### PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

THURSDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Port Fairy and the Shire of Belfast;

FRIDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Corio and South Barwon, and as a Bank Holiday at Geelong;

THURSDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT,

as a Bank Holiday at Clunes;

TUESDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Dunmunkle, and as a Bank Holiday at Rupanyup;

WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT,

as a Bank Holiday at Mornington;

THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Warrnambool;

· THURSDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Bairnsdale.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-ninth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fifty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.
