SHIRE OF PORTLAND.—ORDER CONFIRMED.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 390 and 391 of the *Local Government Act 1890* and section 49 of the *Transfer of Land Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Portland do hereby order and direct that a road one chain wide being the land next hereinafter described shall be a public highway; and be deemed to be dedicated to the public accordingly from and after the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*:—

All that piece of land being part of Crown allotment 3A, parish of Dummore, county of Normanby, containing five acres three roods and nineteen perches or thereabouts: Commencing at a point in the east boundary of the allotment one thousand two hundred and fifty-four links and a half south from the north-east angle of the allotment; thence bearing S. 58° 31' W. one thousand and seventeen links and a half; thence S. 68° 55' W. one thousand two hundred and sixty-four links; thence S. 85° 2' W. one thousand two hundred and sixty-four links; thence S. 60° 18' W. two thousand three hundred and seventy links to the south-west boundary of the allotment; thence S. 48° 35' E. one hundred and five links and a half; thence S. 60° 18' E. two thousand three hundred and fourteen links; thence N. 85° 2' E. one thousand two hundred and fifty-six links and a quarter; thence N. 68° 55' E. one thousand two hundred and eighty-seven links and a quarter; thence N. 58° 31' E. nine hundred and sixty-five links and a half to a Government road one chain wide; and thence north along the said road one hundred and seventeen links and a quarter to the commencing point.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

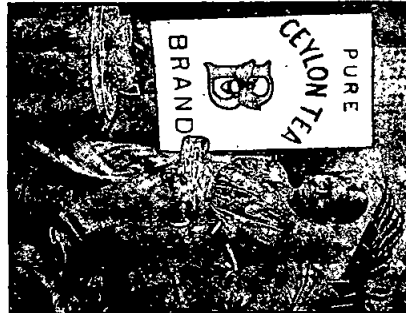

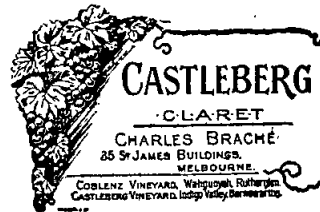

Every man obtaining 137 points shall, in addition, receive and be entitled to wear a marksman's badge for the year in which he becomes a marksman; but should he fail to again secure the number of points requisite in order to be so classed he must relinquish it: Provided that no man shall wear his marksman's badge except on a uniform of the prescribed pattern.

The best shot of the whole of the Rifle Clubs, and the best shot of each Rifle Club District, shall receive and be entitled to wear a badge similar to that worn by the best shot of a Regiment and Company respectively.
