1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual shire valuation of the said Urban District.

2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban District.

3. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the Trust's works, Three shillings and fourpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

4. Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1895.

Such person or persons as the Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

And the Board of Land and Works having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf it enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notices that the said Avoca Water Trust District is supplied with water have been duly given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 22nd October, 1894, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates which should be made by the Board of Land and Works under the said Act should be made in accordance with the provisions of the said Act for one year, that is to say, for the year 1895, and should be made equally upon all rateable property within the said Avoca Water Trust District, exclusive of the lands comprised within a certain Urban District (being part of the Water Trust District) proclaimed on the 10th day of March, 1885, and gazetted in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th March, 1885, and that such rates should not exceed Two shillings in the pound sterling on the net annual value of such rateable property, and should be recovered in the manner provided in the said Act: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 22nd October, 1894, in that behalf, make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The following rate is hereby made and shall be payable for the year 1895 equally upon all rateable property within the Avoca Water Trust District not included within the boundaries of the Urban District proclaimed on the 10th March, 1885, before mentioned, according to the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements and the manner of the district within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated, that is to say, on all such rateable property the sum of One shilling in the pound sterling on such valuation. Such rate is hereby made payable on the 1st day of January, 1895.

Such person or persons as the Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates.

**BAIRNSDALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY
TRUST.—REGULATION No. 8.**

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, hereby make the following Regulation for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply by the Trust within the Urban Division, and for other purposes, during the calendar year 1895:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands, houses, and tenements situate in the Urban Division of the Trust area shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such lands, houses, or tenements situate on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which lands, houses, or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1895, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1895; and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates:—

(a) On every house, tenement, or lands a rate of Sixpence for every One pound per annum of municipal valuation.

(b) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping or any other purpose, a maximum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

(c) For water supplied by the said Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (c) of section 1 of this Regulation), One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(d) Water supplied to gardens, nurseries, manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

(e) For water supplied to Government departments, cricket clubs, bowling greens, boating clubs, show-yards, cattle-yards, and recreation reserves, shall be charged by measurement at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 80,000 gallons per annum.

(f) Private water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each, except when in the opinion of the Trust a meter shall be necessary.

2. The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this Regulation shall be paid by and be recoverable from the owner of the premises, or the occupier or person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and charges shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the 1st day of January, 1895, and on the 1st day of July, 1895 (except in the case of water supplied by meter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust from time to time), and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

In the construction of this Regulation, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1895.

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulation.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1895, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust :—

1. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.

3. For water supplied by the Trust to livery and carriers' stables, the charge shall be Five shillings for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five (5) feet shall be charged for as a stall.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1895.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

OMEOWATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rates and charges for the year 1895 upon all the lands and tenements within the Water Supply District, that is to say :—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds, a rate of Seven and one-half per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty pounds, except where a meter is used.

3. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust a charge of One pound per annum shall be made.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

5. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

6. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows :—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less,	8,000	galls.	per annum.
Do.	12,000	"	"
Do.	16,000	"	"
Do.	28,000	"	"
Do.	40,000	"	"

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load to be taken at one time, Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

(f) All properties through which the race runs situated above the reservoir shall be charged at the rate of five per centum on the amount of municipal valuation.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1895.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1892*, make the following

REGULATION NUMBERED 14,

Fixing the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust district, such rate being made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1895.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows :—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, of the annual value of £20 and under, the sum of £1 1s. per annum.

2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of £5 per cent. per annum on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £200, the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel of the annual value of £30 and under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.

5. On every hotel above the annual value of £30, the sum of £8 per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.

6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation.

7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of 10s. per annum for the first stall, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, 10s. per annum for the first horse kept, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional horse.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of 1s. each per annum.

Water-troughs, 10s. each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be 2s. per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be 20s. per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam-boilers the charge shall be at the rate of 10s. per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1895, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge at 2s. per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust for the year 1895 :—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds municipal value and under, a rate of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-one pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before-mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. A minimum rate of One pound and a maximum rate of Four pounds (as the Commissioners may determine) to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate upon the annual municipal value.

5. On every horse-trough, a charge of One pound per annum.

6. Water supplied to the Government departments and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.

7. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January, 1895, and 1st July, 1895.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1895.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities of the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The rates and charges herein specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid waterworks district, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July:—

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when so supplied shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the event of their being no such contract Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, or plastering, the same to be paid for before the pipes are connected.

3. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-half of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile but not exceeding one-half of a mile from a stand-pipe shall be charged one-quarter of the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations, and that any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby make the following additions to and alteration in the General Rules for the Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

59A. *Oiling of Jetty Cranes*.—All persons about to use any crane placed upon any Government wharf or jetty shall, before using such crane, see that all the working parts thereof have been properly oiled, and must be careful not to lift any weights which exceed the weights painted on the jib of such crane, and indicating the maximum weight intended to be lifted thereby, and must not use any such crane for the purpose of breaking out any articles or goods, or for any purpose for which it was not originally intended.

59B. *Injury to Government Property*.—If any person shall injure in any way or destroy any Government wharf, jetty, tramway, shed, building, or erection of any kind situated in any port or harbor, or any crane, truck, tackle, or other Government property whatsoever belonging to or connected with any such wharf, jetty, tramway, shed, building, or erection, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these regulations, and liable to the penalty prescribed by law therefor.

Clause 81 of the "General Rules and Orders for Ports and Harbors in Victoria" is hereby repealed, and the following is substituted therefor:—

81. *Conveyance of Explosives*.—All boats specially licensed to convey explosives either to or from ships, wharfs, or other places shall be subject to all the regulations, so far as the same may be applicable, in force for the time being for the management of hulks containing explosives; and no boat having explosives on board shall be towed by a high-pressure open-decked steam-boat whose furnaces are exposed, nor shall any such boat be towed by any other steamer with less tow-line between her and the steamer than 60 feet, and no steamer shall approach within 60 feet of any hulk, lighter, or boat containing explosives.
