

BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable John Madden, LL.D., the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Bank Holidays throughout Victoria, viz.:—

MONDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF MAY NEXT.

TUESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF MAY NEXT.

WEDNESDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF MAY NEXT.

THURSDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF MAY NEXT.

FRIDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF MAY NEXT.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in the fifty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.
