REGULATIONS MADE BY HER MAJESTY'S HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR THE WESTERN PACIFIC.

THE following extract from a Despatch from Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosures, are published for general information.

QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made in the name of and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893)

FOR THE PURPOSE OF RAISING A REVENUE TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF GOVERNMENT WITHIN THE PROTECTORATE ESTABLISHED BY HER MAJESTY IN THE GILBERT GROUP.

1. In this Regulation the word "native" shall mean—
 - (a) Aboriginal native of any island in the Gilbert Group;
 - (b) Aboriginal native of any other island in the Pacific resident in the Gilbert Group and not being a subject of any foreign power, or an ordained minister of religion, or a person employed in trade either on his own account or on behalf of another person.

The term "Resident Commissioner" shall mean the British Resident Commissioner in the Gilbert Group.

2. On the coming into force of this Regulation, sections two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten, and eleven of Part I. of "The Gilberts Regulation, 1893," shall be revoked. Provided always that all taxes and licence-fees payable thereunder may be recovered, and all penalties for non-payment of the same enforced, as though the aforesaid sections were still in force.

3. On and after the coming into force of this Regulation, it shall be unlawful to trade in the Gilbert Group except under a licence or licences, to be obtained in the manner provided in this Regulation.

4. For every licence to trade on shore (hereinafter called a "trading licence") a sum of Six pounds shall be paid, and a separate licence must be obtained by every person employed in trading on shore.

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5. For trading from or on board of any ship or sea-going vessel a licence (hereinafter called a "ship's licence") shall be obtained. Such ship's licence may include the whole of the Gilbert Group, or refer specifically to one or more islands. For a ship's licence embracing the whole of the Gilbert Group a sum of One hundred pounds shall be paid. For any other ship's licence a sum of Ten pounds shall be paid for every island to which such licence shall apply. Every ship's licence shall be available for the ship or vessel only in respect of which it is issued. Provided always that on proof to the satisfaction of the Resident Commissioner that any vessel duly licensed as hereinbefore provided has been withdrawn from the Gilbert Group and another vessel substituted therefor the Resident Commissioner may, on surrender of the ship's licence, issue a substituted ship's licence in respect of the vessel so substituted as aforesaid, and for every such substituted ship's licence a fee of Ten shillings shall be paid.

6. Every trading licence and ship's licence shall determine on the thirty-first day of December in the year in which such trading licence or ship's licence shall come into force, and shall only apply to the island for which it is issued; but for the purposes of such licences all islands situated in the same lagoon shall be deemed to constitute one island.

7. A poll tax of One pound shall be paid on the first day of January in every year by every male non-native person (except an ordained minister of religion resident in the Gilbert Group, or a person of less than sixteen or more than sixty years of age); and a like tax shall, after a residence of two months, be paid by every male non-native person, except as aforesaid, who shall come into the said Group between the said first day of January and the thirty-first day of December in any year. In the absence of proof of the age of any male non-native person in the Gilbert Group, the age of such person may be estimated by the Resident Commissioner, and the age estimated by the Resident Commissioner shall be held to be the age of such person.

8. Trading licences and ship's licences available for any island in the Gilbert Group may be obtained from the Resident Commissioner or at the office, in Fiji, of the High Commissioner.

9. The High Commissioner or the Resident Commissioner shall appoint persons to receive the taxes provided for in this Regulation, and to issue trading licences and ships' licences available only in the islands in respect of which such persons may be appointed. Every such person receiving taxes shall, at the earliest opportunity, forward the amount received to the Resident Commissioner, unless duly directed to forward the same to the High Commissioner in Fiji.

10. Any person trading on shore or employing another person to trade on shore without the necessary licence having been obtained shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds.

11. Any person trading from or on board of any ship or sea-going vessel in the Gilbert Group without the necessary licence having been obtained, and the owner and the master of any such vessel, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds.

12. Any person neglecting to pay the annual tax of One pound provided for by this Regulation shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

This Regulation shall come into force on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and may be cited as "The Gilberts (Revenue) Regulation, 1894."

QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made in the name of and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council of 1893)

FOR THE BETTER ADMINISTRATION OF GOVERNMENT WITHIN THE PROTECTORATE ESTABLISHED BY HER MAJESTY IN THE ELLICE GROUP AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1. In this Regulation the word "native" shall mean—

- (a) Aboriginal native of any island in the Ellice Group;
- (b) Aboriginal native of any other island in the Pacific resident in the Ellice Group and not being a subject of any foreign power, or an ordained minister of religion, or a person employed in trade either on his own account or on behalf of another person.

The term "Resident Commissioner" shall mean the British Resident Commissioner in the Ellice Group.

"Recruit" shall mean recruit for the purpose of employment on land beyond the limits of the Protectorate established by Her Majesty in the Ellice Group.

PART I.

TO PROVIDE A REVENUE FOR THE PURPOSES OF ADMINISTRATION.

2. Whereas the Chiefs and Elders of the various Native Governments have agreed to levy a tax on natives for the purposes of the Administration of the Protectorate: And whereas such Chiefs and Elders have requested the High Commissioner to make Regulations providing for charges to be made for trading licences and for other taxes to be paid by non-native persons.

3. On and after the coming into force of this Regulation, it shall be unlawful to trade in the Ellice Group except under a licence or licences, to be obtained in the manner provided in this Regulation.

4. For every licence to trade on shore (hereinafter called a "trading licence") a sum of Six pounds shall be paid, and a separate licence must be obtained by every person employed in trading on shore.

5. For trading from or on board of any ship or sea-going vessel a licence (hereinafter called a "ship's licence") shall be obtained. Such ship's licence may include the whole of the Ellice Group, or refer specifically to one or more islands. For a ship's licence embracing the whole of the Ellice Group a sum of Fifty pounds shall be paid. For any other ship's licence a sum of Ten pounds shall be paid for every island to which such licence shall apply. Every ship's licence shall be available for the ship or vessel only in respect of which it is issued. Provided always that on proof to the satisfaction of the Resident Commissioner that any vessel duly licensed as hereinbefore provided has been withdrawn from the Ellice Group and another vessel substituted therefor the Resident Commissioner may, on surrender of the ship's licence, issue a substituted ship's licence in respect of the vessel so substituted as aforesaid, and for every such substituted ship's licence a fee of Ten shillings shall be paid.

6. Every trading licence and ship's licence shall determine on the thirty-first day of December in the year in which such trading licence or ship's licence shall come into force, and shall only apply to the island for which it is issued; but for the purposes of such licences all closely adjacent islands surrounding or situated in the same lagoon shall be deemed to constitute one island.

7. A poll tax of One pound shall be paid on the first day of January in every year by every male non-native person (except an ordained minister of religion resident in the Ellice Group, or a person of less than sixteen or more than sixty years of age); and a like tax shall, after a residence of two months, be paid by every male non-native person, except as aforesaid, who shall come into the said Group between the said first day of January and the thirty-first day of December in any year. In the absence of proof of the age of any male non-native person in the Ellice Group, the age of such person may be estimated by the Resident Commissioner, and the age estimated by the Resident Commissioner shall be held to be the age of such person.

8. Trading licences and ship's licences available for any island in the Ellice Group may be obtained from the Resident Commissioner or at the office, in Fiji, of the High Commissioner.

9. The High Commissioner or the Resident Commissioner shall appoint persons to receive the taxes provided for in this Regulation, and to issue trading licences and ship's licences available only in the islands in respect of which such persons may be appointed. Every such person receiving taxes shall, at the earliest opportunity, forward the amount received to the Resident Commissioner, unless duly directed to forward the same to the High Commissioner in Fiji.

10. Any person trading on shore or employing another person to trade on shore without the necessary licence having been obtained shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds.

11. Any person trading from or on board of any ship or sea-going vessel in the Ellice Group without the necessary licence having been obtained, and the owner and the master of any such vessel, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds.

12. Any person neglecting to pay the annual tax of One pound provided for by this Regulation shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

PART II.

TO RESTRICT THE SALE OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

13. On and after the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five the sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption on the premises shall be unlawful throughout the Ellice Group. Any person offending against this section, whether such person be buyer or seller, shall for each offence be liable to a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds or to imprisonment not exceeding one month.

PART III.

TO PREVENT THE SALE OF NATIVE LANDS.

14. The sale of land owned by natives to non-native persons shall be unlawful.

15. If any non-native person enter into a lease of land owned by a native he shall forthwith submit such lease to the Resident Commissioner, who shall at a convenient opportunity make inquiry of the native lessor and of the native authorities of the island in which the land sought to be leased shall be situated. If it shall appear that the lease is for a period of more than twenty-one years, or that the land sought to be leased is not the property of the proposed lessor, or that the lease has been unfairly obtained, or that the terms are manifestly to the disadvantage of the native lessor, or that there will not be left sufficient land to support the family of the lessor, or if the lease is otherwise contrary to sound public policy, the Resident Commissioner shall refuse to confirm such lease; otherwise the Resident Commissioner shall make a copy of such lease in a book to be kept for the purpose and shall make an indorsement on the lease to the effect that the lease has been confirmed and registered, and shall make a charge of Ten shillings for every such registration of lease. The registration of the lease shall not be conclusive evidence of title as against a person not claiming through the lessor.

16. In the event of the refusal of the Resident Commissioner to confirm a lease it shall be unlawful for the intended lessee or any person claiming under him to deal or attempt to deal with the land intended to be leased otherwise than as a tenant at will.

PART IV.

WITH REGARD TO EMIGRATION.

17. Any person engaged in or assisting in recruiting natives otherwise than in accordance with this Regulation shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds or to imprisonment not exceeding six months, or both.

18. Subject to the provisions of this Regulation it shall be lawful to recruit natives for any place within the jurisdiction of the Legislature of any British possession: Provided that a licence for the purpose has been duly granted by the Government of such British possession.

19. Natives may be recruited for places not being within the jurisdiction of the Legislature of a British possession provided that a licence has been obtained from the High Commissioner, or from any person authorized by the High Commissioner to issue such licences. Every such licence shall state the name of the vessel in which the native labourers are to be carried, the name of the master, the number that may be recruited, and the conditions regarding accommodation, water and food supply, and the stock of medicines and medical appliances to be kept on board. The licence will be accompanied by a form of contract approved and certified by the High Commissioner or by a person authorized by him for that purpose.

20. Any failure to comply with the conditions of the licence, and the making of any agreement not in accordance with the terms of the form of agreement provided for above, shall be deemed to be a breach of this Regulation.

21. It shall be unlawful to recruit any native apparently under the age of sixteen years without the consent of the parents or guardians of such native, or to recruit any married woman whose husband is not also recruited at the same time and for the same place.

22. The Resident Commissioner may at any time inspect any vessel engaged in recruiting natives, and may examine the stores, provisions, and water supply on board, and the labourers recruited. The Resident Commissioner may, if he think fit, order any labourer recruited to be put on shore and the contract to be cancelled. The Resident Commissioner may also order the vessel to take its final departure from the Group from an island or anchorage to be named by him.

23. The Resident Commissioner may, in the event of the absence of an undue proportion of the adult males, or for any other reason which seems to him good, prohibit, either for a specified time or until further notice, recruiting natives at any island or islands specified. Such prohibition shall be reported forthwith to the High Commissioner, who may vary or rescind the same, and who will take such steps as may appear advisable to make such prohibition public. No person who, but for the provisions of this section, would be legally recruiting natives shall be liable to punishment for recruiting at an island at which recruiting is prohibited unless it is shown that such person had special notice of such prohibition. But any labourer so recruited shall, if still within the waters of the Ellice Group, be landed as soon as the prohibition becomes known.

PART V.

WITH REGARD TO CURRENCY.

24. All taxes, fees, and fines shall be payable in coin of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

25. In all cases of contract or of debt coming before the Court in which the cause of action shall have arisen in the Ellice Group, the word "dollar" shall be deemed to mean "silver Mexican

dollar" unless it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Court that another meaning was attached to it at the time that the contract was entered into or the debt incurred.

26. In the case of a contract by which dollars are expressed to be payable in English money, a dollar shall be deemed to be the equivalent of four English shillings.

PART VI.

WITH REGARD TO CONTRACTS MADE WITH NATIVES.

27. The High Commissioner's Court shall entertain no action brought against a native for money lent, goods supplied, work done, or for passages on board vessels in the Ellice Group subsequently to the declaration of Her Majesty's Protectorate over the Group.

28. This Regulation may be cited as "The Ellice Regulation, 1894," and shall come into force on the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

REGULATIONS.—CLASSIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Section 59 (1).

WE, the undersigned, being Members of the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in us, do make the following Regulation, which shall apply to persons appointed, transferred, or promoted after the 22nd October, 1894:—

1. The Professional Division shall be divided into seven classes, namely, Legal, Medical, Scientific and Literary, Educational, Architectural and Engineering, Survey, and General.

2. When any office in the Professional Division becomes vacant, it shall, unless it be found absolutely necessary to appoint to such vacancy a duly qualified person from outside the Service, be filled by the promotion thereto of the officer who, in the opinion of the Board, possesses the particular professional qualifications required for the vacant office, and is next entitled by merit, good and diligent conduct, length of service, and relative seniority of such officer, and the nature of the work performed by him.

3. In the case of all appointments, transfers, or promotions made after the 22nd day of October, 1894, to such position or office, the scale or amount of emoluments, salary, and allowances attached to the several positions or offices, or class of position or office mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the position or office in such Schedule.

4. When a minimum rate and a maximum rate of pay is attached to any office, the person holding such office shall be paid such amount, being not less than the minimum nor more than the maximum rate, as shall be from time to time fixed by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Board.

5. Every person newly appointed to the Professional Division shall commence at the minimum rate of pay of the office to which he is appointed.

6. Any officer transferred or promoted to any Professional office shall thereupon, so far as regards seniority for promotion, be considered the junior officer in the office or grade to which he is transferred or promoted, but, notwithstanding anything in the Schedule hereto, he shall be paid a salary not less than that which he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion.

REGULATIONS.—CLASSIFICATION OF NON-CLERICAL DIVISION.

Section 59.—(viii.)

WE, the undersigned, being Members of the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in us, do make the following Regulation, which shall apply to persons appointed, transferred, or promoted after the 22nd October, 1894:—

1. In the case of all appointments, transfers, or promotions made after the 22nd day of October, 1894, to or in the Non-Clerical Division, the scale or amount of emoluments, salary, allowances, and wages attached to the several positions or offices, or class of positions or offices, mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the position or office in such Schedule.

2. In cases where no minimum rate of pay is entered opposite the name of his office in the said Schedule, every officer shall be entitled to receive pay at the maximum rate, without addition thereto.

3. Every officer shall be entitled to receive pay at a rate within the minimum and maximum limits, to be fixed by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Board, without addition thereto; provided that an officer on his first appointment to the service shall be paid at the minimum rate of his office.

4. Seniority as regards promotion, and salaries of officers transferred or promoted, will be regulated in accordance with the provisions of Section 10 of the *Public Service Act 1893* so far as such provisions are applicable, but the salary of an officer transferred or promoted is in no case to exceed the maximum amount provided for his new office.

5. In cases where officers are graded promotion from grade to grade shall be regulated in accordance with clause 6, chapter X, of the Regulations relating to "Promotion of Officers in the Non-Clerical Division."

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECEIPT AND COINAGE OF GOLD AT THE MELBOURNE BRANCH OF THE ROYAL MINT.

Gold can be deposited at the Mint, in small or large parcels, for coinage, subject to the following charges, allowances, and condition:—

Charges.

1. For a deposit containing 1,000 ounces gross or over, Three halfpence per ounce.
2. For a deposit containing less than 1,000 ounces gross, Two-pence per ounce, provided that—

Four shillings shall be the minimum charge for any one deposit.

The above charges will be made on the gross weight before melting in cases where silver is allowed for and otherwise on the standard weight.

If a deposit contains more than two per cent. of base metal an extra charge, to be fixed by the Deputy-Master, will be made for its extraction.

Allowance.

Any silver in a deposit in excess of eight per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting will be allowed for at a rate per ounce fine, to be fixed periodically by the Deputy-Master.

Mode of Payment.

Deposits weighing in the aggregate 1,000 ounces or over will be paid for, if desired (in even thousands), in coin. The balance of coin payments and all other deposits by cheque.

Gold deposited on Monday and Tuesday will be made payable on the following Friday week, and on the following Tuesday week if deposited on Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday; but, in case of lodgments (for which coin is desired) which contain any deposits of less than 1,000 ounces, payment will be postponed to the pay-day following that on which they would otherwise be due.

Payment can be obtained for gold as soon as it is assayed and valued by paying a discount charge, to be fixed from time to time by the Deputy-Master, for the unexpired days.

N.B.—These arrangements respecting payment will be carried out as far as possible, but the Deputy-Master cannot be held responsible for their absolute performance in case of accident to the machinery, or should unusually heavy deposits be made on one day. In this latter case preference will be given to the earlier depositors.

Conditions.

1. Each parcel for which a separate assay is required shall be considered as a separate deposit: Provided always that the value of all deposits shall be determined upon the report of the Assay Department of this Branch of Her Majesty's Mint, which shall be final; and that the Deputy-Master may refuse any deposit which he may deem unsuitable for coinage; and that it shall be in his discretion to make exceptional arrangements, in cases in which he may consider it desirable to do so for the advantage of the public service.

2. The receiving-office at the Mint will be open daily for the receipt and issue of bullion from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., except on Saturdays and holidays, but deposits made during the last ten days of each quarter will be received as for the following quarter.

Note.—Gold and silver bullion, in ingots or bars, can be obtained at the Mint to a limited extent; gold at £3 17s. 10½d. the ounce standard, and silver at such price as the Deputy-Master may think proper to accept. Not less than £5 worth of either metal will be sold at one time.

Gold coin which has become light after issue from the Royal Mint or any of its Branches will be received at the Mint, in parcels of not less than £10 nominal value, at £3 17s. 10½d. per ounce.

The births of 1,162 children, viz., 606 boys and 556 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. In the month of August, 1,161 births were registered, or 1 less than in the month under review. The births were 173 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 252 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 553, viz., 284 of males and 269 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 609, or 110 per cent. The deaths were less than those in August by 15, and below the average of September during the previous ten years by 49. If, moreover, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 84.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.61, and of deaths registered 1.24.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 71.2° on the 20th, and the lowest was 36.1° on the 29th. The mean temperature of the month (51.6°) was 2.1° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32.7°) took place on the 20th, and the least range (8.1°) on the 9th and 27th; the mean daily range was 16.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.366 inches on the 16th, and the lowest was 29.258 inches on the 9th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.960 inches) was a fraction of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 19 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.69 inches. The average rainfall in September during the previous ten years was 2.05 inches, or .64 of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 1 day during the month.

Males contributed 51 per cent., and females 49 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 30 per cent. to that mortality, as against 29 per cent. in September, 1893; 29 per cent. in September, 1892; 33 per cent. in September, 1891; 35 per cent. in September, 1890; 34 per cent. in September, 1889; and 29 per cent. in September, 1888.

Sixty-seven deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a publican, aged 75, died of apoplexy; a surveyor, aged 75, of paralysis; a labourer and a female, each aged 75, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 75, of pleurisy; a female, aged 75, of gout; a female, aged 75, of cancer; three females, each aged 75,

Twenty-nine deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which twenty-six were set down to accident, one to homicide, and two to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A fireman, aged 30, was passed over by a railway train; a labourer, aged 19, and a pavior, aged 40, died of injuries consequent on falls; a labourer, aged 32, of injuries caused by a tree falling on him; a mounted constable, aged 31, of injuries resulting from his horse falling on him; a medical practitioner, aged 43, of injuries received in a buggy accident; a labourer, aged 18, was killed by the breaking of a chain; a carpenter, aged 46, by the collapse of a scaffold; a female child, aged 8, by being gored by a cow; a female, aged 44, died of dislocation of the humerus; a female, aged 75, of fracture of the thigh—how caused not stated; a boy, aged 4, of scalds; a dressmaker, aged 34, in a phosphorus poisoning caused by sucking lucifer matches; a female, aged 8, was drowned at Moorabbin; a female, aged 55, in the Saltwater River; a ship's apprentice, aged 21, and a seaman, aged 53, in Hobson's Bay; and a master mariner, aged 55, in the Saltwater River; four male infants, aged 2 days, 11 days, 13 days, and 3 months respectively, were overlain; a female infant, aged 17 days, was suffocated by swallowing curdled milk; a labourer, aged 32, whilst in an epileptic fit; and a clerk, aged 67, during an attack of pneumonia; a male infant, aged 4 days, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a new-born male infant who was smothered, a verdict of wilful murder being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a lumper, aged 52, who shot himself, and a female, aged 30, who poisoned herself with carbolic acid.

One hundred and twenty-four deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the St. Vincent's Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Women's Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 14 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 6 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 165, of which 95, or 58 per cent., were of males, and 70, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 104 were under one year of age, 34 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 388. Of these, 189, or 49 per cent., were males, and 199, or 51 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 5 were between fifteen and twenty, 23 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 31 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 20 were between forty and forty-five, 12 were between forty-five and fifty, 36 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 35 were between sixty and sixty-five, 32 were between sixty-five and seventy, 44 were between seventy and seventy-five, 37 were between seventy-five and eighty, 20 were between eighty and eighty-five, 3 were between eighty-five and ninety, 6 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 was ninety-five years of age.

As compared with the experience of the previous month, deaths from influenza rose from 9 to 16, deaths from scarlet fever from 1 to 3, and deaths from diphtheria from 4 to 5. On the other hand, deaths from whooping-cough fell from 30 to 17, whilst 4 deaths were set down to typhoid fever in both months. From the beginning of the year to the end of September, 132 deaths were set down to typhoid fever and 39 to diphtheria, as against 109 and 26 deaths from those causes respectively in the first 9 months of the previous year.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of the years 1889 to 1893, and the first nine months of 1894:—

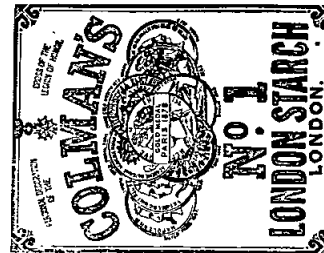

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106), section 142 power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

SPECIAL LICENCE UNDER DIVISION 3 OF PART I.

The licence to occupy and improve allotments 6 and 7, section 30, parish of Merino, containing sixteen acres more or less, to be issued to James Heaney in accordance with an agreement dated the 16th day of August, 1894, made between the said James Heaney and the Board of Land and Works, shall be in the form and subject to the conditions specified in Schedule A hereto.

THIS INDENTURE made the first day of _____ in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and _____ between His Excellency The Right Honorable JOHN ADRIAN LOUIS Earl of Hopetoun Viscount Aithrie and Baron Hope in the Peerage of Scotland Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle in the Peerage of the United Kingdom Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies in the name and on behalf of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria of the one part and James Heaney of Merino farmer in the said colony (hereinafter called the "licensee") of the other part Whereas the licensee having applied for this licence and made the declaration required by the 44th section of the *Land Act 1890* the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council has agreed to grant the same on the faith that the applicant does not by becoming the licensee violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of the Land Acts And whereas the Governor with the advice aforesaid has approved of and directed the conditions and provisions hereinafter contained to be inserted in this licence And whereas the licensee has paid half a year's fee for occupation in advance Now this indenture witnesseth that in consideration of the payment aforesaid of the fee for occupation hereby reserved and of the agreements by the licensee hereinafter contained the Governor with the advice aforesaid doth hereby grant unto the licensee licence and liberty to enter upon and personally to occupy in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts the surface and down to a depth of fifty feet below the surface of all that agricultural allotment situate in the parish of Merino county of Normandy in the colony of Victoria containing _____ acres more or less and delineated on the plan prepared in accordance with the provisions of the 30th section of the *Land Act 1890* and thereon numbered _____ in the said parish and also delineated on the plan drawn in the margin of these presents and thereon coloured yellow for the term of six years from the day of the date of this licence Excepting and reserving unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors all gold and silver and auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone and all copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores whatsoever and all mines seams veins lodes and deposits containing gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores in upon and under the land hereby licensed together with liberty for Her Majesty her heirs and successors and her and their agents servants lessees licensees and assigns at any time or times during the said term to enter upon the said land and to search and mine therein for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores or to remove therefrom any gold silver auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores and for the purposes aforesaid to sink shafts make drives and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining And also excepting and reserving to Her Majesty her heirs and successors and the holder of a miner's right or of a licence to search for metals and minerals or of a gold mining or mineral lease and their agents and servants tenants and workmen liberty and right of ingress egress and regress at all times through over and across the land hereby licensed with or without horses cattle and other animals carts waggons and carriages to or from any claim or mine and to any public road or track subject to such regulations to be made by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council as may for the time being be in force The land comprised in this licence is also subject both during the currency of this licence and after the licensee shall have acquired the fee-simple or leasehold thereof to the right of any person being the holder of a miner's right or a licence to search for metals and minerals or of a gold mining or mineral lease being allowed by the licensee his executors administrators and assigns to enter upon the area hereby licensed and search for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to mine

therein and thereon and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery thereon in the same manner and under the same conditions and provisions as those on which such persons had at the time of the passing of the *Land Act 1890* the right to mine for gold and silver in and upon Crown lands provided that compensation shall be paid to the licensee by such persons for surface damage to be done to such lands by reason of mining thereon such compensation to be determined as by law required and the payment thereof to be a condition precedent to such right of entry and this licence is subject to the conditions that the licensee shall at all times during the currency hereof permit every such person to exercise the right aforesaid. Yielding and paying therefor during the same term a yearly fee for occupation of being calculated at the rate of One shilling per annum for each and every acre or fractional part of an acre contained in the said allotment and such further fee (if any) fixed by any Order in Council made in that behalf under and by virtue of the provisions of section 17 of the *Land Act 1891* the said yearly fee to be paid in advance by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of and the first day of in every year clear of all deductions the first of the half-yearly payments having been made in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts the next of the said half-yearly payments to be made on first day of next and the last of the half-yearly payments to be made on the first day of next preceding the expiration of the term of this licence. The licensee for himself his heirs executors and administrators hereby agrees with the Governor as follows:—

1. To pay the said licence-fee in moieties in advance at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions.
2. To pay all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time being payable by landlord or tenant in respect of the premises.
3. That he will not during the currency of this licence assign the licence nor transfer his right title and interest therein or in the allotment hereinbefore described and herein comprised or any part thereof nor sublet the said allotment or any part thereof.
4. To at once and to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works commence and continue to destroy and within two years after the issue of this licence to have destroyed to the satisfaction of the Board the animals and birds by the said Act included in the term "vermin" or which the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to be vermin for the purposes of the said Acts upon such land and to keep the same free from such animals and birds to the satisfaction of the said Board during the currency of this licence.
5. To enclose within six years from the issue of this licence if not sooner called upon under the provisions of the *Fences Act 1890* the land herein comprised with a fence of such kind as shall come within the meaning assigned to the word "fence" by the *Land Act 1890* and keep the same in repair during the continuance of this licence.
6. That he will within twelve months after the issue of this licence commence and thenceforward during the continuance of this licence without intermission (except for any period specified in a notice registered in conformity with the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act) occupy personally the said allotment.
7. That he will make and erect on the said allotment before the end of the sixth year from the commencement of this licence substantial and permanent improvements of the value of One pound for every acre and fractional part of an acre of the allotment.
8. That he will at all times during the continuance of this licence *bona fide* comply with all and will not violate any of the provisions of the said Acts.
9. That if and whenever any part of the said fees for occupation are in arrear whether the same have been demanded or not or if and whenever there shall be a breach of any of the agreements positive or negative by the licensee herein contained or if this licence be assigned whether by operation of law or otherwise save as in the said Acts is otherwise expressly provided or if the said allotment or any part thereof is sublet or in case the licensee do not within twelve months after the issue of this licence and thenceforward during the continuance of this licence without intermission (except as hereinbefore mentioned) personally occupy the said allotment or in case substantial and permanent improvements certified in writing under the seal of the Board of Land and Works or under the hands of arbitrators as provided by the *Land Act 1890* to be of the value of One pound for every acre and fractional part of an acre of the allotment have not been made on

the said allotment by the licensee before the end of the sixth year from the commencement of this licence or if at any time be shown to the satisfaction of the Governor with the advice aforesaid (and that it has been so shown the production of a copy of the *Government Gazette* containing a notice purporting to be signed by the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Acts or Part I. Division 3 of the *Land Act 1890* so declaring or notifying or declaring or notifying that this licence has become forfeited and void shall be conclusive evidence) that the licensee became such licensee or that he held or continued to hold this licence in violation of or non-compliance with any of the provisions of the said Acts or that the licensee has committed a breach of or not fulfilled any of the conditions of this licence then and in any of such cases this licence shall be void and of no effect.

12. That ancillary and without prejudice to the provisions of the 45th and 125th sections of the *Land Act 1890* it is hereby agreed that immediately upon this licence so becoming void and of no effect it shall be lawful for any bailiffs of Crown lands or for any other agents or officers authorized in that behalf without any demand whatever to enter upon the said allotment and the licensee and all persons claiming under him for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case Her Majesty had obtained judgment in ejectment or in an action for the recovery of land and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or writ of possession or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law and that in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for or on account of the same by any person whatsoever the defendants or defendant to such action may plead leave and licence thereto and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and licence of the licensee and all persons claiming under him to any bailiff of Crown lands and all persons acting in the matters complained of in such action or other proceeding.

That if the licensee during the said period of six years occupy the said allotment for not less than five years and fence and make the improvements of the nature and value hereinbefore mentioned on the said allotment during the said period of six years and prove to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works (to be certified under its seal) by such evidence as the Board may require that he has complied with the said conditions and with all other conditions hereof he shall be entitled at any time within twelve months after six years from the commencement of this licence to demand and obtain from the Governor in Council a lease of the said allotment and such lease shall be for a term of fourteen years at a yearly rent of One shilling or of such other sum (if any) not being less than one-eighth part greater nor more than double the sum of One shilling as may be fixed by any Order in Council as aforesaid for each acre or fractional part of an acre so demised payable in equal parts half-yearly in advance and will contain the usual covenants for the payment of rent and a condition for re-entry on non-payment thereof and a covenant that the licensee will not sell assign or sublet the whole or any portion of the land included in such lease but at all times during the continuance thereof will occupy the land in his own proper person or by members of his family or by his servants *bona fide* and exclusively in his service with a proviso for re-entry on any assignment or subletting or on any person being allowed to occupy the same save as aforesaid also a covenant that in the event of the lessee becoming or being made insolvent or by his assigning his estate for the benefit of creditors or in the event of any process issuing out of any court having jurisdiction on that behalf and the land included in such lease being seized or of any act being done by the sheriff or other officer having the execution of any such process with the view of offering for sale the same or the lessee's interest therein in the event of any such case occurring as aforesaid the land in the said lease shall absolutely revert to Her Majesty and also will contain such other covenants conditions exceptions and reservations as the Governor in Council may direct.

15. That upon payment of the last sum due on account of the rent under such lease and having observed and performed the several matters clauses covenants conditions and provisions thereof the lessee or if he be dead his executors or administrators shall be entitled to a grant in fee of the lands leased and every such grant shall be subject to such covenants conditions exceptions and reservations as the Governor in Council may direct.

16. Except as herein otherwise expressly provided the word "licensee" shall include his executors and administrators.

17. The licensee for himself his executors administrators further agrees with Her Majesty her heirs and successors in manner following that is to say In the event of the whole or any portion of the land hereby licensed being at any time or times required by the Victorian Railways Commissioners or by any other person or persons or corporation for the time being by any law in force in Victoria authorized to make construct manage or maintain any state railway or railways for the construction maintenance or management of any railway or railways or railway stations or for obtaining earth stone timber gravel or sand or any other materials or things or for railway water supply purposes or other works matters or conveniences in connexion with any railway or railway works already or hereafter authorized to be constructed maintained or managed or by the Governor for the construction of water supply works irrigation works reservoirs dams races water-courses or drains or for public roads or highways to be hereafter set out by the authority of the Governor he the said licensee his executors and administrators will within one month upon receiving notice in writing from the Railways Commissioners or other person or persons or corporation

fore said or from a responsible Minister of the Crown authorized by Order in Council that the land is so required relinquish possession of the land so required and all claims thereto provided that such licensee his executors or administrators shall for a period of one month after the receipt by him or them of such notice be entitled to remove all buildings erections or fences upon the land so required but such right shall be forfeited if the same be not exercised and such buildings erections or fences removed within the time hereinbefore limited and that neither he nor they will make any claim for compensation whatsoever for the said buildings erections or fences or for any improvements or for any moneys expended upon the said lands or for the cost which he or they may incur in such removal nor will he or they make any claim for compensation for any loss of frontage to or access from any road or roads in consequence of the construction of any such railway railway station or other works matters or conveniences and the said Railways Commissioners or other person or persons or corporation aforesaid shall not be liable to construct any crossing or other accommodation works under or upon any railway that may be made through or adjacent to such land or any part thereof nor will the licensee his executors or administrators make any claim for compensation for any right or interest which he or they may possess in such land beyond a proportionate reduction in the licence-fee which shall in all cases be fixed by an officer appointed by the Governor nor in respect of the severance from the other lands occupied by him or them under this licence And it is expressly agreed between the parties hereto that this agreement is to be construed as a release by the said licensee his executors and administrators to Her Majesty her heirs and successors from all or any payment to him or them and from all claims thereto which might otherwise have been made in respect of resumption of any portion of the land hereby licensed for any railway or railway station or railway water supply purposes or other works matters or conveniences or for the purposes of the construction of water supply works irrigation works reservoirs dams races water-courses or drains or for public roads or highways under the before-contained conditions for resumption by or on behalf of Her Majesty her heirs and successors.

18. That the term "Governor" in these presents shall mean the Governor or the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria for the time being unless such meaning shall be inconsistent with the context.

No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the Land Act 1890, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that upon the publication in the Government Gazette of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that subject as aforesaid such old road or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Ararat has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a road in the parish of Ararat, county of Ripon: And whereas an Order of the Governor in Council deviating such road was made on the 9th day of July, 1894: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Order and to make another Order in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke the said Order made on the 9th day of July, 1894, and, in lieu thereof, doth declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC PARK IN THE
PARISH OF ANGORA.

WE, Thomas McKnight Hamilton, William St. Clair Lyall, James Winnett, Duncan Fraser, and John Barkley, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Public Park in the parish of Angora, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*—

REGULATIONS.

1. The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the park.
5. No person shall put in the park any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
