THE FEDERAL COUNCIL OF AUSTRALASIA.—ACT ASSENTED TO.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48th and 49th Vict. Ch. 60, intituled *An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia*, it was enacted that every Act assented to in the first instance should be proclaimed in the *Government Gazette* of the Colony in which the Session of the Council at which it was passed was held, and should also be transmitted by the Governor assenting thereto to the Governors of the several Colonies affected thereby, and should be proclaimed by them within the respective Colonies of which they are Governors: And whereas the Bill as set forth hereunder, passed in the Fifth Session of the Federal Council, held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, has been assented to and proclaimed in the *Hobart Gazette*, bearing date the sixteenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, by His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Tasmania, and transmitted by him to me in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore in part recited Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do hereby proclaim the said Act so passed and assented to as aforesaid, that is to say:—

“An Act to make Provision for the Discipline and Government of the Garrisons established at King George’s Sound and Thursday Island at the joint Expense of the Australian Colonies or some of them.” (3 February, 1893.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in the fifty-sixth year of Her Majesty’s reign.

ANNO QUINQUAGESIMO SEXTO VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.—No. 1.

An Act to make Provision for the Discipline and Government of the Garrisons established at King George’s Sound and Thursday Island at the joint Expense of the Australian Colonies or some of them. [3 February, 1893.]

**WHEREAS** the Legislatures of the Colonies of Queensland, Victoria, and Western Australia have, pursuant to the Preamble, provisions of *The Federal Council of Australasia Act 1885*, referred to the Federal Council the matter of the discipline and government of the garrisons that have been heretofore or may be hereafter established and maintained at King George’s Sound, in the Colony of Western Australia, and at Thursday Island, in the Colony of Queensland, or at any other place within the Australian Colonies, at the joint expense of those Colonies or any of them:

And whereas agreements have been concluded by and between the Governments of the several Australian Colonies of New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Victoria, and Western Australia, for the construction, at the joint expense of the said Colonies, of fortifications at King George’s Sound and at Thursday Island aforesaid, and for the establishment and maintenance of garrisons at those places respectively at the like joint expense:

And whereas it is desirable that the discipline and government of the garrisons so to be established and maintained should be regulated by a law of the Federal Council:

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Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Federal Council of Australasia, assembled at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as *The Federal Garrisons Act 1893*.

Garrisons to be subject to local laws with certain modifications.

2. The garrisons established and maintained at King George's Sound, in the Colony of Western Australia, and at Thursday Island, in the Colony of Queensland, in pursuance of the said recited agreements, shall be governed by the laws relating to the military forces of the Colony in which those places are respectively situated, but subject to such modifications, if any, as may be made in those laws under the following provisions of this Act, that is to say:—  
If, at the time when any of the officers or men who form part of either of the said garrisons were or are engaged for service in the garrison, they were or are under engagement according to the laws of another Australasian Colony for service therein during a specified period as part of the naval or military forces of such last-mentioned Colony, an agreement may be made by and between the Governor of such last-mentioned Colony and the Governor of the Colony in which the garrison is established, with the advice of their respective Executive Councils, providing for all or any of the following matters, that is to say:—

(a) The application to any such officers and men of any provisions of the laws relating to the military forces of the Colony in which they were or are so under engagement at the time when they were or are engaged for service in the garrison;

(b) The exercise by the military authorities of such last-mentioned Colony with respect to any such officer or man of any powers or authorities conferred on them by the laws relating to the military forces of that Colony;

(c) The places at which and manner in which the last-mentioned powers and authorities are to be exercised;

(d) Excluding the application to any such officers or men of any provisions of the laws relating to the military forces of the Colony in which the garrison is established, or modifying any of such provisions so far as regards their application to such officers or men.

And any such agreement shall have the force of law.

Enforcement of discipline.

3. When in the exercise of the powers conferred under such an agreement, any officer or man is subjected to military discipline or to punishment by the military authorities of the Colony in which he was or is under engagement when he engaged or engages for service in the garrison, such discipline or punishment may be enforced in the Colony in which the garrison is established.

Engagements for service may be entered into at any place within the Australasian Colonies.

4. An engagement for service in either of the said garrisons may be entered into at any place within the Australasian Colonies, whether that place is within the Federation or not; and, if such an engagement is entered into at a place which is not within the Federation, it shall nevertheless be valid and effectual within the Federation, and on board of all British ships to which this Act extends.

Return of troops to the Colony where they were originally engaged.

5. When a man is, at the time of his engagement for service in either of the said garrisons, under engagement for service in the naval or military forces of another Australasian Colony for a specified period, which period has not expired at the time of his engagement for service in the garrison, he may, at any time before the expiration of the period of his engagement for service in that other Colony, be ordered to return to that Colony and resume his service in the forces thereof, and may, if he refuses, be removed to that Colony in custody, by sea, in any British ship to which this Act extends.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I assent to this Act.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Vict., cap. 60, intitled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is enacted that the Federal Council of Australasia shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the Colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of each of the Colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation: And whereas the present Session of the said Federal Council has been held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania: And whereas it is expedient that the said Federal Council shall be prorogued: Now therefore I, the Honorable Sir William Lambert Dobson, Knight, Chief Justice of the Colony of Tasmania, Administrator of the Government thereof, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred upon me, do, by this my Proclamation, prorogue the said Federal Council.

*Police Offences Act 1891, Section 8.*

**REGISTRATION OF FIRMS ACT 1892.**

**A**NY person or persons carrying on business under a firm or trading name, which does not disclose the full or usual names of all the partners, or under any name which may be different to the name of the actual proprietor or proprietors of the business, and any person or firm still carrying on business under an old firm name where the original proprietor has ceased to be a partner, or where one or more of the old partners have died or retired, must register on or before 31st March, 1893.

Where the same person or persons are carrying on a business under one or more different firm or trading names each must be registered separately.

Any new firm or any person about to commence business under a firm or trading name must register before commencing business.

Any alteration in a firm or trading name and any change in the constitution of the firm must be registered within one month.

Penalty Five pounds, and for every subsequent conviction not exceeding Ten pounds. Any action by an unregistered firm may be stayed.

Further information can be obtained from the Registrar-General, Melbourne. Printed forms at all Courts of Petty Sessions, at which a copy of the Act can be seen.

*Alteration in character of Apparatus and in position  
of Madras Light.*

WITH reference to the previous Notices to Mariners on the subject, dated respectively the 2nd September, 1892, and 23rd November, 1892, it is now notified that the new light will be exhibited on the 1st July, 1893.

2. Special attention is drawn to the following particulars regarding the light, and the main tower of the Law Courts from which it will be exhibited, viz.:

(a) The light will be a 3rd order dioptric double-flashing white light of half-minute periods, giving two flashes of about two seconds, separated by an eclipse of about three seconds, followed by a long eclipse of 23 seconds, and should be visible at a distance of 20 miles in clear weather from N. by E. through W. to S. by W., or from all directions seaward.

(b) The main tower of the Law Courts from which the light will be exhibited is an octagonal structure of brick and stone. It will be surmounted by a stone dome having a cupola termination, on which the lantern, which will have a gilded dome, will be placed. The tower is clearly distinguishable from seaward.

3. The approximate position of the tower is latitude 13° 5' 13" N., longitude 80° 16' 52" E.

4. The height above high water of the centre of the lantern will be 166 feet.

5. It is intended to dismantle the existing light-house as soon as possible after the exhibition of the new light.

- (5) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (6) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *voce voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.



4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

BY-LAW No. 44.

By-law making a rate for water supply purposes, and for fixing a scale of charges for water supplied by measure.

THE Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by Part VI. of the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rate for one year, from the 1st day of January, 1893, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of St. Arnaud, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

On every house or tenement of the annual value of £5 and under, the annual sum of Ten shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £5 and not exceeding £10, the annual sum of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10 and not exceeding £20, the annual sum of Twenty shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, the annual sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
