SHIRE OF BERWICK.—ORDER CONFIRMED.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 390 and 391 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Berwick doth hereby order as follows:—That the lands hereunder described, marked "A," shall be a public highway from and after the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*. Such public highway is hereby declared to be in lieu of that portion of the old road hereunder described, and marked "B" on the attached plan.



THE SHIRE OF DEAKIN AND THE RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.— APPLICATION OF MUNICIPAL FUNDS.

WHEREAS by section 373 of the *Water Act 1890* it is enacted that any municipal council may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, from time to time apply any portion of its municipal fund towards the payment of interest on and the creation of a sinking fund for the liquidation of any moneys borrowed by any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust: And whereas the Municipal Council of the Shire of Deakin is desirous of applying a portion of the municipal fund of the said shire, that is to say, a sum of One hundred and seventy-eight pounds eleven shillings sterling (£178 11s.) for the purpose of paying interest on moneys borrowed by and liabilities transferred to the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, His Excellency the Governor in Council has therefore consented to the Municipal Council of the said Shire of Deakin applying the said sum of One hundred and seventy-eight pounds eleven shillings sterling (£178 11s.) from the municipal fund thereof for the purpose aforesaid.

TRAGOWEL PLAINS IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation for the sale and distribution of water:—

REGULATION No. 11.

That Regulations Nos. 4 and 8 be and the same are hereby repealed, and the following adopted in lieu thereof:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure, and the quantities of water supplied for such purpose shall be determined by the officer of the Trust in charge of the distribution of such water, who shall measure the area of the land irrigated.

2. No water shall be supplied for any purpose from any of the Trust channels excepting through a properly-constructed outlet, unless otherwise specially sanctioned by the Trust, in writing, or pending the construction of an outlet already applied for as hereinafter provided for, nor unless a suitably-constructed channel be made to convey the water from the outlet to where it is required; provided nevertheless that, where practicable, more blocks than one owned or occupied by the same person may be supplied with water from one outlet where proper connecting channels are constructed.

3. All irrigation or other outlets required from any of the channels or works of the Trust may be constructed by the Trust, or by the applicant at his own cost, upon the application only of owners of the land to be supplied from such outlet or outlets, or of occupiers of the said land indorsed or approved by such owners.

4. All applications for the construction of outlets, either by the Trust or the applicant, must be made on the proper forms of the Trust provided for that purpose.

5. The construction of all outlets by the owner or occupier must be in accordance with the plan provided by the engineer to the Trust, and a deposit of Two pounds (£2) shall be made to insure the same being carried out to his satisfaction.

6. Outlets may be fixed at any suitable spot most convenient to the applicant, subject to the approval of the engineer to the Trust.

7. Only one irrigation outlet shall be allowed to each owner or occupier of land up to three hundred and twenty acres and one for every additional three hundred and twenty acres or fraction thereof, unless in exceptional cases, such as when an allotment is divided by a channel into two parts, either of which shall not be less than forty acres, or where more than one channel goes through the allotment and the owner or occupier had cultivation adjacent to such second channel and commanded by it before the channel was made; but in no case shall an allotment be entitled to more than two outlets by partial payment; but it shall be optional for any owner or occupier to have any further number of outlets he may think fit, provided he pays the whole cost of such further outlets as well as the cost of any stops which may have to be put in the channels to work the said further outlets, provided also such stops are not required to work the outlets on any other selection, in which case he shall only have to pay his share of the cost of such stop or stops.

8. The amount payable to the Trust for the construction of each irrigation outlet shall be Three pounds sixteen shillings (£3 16s.) cash, or Four pounds (£4) by promissory note payable at nine months from date of same, but should such promissory note be dishonoured the amount, with interest at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum added from the due date thereof, must be paid before any water will be supplied to the drawer thereof.

9. Outlets for the purpose of irrigating small gardens and other special purposes where suitable will be constructed by the Trust at a cost of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) each cash, or may be constructed by the owner or occupier at his own cost, in accordance with the plan to be provided by the Trust.

10. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet or outlets, shall be and remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with either by such owner or occupier or any other person in any way whatsoever, except the authorized officer of the Trust, or with the sanction of the Trust, in writing, and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.

11. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for all lands, including gardens, except as hereinafter provided; payment in all cases to be made on the delivery of such water.

12. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets, at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Water Committee or the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence (excepting in the cases of gardens, applications for the supply of water for the irrigation of which may be dealt with by the Trust on their merits, and such agreement made from time to time as may be deemed expedient); and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.

13. The water bailiffs shall receive all applications for water for the various areas in which they are employed respectively, and shall enter same in an order-book supplied to them for that purpose with the several particulars required therein, which shall be signed by the applicant, and all applicants for water may request, and shall be entitled to, the inspection of such order-book.

14. Each applicant for water will be supplied in the order in which his application appears in the order-book, except in the case of any subsequent applications being received on the channel then working, when all such applications shall be supplied on that channel before the water is transferred to another channel, and so on by rotation of channels for which applications for

water have been made, and the water will be supplied to the applicant as near as practicable to the time at which such water is required (if available), but the Trust will not be responsible for the non-supply of water applied for under any circumstances.

15. No person shall receive water for the irrigation of land to a greater extent at each turn than is equal to fifty acres for each allotment on the channel then working when there are other applicants awaiting service, unless special instructions are given by the Water Committee or the Trust to do otherwise.

16. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owners, damage to works on adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

17. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlet or junction sluice, or interfere with any stop, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, excepting as hereinafter provided, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

18. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or do any act which may cause such works to be injured or damaged, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.

19. Garden irrigation rights must be paid for at the time the application is made for the said rights.

20. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against or breach of this regulation shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 411 of the *Water Act 1890*.

SHIRE OF BORUNG.

BY-LAW No. III.

By-law under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered three.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Borung, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, doth hereby make the by-law following (that is to say):—

INTERPRETATION OF TERMS.

1. In the construction and for the purpose of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say):—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage (whether a thoroughfare or not).

PREMISES TO BE KEPT SO AS NOT TO BE A NUISANCE.

2. Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

REMOVAL OF REFUSE FROM HOUSES OR PREMISES.

3. Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once at least every week; and in case of the default of such occupier the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of the occupier.

REMOVAL OF REFUSE FROM PLACES WHERE ANIMALS ARE KEPT.

4. Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards, or once at least every week; and in case of the default of such occupier the council may remove the same at the expense of the occupier.

POWER TO USE REFUSE AS MANURE.

5. Nothing contained in the foregoing section shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the council or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

CONSTRUCTION OF PRIVIES.

6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil the contents whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

SUPPLY OF DEODORIZING MATERIAL TO EARTH-CLOSETS.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil; and shall cause all the night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

EMPTYING RECEPTACLES FOR NIGHT-SOIL.

8. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

REMOVAL OF NIGHT-SOIL TO BE BY PROPERLY CONSTRUCTED CONVEYANCES.

9. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or of any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

HOURS WITHIN WHICH NIGHT-SOIL MAY BE REMOVED.

10. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-

closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

DISPOSAL OF REFUSE AND OFFENSIVE MATTER.

11. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil, or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

NIGHT-SOIL, ETC., REMOVED FROM ANY EARTH-CLOSET, ETC., AND DEPOSITED ANYWHERE TO BE COVERED WITH EARTH.

12. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing on any land (whether by way of manure or otherwise) any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six (6) inches in thickness.

EARTH-CLOSETS, ETC., NOT TO BE EMPTIED INTO DRAINS OR SEWERS.

13. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way or be likely to find their way into any drain or sewer.

PREVENTION OF POLLUTION OF WATER.

14. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

15. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes or likely to be used in any dairy shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within 24 hours of notice given by the council or by one of its officers.

ANIMALS NOT TO BE KEPT AS TO POLLUTE WATER.

16. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

DRAINAGE OF NEW BUILDINGS.

17. Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof and the ground over which such building is to be placed to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

DRAINAGE OF EXISTING BUILDINGS.

18. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building.

REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

19. Every person who is the owner or occupier of any dairy, farm, or milk store situated in the Shire of Borung shall on or before the first day of January in each and every year register himself by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in the form prescribed by the regulations approved of by the Governor in Council; and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee for registration of Five shillings.

20. The foregoing by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Borung.

PENALTIES.

21. If any person commit a breach of the foregoing by-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; and such penalties, together with all expenses incurred by the council under this by-law, may be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace: provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

The births of 1,051 children, viz., 530 boys and 521 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July. In the month of June, 1,142 births were registered, or 91 more than in the month under review. The births were 232 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 308 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 563, viz., 291 of males and 272 of females: the births thus exceeded the deaths by 488, or 87 per cent. The deaths were more than those in June by 70, but below the average of July during the previous ten years by 82. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 120.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.36, and of deaths registered 1.27.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62.2° on the 28th, and the lowest was 31.7° on the 11th. The mean temperature of the month (47.8°) was the same as the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (22.4°) took place on the 11th, and the least range (2.8°) on the 6th; the mean daily range was 11.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.315 inches on the 25th, and the lowest was 29.273 inches on the 21st. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.886 inches) was about a sixth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 15 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.23 inches. The average rainfall in July during the previous ten years was 2.21 inches, or a small fraction of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 2 days during the month.

Males contributed 52 per cent., and females 48 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 27 per cent. to that mortality, as against 50 per cent. in July, 1893; 29 per cent. in July, 1892; 33 per cent. in July, 1891; 38 per cent. in July, 1890; 37 per cent. in July, 1889; and 32 per cent. in July, 1888.

Fifty-two deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, an ex-warder, aged 75, died of pneumonia; an architect, aged 75, of hepatitis; a groom, aged 75, of nephritis; a gentleman, aged 75, of Bright's disease; a male of no occupation, aged 75, hanged himself in a fit of temporary insanity; a female, aged 75, died of apoplexy; a labourer and a female, each aged 76, of cancer; a labourer, aged 76, of bronchitis; a carpenter, aged 76, of hepatitis; a female, aged 76, of fracture of the hip—how caused not stated; a bill poster, aged 77, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 77, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 77, of phthisis; a cashier, aged 78, of syncope; a bootmaker, aged 78, of embolism; a calico printer, aged 78, of heart disease; a tailor, aged 78, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 78, of syncope; a female, aged 78, of congestion of the lungs; a farmer, aged 79, of bronchitis; a retired civil servant, aged 79, of pneumonia; a Presbyterian minister, aged 79, suddenly (cause unascertained); a female, aged 79, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 80, of syncope; two females, each aged 80, of pneumonia; a grocer, aged 81, of heart disease; a female, aged 81, of bronchitis; a farmer, aged 82, of apoplexy; a man of unknown occupation, aged 83, of insanity; a female, aged 83, of cancer; two females, each aged 84, of heart disease; a seaman, aged 85, of pneumonia; a female, aged 85, of softening of the brain; a nurse, aged 85, of bronchitis; a male of no occupation, aged 87, of apoplexy; a labourer, aged 93, of pneumonia; a gold miner, aged 77, two females, each aged 78, a female, aged 79, a female, aged 81, a confectioner, aged 83, three females, each aged 84, a teacher, aged 85, a female, aged 86, and a labourer, aged 95, of old age.

Twenty-two deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which sixteen were set down to accident, three to homicide, and three to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female aged 63, was passed over by a railway train; a female child, aged 2, by a tram car; two miners, aged 24 and 43 respectively, were killed by a fall of earth; a boat traveller, aged 57, by being thrown from a buggy; a female child, aged 2, by a dray passing over her; a female, aged 76, died of fracture of the hip—how caused not stated; a male child, aged 3, and a female child, aged 8, of injuries consequent on burns; a boy, aged 5, and a male of unknown occupation, aged 45, were found drowned in the River Yarra: three female infants, aged 1 month, 12 weeks, and 11 days respectively, were overlain; a solicitor, aged 35, was suffocated whilst in an epileptic fit; and a male of no occupation, aged 40, in consequence of a diseased wind-pipe. The homicidal deaths were those of two new-born male infants, who were smothered, and a female, aged 23, who was beaten to death by her paramour, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a seaman, aged 28, who shot himself, a labourer, aged 67, who drowned himself, and a male of no occupation, aged 75, who hanged himself.

One hundred and twenty-three deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—47 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Women's Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 1 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 151, of which 86, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 65, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 105 were under one year of age, 25 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 412. Of these, 205, or 50 per cent., were males, and 207, or 50 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 27 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 39 were between fifty-five and sixty, 38 were between sixty and sixty-five, 37 were between sixty-five and seventy, 43 were between seventy and seventy-five, 29 were between seventy-five and eighty, 15 were between eighty and eighty-five, 6 were between eighty-five and ninety, 1 was ninety-three, and 1 was ninety-five.

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Twenty-two deaths were set down to miasmatic diseases both in June and July, the latter month, however, being one day longer than the former. Under this head, deaths from whooping-cough increased from 7 to 10, and 1 death in July was set down to influenza, no such death having been reported in the previous month. On the other hand, deaths from scarlet fever fell from 3 to 1, and deaths from diphtheria from 6 to 4; whilst typhoid fever caused 6 deaths both in June and July. Under the head of constitutional diseases, deaths from cancer rose from 22 to 32, and deaths from phthisis from 57 to 75. Deaths from the consequences of child-bearing fell from 7 in June to 6 in July, which numbers, compared with the births, show 1 mother to have died to every 163 children registered as born alive in the former, and 1 to every 175 so registered in the latter month.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of the years 1889 to 1893, and the first seven months of 1894:—

BY-LAWS.

THE following are the by-laws of the Geelong and Western District Ladies' Benevolent Association (Incorporated), made by the contributors thereof on the 26th day of June, 1894, and confirmed by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose on the 26th day of July in the same year, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th day of August, 1894:—

1. *By-laws.*—All by-laws or rules heretofore made are hereby repealed: provided that any regulations made or agreements entered into under any such by-laws or rules shall be taken to have been made under these by-laws until the same are amended or rescinded.

2. *Title.—Objects.*—The association shall be called the Geelong and Western District Ladies' Benevolent Association, and shall have for its objects the relief of the wants of the poor in Geelong and the neighbourhood (particularly females), the sick and destitute, poor women in their confinement, and poor children; and shall be supported by voluntary or other contributions, together with such aid as may be obtained from the public revenue or municipal rates.

3. *Government.*—The association shall be governed by a committee of management, not to exceed thirty-six, nor fewer than twelve ladies, who shall be annual contributors, including president, four vice-presidents, and treasurer.

4. *Custody of common seal.*—The common seal shall be in the custody of the secretary of the association, who shall be responsible for the safe keeping thereof: and it shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing except by order of the committee of management at a meeting of which due notice has been given.

5. *Affixing seal.*—The common seal shall be affixed by the secretary, attested under her hand; and her signature shall be witnessed by the president of the meeting of the committee ordering the seal to be affixed.

6. *Life contributors.*—A donor of £25 and upwards, any minister collecting in his church or place of worship in any one year £25 or upwards, any person appointed by any corporation or society contributing £25 or upwards in any one year, and the first executor named in any will or codicil by which a legacy or bequest of £25 or upwards shall be made to the association shall be life contributors, with the privilege of voting at all special and general meetings of the association.

7. *Votes of contributors.*—Every donor of £25 or annual contributor of £10 shall be entitled to three votes; every annual contributor of £5, to two votes; and of £1, to one vote; but no one person shall be entitled to more than three votes.

8. *Annual subscriptions when due.*—The annual subscriptions shall be due on the 1st day of July in every year, and no contributor shall be entitled to vote at the annual or any special meeting unless his subscription for the current year has been paid or he expresses his willingness to pay the same when demanded.

9. *Annual meeting of contributors.*—An annual meeting of contributors shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in every year, due notice of which shall be given at least one week previously in one or more local papers, at which meeting the report and balance-sheet shall be presented.

10. *Election of officers.*—The president, vice-presidents, and treasurer shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting; but if any vacancy shall occur in the office of president, vice-president, or treasurer during the year, the committee of management shall elect by ballot one of its number to fill such vacancy until the annual meeting.

11. *Special meeting.*—On the written request of ten contributors or by a resolution of the committee of management a special meeting shall be called by the secretary, who shall give

notice of such meeting and the object thereof in one or more of the local papers one week before the meeting. At such meeting no business shall be considered but that for which the meeting has been called.

12. *Quorum at meetings.*—*Voting by proxy.*—At all meetings of contributors ten entitled to vote shall form a quorum. It shall be lawful for any contributor who resides more than 5 miles from the General Post Office, Geelong, to vote by proxy—the proxy to be in writing, and in favour of a contributor, and shall be in force only for the meeting named or any adjournment thereof.

13. *Chairman.*—At all meetings of contributors the president, or in her absence one of the vice-presidents, shall take the chair; but in their absence, or with their consent, the meeting may choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting as well as a deliberative vote.

14. *Salaries of officers not to vote.*—No contributor who is a salaried officer of the association shall vote at any meeting.

15. *Duties of committee.*—The committee of management shall conduct the general business of the association, appoint and discharge paid officers, enter into contracts and make payments, and have the charge of the property of the association. It shall meet on the first Wednesday in every month at Three o'clock, or oftener if necessary, and may enter upon business when a quorum of five is present. The chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and in cases of equality a casting vote. The business shall be as follows:—The minutes of the previous monthly meeting and of any special meetings held during the month shall be read and confirmed, no discussion being allowed thereon except as to their accuracy; the reports of the district visitors shall be read and confirmed; and cases requiring aid and assistance considered. At the monthly meeting in June the committee shall consider and determine the rate of salaries of officers of the association for the ensuing year; and should vacancies occur, or by giving one month's notice, the committee shall have power to alter or amend the rate of salaries.

16. *Nomination for members.*—Nominations for members of the committee and district visitors must be made a month previous to the date of election, voting to be by ballot.

17. *Casual cases.*—All casual cases must be reported, with names, amount, and nature of relief.

18. *Collection of annual subscription.*—Each member of committee must take part in the collection of the annual subscriptions, there being no paid collector employed by the society.

19. *For preventing imposition.*—To prevent imposition, all cases relieved shall be visited by one or more members of the committee.

20. *Cases of emergency.*—Any two members of committee shall be competent to give relief from the funds of the association in cases of emergency to an amount not exceeding Two pounds.

21. *Account of cases.*—Each lady shall keep a book, with a written account of all cases she may have during the year.

22. *Alterations.*—Any alterations, amendments, or additions proposed to be made in the by-laws shall be advertised once in one or more local newspapers at least one week before the meeting at which the same are to be considered.
