To the Honorable Thomas Bent, Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of the Colony of Victoria.

The Humble Petition of Thomas Kennedy, of Cobram, in the Colony of Victoria, Farmer and Grazier:

RESPECTFULLY SHEWETH—

Your Petitioner was a duly qualified and nominated Candidate at the election of One Member to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the Electoral District of Benalla and Yarrowonga, held the ninth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

That at the said election Lieutenant-Colonel John Montgomery Templeton and your Petitioner each obtained an equal number of votes at the polling.

That, subsequently to the said election, one John Nicholson, who was the Returning Officer at the said election, under the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1890*, gave his casting vote in favour of the said Lieutenant-Colonel John Montgomery Templeton.

That the said Lieutenant-Colonel John Montgomery Templeton was declared elected and returned as the Member for the said Electoral District.

That the said Lieutenant-Colonel Templeton had been for many years prior to such election, and still held at the time of such election and return, the office and appointment of Lieutenant-Colonel in the Military Forces of Victoria.

That the said Lieutenant-Colonel Templeton held since the fourteenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and still held at the time of such election and return, the office and appointment of an Official Liquidator under the provisions of Act 27 Victoria, No. 190, section 85 (now the *Companies Act 1890*).

That the said Lieutenant-Colonel Templeton, at the time of his election and return, held offices and places of profit under the Crown, and the said Lieutenant-Colonel Templeton was, at the time of such election and return, employed in the Public Service of Victoria for salary, wages, fees, or emolument.

That, on the taking of the poll at such election, divers voters, who were desirous of voting for your Petitioner, applied to the Returning Officer and Deputy Returning Officers at their respective polling places for ballot-papers to enable them to record their votes at the said election, and were improperly refused ballot-papers, and were not permitted to record and did not record their votes at the said election.

That at the Devenish polling places in the Dookie Division of the said Electoral District, being one of the polling places duly appointed for the recording of votes at the said election, no general roll of the electors entitled to vote was supplied by the Returning Officer to his Deputy at such polling place, whereby the said Deputy Returning Officer wholly refused to give any ballot-papers to the voters on such roll who were entitled to vote at such election, and a large number of voters who attended the said polling places to record their votes were not permitted to do so, and did not vote at the said election.

That divers votes which would have been cast in favour of your Petitioner at the said election were by the Deputy Returning Officers wrongfully declared informal, and were not counted in the compilation of votes polled on behalf of your Petitioner.

Your Petitioner also says that but for the facts as in the three preceding paragraphs mentioned he would have obtained a majority of lawful votes at the said election.

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays that you will communicate the matter of this Petition to the Legislative Assembly, in order that the same may be referred to the Committee of Elections and Qualifications.

That the said Lieutenant-Colonel Templeton may be declared not duly elected for the said district.

That your Petitioner may be declared duly elected for the said District, and that the return may be amended accordingly.

That all electors who were refused ballot-papers at the said election may be admitted to vote according to their intention, and that, if necessary, there may be a new election.

And that your Petitioner may have such further or other relief as the circumstances of the case may require or as to the said Committee may seem just.

And your Petitioner, as in duty bound, will ever pray.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

It is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 1st December, 1893, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next.

ESTABLISHMENT OF GAS BEACONS AND BUOYS, NEW CHANNEL, POINT HENRY, AND PORT PHILLIP BAY, AND REMOVAL OF GEELONG LIGHT-SHIP AND GEELONG AND PORTARLINGTON BEACON LIGHTS.

NOTICE is hereby given that the New Channel, Point Henry, extending from outer to inner harbors, Geelong, has been completed throughout its entire length of 2 nautical miles to a navigable depth of 22 feet at average low water, by a width of 110 feet; and that on and after Wednesday, the 20th December, 1893, seven all-round gas-lights, visible in clear weather about 6 miles distant, and showing white on the north side and red on the south side, will be exhibited 26 feet above the mean level of the sea from pile structures erected about 20 feet outside the north and south edges of the channel.

Entering the channel from seaward the north or starboard-hand side will be indicated by four fixed white lights at about equal distances of 4,040 feet apart, and extending from the eastern to the western entrance of the channel, whilst the south or port-hand side will be marked by three fixed red lights at equal distances, but placed so as to alternate with the white lights. These white lights in line will also be in line with the perch buoy off Point Wilson.

Mariners in charge of steam-ships navigating this New Channel, Point Henry, or the South Channel, Geelong, shall cause the speed of such steam-ships to be so reduced that it shall not exceed 5 nautical miles per hour, and no sailing vessel shall enter the New Channel, Point Henry, whilst any other vessel is proceeding through such channel in an opposite direction. These cautions will, in due course, form the subject of port regulations, the infringement of which will render the person in fault liable to a penalty not exceeding £100.

The buoys at present marking Prince George's Bank, Point Richards, and Wilson's Spit, will on the same date, 20th December, be removed, and replaced with gas buoys showing occulting lights, visible in clear weather 6 miles distant, with from six to eight flashes and eclipses every minute. The Prince George's Bank Buoy will show a white light, Point Richards red, and Wilson's Spit white.

REMOVAL OF GEELONG LIGHT-SHIP AND GEELONG AND PORTARLINGTON BEACON LIGHTS.

After the New Channel, Point Henry, has been lit for night traffic as above, the Geelong Light-ship in the North Channel will be removed, and the lighted beacons in both the North and South Channels, Geelong, and the red beacon shore light, Portarlington, will also be discontinued.

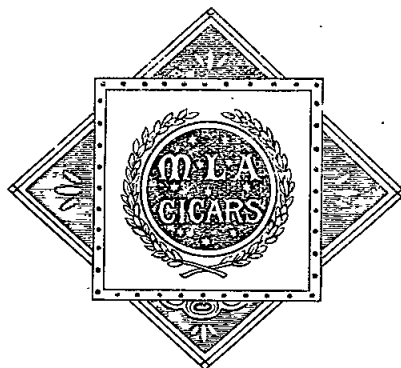

The births of 1,271 children, viz., 620 boys and 651 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. In the month of August, 1,422 births were registered, or 151 more than in the month under review. The births were 20 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 320 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 642, viz., 342 of males and 300 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 629, or 98 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in August by 68, but exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 65. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 69.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2·68, and of deaths registered 1·35.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 81·5° on the 30th, and the lowest was 33·9° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (53·5°) was one-tenth of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (29·5°) took place on the 22nd, and the least range (7·2°) on the 23rd. The mean daily range was 15·0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30·159 inches on the 28th, and the lowest was 29·415 inches on the 11th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·777 inches) was one-sixth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 18 days, the amount of rainfall being 3·273 inches. The average rainfall in September during the previous ten years was 1·89 inches, or 1·38 inches less than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 29 per cent. to that mortality, as against 29 per cent. in September, 1892; 33 per cent. in September, 1891; 35 per cent. in September, 1890; 34 per cent. in September, 1889; 29 per cent. in September, 1888; 28 per cent. in September, 1887.

Fifty-seven deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of cancer; a female, aged 75, of rheumatic gout; a manufacturer, aged 75, of heart disease; a baker, aged 75, of bronchitis; a male of no occupation, aged 75, of nephritis; a civil engineer, aged 75, of Bright's disease; a gentleman, aged 75, of cystitis; a female, aged 76, of erysipelas; a female, aged 76, of apoplexy; a carpenter and three females, each aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 77, of anæmia; a female, aged 77, of asthma; a male of no occupation, aged 77, of pneumonia; a hatter, aged 77, of vesical calculi; a female, aged 78, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 78, of gastric catarrh; a labourer, aged 78, of pneumonia; a female, aged 79, of cerebral softening; a gentleman, aged 79, of syncope; a female, aged 80, of apoplexy; a labourer, aged 80, of syncope; a cooper and a female, each aged 80, of heart disease; a female, aged 80, of bronchitis; a physician, aged 81, of heart disease; a rate collector, aged 81, of bronchitis; a female, aged 82, of senile gangrene; a bootmaker, a boilermaker, and two females, each aged 82, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 83, of influenza; a retired civil servant, aged 83, of morbus cordis; a female, aged 83, of apoplexy; a female, aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 84, of apoplexy; a female, aged 84, of heart disease; a female, aged 84, of pneumonia; a female, aged 85, of softening of the brain; a gentleman, aged 85, of cancer; a labourer and a tailor, each aged 75, a female, aged 76, a female, aged 77, two gentlemen and a female, each aged 78, a female, aged 80, a female, aged 81, a female, aged 85, a gentleman, aged 86, a gardener, aged 87, a gentleman, aged 90, and a female, aged 93, of old age.

Thirty-one deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which twenty-one were set down to accident, three to homicide, six to suicide, and one to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A waiter, aged 34, was killed by a tram; a female, aged 14, by a train; a boy, aged 10, a clerk, aged 23, a stevedore's labourer, aged 48, and a cab-driver, aged 53, died of injuries resulting from falls; a female, aged 68, of fracture of femur—how caused not stated; two male infants, aged 15 days and 3 weeks respectively, died of the effects of circumcision; a female, aged 6, was scalded to death; a boy, aged 10, a seaman, aged 33, a male of no occupation, aged 36, and a boatswain, aged 56, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a boy, aged 16, a carter, aged 27, and a butcher, aged 50, in Hobson's Bay; a male and two female infants, aged 5 months, 1 day, and 6 months respectively, were overlain; a labourer, aged 72, was choked by food. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male and two new-born female infants, who were smothered, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a printer, aged 26, who shot himself; a female, aged 25, a jeweller, aged 33, a storeman, aged 34, and a night watchman, aged 58, who poisoned themselves, and a carpenter, aged 50, who hanged himself. The execution was that of a selector, aged 57, who was hanged for the murder of an Asiatic at Bendoc.

One hundred and fourteen deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—42 in the Melbourne Hospital, 14 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 10 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Women's Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Penridge Stockade, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, 1 in the Infant Asylum, and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 188, of which 106, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 82, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 116 were under one year of age, 31 were between one and two, 20 were between two and three, 12 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 454. Of these, 236, or 52 per cent., were males, and 218, or 48 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 15 were between ten and fifteen, 20 were between fifteen and twenty, 21 were between twenty and twenty-five, 36 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 15 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty, 36 were between fifty and fifty-five, 40 were between fifty-five and sixty, 44 were between sixty and sixty-five, 37 were between sixty-five and seventy, 37 were between seventy and seventy-five, 29 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 28 were upwards of eighty.

Thirty-one deaths were set down to measles during the month, as against 116 in August, 186 in July, 42 in June, and 2 in May; the total deaths from measles in Melbourne and suburbs since the first outbreak of the epidemic being thus 377. In September, only 10 of the deaths were set down to measles simply, the complaint being complicated with pneumonia in 14 instances, with meningitis in 2 instances, and with diarrhoea, whooping-cough, congestion of the lungs, bronchitis, and cerebro-colitis 1 case of each. Besides these, 1 out of 9 deaths from diphtheria was said to be complicated with measles. Only 1 death from diphtheria occurred in the previous month. Typhoid fever caused 2 deaths both in September and August. Two infants in the month under notice died of the effects of circumcision, the immediate cause of death being hæmorrhage in one instance, and septic peritonitis in the other.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in the first nine months of 1893, and of the four previous years:—

COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—AMENDED REGULATION No. 6.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, repealed the Order in Council made on the 14th day of August, 1893, approving Regulation No. 6 made by the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and has approved the subjoined Regulation No. 6 made by the said Trust in lieu thereof, viz.:—

REGULATION No. 6.

- All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of lands shall be paid for by measure. The form of measurement shall be determined by the Trust.
- Every outlet required in addition to those provided free of cost by the Trust shall be borne by the occupier of the land.
- Any person who shall construct any outlet from the works of the Trust without the written authority of the Trust, and in that case without the supervision of the authorized officer, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.
- The rate or price to be paid for water delivered by gravitation from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes, which shall include the irrigation of vineyards, orchards, and gardens, unless a garden irrigation right is taken out, shall be—for crops of all kinds and of fallow land, for each watering Three pence per inch per acre or any fractional part of an acre, and 2 inches shall be deemed a watering; for the irrigation of grass land by gravitation water, One penny halfpenny per inch per acre or for any fractional part of an acre, 2 inches to be deemed a watering, shall be the charge or rate for each watering. No charge shall be made for the filling of tanks by gravitation water. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered by pumping from the works of the Trust, for irrigation purposes, including the irrigation of vineyards, orchards, and gardens, unless a garden irrigation right be taken out, shall be for each watering Six pence per inch per acre or any fractional part of an acre, and 3 inches shall be deemed a watering. Tanks when filled by water pumped shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings for each tank for each filling or partial filling.
- Garden irrigation right.*—The rate or price to be paid for the irrigation of vineyards, orchards, or gardens (for each owner or occupier may take out a garden irrigation right), for the period from the 1st day of January, 1893, to the 31st day of December, 1893, inclusive, or for any portion of the said period, shall be for water delivered either by gravitation or by pumping, for the first or one acre or any fractional part of an acre Six pence per inch, and 40 inches shall be deemed the year's irrigation; for the second acre or fractional part of an acre Six pence per inch, and 30 inches shall be deemed the year's irrigation; and for each additional acre or fractional part of an acre Six pence per inch, and 20 inches shall be deemed the year's irrigation.
- All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of gravitation water than is equal to the value of Five shillings, or of pumped water to the value of Ten shillings; and the delivery of water shall be continued on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

7. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him, whereupon, and before the delivery of the water shall be proceeded with, he shall pay to the Secretary to the Trust, or other officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose, the sum of money to which the quantity of water to be delivered to him will amount at the rate or price set forth in clauses 4 and 5 of this regulation.

8. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers shall, under any circumstances, open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works.

9. Any person not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust who shall open any irrigation outlets, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

10. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

11. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet, shall remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with either by such owner or occupier or any other person in any way whatsoever, except with the express sanction of the Trust, in writing, and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.

12. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owners, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

13. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 411 of the *Water Act 1890*.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 30th day of August, 1893.

REBATES OF DUTY UPON SUGAR AND LIQUID GLUCOSE.—REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the *Duties of Customs Act 1893 (No. 2)* (57 Vict. No. 1321) it is amongst other things enacted that, on and after the fourteenth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, a rebate of duty of Three shillings per hundredweight shall be allowed to manufacturers on all sugar used in the manufacture of ale, beer, cordials, syrups, jams, jellies, and preserves, and on all sugar and glucose used in the manufacture of confectionery; and that such rebate shall be allowed only to licensed or registered manufacturers under regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council, and shall be allowed only in respect of sugar and glucose upon which the increased duty under the said Act has been paid: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR REBATE OF SUGAR AND LIQUID GLUCOSE DUTIES.

- Persons desirous of obtaining rebate of duty on sugar and liquid glucose used by them in their manufactures must register their names, callings, and places of business with the Secretary for Trade and Customs, Melbourne.
- No person using less than two tons of sugar or liquid glucose per month can be so registered.
- No person being a cordial maker or aerated water manufacturer can be registered under clause 1 who is not the holder of a wine and spirit licence, and whose premises are not registered under the Factories Act.
- Claims for rebate must be made in the form of Schedule 1 hereto, and must be accompanied by the seller's original invoice of the sugar or liquid glucose in respect of which the rebate is claimed.
- Every person desirous of claiming rebate shall keep a book in the form prescribed by the Secretary for Trade and Customs, showing the quantity of sugar and liquid glucose purchased, the quantity of sugar and liquid glucose used in manufacture, and the quantity of each article manufactured in which such sugar and liquid glucose are contained, and must prove to the satisfaction of the Secretary for Trade and Customs that the duty in respect of which rebate has been claimed has been actually paid.
- In order to obtain rebate an officer of Customs must have been present when the sugar and liquid glucose in respect of which rebate is claimed has been manipulated in such a manner as to render it unfit for ordinary use. Provided that in cases where the Secretary for Trade and Customs may not consider that the above regulation must be strictly carried out in order to protect the revenue this condition may be waived by him.
- The Commissioner of Trade and Customs may at any time refuse to grant rebate without cause assigned, or may allow rebate in any case where he may deem it just to do so, notwithstanding that these regulations may not have been complied with in every respect.
- Each person desirous of manufacturing under these regulations shall give a bond, in the form of Schedule 2 hereto, with two sufficient sureties in the sum of £500, conditioned that he will in every way comply therewith, and will not improperly or illegally deal with any sugar or liquid glucose in respect of which he may claim or intend to claim rebate.
- Any place registered under these regulations, and any books or documents kept thereon, shall be at all times open to the inspection of the Customs officers.
- The expenses of Customs supervision shall be paid by the manufacturer registered as aforesaid, and the amount payable in each case shall be fixed by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.
- No person shall be permitted to register under clause 1 of these regulations who is carrying on business as a grocer or storekeeper in the same locality as that in which his place of manufacturer is situated, and no person who having been registered shall thereafter carry on any such business shall be entitled to receive rebate under these regulations.

CAULFIELD RACES ON 21ST OCTOBER.

Return tickets, at Holiday Excursion fares, will be issued at all stations (suburban excepted) to Melbourne by all trains (express trains included) on the 20th October, and by all trains timed to reach Melbourne not later than 1.15 p.m. on the 21st October.
