## NORWEGIAN VESSELS.

SIR,—With reference to the Earl of Derby's Circular Despatch of the 28th February, 1884, I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a further Order of the Queen in Council respecting the tonnage admeasurement of Norwegian vessels.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1882* it is enacted that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854* have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their Certificates of Registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be remeasured in any port or place in Her Majesty's Dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their Certificates of Registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificates of Registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships:

And whereas by *The Merchant Shipping Act 1876* it is enacted that "where Her Majesty has power, under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, or any Act passed or hereafter to be passed amending the same, to make an Order in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time to make such Order in Council, and by Order in Council to revoke, alter, or add to any Order so made":

And whereas it was made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854* had been adopted by the Royal Norwegian Government, and came into force in Norway on the 1st day of April, 1876:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th day of May, 1876, and by Order in Council dated the 2nd day of February, 1884, which revoked the last recited Order, Her Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that, subject to certain provisos therein contained, the merchant ships belonging to the Kingdom of Norway, the measurement of which had been ascertained and denoted on the Registers or other national papers of such ships, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such Registers or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificates of Registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships:

No. 121.—SEPTEMBER 21, 1894.—1.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that a new Royal Ordinance, which came into operation on the 1st day of October, 1893, stipulates that the Certificates of Tonnage of Norwegian steam-ships may show the net tonnage, calculated according to British rules:

And whereas it has been made to appear desirable to Her Majesty that the provisions of the said recited Order in Council of the 2nd day of February, 1884, should be revoked, and a new Order in Council made and substituted in lieu thereof:

Now therefore Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Acts, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the said recited Order of the 2nd day of February, 1884, shall be and the same is hereby revoked, and in lieu thereof and in substitution thereof, Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that the ships of Norway, the certificates of Norwegian nationality and registry of which are dated on and after the said 1st day of October, 1893, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of Norwegian nationality and registry.

MY LORD,—With reference to my Despatch No. 62 of this series of the 24th of May last, I have the honour to inform Your Lordship that, in amplification of the Rules of the 26th April, 1893, for preventing the spread of epidemic diseases along the maritime frontiers of the Empire, the Committee of Ministers have decided, with the approval of His Imperial Majesty, that all foreign vessels arriving in Russian ports shall present Bills of Health visé by Russian Consuls at the port of their departure; at the same time it has been decreed that no Bills of Health issued by authorities of intermediate ports at which vessels may have touched need be presented.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received the following communication from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Madrid:—

“Under the provisions of an Act recently passed by the Spanish Cortes, goods arriving in Spain and her Colonies from the United Kingdom and the British Colonies will continue to receive the same treatment as heretofore, namely, in the Peninsula and the adjacent Islands the Minimum Tariff, together with the

advantages conceded by Treaty to Switzerland, Sweden and Norway, and the Netherlands, or other European States, except Portugal.

“In the Spanish Colonies, such goods will continue to be treated under the Minimum Column of the Colonial Tariff.

“This treatment will be maintained until a permanent Commercial Treaty is concluded between the United Kingdom and Spain, or until the negotiations now pending for the conclusion of such a Treaty are formally broken off.”

Candidates must lodge their applications with the Secretary to the Board not later than the 12th September; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the six following subjects:—

- (1) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
- (2) Levelling.—Practice of surface and underground levelling, levelling by vertical angles, plotting sections.
- (3) Mensuration of earthwork.

(6) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visà voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

*Defences and Discipline Act 1890.*ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS FOR RIFLE CLUBS.<sup>1</sup>*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of August, 1894.*

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order make the following addition to the Regulations for Rifle Clubs (that is to say):—

Regulation 14 is cancelled, and the following Regulation is substituted therefor:—

14. Every effective rifleman who obtains 75 points or more will earn for his club the sums\* set forth below, provided he has attended at least two "battle-firing" parades during the year ending 30th June:—

Points.	Sum Payable.
75 and less than 100	5s.
100 and less than 125	7s. 6d.
125 and over	10s.

Every man obtaining 137 points shall, in addition, receive and be entitled to wear a marksman's badge for the year in which he becomes a marksman; but should he fail to again secure the number of points requisite in order to be so classed he must relinquish it: Provided that no man shall wear his marksman's badge except on a uniform of the prescribed pattern.

The best shot of the whole of the Rifle Clubs, and the best shot of each Rifle Club District, shall receive and be entitled to wear a badge similar to that worn by the best shot of a Regiment and Company respectively.

\* Subject to the requisite funds being voted by Parliament.

And the Honorable Robert Reid, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
