"An Act relating to the transfer of certain powers and duties from the Registrar-General to the Government Statist."

VICTOBIA B.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirty-third year of Our Reign, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the Coinage and Her Majesty's Mint," it is amongst other things enacted: That We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, shall from time to time by Proclamation determine the design for any coin:

We have, therefore, thought fit to order that certain of the coins made at Our Mint, mentioned in the First Schedule to the aforesaid Act. of the weight and fineness specified in that Schedule, shall bear designs as follows:—

That every Five-Pound Piece should have for the obverse impression Our Effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei: GraBritt Regina Fid Def Ind. Imp," and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Two-Pound Piece should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Sovereign should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Half-Sovereign should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, and on the edge of the piece in raised lettors "Decus et Tutamen Anno Regni," the year of the reign being in roman numeral letters; and that every Half-Crown should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria" Dei: Gra Britt Reg." and of the reverse the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained

in a shield surmounted by the Royal Crown and surrounded by the Collar of the Garter, with the inscription "Fid' Def' Ind' Imp," together with the words "Half-Crown," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Florin should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, and for the reverse two Royal sceptres in saltire behind three shields, the shield on the dexter, in bend, bearing the Arms of England, that on the sinister, in bend sinister, Scotland, and that in base, Ireland; between them the three emblems, the rose, the thistle, and the shamrock, each shield surmounted by the Royal Crown, the garter, bearing the motto" Honi soit qui mal y pense," underlying the whole, and the words "One Florin Two Shillings" and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Shilling should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, and for the reverse three shields, that on the dexter bearing the Arms of England, that on the sinister, Scotland, and that in base, Ireland, each surmounted by the Royal Crown; between them the three emblems, the rose, the thistle, and the shamrock, the garter, bearing the motto "Honi soit qui mal y pense," underlying the whole, and the word "One Shilling," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Sixpence should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, and for the reverse the words "Six Pence" placed in the centre of the piece, having an olive branch on one side and an oak branch on the other, surmounted by the Royal Crown, and the date of the year between and below the branches, with a graining upon the edge; and that certain other pieces of silver money called "The Queen's Maundy Moneys," of Fourpence, Threepence, Twoepence, and one Fenny, should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, and for the reverse the respective figure

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1893.

WITH reference to the notice dated 8th inst., published in the Government Gazette of the 10th inst., p. 1277, it is now notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 1st August, 1893, and following days, an Examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

- (ii.) That his age will be above twenty-one years and under twenty-three years on the 1st April, 1893.

[N.B.—In the case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or should he reside in a Native State, by the highest Political Officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]

(iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.

(iv.) That he is of good moral character.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act 1820 (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.—

The petitioners purport to constitute majorities of the rate-payers in the respective portions of the Shires of Kyneton, Ballan, and Glenlyon which are described in their petition, and they desire that the areas so described may be severed from the Shires of Kyneton, Ballan, and Glenlyon respectively, and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Trentham."

Petitioners state that the area described does not receive proper consideration at the hands of the councils in whose territory it at present is, and they consider that the district has now attained sufficient importance to be intrusted with the conduct of its own municipal affairs; that certain portions of Ballan Shire send very heavy traffic on the road to Trentham, but do not contribute any rates towards the maintenance thereof; that the ratepayers of the Coliban portion of Glenlyon Shire are desirous of having a good road to Trentham, which they cannot obtain under present circumstances, owing to want of attention on the part of Glenlyon Shire; that if the proposed new shire were constituted the revenue would be expended to better advantage, and the fact of a shire hall being erected at Trentham, together with the offices of the municipality, would help the progress and importance of that township and the adjacent district; and that from the neglect of the councils of the existing shires to expend a fair proportion of the income in the portions sought to be severed a great injustice has been done to them, and the petitioners are satisfied that unless the severance be granted the injustice will continue.

Petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said areas and constitute them a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Shire of Trentham."

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and
Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1890 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the Land Act 1891 it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the Land Act 1890 as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, and 8 of section 6 of the Land Act 1890 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively, that is to say:—
