## VICTORIAN TREASURY BONDS (56 VICT. No. 1283).

PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST PAYABLE IN MELBOURNE,  
TRANSFERABLE ON DELIVERY.

**T**ENDERS will be received at the Revenue and Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, until Noon of Tuesday, the 31st January, 1893, for the whole or any part of the Treasury Bonds to be issued under the authority of the *Treasury Bonds Act 1892* to the extent of Seven hundred and fifty thousand pounds secured upon the Consolidated Revenue of Victoria.

The Bonds will be repayable as follows:—

£250,000 on the 1st January, 1896,  
£250,000 on the 1st January, 1897,  
£250,000 on the 1st January, 1898,

and carry interest from the 1st January, 1893.

The Bonds will, at the option of tenderer, be issued for amounts of One hundred, Five hundred, or One thousand pounds.

The interest will be at the rate of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly, viz.:—1st July and 1st January in each year, the first half-year's interest being payable on the 1st July, 1893.

Each tender must specify the number of Bonds tendered for, the denomination thereof, the currency, the rate per £100, amount of tender, and the amount of Bonds tendered for, and must be accompanied by a deposit equal to Five per cent. of the nominal amount of the Bonds tendered for in cash or bank draft, which will be refunded if tender is not accepted.

The envelope containing the tender must be addressed to the Honorable the Treasurer, Treasury, Melbourne, and inscribed "Tender for Treasury Bonds," and may be deposited in the Tender-Box in the Revenue and Pay Office, at the Treasury, Melbourne.

Tenders will be opened in the presence of such of the tenderers as may desire to attend at the Board Room at the Public Offices, Treasury Gardens, at Noon on Tuesday, the 31st January, 1893.

The Government will not necessarily accept any tender.

Successful tenderers will be allowed till Tuesday, the 14th February, to pay the balance, on which date the Bonds will be delivered to the successful tenderers.

Forms of tender may be obtained either on application by letter, addressed to the Under-Treasurer, Melbourne, or by personal application to the Secretary to the Tender Board, at the Treasury, Melbourne.

The decision of the Government will be made known on the day following that on which the tenders are opened.

The petitioners state that, owing to their distance from the present seat of local government and the size of the shire, they are unable to obtain proper representation, or to exercise the necessary control and supervision over public works; that they are unable to secure a proper extension of water supply, owing to their representatives being in a minority in the council; that no community of interests exists between the area above described and other portions of the shire in regard to irrigation matters; and that, if the proposed new shire were constituted, better supervision would be exercised over the expenditure of rates, &c., derived from the area.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said area from the Shire of Echuca and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of the "Shire of Deakin," such municipality to be divided into three ridings.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of January, 1893.*

WHEREAS by the *Infant Life Protection Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1198) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time and from time to time make regulations for all or any of the purposes specified in section 6 of the said Act, and by such regulations may impose a penalty not exceeding Twenty-five pounds for any breach of the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. One Register under the *Infant Life Protection Act 1890* shall be kept at each of the undermentioned police stations:—

Russell-street, Melbourne, Ararat, Bairnsdale, Ballarat, Beechworth, Benalla, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Daylesford, Echuca, Geelong, Hamilton, Horsham, Jamieson, Kilmore, Kyneton, Mansfield, Maryborough, Mildura, Nhill, Omeo, Palmerston, Port Fairy, Portland, Sale, Shepparton, St. Arnaud, Stawell, Wangaratta, Warra-gul, Warrnambool.

2. All applications for registration or renewal shall be made upon the form in Schedule A to these regulations, each application being delivered by the applicant personally to the sub-officer of police in charge of any of the stations where registers are required to be kept. Such sub-officer shall on receipt of an application make such inquiry as appears necessary and report to the Chief Commissioner of Police, who shall direct that the registration be effected or the application refused as he may see fit. If the application be approved by the Chief Commissioner of Police, the sub-officer in charge shall forthwith enter the particulars in the register and issue a certificate of registration to the applicant.

3. Registers shall contain the particulars set forth in Schedule B to these regulations.

4. Houses registered shall be classified according to the floor area available for infants, which shall be determined on the basis defined hereunder, viz:—

(a) The floor area of the house shall be taken to be the total internal floor area of all the rooms of the house, the following deductions having been made, viz:—(1) that of the passages and stairways, of the bathroom, of the kitchen and scullery, and of any lean-to imperfectly closed or of less height than 7 feet in any part; (2) that of any room or rooms specially set apart as sitting or receiving rooms and not regularly occupied either by day or by night; (3) that of any cupboard or dresser, extending down to or to within 7 feet of the floor; (4) that of any room or rooms having a smaller area than 90 square feet or having no open chimney or flue, or having no readily openable window, or having a glazed window surface of smaller area than two-thirds of a square yard; (5) that of any room or rooms or of portion of any room or rooms of less height than 7 feet; and (6) that of any cellar or cellars.

(b) The floor area available for infants, hereinafter called the available floor area, shall be taken to be the floor area minus such area as is required for the other occupants of the house, including the attendant or attendants on the infants, and allowing 50 square feet as the requirement for each such occupant.

5. The classification of houses registered shall be as follows:—

- Houses with available floor area measuring 50 square feet, to receive not more than one infant.
- Houses with available floor area measuring 100 square feet, to receive not more than two infants.
- Houses with available floor area measuring 150 square feet, to receive not more than three infants.
- Houses with available floor area measuring 200 square feet, and with an outdoor area of at least 400 square feet, to receive not more than four infants.
- Houses with available floor area measuring 275 square feet, and with an outdoor area of at least 400 square feet, to receive not more than five infants.
- Houses with available floor area measuring 350 square feet, and with an outdoor area of at least 400 square feet, to receive not more than six infants.
- Houses with available floor area exceeding 350 square feet, and with an outdoor area of at least 400 square feet, to be specially considered as to the maximum number of infants to be admitted.

6. The Chief Commissioner, or any person authorized by him, shall be empowered to inspect any house registered from time to time as occasion may require.

7. Any person registered under the *Infant Life Protection Act 1890* who shall have charge of a greater number of infants than the number allotted under these regulations for the house occupied by such person shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound or more than Five pounds.

No. 1099) it is amongst other things enacted that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned, and that all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of Part I. of the said Act: And whereas it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*; and that if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication, the Governor in Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and that they shall thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition, signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Williamstown Hospital, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, declare the contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Williamstown Hospital, in the colony of Victoria, to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of

WHEREAS by section 102 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time fix a sum which shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by any owner or occupier of property liable to be rated by any Waterworks Trust: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order and direct that the sum of One pound five shillings sterling (£1 5s.) shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid for the year 1893 by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement supplied with water and liable to be rated by the Borough Echuca Water Trust.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

# BOROUGH OF ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—WATER REGULATIONS FOR 1893.

## REGULATION No. 8.

REGULATIONS for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Borough of Echuca Water Trust District, the same being duly supplied with water for the year 1893.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Echuca Water Trust District shall pay for the year 1893, viz:—

2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty-five pounds or less, the sum of Twenty-five shillings.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty-five pounds, in addition to the Twenty-five shillings named in the last clause, a sum of Four pounds per centum for every pound from Twenty-six pounds to One hundred pounds inclusive, and a sum of Three pounds per centum on every pound from One hundred pounds upwards.

4. On every cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory using water, a charge of Ten pounds per annum, and on every flour-mill a charge of Fifteen pounds per annum.

5. On every steam-engine a charge of Twenty shillings, not to include any steam-engine working any factory or mill named in clause 4.

6. On every livery-stable a charge of Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

7. On every hotel a charge of Five pounds per centum on the valuation up to One hundred and fifty pounds, and for every pound from One hundred and fifty pounds upwards, a charge of Three pounds per centum.

8. On every horse-trough a charge of Ten shillings.

9. The charge for every private house shall include one quarter acre of land. Should any larger quantity of cultivated land be attached to a private house, an extra charge of Ten shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre shall be paid.

10. For water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold, in addition to the ordinary charge for domestic purposes, they shall pay an additional charge of Fifty shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre.

11. The use of water by hose or otherwise for garden purposes shall be absolutely prohibited between the hours of Seven a.m. and Six p.m.

12. Any person supplied with water by the Commissioners who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

13. Any owner or occupier of property wishing the water cut off, by giving due notice shall be charged at the minimum rate, as provided for in clauses 19 and 20.

14. If any person supplied with water by the Commissioners does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or do any thing which under these Regulations ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Commissioners may cut off the supply from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Commissioners.

15. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of same.

16. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Commissioners, without giving at least twelve hours' notice, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Commissioners, without the permission of the Commissioners, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Commissioners, shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

18. That in every case where rates are three months in arrears, the water be cut off until such arrears are paid, dating from 1st January, 1893.

## CASES WHERE WATER IS NOT LAID ON.

19. On every house, tenement, hotel, factory, &c., not supplied with water, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the valuation of same shall be paid.

20. On each allotment or piece of land rated separately from any tenement, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of the same, provided that no allotments or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings and sixpence.

## METERS.

21. The charge for water supplied by meter shall be Three shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the amount shall not in any case be less than the charges hereinbefore made.

22. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Three shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons.

23. The foregoing Regulations were duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough of Echuca Water Trust, at their office, Echuca, on the 30th day of November, 1892, and the seal of the Trust was fixed hereto this 7th day of December, 1892.

AND SCALE OF FEES.

THE subjoined Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Beaufort Public Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE BEAUFORT  
PUBLIC CEMETERY, MADE BY THE TRUSTEES 28TH NOVEMBER,  
1892.

1. IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Beaufort Public Cemetery make the following Rules, Regulations, and Scale of Fees, which said Rules, Regulations, and Scale of Fees shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules, regulations, and scale of fees heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders for interments are given.

3. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial, and the hours for burials shall be—On week days from Eight a.m. to Six p.m., and on Sundays from Two p.m. to Five p.m.

4. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made to the secretary, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, has been delivered to the secretary or sexton.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, and the digging of all common graves shall be performed by the sexton or some other person duly authorized by the trustees, and no other person or persons shall be permitted to dig a common grave in the cemetery without first obtaining the written consent of the trustees.

6. Any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

7. Any person desiring to purchase ground for a private burial place shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a certificate which shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and also the right to make a grave or vault on such private ground, and to erect and maintain any fence, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or tablet erected thereon.

8. A plan of all monuments, cenotaphs, tombstones, tablets, and fences proposed to be erected, also a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, must be first submitted to the trustees, and no erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

9. No private grave shall be dug or re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

10. Every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection shall be maintained in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of any person having the exclusive right of burial or interment in such grave or vault, and all wooden fencing not kept in repair may be removed by the trustees.

11. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original interment taken from the cemetery register, and also the licence for disinterment obtained from the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

12. Every adult's grave shall be 6 feet deep, and not more than two adults shall be interred therein, unless the grave be of greater depth, or of extra width. In such graves two children shall be considered equal to an adult.

13. Every grave for a child's body shall be 5 feet deep, and not more than two such bodies shall be interred therein, unless the grave be of greater depth, or of extra width.

14. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

15. Any application for more than three private graves shall be dealt with by the trustees.

No. 4.—JANUARY 13, 1893.—3.

16. Any monument, headstone, wall, fence, or other erection requiring to be removed on re-opening or sinking a grave shall be removed and re-erected by the owner thereof.

17. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except as approved by the trustees, and no person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless by authority of the trustees first had and obtained.

18. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily throughout the year, but the trustees shall have the right, by themselves and servants, to remove from the cemetery all persons misconducting themselves, or violating the rules of decorum, or committing any nuisance.

19. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fire-arms discharged therein.

20. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment of special authority from the trustees.

21. Any person working in the cemetery, though not in the employment of the trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery; and all stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work. All material required in any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery.

22. An additional fee, according to the circumstances of the case, shall be paid for any exhumation involving extra labour.

23. The fees mentioned in Schedule B shall be the fees payable under these Rules and Regulations.

24. No person shall be permitted to enclose any ground or grave situated in the denominational portions of the cemetery without first obtaining a certificate issued in accordance with the provisions of Rule 7. A frame of wood not more than 10 inches high may, however, be put on any grave so situated.

## FIRST DIVISION.—250 SERVICES.

**TENDERS** are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon on Tuesday, the 17th day of January, 1893, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails, viz., Letters, Packets, Parcels, and Newspapers, as undermentioned, FOR THREE YEARS, from the 1st July, 1893, to 30th June, 1896.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.
