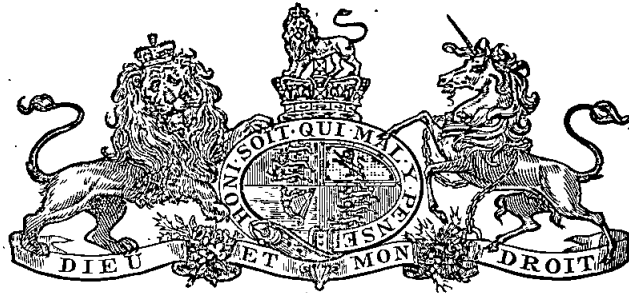

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the
Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria,
and Administrator of the Government of the said
Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public
Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135)
and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164,
Part III., section 20), I, the Administrator of the Government
of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by
this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder
mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays
(as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

THURSDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of
Maffra, and as a Bank Holiday at Bairnsdale and throughout
the Shire of Maffra;

FRIDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,
to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Allendale;

TUESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,
WEDNESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT, and
THURSDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,

to be observed as Public Half-Holidays throughout the Town
of Warrnambool, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each
day;

WEDNESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of
Kilmore, and as a Bank Holiday at Kilmore;

THURSDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT,
to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Warrnambool.

ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the
Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria,
and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony,
&c., &c., &c.

I, THE Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do
hereby declare that I have assented, in Her Majesty's
name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title
whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say :—

"An Act relating to the transfer of certain powers and
duties from the Registrar-General to the Government
Statist."

GOLD AND SILVER COINS.—NEW DESIGNS.

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government has
directed the subjoined Proclamation of Her Majesty in
Council to be published.

A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA R.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirty-third year of Our
Reign, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the law
relating to the Coinage and Her Majesty's Mint," it is amongst
other things enacted: That We, by and with the advice of Our
Privy Council, shall from time to time by Proclamation de-
termine the design for any coin:

We have, therefore, thought fit to order that certain of the
coins made at Our Mint, mentioned in the First Schedule to the
aforesaid Act, of the weight and fineness specified in that
Schedule, shall bear designs as follows:—

That every Five-Pound Piece should have for the obverse im-
pression Our Effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gra
Britt Regina Fid Def Ind Imp," and for the reverse the
image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking
the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground,
and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and
that every Two-Pound Piece should have the same obverse and
reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-
Pound Piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every
Sovereign should have the same obverse and reverse impression
and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, with a
graining upon the edge; and that every Half-Sovereign should
have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in
all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, with a graining upon the
edge; and that every Crown should have the same obverse and
reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-
Pound Piece, and on the edge of the piece in raised letters
"Decus et Tutamen Anno Regni," the year of the reign being
in roman numeral letters; and that every Half-Crown should
have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with
the inscription "Victoria Dei Gra Britt Reg," and for the
reverse the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained

in a shield surmounted by the Royal Crown and surrounded by the Collar of the Garter, with the inscription "Fid. Def. Ind. Imp." together with the words "Half-Crown," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Florin should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, and for the reverse two Royal sceptres in saltire behind three shields, the shield on the dexter, in bend, bearing the Arms of England, that on the sinister, in bend sinister, Scotland, and that in base, Ireland; between them the three emblems, the rose, the thistle, and the shamrock, each shield surmounted by the Royal Crown, the garter, bearing the motto "Honi soit qui mal y pense," underlying the whole, and the words "One Florin Two Shillings" and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Shilling should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, and for the reverse three shields, that on the dexter bearing the Arms of England, that on the sinister, Scotland, and that in base, Ireland, each surmounted by the Royal Crown; between them the three emblems, the rose, the thistle, and the shamrock, the garter, bearing the motto "Honi soit qui mal y pense," underlying the whole, and the words "One Shilling," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Sixpence should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, and for the reverse the words "Six Pence" placed in the centre of the piece, having an olive branch on one side and an oak branch on the other, surmounted by the Royal Crown, and the date of the year between and below the branches, with a graining upon the edge; and that certain other pieces of silver money called "The Queen's Maundy Moneys," of Fourpence, Threepence, Twopence, and One Penny, should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five-Pound Piece, and for the reverse the respective figures "4," "3," "2," "1" (according to the denomination or value of the piece) in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled by an oak wreath surmounted by the Royal Crown, with a plain edge.

And whereas pieces of money of the above descriptions respectively have been coined at Our Mint, and will be coined there, and, so far as relates to Gold Coins, at Our Branch Mints, in pursuance of Orders which We have given for that purpose, We have, therefore, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby ordain, declare, and command that the said pieces of money respectively so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid shall be current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and that this Our Royal Proclamation shall come into operation in the United Kingdom from the date on which it is published in the *London Gazette*, and in the Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria from the date on which it is published by the Governors of those Colonies respectively.

Given at Our Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, this Thirtieth day of January, in the Year of Our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in the Fifty-sixth Year of Our Reign.

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1893.

WITH reference to the notice dated 8th inst., published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th inst., p. 1277, it is now notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 1st August, 1893, and following days, an Examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners :—

(i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.

(ii.) That his age will be above twenty-one years and under twenty-three years on the 1st April, 1893.

[N.B.—In the case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or should he reside in a Native State, by the highest Political Officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]

(iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.

(iv.) That he is of good moral character.

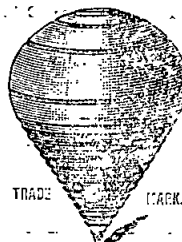

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE CITY OF RICHMOND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112, section 388) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Richmond has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making streets within the said City of Richmond, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the City of Richmond aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Acts, a sum of Five hundred pounds a shire; to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; to alter the boundaries of or abolish the subdivisions existing in any municipal district; to determine and alter within the limits prescribed by the said Acts the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and to alter and adjust the boundaries of continuous municipal districts, and determine any questions arising out of such alteration and adjustment: And whereas it is further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part II. of the *Local Government Act 1891*, as amended by the *Local Government Act 1892*, shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Administrator of the Government in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Echuca, praying that a certain area described in such petition, being part of the Central and South-east Ridings of the said shire, be severed from the said shire and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Deakin: And whereas the substance and

prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a shire to be named the Shire of Deakin, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shire of Echuca as reduced, shall be those hereunder set forth and described; and doth hereby subdivide the said new Shire of Deakin into three ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be those also severally hereunder set forth and described, and doth order that the Council of the said Shire of Deakin shall consist of nine members, and doth further by this Order abolish the South-east Riding of the Shire of Echuca, and alter the boundaries of the Central Riding of the said shire in the manner also set forth and described hereunder, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF DEAKIN CONSTITUTED AND DEFINED.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, and 8 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively, that is to say:—

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense; and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

7. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

8. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

9. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

13. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

15. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department, or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

17. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

18. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. 9. *Obstructions, &c., to streets, &c., by cattle, &c.*—If any cattle are found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner as "Owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may after the expiration of Twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear, then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within One month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money is not sufficient for all purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner, if and when known, in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.
