FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Wednesday, the twelfth day of April, 1893, and it is expedient to further prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Wednesday, the twelfth day of April, 1893, until Thursday, the twenty-fifth day of May, 1893.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this tenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in the fifty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135), and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

FRIDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Pymlico;

THURSDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Bairnsdale and Winchelsea;

FRIDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,

to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Chiltern and Walhalla;

THURSDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Berwick.
