EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1893.

Factorics and Shops Act 1890.

The compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the Waterproof Garment Factory of Mr. B. Glass, at 18 Queensberry-street, North Melbourne,

for a period of eight weeks from the 4th April, 1893, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

- 1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than twelve females or six males under sixteen years of age for more than fifty-eight hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
- 2. That each female and each male under sixteen years of age so employed shall be paid for the extra work she or he is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
- That none of such females or males under sixteen years of age shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
- 4. That a copy of this Order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.


