LIABILITY OF VESSELS FROM WESTERN AUSTRALIA TO QUARANTINE DISCONTINUED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Administrator of the Government and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and issued in pursuance of the *Health Act 1890*, it was notified that the Colony of Western Australia was infected with Small-pox, and that it was probable that such disease might be brought from the said Colony to Victoria; and whereas the circumstances which led to the issue of such Proclamation have ceased to exist: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation, such revocation to take effect in respect to all vessels leaving Western Australian Ports after the date hereof.

One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in the fifty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.
