INTERNATIONAL COPYRIGHT. — CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND AUSTRIA- HUNGARY.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosures, are published for general information.

SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of Circular 7353. a Convention between Great Britain and Austria-Hungary for the Establishment of International Copyright, which was signed at Vienna on the 24th April, 1893; and of which the ratifications were exchanged on the 14th April, 1894.

I have also to enclose a copy of the Order of Her Majesty in Council, which was issued on the 30th April 1894, last, for giving effect to the provisions of the Convention.

I have to draw your attention to Article IX. of the Convention from which you will observe that if it is desired that the stipulations of the Convention should be made applicable to the Colony under your Government, notice to that effect must be given by Her Majesty's Representative at the Court of Vienna within two years from the date of the exchange of the ratifications.

I shall be glad to be informed at an early date whether your Government would wish the Convention and Order in Council to be applied to the Colony under your Government.

WHEREAS a Convention has been concluded on the 24th day of April, 1893, between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, and Apostolic King of Hungary, with respect to the protection to be given by way of copyright to the authors of literary and artistic works:

And whereas the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged on the 14th day of April, 1894, between Her Majesty the Queen and His Majesty the Emperor:

And whereas Her Majesty in Council is satisfied that the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy have made such provisions as it appears to Her Majesty expedient to require for the protection of authors of works first produced in Her Majesty's dominions:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by the International Copyright Acts 1844 to 1886, doth order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The Convention as set forth in the First Schedule to this Order shall, as from the commencement of this Order and subject No. 103.—AUGUST 3, 1894.—1.

to clause 5 of this Order, have full effect throughout Her Majesty's dominions, and all persons are enjoined to observe the same.

2. The author of a literary or artistic work which, on or after the commencement of this Order, is first produced in the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy shall, subject as in this Order and in the International Copyright Acts 1844 to 1886 mentioned, have as respects that work throughout Her Majesty's dominions, but subject to the exceptions specified in clause 5 of this Order, the same right of copyright, including any right capable of being conferred by an Order in Council under section two or section five of the *International Copyright Act 1844*, or under any other enactment, as if the work had been first produced in the United Kingdom, and shall have such right during the same period.

Provided that the author of a literary or artistic work shall not have any greater right or longer term of copyright therein than that which he enjoys in the country in which the work is first produced.

The author of any literary or artistic work first produced before the commencement of this Order shall have the rights and remedies to which he is entitled under section six of the *International Copyright Act 1886*.

3. Section six of the *International Copyright Act 1886* shall not apply to any dramatic piece to which protection is extended by virtue of this Order.

4. This Order shall be construed as if it formed part of the *International Copyright Act 1886*.

5. This Order shall apply to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to—

India.
The Dominion of Canada.
Newfoundland.
The Cape.
Natal.
New South Wales.
Victoria.
Queensland.
Tasmania.
South Australia.
Western Australia.
New Zealand.

Provided nevertheless that the provisions of this Order may be applied by further Order to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to the effect indicated in Article 9 of the Convention shall be given.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the 11th day of May, 1894, which day is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

And the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.

CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND AUSTRIA-HUNGARY
FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF INTERNATIONAL COPYRIGHT.

Signed at Vienna, April 24, 1893.

[Ratifications exchanged at Vienna, April 14, 1894.]

[A Hungarian version was also attached to the Convention as signed.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, &c., and Apostolic King of Hungary, animated with the desire to secure in the most complete manner, within their respective dominions, the rights of authors, or their legal representatives, over their literary or artistic works, have resolved to conclude a Convention to that effect, and have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., the Right Honorable Sir Augustus Berkeley Paget, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, a Member of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Her Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty, &c., &c., &c.;

His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, &c., and Apostolic King of Hungary, the Count Gustave Kálnoky de Köröspatak, Knight of the Golden Fleece, Knight Grand Cross of the Order of St. Stephen, Knight of the Order of Leopold, His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty's Privy Councillor and Chamberlain, Minister of the Imperial House and of Foreign Affairs, General of Cavalry, &c., &c., &c.;

Who, having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

Authors of literary or artistic works and their legal representatives, including publishers, shall enjoy reciprocally, in the dominions of the High Contracting Parties, the advantages which are or may be granted by law there for the protection of works of literature or art.

Consequently, authors of literary or artistic works which have been first published in the dominions of one of the High Contracting Parties, as well as their legal representatives, shall have in the dominions of the other High Contracting Party the same protection and the same legal remedy against all infringement of their rights as if the work had been first published in the country where the infringement may have taken place.

In the same manner, the authors of literary or artistic works and their legal representatives who are subjects of one of the High Contracting Parties, or who reside within its dominions, shall in the dominions of the other Contracting Party enjoy the same protection and the same legal remedies against all infringements of their rights as though they were subjects of or residents in the State in which the infringement may have taken place.

These advantages shall only be reciprocally guaranteed to authors and their legal representatives when the work in question is also protected by the laws of the State where the work was first published, and the duration of protection in the other country shall not exceed that which is granted to authors and their legal representatives in the country where the work was first published.

ARTICLE II.

The right of translation forming part of the copyright, the protection of the right of translation is assured under the conditions laid down by this Convention. If ten years after the expiry of the year in which a work to be protected in Her Majesty's dominions on the basis of this Convention has appeared no translation in English has been published, the right of translating the work into English shall no longer within those dominions exclusively belong to the author.

In the case of a book published in numbers, the aforesaid period of ten years shall commence at the end of the year in which each number is published.

ARTICLE III.

Authorized translations are protected as original works. They consequently enjoy the full protection granted by this Convention against the unauthorized reproduction of original works.

It is understood that in the case of a work for which the translating right has fallen into the public domain, the translator cannot oppose the translation of the same work by other writers.

ARTICLE IV.

The expression "literary or artistic works" comprehends books, pamphlets, and all other writings; dramatic or dramatico-musical works, musical compositions, with or without words; works of design, painting, sculpture, and engraving, lithographs, illustrations, geographical charts, plans, sketches, and plastic works relating to geography, topography, architecture, or science, in general; in fact, every production whatsoever in the literary, scientific, or artistic domain which can be published by any mode of impression or reproduction.

ARTICLE V.

In the British Empire, and in the Kingdoms and States represented in the Austrian Reichsrath, the enjoyment of the rights secured by the present Convention is subject only to the accomplishment of the conditions and formalities prescribed by the law of that State in which the work is first published; and no further formalities or conditions shall be required in the other country.

Consequently, it shall not be necessary that a work which has obtained legal protection in one country should be registered, or copies thereof deposited in the other country, in order that the remedies against infringement may be obtained which are granted in the other country to works first published there.

In the dominions of the Hungarian Crown the enjoyment of these rights is subject, however, to the accomplishment of the conditions and formalities prescribed by the Laws and Regulations both of Great Britain and of Hungary.

ARTICLE VI.

In order that the authors of works protected by the present Convention shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be considered as such, and be, consequently, admitted to institute proceedings in respect of the infringement of copyright before the courts of the other State, it will suffice that their name be indicated on the work in the accustomed manner.

The Tribunals may, however, in cases of doubt, require the production of such further evidence as may be required by the laws of the respective countries.

For anonymous or pseudonymous works, the publisher whose name is indicated on the work is entitled to protect the rights belonging to the author. He is, without other proof, reputed the legal representative of the anonymous or pseudonymous author, until the latter or his legal representative has declared and proved his rights.

ARTICLE VII.

The provisions of the present Convention cannot in any way derogate from the right of each of the High Contracting Parties to control, or to prohibit by measures of domestic legislation or police, the circulation, representation, exhibition, or sale of any work or production.

Each of the High Contracting Parties reserves also its right to prohibit the importation into its own territory of works which, according to its internal laws, or to the stipulations of Treaties with other States, are or may be declared to be illicit reproductions.

ARTICLE VIII.

The provisions of the present Convention shall be applied to literature or artistic works produced prior to the date of its coming into effect, subject, however, to the limitations prescribed by the following regulations:—

(a) In the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy—
Copies completed before the coming into force of the present Convention, the production of which has been hitherto allowed, can also be circulated in future.

In the same manner, appliances for the reproduction of works, such as stereotypes, wood blocks, and engraved plates of every description, such as lithographers' stones, if their production has not hitherto been prohibited, may continue to be used during a period of four years from the coming into force of the present Convention.

The distribution of such copies and the use of the said appliances is, however, only permitted if an inventory of the said copies and appliances is taken by the Government in question, in consequence of an application of the interested party, within three months from the coming into force of the present Convention, and if these copies and appliances are marked with a special stamp.

Dramatic and dramatico-musical works or musical compositions legally performed before the coming into force of the present Convention, can also be performed in the future.

(b) In the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland—
The author and publisher of any literary or artistic work first produced before the date at which this Convention comes into effect shall be entitled to all legal remedies against infringement: provided that where any person has, before the date of the publication of the Order in Council putting this Convention into effect, lawfully produced any work in the United Kingdom, any rights or interests arising from or in connexion with such production, which are subsisting and valuable at the said date, shall not be diminished or prejudiced.

ARTICLE IX.

The provisions of the present Convention shall apply to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to—

India.
The Dominion of Canada.
Newfoundland.
The Cape.
Natal.
New South Wales.
Victoria.
Queensland.
Tasmania.
South Australia.
Western Australia.
New Zealand.

Provided always that the provisions of the present Convention shall apply to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative at the Court of His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty within two years from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the present Convention.

ARTICLE X.

The present Convention shall remain in force for ten years from the day on which the ratifications are exchanged; and in case neither of the two High Contracting Parties shall have given notice twelve months before the expiration of the said period of ten years of their intention of terminating the present Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given such notice.

Her Britannic Majesty's Government shall also have the right to denounce the Convention in the same manner, on behalf of any of the Colonies or foreign possessions mentioned in Article IX., separately.

ARTICLE XI.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Vienna as soon as possible. It shall come into effect ten days after its publication in conformity with the forms prescribed by the Laws of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed this Convention, and have hereunto affixed their seals.

Done at Vienna the 24th day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million two hundred and thirty-four thousand four hundred and eighty-two pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four and ninety-five."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this first day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fifty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

BAG FACTORY OF MESSRS. F. EDMONDSON AND CO.,

for a period of one month from the 25th July instant, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than seven females for more than fifty-eight hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall be paid for the extra work she is called upon to perform, the overtime rate of pay to wage workers being that mentioned in the letter notifying the suspension of the operation of the first clause of the section above mentioned.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

2. Principles and Practice of Land Surveying:
Details of field practice, including the keeping of field-notes;
Topographical surveying;
Setting out block surveys;
Laying out roads;
Setting out of curves;
Plotting from field-notes.

3. Computations connected with Land Surveying:
Reduction of traverses and bearings;
Computations connected with the setting out of roads and curves;
Elimination of discrepancies in measurements and observations in the field;
Computation of areas, including irregular and curved boundaries.

4. Trigonometry, Astronomy, &c.:
Plane trigonometry (practical);
Spherical trigonometry, as applied to land surveying;
Determination of latitude;
Determination of true meridian;
Determination of azimuth;
Barometric measurements of heights.

5. Levelling, &c.:
Levelling and mensuration of earthwork.

6. Drawing and Charting:
Construction of maps and charts, including projection;
Compilation of plan from detached plans and notes;
Drawing;
Hill shading;
Writing.

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of *revoc* or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

THE subjoined Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Williamstown General Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council.

WILLIAMSTOWN GENERAL CEMETERY.—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Williamstown General Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th day of November, 1889, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. Any person desiring ground for a private grave, or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees thereof. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule B.
3. Any person desiring to construct, add to, alter, or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect, add to, or amend a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other construction or erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply, in writing, to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit, in writing, a statement, plan, design, or drawing of the same, with full particulars, and shall obtain such permission, in writing, before proceeding with the work.
4. All applications for interment shall be made at the cemetery at least six working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed unless applications therefor be made at least six working hours prior to the time fixed for same.
5. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule C, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the manager, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
7. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate fastened with copper tacks not less than ¼-inch long with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.
8. Every grave shall be at least 7 feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.
9. No interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial as evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in Rule 11.
10. Should the necessary certificate of right of burial be lost, destroyed, or otherwise missing, the trustees will prepare another on satisfactory evidence being given that the applicant is the owner of the grave he claims the right to bury in.
11. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
12. No burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths, or a coroner or justice of the peace. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the cemetery.
13. The hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week days, from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.; on Sundays, from Two to Four p.m., unless ordered by the coroner or the Board of Health under special circumstances.
14. No burials shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven p.m. and Seven a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.
15. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
16. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance of the cemetery, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter or to stand opposite the entrance gates. Breaking out of the procession after passing the gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.
17. Any person desiring to place any inscription, epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the cemetery shall apply, in writing, to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof, and shall obtain their written permission for the same.
18. No person shall put up any erection or place any inscription, epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees, and any workman (though not employed by the trustees) shall, while occupied in any of the works aforesaid, be deemed to be under the supervision and control of the manager, who may define his hours of labour within the said cemetery, and see that all work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch. All persons engaged in such work shall obey all lawful and necessary commands of the said manager, and shall be removable from the cemetery upon any breach of the regulations, and any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey any such directions.
19. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, or other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once by and at the expense of the person causing the same. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone work.
20. All materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.
21. Any person taking any part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules, viz.:—First—That no rubbish, clay, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately after the completion of the work. Second—That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave. Third—That no grave shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the secretary, nor shall any materials be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft from rain or otherwise. Work in all cases is to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
22. No catacomb shall be allowed.
23. No wooden erection shall be allowed.
24. Every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of the owner.
25. The trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment either in this or any other cemetery.
26. Before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of said application being granted the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Act 1890* or any amendment or substitution thereof, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.
27. Unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.
28. No child under 10 years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.
29. No smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery nor any fireworks be discharged therein.
30. No dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.
31. No person in the cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border railing, fence, or any other erection or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying place.
32. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the cemetery or its approaches any trade, business, or calling either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.
33. The secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.
34. "The manager," as referred to in these rules, means the person for the time being employed by the trustees as the manager of the cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the trustees, carry out and enforce these rules, and subject to the provisions of the *Cemeteries Act*, the direction of such person shall in all such matters and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the trustees.
35. No person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees, nor shall any one employed by the trustees be allowed to carry on any pecuniary business outside of the cemetery detrimental to the interest thereof.
36. Any person so employed accepting any such gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work or business shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.
37. Any person committing any breach of any of these rules and regulations, or of any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the cemetery by the trustees or the manager, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.
38. Licences to grave dressers or decorators may be issued by the trustees in the form set out in Schedule D.
39. To encourage as much as possible decorating and maintenance of graves, the trustees will undertake the responsibility of doing same with their own staff of men at moderate charges (see Schedule A).
40. Persons requiring shrubs, plants, or any material for grave decorating can arrange for same with the secretary.
41. No waste paper, weeds, dead leaves, or decayed flowers shall be left or deposited anywhere but in the rubbish baskets distributed about the cemetery for that purpose.
42. The trustees will continue to allot for new graves the 4 feet formerly left between each line of graves unless the same be applied for as extensions.

43. A plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial, shall be kept by the secretary.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, and 8 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively, that is to say:—
