Health Act 1890.
CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.
BY-LAW No. 115.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 115, for keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; for preventing the deposit of rubbish, &c., by the side of any street, or on any vacant or unfenced land, or in any public place; for requiring the occupiers of houses or premises to provide boxes or other receptacles for the temporary deposit of house refuse in places contiguous to such houses or premises convenient for the discharge and removal of the contents of such boxes or receptacles; for regulating the position and manner of construction of privies, earth-closets, and urinals; for regulating the management of privies, earth-closets, &c., and of the removal of night-soil: and for repealing By-law No. 90, and all other by-laws of the said city on the matters and things hereinafter provided for.

BY virtue of the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Municipality of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne hereby make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. The by-law numbered 90, and all other by-laws of the City of South Melbourne on the matters and things hereinafter provided for, are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. The occupier of every house and premises within the said city shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and no garbage, house sweepings, or other refuse shall be scattered upon or within such yard or ground, nor heaped or otherwise deposited therein, save in one or more box or boxes, or vessel or vessels, which, as to material, shape, and size when filled, shall be reasonably portable by one man, but such boxes or vessels shall not be capable of holding more than five cubic feet of refuse, and shall be specially provided by the occupier of such house or building, and be by such occupier or by his direction so placed and kept as to be conveniently accessible to the persons employed by the said council for the cleansing of streets and the removal of refuse therefrom and from the houses in or adjacent to such streets.

3. The occupier of any land in the said city on which is erected any stable, cow-yard, or cattle-shed shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect to cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard. And such stable, cow-yard, or cattle-shed shall be constructed of suitable materials and be paved or flagged with brick, stone, cement, asphalt, or other like impervious material, and shall have impervious drains and receptacles for offal, dung, or other filth or refuse. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the council of the said city at the expense of such occupier.

4. The occupier of any premises within the said city used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and in the meantime to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the council of the said city at the expense of such occupier.

5. No person shall deposit, or cause or suffer to be deposited, by the side of any street, or on any vacant or unfenced land, or in any public place, any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, offal, manure, dung, or soil; and for the purposes of this by-law any unsold or reserved Crown lands shall be deemed and taken to be a public place as before mentioned.

6. The owner or occupier of any house or tenement shall make such provision for the emptying of the cess or privy pans or earth-closets of such house or tenement as shall ensure such emptying being done without any nuisance to the inhabitants of South Melbourne.

7. That from and after the coming into operation of this by-law, no person shall construct, or place, or cause or suffer to be constructed or placed, any privy, earth-closet, cess-pan, or urinal on premises within the city of South Melbourne, at a less distance than three feet from any public highway, or any lane or street of a width at any part thereof of eleven feet or upwards, or from any street channel, nor at a less distance than six feet from the door or window of any dwelling or tenement, nor to be situated in any position on any premises where the erection or placing of such privy, earth-closet, cess-pan, or urinal would be a nuisance, either to the owner or occupier of the adjoining premises or the public; and no privy or earth-closet shall have any opening for the putting in or taking out of any pan or earth-closet which shall be flush with the building line of any street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width within the city of South Melbourne, nor within the view of any person in any such street, lane, or right-of-way. Every closet shall be provided with a cess-pan constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding two cubic feet.

8. If the pan of any privy or earth-closet within the said city shall at any time be leaky or overflowing, the occupier of the premises on which such leaky or overflowing pan shall be shall forthwith give notice thereof to the inspector for the said city.

9. No person, except a nightman licensed by the said council, or a nightman employed by any person or persons carrying out a contract with the said council for the removal of night-soil from places within the said city, shall empty or remove the contents of any earth-closet, privy, cess-pan, or place for the reception of night-soil, and then only by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance, properly constructed, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

10. It shall not be lawful for any licensed nightman or any other person to empty any earth-closet, privy, or cess-pan, or to cart any night-soil in or through the city of South Melbourne, except after the hours of Eleven of the clock at night and before Five of the clock in the morning.

11. No person shall carry in or through the city of South Melbourne any offal, fat, or other offensive matter or thing, except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance, properly constructed, and provided with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

12. Nothing in this by-law shall apply to any water-closet connected with the underground sewerage system, and approved by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.

13. Every person who shall, by any act or default, be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties (such portion not being less than Five shillings) to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council of the said city may be empowered by this by-law, or otherwise, to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers or not.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of *visa voce* or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

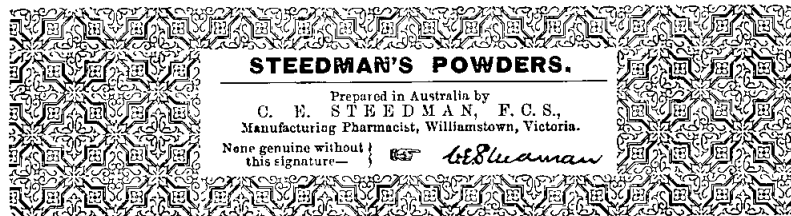

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 4th August, 1890, the Council of the Shire of Dunmunkle, having drafted the following Regulations for the management of the Murtoa Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of February and the 1st day of August in every year:—

For every head of large cattle (other than horses) over six months and under two years old, Thirteen shillings per annum.

For every head of large cattle (other than horses) two years and under three years old, Twenty-six shillings per annum.

For every head of large cattle (milch) (other than horses) three years old and upwards, Fifty-two shillings per annum.

For every horse over six months and under two years old, Thirteen shillings per annum.

For every horse two years and under three years old, Nineteen shillings and sixpence per annum.

For every horse three years old and upwards, Twenty-six shillings per annum.

For every sheep or goat over six months old, Four shillings per annum.

Progeny, under the age of six months, of stock legally depasturing on the common, Free.

4. No bull or entire horse shall be depastured on the common without the written consent of the managers.

5. The brands of all licensed stock shall be registered with the managers, and all sheep shall, if registered, have the common brand affixed prior to depasturing. The owners or persons in charge shall, when required, assist in mustering and branding their stock.

6. All stock found upon the common upon which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid, and of which the brands have not been duly registered, and upon which, when required, the common brand has not been affixed, shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded.

7. The managers shall be at liberty to issue licences for any period less than six months at proportional amounts to the prescribed fees.

8. Wherein by these regulations, or by the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council, any act, matter, or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be deemed to be well and effectively done under the signature of any two of them.

9. One clear month before the above-named half-yearly dates of the 1st of February and 1st of August all persons entitled to depasture stock, and desirous of obtaining licences, shall send in applications to the managers, who shall direct what licences shall issue for the ensuing six months.

10. The managers shall be at liberty to set apart a portion of the common for the depasturing of large cattle only; and, in any such case, any small cattle, although licensed, depasturing on such portion shall be deemed to be trespassing, and shall be liable to be impounded.

11. In the event of any infectious diseases appearing in the stock on the common, the herdsman shall forward an immediate report to the Inspector of Stock.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE SHEPPARTON COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 4th August, 1890, the Managers of the Shepparton Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of April and the 1st day of October in every year:—

For every horse	...	6s. per annum.
For every head of other large cattle	...	5s. per annum.
For every sheep or goat	...	5s. per annum.

3. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

4. All licences applied for and issued during the currency of a half-year shall be subject to the full rate, but in case of removal from the common of any stock already licensed, an equivalent number may be substituted for the unexpired term of the licence, provided that the licensee deliver to the herdsman, in writing, a statement of the number and the description of the substituted stock.

5. Accepted stock, before being placed on the common, shall be duly registered and delivered to the herdsman, who shall be in attendance at the mustering yards.

6. No stock shall be allowed to depasture on the common unless the same shall be marked with the proper brands of the person by whom the stock is registered, and with the common brand in pitch or tar.

7. All persons depasturing stock on the common shall assist at the bi-annual mustering, or in default pay Sixpence (6d.) for every head they may have depasturing on the common.

8. No entire horse or bull over the age of six months shall be allowed on the common without the consent, in writing, of the managers.

9. No person shall remove horses, cattle, sheep, or goats from the common without first notifying the herdsman.

10. All stock affected with any contagious disease shall be removed from the common by the owners within 24 hours after notice to do so has been served upon them by the herdsman, and in default of compliance therewith the managers may destroy such stock at the cost of the owner or owners thereof.

11. The managers shall not be responsible for any neglect or irregularity on the part of the herdsman, or for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. II. (Staff, Salaries and Allowances) of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz:—

II.—STAFF, SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES.

1. No person shall be employed in a classified school as head teacher, assistant teacher, or relieving teacher unless he shall hold a certificate of competency or a licence to teach.

2. Staffs will be allotted and salaries paid in accordance with the provisions of the *Public Service Act 1890* and the schedules thereto.

3. The number of teachers employed in any school will be increased or reduced from time to time as the average attendance for the two months immediately preceding may render necessary; but, in cases where the attendance has been reduced by the prevalence of sickness or other exceptional cause, a longer trial may be given before the staff is reduced.

4. In the case of a new school, a staff of teachers will be allotted upon the expected attendance at the school.

5. In addition to their salaries, head teachers of day schools will be paid monthly allowances for maintenance expenses, according to the following scales for the period and from the date respectively mentioned therein (the distinction between Summer and Winter allowances being abolished from the 1st October, 1893):—

The average attendance during the six months ending the 30th April and 31st October in each year will be generally adopted as

the basis for determining the allowances from 1st July and 1st January respectively next ensuing; but in cases where exceptional fluctuations in attendance have occurred, the average attendance of any other month or months may, with the sanction of the Minister, be adopted.

6. In consideration of the above allowances, the head teacher will be required—

- (a) To have the floors of all the school-rooms, class-rooms, porches, out-offices, &c., properly swept and thoroughly scrubbed out, the walls brushed down, and the paint washed with sufficient frequency to keep the rooms clean and healthy. To keep all eaves, spouting, down-pipes, and iron tanks free from leaves and dirt, and all drains clean and free from stoppages.
- (b) To provide water for the use of the children for drinking and washing; also soap and towels.
- (c) To keep the chimneys and windows clean, and all locks, latches, &c., to doors and cupboards, and glass in windows, in proper repair.
- (d) To keep properly emptied, disinfected, and attended to the pans in earth-closets and the cesspits where there are no earth-closets.
- (e) To provide pens, pen-holders, ink, slate-pencils, chalk, sewing materials, and all stationery (except copy-books).
- (f) To provide fuel for warming the school-rooms and to keep them properly warmed.

All articles must be provided, and the duties specified must be performed, to the satisfaction of any officer of the Education Department who may be authorized by the Minister of Public Instruction to visit and examine the schools. On leaving a school, the teacher will be required to furnish an acknowledgment from his successor that he has received everything in proper order.

7. An allowance of 2s. 6d. per meeting will be made to head teachers of State Schools in which Boards of Advice hold their meetings; and in consideration of such amount they will be required to provide lights and fires when necessary and to supply pens, ink, &c.

8. Whenever and so long as the teaching staff of a school is reduced below its proper strength by the death, resignation, absence on leave, or the transfer of any assistant employed in a school, the head teacher may, subject to the approval of the Minister, appoint a temporary pupil teacher in the stead of each assistant so deceased, resigned, absent on leave, or transferred. The salary payable to each such temporary pupil teacher will be that payable to fourth-class pupil teachers.

9. Whenever and so long as the teaching staff of a school is reduced below its proper strength by the death, resignation, or absence on leave of a pupil teacher, or by the withdrawal of a first-class pupil teacher to act temporarily as assistant or head teacher, the head teacher of the school may, subject to the approval of the Minister, appoint a temporary pupil teacher in the stead of each pupil teacher so withdrawn. The salary payable to each such temporary pupil teacher will be that payable to fourth-class pupil teachers.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, has been delivered to the secretary.

6. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

7. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

8. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WARBURTON CEMETERY.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Warburton Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereinafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor the full quantity estimated, but only such quantities of those articles as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The boots are to be made in Victoria, of Victorian leather, and the contractor must provide everything necessary for the due fulfilment of the contract.

3. The boots are to be strictly in accordance with sample. They must be of such trade sizes as may be ordered, and subject in every respect to the approval of the Controller, Naval and Military Stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the department requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within such time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 3, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

6. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

7. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

8. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall, as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver to the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 11 of these conditions.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 5.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 5.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 5. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

12. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.
