, and if the said number shall not be reduced shall omit the name of such persons so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such ballot-papers shall have been already printed shall erase such name therefrom, and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

15. At every election the returning officer, if it shall appear to him expedient for taking the poll, may cause school buildings to be divided and allotted into compartments as to the returning officer shall seem most convenient, and the returning officer may also appoint poll clerks to attend at such election.

16. The returning officer or his deputy, or some one to be appointed by writing under the hand of the returning officer or his deputy, shall preside at each polling booth for taking the poll.

17. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint in writing one scrutineer, to be present at each polling booth; and such scrutineers and the returning officer or deputy or other person and the poll clerks, and any voters not exceeding six in number actually engaged in voting and to be named if necessary by such returning officer or deputy or other person so appointed, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.

18. The returning officer or his deputy or other person so appointed shall provide pencils in every polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the poll clerks and scrutineers before the polling begins, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer or deputy or other persons so appointed, who shall keep the key of such box.

19. The returning officer or his deputy or other person so appointed shall deliver to every voter who shall require the same one ballot-paper in the form aforesaid, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from such paper the names of every candidate for whom he shall not desire to vote; and in case any voter shall be unable to read or write, the returning officer or his deputy or other person so appointed, if required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as such voter may desire, strike out the names of such candidates as such voter may designate, and after such names shall be so struck out the ballot-paper shall be forthwith deposited in the said box.

20. Before delivering a ballot-paper to a voter the returning officer or his deputy or other person so appointed shall write upon the back of such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number corresponding to the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll of ratepaying electors, if any, and if necessary some mark to designate such roll, and shall thereupon upon a copy of such roll check off such voter's name as having voted, and if such voter's name is not on the roll of ratepaying electors he shall enter such name in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall number such name and the ballot-paper with a corresponding number.

21. If any voter shall suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of members to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

22. At all elections in any school district the returning officer, or his deputy or other person so appointed as aforesaid, may if he see fit, or if required so to do by any candidate or scrutineer, shall put to any person tendering his vote—

As being on a roll of ratepaying electors, the questions following:—

(i.) Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll of ratepaying electors now in force for [naming the municipal division]?

(ii.) Are you still a ratepayer residing in the school district?

(iii.) Have you already voted at the present election?

And no person who shall refuse to answer any of such questions, or who shall not answer the first and second of such questions absolutely in the affirmative and the third of such questions absolutely in the negative, shall be permitted to vote.



Where the person claiming to vote as a ratepayer, and whose name is not on the roll of ratepaying electors, the questions following:—

- (i.) What is your name?
- (ii.) Are you the owner or occupier of property within this school district for which you are liable to be rated?
- (iii.) What is the property in respect of which you claim to vote, and the name and situation thereof, and to what corporation are you liable to pay rates in respect thereof?
- (iv.) Have you already voted at the present election?

And no person who shall refuse to answer any of such questions, or whose answer to the same shall not show his right to give such vote, shall receive a ballot-paper, or be permitted to vote.

23. Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer or his deputy, or such other person appointed at each polling booth, shall proceed, in the presence and subject to the inspection of the poll clerks and of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as shall be pleased to be present, to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer or deputy or other person respectively shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the deputy or such other person shall immediately forward the ballot-papers sealed up, together with a list made up under the inspection of the said scrutineers of the total number of votes for each candidate, to the returning officer; and the returning officer shall in like manner seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth in which he shall have presided; and such returning officer shall as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll give public notice of the number of votes given to each candidate, and shall declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received at all the polling booths taken together the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the Board of Advice, and shall notify under his hand, to the Minister of Public Instruction, the names of the members so elected, and such names shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in such case have the casting vote.

24. The returning officer shall forthwith after the declaration of the poll cause all the sealed parcels of ballot-papers to be sealed up in a packet indorsed with the description of the contents thereof signed by the returning officer, and shall safely and secretly keep the same for six months; and shall after the expiration of such period of six months cause such ballot-papers to be destroyed in presence of three of the members of the Board of Advice so elected.

25. When the proceedings at any election of any Board of Advice shall be interrupted or obstructed at any polling place by any riot or open violence, the returning officer or deputy or person appointed as aforesaid, as the case may be, shall not finally close the poll, but shall adjourn the taking of the poll at the polling place at which such interruption or obstruction shall have happened to the following day; and, if necessary, such returning officer, deputy, or person aforesaid, shall further adjourn such poll until such interruption or obstruction shall have ceased, when such returning officer, deputy, or person aforesaid, shall again proceed with the taking of the poll at the place at which the same may have been so interrupted or obstructed.

26. If from any cause, not being such as in the last preceding section mentioned, after a poll shall stand appointed for any election no such election shall take place on the day appointed for the same, the election shall stand adjourned until the same day of the following week, and the returning officer shall give not less than three days' previous notice thereof, by advertisement or by placards affixed in public places in the school district.

27. If at any election no members or a less number of members than is necessary to fill the vacancies to fill which such election was held shall be elected, the returning officer shall notify the same forthwith to the Minister of Public Instruction.

Filling up casual vacancies. 28. Whenever, during the period which elapses between two triennial elections, a vacancy occurs in any Board of Advice, and it may not be advisable or practicable to hold an election to fill up such vacancy, the Governor in Council may appoint some suitable person to fill up such vacancy, and the person so appointed shall hold office till the conclusion of the next triennial election.

When an election is necessary Minister to notify vacancy to returning officer. 29. When any vacancy takes place in any Board of Advice, and it is deemed advisable to fill up such vacancy by an election, the Minister of Public Instruction shall cause the same to be notified to the returning officer, who shall thereupon proceed to fill up the vacancy by an election in the manner hereinbefore provided.

Returning officer not to be a candidate. 30. No person who acts as returning officer, or as deputy returning officer, at any election shall be or become a candidate for the office of member of the Board of Advice at such election.

Death or resignation of members to be notified. 31. The death or resignation of any member of a Board of Advice shall be at once notified by such Board to the Minister of Public Instruction.

Removal of member on account of absence. 32. Any member of a Board of Advice who shall absent himself from the meetings of the Board for three months consecutively, having been duly summoned to attend, shall be liable to be removed, and may thereupon be removed accordingly.

Removal of member for misconduct. 33. The removal by the Governor in Council of any member of a Board of Advice for misconduct shall render every such person ineligible for re-election, and incapable of holding the position of a member of a Board of Advice for any school district for a period of three years from the date of such removal, or for such further period as may be determined on by the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by section 250 of the *Lunacy Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1113) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations as to him shall seem meet for fixing the fees to be charged and paid in all or any proceedings in lunacy: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations fixing the fees to be paid to medical practitioners ordered by justices to examine persons charged with lunacy under the provisions of Part I. of the aforesaid Act, viz.:—

The fee for examining any person charged with lunacy, and for giving the necessary evidence and certificate shall be £1 1s.

Should more than one examination be necessary to determine the question of insanity, the fee for each such additional examination (not exceeding three examinations in all) shall be 10s. 6d.

The fees above prescribed shall not apply to the cases of such persons as shall not have been found within any city, town, borough, or shire, and shall not include the allowance payable for travelling expenses of medical witnesses under any regulations that are now or may hereafter be in force.

## REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE ORVILLE COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on 3rd July, 1893, the managers of the Orville Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. Ratopayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year:—

For every head of large cattle, Four (4) shillings per annum.  
For every head of small cattle, Two (2) shillings per annum.

Provided always that the full fee shall be paid for each half-year for every head of large or small cattle depasturing on the common during any portion of a half-year.

3. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

4. All stock remaining on the common fourteen (14) days after the period for which payment has been made, shall be liable to be impounded without notice to the owners of such stock.

5. All persons desiring to depasture stock on the common shall apply to the managers, and shall deliver to them a written description of such stock showing the numbers, sexes, colours, brands, and other conspicuous marks (if any), and if found entitled to depasture such stock on the common, shall pay the fees for the current half-year. All unlicensed stock shall be deemed to be trespassers on the common.

6. The owners of stock depasturing on the common shall muster them at such places as may be appointed by the managers, as often as the managers may deem necessary, for the purpose of branding them, notice being given by the managers or herdsman at least four (4) days before such musters shall take place.

7. All stock not branded at the latest time appointed by the managers for branding shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall, except as hereinafter provided, be liable to be forthwith impounded by the herdsman.

8. Whenever the managers believe that any animal depasturing on the common is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common on receiving twenty-four (24) hours' notice to do so from the managers or herdsman; and in the event of such owner neglecting or refusing to remove an animal so affected, it shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be dealt with accordingly.

9. Bulls or entire horses shall not be permitted to run on the common without the consent, in writing, of the managers.

10. All stock depastured on the common shall run at the owner's risk.

11. No stock trespassing on the common, and bearing the brand of an adjoining common, shall be impounded until after forty-eight hours' notice has been given to the herdsman or managers thereof by the herdsman or managers of the former common.

12. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her rights of commonage.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

**REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE PYRAMID HILL COMMON.**

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on 3rd July, 1893, the managers of the Pyramid Hill Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
  2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.
  3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—  
 For every horse, mare, gelding, filly, colt, ass, or mule, £1 per annum.  
 For every cow, heifer, ox, or steer over two years old, 12 shillings per annum.  
 For every cow, heifer, ox, or steer over six months and under two years old, 6s. per annum.  
 For every sheep, 6s. per annum.  
 For every goat, 6s. per annum.  
 Progeny under six months old of stock legally depasturing on the common, Free.
  4. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.
  5. No bull or entire horse over the age of nine (9) months shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers, who may refuse to allow thereon any beast or animal which in their opinion would be dangerous to stock on the common.
  6. The herdsman shall, with the assistance of the owners, muster during the last week of every quarter all stock on the common, and shall during the same week take delivery of stock that may be placed on the common, and the managers shall, on payment of the prescribed fees on stock of which the owners shall have furnished, in writing, the number and description, give a receipt for the same, and the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owners or persons in charge, brand such stock with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar.
  7. All registered stock on which the prescribed fee shall not be paid within ten (10) days after the beginning of each quarter shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded.
  8. No stock registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common unless notice of intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owners for the stock removed.
  9. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to stock depasturing on the common, save as provided in clause ten (10).
  10. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common or being removed therefrom without the consent of the owners, notify them within three (3) days thereof, and if the herdsman fail or neglect to give the owners notice, in writing, within the time specified, the former shall, should the stock be lost, be held responsible for the loss, which shall not exceed five pounds (£5) for every horse, Three pounds (£3) for every head of other large cattle over two (2) years old, and One pound (£1) for every head of large cattle over six months and under two years old.
  11. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and as soon as the herdsman shall discover that any stock legally depasturing thereon is affected with any such disease, he shall forthwith give notice, in writing, to the owner or owners of such stock, and to the managers of the common, and shall at once take steps to remove such stock therefrom, and shall not be responsible for any loss the owners thereof may suffer.
  12. The herdsman shall assist the owners of stock legally depasturing on the common to separate any they may require to remove.
  13. All carcasses found on the common, which the owner or owners thereof may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four (24) hours' notice, in writing, from the managers or the herdsman, may be removed or destroyed by burning or otherwise at the expense of such owner or owners.
- Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.
