SOUTH CHANNEL, PORT PHILLIP BAY.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners dated 29th February, 1892, it is hereby notified that dredging will be re-commenced on and after the 4th December, 1894, in the vicinity of the Pile Light, South Channel, and the south edge of the channel will not be buoyed off, but instead thereof two small red can buoys will be moored in the vicinity of No. 11 gas buoy between sunrise and sunset to mark the alignment of the dredging operations, and it is requested that care be taken to avoid such marks. A basket ball will be exhibited from the port or starboard side of the dredger by day, and three red lights in a vertical position by night, to indicate the side on which vessels navigating the channel are to pass such dredger.





MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS BOARD.—CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY, QUALIFICATION, AND CLERK OF WORKS.—REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by an Order made on the 29th day of November, 1894, rescinded all previous Regulations under which Certificates of Competency, Qualification, and Clerk of Works will be issued by the Municipal Surveyors Board appointed under the provisions of the said Acts, and has, by the same Order, made the following Regulations in lieu thereof, viz. :—

MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS BOARD.

Regulations relating to the issue of Certificates of Competency, Qualification, and Clerk of Works by the Municipal Surveyors Board.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates of competency will be held in Melbourne, at a place to be from time to time hereafter appointed, commencing at Ten o'clock a.m., on the last Tuesday in the months of February, May, August, and November in each year.

2. Candidates must be in attendance in the examination room punctually at the hour named each day, and in the event of any adjournment at the hour named for such adjournment.

3. Every candidate must forward to the Secretary of the Board fourteen (14) clear days at least before the commencing day of the examination at which he intends to present himself, notice in writing of such intention, and with satisfactory documentary evidence of having complied with one of the following conditions :—

- (a) Of having completed his articles of indenture in the office of some competent engineer or surveyor.
- (b) Of having completed a University course of instruction in civil engineering.
- (c) Of having passed the examination for land or mining surveyors or water supply engineers, and of having had one year's practical experience of engineering work.
- (d) Of having had three years' experience in designing or executing engineering works.

4. Satisfactory evidence must be produced, if required, of the age and respectability of character of any candidate; and no candidate shall be eligible for examination under the age of twenty-three (23) years, or who has been convicted of a breach of trust.

5. Candidates who have complied with Regulations 3 and 4 will be required to pay to the Secretary the sum of £2 2s., a receipt for which will be passport to the examination.

6. Two classes of Certificates of Competency will be issued, (marked A and B), B being the ordinary certificate, and A denoting that the candidate has passed with credit.

7. Gentlemen holding the B certificate under this or previous Statutes may present themselves for the purpose of obtaining the A certificate on payment of a fee of £1 1s., and giving notice to the Secretary not less than fourteen (14) clear days before the day of the examination of intention to come forward for said certificate.

When making application for the A, the B certificate must be returned to the Secretary; and in the event of a first-class (A) being granted, the second class (B) will be cancelled by the Board.

8. Candidates must provide themselves with drawing instruments, scales, and a book of logarithms, and may also use Molesworth's and Troutwine's Engineering Pocket-book.

9. Each examination will occupy the space of three (3) days, during which six (6) sets of questions will be issued to each candidate.

The 1st, 3rd, and 5th sets of questions will be issued at Ten a.m. each day, and the replies thereto must be handed to the Secretary at or before One p.m. The 2nd, 4th, and 6th sets of questions will be issued at Two p.m. each day, and the replies thereto must be handed to the Secretary at or before Five p.m.

The answers to the questions must be written on one side only of each sheet of paper, signed by the candidate, arranged in consecutive order, with the question sheet on the top, and pinned together.

Any candidate detected in the act of using books or notes (except those above indicated), or of giving or receiving assistance, will be dismissed from the examination room.

10. Candidates will be examined in a selection made by the Board from the following list of subjects, viz. :—

- (a) The construction, adjustment, and use of the theodolite, level, clinometer, box sextant, prismatic compass.
- (b) Plotting surveys and sections.
- (c) Calculation of traverses, areas, and volumes.
- (d) Determination of gradients and waterways of bridges and culverts.
- (e) Construction of roads with metal or gravel, pitched foundations for roads. Roads on loess sand and wet clay. Town streets, including footpaths of various kinds, kerbing, channelling, and wood paving. The maintenance and cleansing of roads and streets.
- (f) Bridges, culverts, and retaining walls in masonry, brick-work, and concrete, including piled foundations.
- (g) Timber bridges and culverts.
- (h) Iron and steel bridges.
- (i) Drainage and sewerage, including simple hydraulic calculations.

CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION.

11. The Board will grant Certificates of Qualification as follows :—

- (a) To Corporate Members of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London.

- (b) To persons who have passed the Examination of the Association of Municipal and Sanitary Engineers of England and Wales.
- (c) To Masters of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne.

12. It will be necessary in all cases for applicants to produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that they have for a period of not less than three (3) years been engaged in carrying out works such as are usually supervised by municipal surveyors.

13. Each application for a certificate must be accompanied by a fee of £1 1s.

14. The presence of the applicant will not be necessary unless specially requested.

CERTIFICATE OF CLERK OF WORKS.

15. Certificate.—Every applicant for a Certificate of Clerk of Works shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

- (a) A copy of the minute of his appointment, under seal of the municipality by which he has been employed, and certified to by the chairman thereof.

This document must be accompanied by a separate statement similarly certified to, indicating—

- (b) the precise nature of the duties performed under such appointment;
- (c) the exact period or periods within which such duties have been performed by the applicant;
- (d) that during such period or periods, the applicant performed and was personally responsible for the whole of the duties usually appertaining to the office of municipal engineer or surveyor.

16. *Provisional Certificate.*—All persons claiming to be affected by the provisions of section 35 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, though by reason of insufficient length of service not entitled at the present time to a Certificate of Clerk of Works, must, so far as they are able, submit to the Board the evidence prescribed in Regulation No. 15.

17. In the event of the evidence for a Certificate of Clerk of Works being sufficient, and the provisions of the Act having in all respects been complied with, the Board will cause a certificate to be issued in accordance with Form A hereto subjoined.

18. Where the evidence shows that the provisions of the Act have been complied with in every respect, except that of length of service, the Board will issue a provisional certificate in Form B, to the effect that on completion of a further period of service, to be named therein, the holder will be entitled to apply for a Certificate of Clerk of Works.

19. Every application for a certificate must be accompanied by a fee of £1 1s.

20. The presence of the applicant will not be necessary unless specially requested.

During the third quarter of 1894 the registered births numbered 8,657 and the registered deaths 3,618; the excess of the former over the latter being 5,039, or 139 per cent. As compared with the corresponding quarter of 1893, the births in the quarter under notice were fewer by 936 and the deaths by 780.

The recorded arrivals by sea during the quarter numbered 15,085, but the recorded departures by sea numbered as many as 17,158; the apparent loss by excess of emigration over immigration being 2,073. Unrecorded departures, moreover, estimated at 1,519, being taken into account, the actual loss is found to have been greater than this, viz., 3,592.

The net increase of population during the quarter was 1,447, made up of a gain of 1,727 females, less a loss of 280 males. During the corresponding quarter of the previous year the net increase was only 866, made up of a gain of 1,670 females, less a loss of 804 males.

During the quarter the recorded arrivals from were greater than the recorded departures for New South Wales by 944, and Tasmania by 586. On the other hand, the recorded departures for exceeded the recorded arrivals from Western Australia by 2,638, the United Kingdom by 365, Queensland by 203, Foreign Ports by 183, New Zealand and the South Seas by 115, and South Australia by 109.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 22,170, viz., 17,286 males and 4,884 females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of September would have been 1,197,086, viz., 623,125 males and 574,961 females.

The estimate for unrecorded departures is based upon the loss which was found to have occurred from this cause between the censuses of 1881 and 1891. From the falling off, however, which has been taking place for some time past in the number of births and deaths, it would appear probable that the allowance made has been too small, and consequently that the population of the colony is really less than that shown in the table.

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1895.

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

1. For all land and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District the water rate for 1895 shall be One shilling in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such land and tenement for the year 1894-5. The minimum rate to be charged shall be One pound upon all lands and tenements except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 120 *Water Act 1890*, valued at or under Twenty pounds.

2. Such rate shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July, 1895.

3. All water sold by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be paid for quarterly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be that which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to one-fourth of the water rate payable in respect of the premises as supplied if supplied otherwise than through a meter.

All payments shall be payable at the offices of the Trust Town Hall, Wilson-street, Horsham.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 19.

1. This Regulation shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah, as such district is proclaimed and defined in an Order in Council bearing date the 23rd June, 1890.

2. In clauses 2 and 5 of Regulation No. 13, the words "One shilling" shall be substituted for the words "One shilling and sixpence."

3. The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said Urban District shall pay in respect of the year 1895 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes.

4. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Fifteen pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings; on every house or tenement above the annual value of Fifteen pounds, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling on the amount of the municipal valuation for the time being, provided that no owner or occupier shall be rated in respect of more than one vacant allotment.

5. Such rates shall be payable in two equal instalments on the 1st day of January, 1895, and the 1st day of July, 1895.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust on the 15th day of November, 1894.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR YEAR 1895.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1895, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be charged.

3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be charged.

4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.

6. For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

7. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

8. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1895.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation dealing with the supply of water within the said district:—

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables or troughs, or a supply for steam boilers or for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing the house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged by meter. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.
2. The charges for water supplied by measure for other than domestic purposes solely shall, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—
 - (a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
 - (b) Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
 - (c) Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
 - (d) Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
 - (e) Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.
 - (f) And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.
 - (g) In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.
3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.
4. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, or by meter or measure, shall be paid monthly, or as may be agreed upon.
5. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away any such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, and who shall not be rated or liable to be rated for water in respect of property situated within the Urban District, who shall take or carry away water from any private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
7. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, allow persons not residing within the Trust District to have water from any public service-pipe in such district at the rate of One shilling and sixpence for each tank of 400 gallons or for any less quantity.
8. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary; such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons, and until it shall have been tested and approved by an officer of the Trust.
9. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
10. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.
11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.
12. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve

for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter under a penalty of Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

13. All service-pipes must be of the best galvanized iron, and not more than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch diameter, except in cases where special permission, in writing, from the Trust or their engineer is given to increase the size. All pipes must be provided with proper couplings for jointing same, and all joints to be well screwed up and red lead applied to thread of screw. All screws to be properly cut. Connexions to cast-iron mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which three feet of lead pipe of full weight must be attached. Connexions with lead and iron pipes must be with brass union couplings and wiped joints.
14. Each service-pipe from cast-iron mains to be supplied with one brass high-pressure stop-cock at the building line; wooden box, with cover, to be placed over this to prevent dirt getting in. On service-pipes from wrought-iron sub-mains an additional stop-cock shall be affixed at the sub-main.
15. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.
16. In no case will one service-pipe be allowed to serve two or more houses.
17. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works. And any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
18. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.
19. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
20. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and if none, the owner, shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.
21. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds; and in case he shall not, immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust may seem best.
22. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.
23. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.
24. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meter laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.
25. In the construction of these regulations the word "Trust" shall mean the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust.

**SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1895.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at £16 (Sixteen pounds) and upwards, situate within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1895.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than £16 (Sixteen pounds sterling) on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket-grounds, bowling-greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of 250 gallons or under, Sixpence shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in said year 1895, excepting those by measure, which shall be payable monthly.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the 13th November, 1894.

Division 9 of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 29th October, 1894, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban Districts for the year 1895, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1895 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said Urban Districts.

2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.

3. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.

4. The rate to be made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1895.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf, the 28th day of November, 1894.

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1895, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1895, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1895, and shall be payable the one moiety on the first of January and the other on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

of the Shire of Nunawading, be included in the area of the Metropolis within the meaning of section 4 of the said Act, and doth declare such land to be area to which the said *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890* shall apply, that is to say:—

No. 1120) it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make Regulations, not being contrary to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Part in respect to leases and licences, and such Regulations from time to time to alter, add to, or rescind: And whereas it is expedient to alter the Regulations relating to mining leases, made in pursuance of the provisions of the said Part of the said Act by Order in Council dated the 5th day of April, 1892: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind clauses 54 and 55 of the said Regulations, and in lieu thereof doth make the Regulations following: Provided always that the clauses hereby repealed shall continue to have full force and effect until the coming into operation of the Regulations hereby made, that is to say:—

54. The Warden shall give such notice to the parties as he shall think necessary, and on failure of either party to attend him he may proceed *ex parte*; and on such inquiry shall hear and examine the parties and their witnesses, and shall reduce their evidence to writing, and shall forward the same, together with a report and recommendation thereon, to the Minister of Mines; and on any such hearing the Warden may allow, in his discretion, to the lessees or lessee; their, his, or its successors, executors, administrators, or transferees, costs not exceeding five pounds, to be taken out of the deposit made by the person or persons so applying as aforesaid. If, however, either party shall be dissatisfied with the recommendation of the Warden, he or they may, within ten days after such hearing, make a written appeal to the Minister, who may, should he think it advisable, hold a further public hearing at which both sides may be present, and thereupon he shall proceed as provided hereinafter.

55. If the Minister of Mines, after perusing such report, or after such further public hearing, shall be of opinion that any breach of the covenants or conditions of the lease has been committed, and that the lease should be forfeited, he shall submit the matter for the judgment and determination of the Governor in Council.

And the Honorable Henry Foster, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WE, James Philpott Middleton, John Bremner, Henry Cotton, John Pook, William John Long, Andrew Scott, Samuel Henry Farrall, James Heeps, and Walter Thomas Harse, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Recreation purposes in the township of Elmore, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No persons shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall exercise or train horses (without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained), or put goats or pigs in the reserve.
 6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
 8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
 9. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as it may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements:—
For admission of every adult, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One shilling (1s.).
For admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of rider, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One shilling (1s.).
For admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse, exclusive of passengers, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).
For admission of every additional horse, Sixpence (6d.).
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF BLACKWOOD.

WE, James Barkla, Michael John Croker, William Gribble, Laurence Hayden, and Thomas Vigor, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Blackwood, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be divided as follows:—
(1) The pavilion and members' room.
(2) The playing ground.
(3) The remainder of the reserve.
 2. All persons shall be admitted to the third division free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
 3. No person shall use the members' room without first obtaining permission from the committee of management.
 4. Every person paying for admission to the third division or any part thereof, or to the pavilion, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall on demand produce and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority to demand the production or surrender of same, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.
 5. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 6. No person shall damage in any way the trees or tree-guards, or shrubs in the reserve.
 7. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or seats in the reserve, or leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.
 8. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals without first obtaining the permission, in writing, of the committee of management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
 9. No person shall bring any horse or vehicle into the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.
 10. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
 11. No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the purpose of protecting young trees or shrubs.
 12. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or the erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—
(a) Being drunk, or using profane, indecent, or abusive language.
(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
(c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match, or sports, or during practice at cricket or football, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground or pitch would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
 13. The fee or charge for admission of each person to the third division and the pavilion on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for sports, games, or holiday amusements shall be such a sum as the committee of management shall determine, not exceeding One shilling.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE VILLAGE OF COHUNA.

WE, John Gibbins, William Thomas, Ambrose Bowles, and Edward Beguin, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the village of Cohuna, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:-

REGULATIONS

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for sports, games, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding one shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the consent in writing of the committee of management.

4. No person shall jump or climb over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management. Provided always that the monies received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the supplies accepted and shall return the order to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If after the delivery of the supplies has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such supplies may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase, at the contractor's risk, and to deduct from the contractor's account or the security money the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

6. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

7. Tenders must be accompanied by a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary of the Tender Board, or by bank notes, for Ten per cent. of the amount of the security required (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations or erasures.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for Steam Coal at" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The coal to be supplied must have been screened at the pit's mouth, and must be of the best quality. No other coal will be received. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

2. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the coal.

3. Coal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

4. At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the coal accepted and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. If after the delivery of the supplies has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such supplies may be returned to the contractor.

6. The pit certificate to be produced upon request.

7. The contractor will be bound to deliver the coal for vessels into the ships' bunkers. (Dredges are not included in this condition.)

8. When baskets are used in the delivery of coal they are all to be of one size, and the contractor will be bound to tare the baskets when so required by the officer taking delivery. In other cases the contractor will be bound to satisfy the officer receiving that the weight or quantity is correct.

9. Coal to be put on board at a rate of not less than ten (10) tons per hour.

10. In the event of the officer ordering the coal not requiring the same to be put into the ship's bunkers, as required by condition No. 7, a rebate of 1s. per ton to be made by the contractor.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

12. If the board of survey shall decide that the coal is of inferior quality, the delay in delivering the quality specified in condition No. 1 will subject the contractor to a mulct assessed according to the actual loss sustained by such delay, and it will also be in the power of the Treasurer of the colony for the time being to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

13. Steam vessels are to be supplied with coal on demand. No more delay will be allowed than is sufficient to give the necessary orders and get the hulk or vessel alongside. Bad weather to be the only excuse. When there is not a necessity for an immediate supply, a day's notice will be given.

14. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his accounts in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery orders attached thereto.

15. A refusal to execute orders, or repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or in delay of delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, such mulct to be deducted from the contractor's account or the security money. It will also be in the power of the Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

16. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

17. *In the event of a general strike occurring at the collieries, or in the event of war breaking out between Great Britain and any large maritime power, any contract entered into under these conditions after the expiry of one calendar month from notice being given may be suspended, such contract to come into full force and effect again ten (10) days after such cause of suspension shall be discontinued.*

18. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by any purchase of Welsh coal or Westport coal by the Defence Department for the use of torpedo boats, or by the purchase of coal by the Victorian Government from any mine or mines within the colony of Victoria for any of the Departments of the Public Service.

19. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice of the termination of the contract to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

20. *Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 19 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.*

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may station at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September, 1895, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

Tenders must be sent in on proper form, which can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Survey Offices in the country.

Tenders must be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box not later than Twelve noon on Friday, 21st December, 1894.

NOTE.—The fee for the period from 1st January, 1895, to 30th June, 1895, and fee of Five shillings for Licence, must accompany each Tender.

TENDERS will be received by the Board of Land and Works up to Noon of Friday, 21st December, 1894, for the occupation, for grazing purposes only, of the following unappropriated portions of land, subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every licence granted under section 123 of the *Land Act 1890* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Under section 7 of the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890*, all licensees under the section for which these licences will issue are liable for the destruction of rabbits within the boundaries of their licences.

1. 2. In case the said land, or any part or parts thereof, shall be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than the return of such portion of his licence-fee paid by him as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering Division II. of the *Land Act 1890* may think fit. This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.
3. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the licence has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same without the permission or sanction of the licensee or any one claiming under her, him, or them.
4. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.
5. This licence entitles the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but does not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or to fence any portion thereof.
6. If the licensee desire a renewal of this licence, notice to that effect must be given to the responsible Minister aforesaid one month prior to the expiration thereof, but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to confer the right to any renewal.
7. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.
8. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.
9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.
10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.
11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.
12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.
13. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the Thistle Act in like manner as holders of freehold lands.
