SUMMONING OF COUNCIL.

THE subjoined Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania is published in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the Imperial Parliament (48 and 49 Vict. cap. 60), intituled *The Federal Council of Australasia Act 1885*.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Vict. ch. 60, intituled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is enacted that the Sessions of the Federal Council subsequent to the First Session thereof shall be held in such Colony as the Council shall from time to time determine; and further, that the Council shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the Colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of each of the Colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation, and shall meet at such time and such place as shall be named in the Proclamation: And whereas in the Fifth Session of the Federal Council, held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, during the months of January and February, in the fifty-sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, it was, on the third day of the said month of February, determined by the said Council that the next Session thereof should be held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania: Now therefore I, the Right Honorable Jenico William Joseph, Viscount Gormanston, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred on me, do, by this my Proclamation, summon the Federal Council of Australasia, as constituted by the said Act, to meet at the Parliament Buildings, in Hobart, in Tasmania aforesaid, on Wednesday, the thirtieth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, at the hour of Eleven in the forenoon, for the despatch of business.

3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order and of the letter referred to in condition No. 2 be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1894.

THE births of 80 boys and 59 girls, or in all of 139 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of November. Of these, 64 occurred in Ballarat East, 68 in Ballarat West, 2 in Sebastopol, and 5 in the outlying districts; included were 17 illegitimate births and 3 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 132, viz., 62 of boys and 70 of girls.

The deaths registered in November numbered 74, viz., 46 of males and 28 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 65. In October the recorded deaths numbered 80; in November, 1893, they numbered 67; in November, 1892, they numbered 49; in November, 1891, they numbered 77; in November, 1890, they numbered 55; in November, 1889, they numbered 50; in November, 1888, they numbered 45; in November, 1887, they numbered 37; in November, 1886, they numbered 41; in November, 1885, they numbered 54; and in November, 1884, they numbered 53.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

THE Napier Harbor Board has given notice that, on and after the 30th day of November, 1894, the lights exhibited from the eastern and western piers at the entrance to the Inner Harbor, Napier, will be altered so as to show on the following bearings from seaward:—

*Eastern Pier Lights.*

Green: W. by S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. to S.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W.  
White: S.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. to S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. (clears Auckland Rock).  
Red: S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. to S.W. by S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. (over Pania Reef).  
White: S.W. by S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. to S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.  
Green: S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. to S.E. by S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. (over anchorage).  
White: S.E. by S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. to E. by N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N. (westward of anchorage).

Vessels coming from the south should open the white light before rounding the Bluff to avoid the Auckland Rock. The light is exhibited from an open timber-work structure, painted black with a white roof, which is situated about 190 feet from the end of the eastern pier.

The light is elevated about 27 feet above the level of the sea, and is visible about 7 nautic miles in clear weather, allowing 10 feet for the height of the observer's eye.

*Western Pier Lights.*

The two red lights shown vertically, placed 9 feet apart, with the lower one 12 feet above high water, will show from seaward between the bearings of S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. to S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.  
The lights are exhibited from a lighthouse, painted white, placed on the outer end of the western pier.  
All bearings are magnetic and from seaward.

AMENDED LIMITS AND SCALES OF PILOTAGE RATES.

RATES OF PILOTAGE.

WHEREAS by section 57 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is among other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Marine Board of Victoria may exercise the powers and shall perform the duties exercised and performed before the commencement of the said Act by the Pilot Board of Victoria: And whereas section 63 of *The Passengers Harbors and Navigation Statute 1865* provided among other things that the Pilot Board of Victoria might fix the limits within which the rates of pilotage therein mentioned should be payable, and appoint a scale of lesser rates for any shorter distance within such limits, and also a scale of rates for pilotage from any one part of any port to any other part thereof: And whereas the said Pilot Board of Victoria did from time to time fix such limits and appoint such scales of rates as aforesaid:

And whereas by section 82 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is enacted that the rates of pilotage on ships arriving at or departing from any of the ports of Victoria, or from any one part of such port to any other, shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule of the said Act, subject to the exemptions therein contained, and the powers to alter or reduce such rates as thereinbefore in the said Act provided:

And whereas by section 58 of the said Act it is among other things further enacted that the Marine Board may fix the limits within which the rates of pilotage therein mentioned shall be payable, and may appoint a scale of lesser rates for any shorter distance within such limits at which any vessel may be boarded, and also a scale of rates for pilotage from any one part of any one port to any other part thereof, and from time to time reduce such rates of pilotage as well as those set forth in the Third Schedule of the said Act:

And whereas the Marine Board did, on the 31st day of December, 1891, fix such limits and appoint such scales of rates as aforesaid, which limits and rates were duly published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st December, 1891:

And whereas it is expedient to repeal all limits and rates now in force which have been hitherto made by the Pilot Board of Victoria as aforesaid or by the Marine Board of Victoria, and also to fix amended limits and appoint amended scales of rates in lieu thereof:

Now therefore the said Marine Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, repeal all previous limits and rates from the date hereinafter specified, and in lieu thereof doth fix the following limits and appoint the scales of rates of pilotage hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Provided that in every case not otherwise specified in the foregoing schedule in which any vessel shall have received towage assistance through any portion of any channel in Port Phillip Bay a deduction of One farthing per ton from the full pilotage rates payable may be made and refunded to the person who paid the same.

Every ship (taking the services of a pilot) proceeding from sea to Hobson's Bay, and thence subsequently proceeding within seven (7) days of arrival therein to a Melbourne Wharf, shall, in such cases as a full rate may be specified, be charged the full rate of pilotage as specified in the above schedule for a vessel proceeding from sea to a Melbourne Wharf; but any such vessel remaining in Hobson's Bay longer than seven (7) days shall be charged a further sum equivalent to the difference between the amount already paid and the total pilotage payable for the services of a pilot from sea to Hobson's Bay and from Hobson's Bay to Melbourne, according to the above scale; like conditions shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to any vessel subject to compulsory pilotage, proceeding from a Melbourne Wharf to Hobson's Bay and subsequently going to sea.



7. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

8. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1895.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

And the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust; And whereas notice that the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by two Proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Kerang and Castle Donnington) were proclaimed Urban Districts within the meaning of the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 29th day of October, 1894, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said Urban Districts should be made for the year 1895, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 29th October, 1894, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban Districts for the year 1895, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1895 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said Urban Districts.
2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.

3. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.

4. The rate to be made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1895.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf, the 28th day of November, 1894.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and under provisions of section 122, the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust makes the Regulation, as follows:—

Regulation for the making of a rate for the year 1895 on all rateable property within the Urban District of Wycheproof.

The following are the rates which owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Wycheproof (that is to say) in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1895, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1895, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1895, and shall be payable the one moiety on the first of January and the other on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust on the 10th day of October, 1894.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
RATING REGULATION FOR 1895.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling and upwards, situated within the waterworks district of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1895.

2. Upon properties of the municipal value of Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty-three pounds, a rate of One pound and ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before-mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) from the works of the Trust, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust the sum of Forty shillings per annum, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, show yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum; otherwise by special agreement.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the

amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using a hose for ornamental, garden, or other purposes.

11. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid monthly.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

- (3) The report on the railway proposed shall be prepared in the following form:-

No. 1106, Part I, sec. 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid, that is to say:-

**CHAPTER XI.—LICENCES.—STATE FORESTS AND TIMBER RESERVES.**

The Regulation and Schedule (57A) made by Order dated the 6th day of August, 1894, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulation and Schedule are substituted therefor, viz.:-

There may be issued licences to cut and take away dead wood from State Forests; and every such licence shall be subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 57B hereto and to a fee of Five shillings (5s.) per quarter.

The following lands are hereby expressly exempted from the operation of this Regulation:-

- You Yangs Plantation.
- Majorca Plantation.
- Havelock State Forest.
- Creswick State Forest.
- Linton and Scarsdale State Forest.
- Lands within a radius of 10 miles of the Bendigo Post Office.
- Lands within a radius of 5 miles of the Maryborough Post Office.
- Lands within a radius of 5 miles of the Ballarat Post Office.

## SCHEDULE 57B (CHAP. XI.)

*Conditions of Licence to cut and take away dead wood from State Forests.*

1. This licence is personal and must be produced by the holder thereof when asked to do so by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
2. This licence is not available for any area over which an exclusive right to cut timber shall have been granted.
3. This licence only gives the right to cut and remove dead logs and forest debris lying upon the ground.
4. In no case shall standing trees, whether dead or alive, be cut under this licence.
5. No logs shall be cut for the supply of saw-mills.
6. No logs which have been cut for a saw-mill and bear the saw-miller's brand upon them shall be deemed "dead wood" within the meaning of this licence, unless the same have been condemned by the forester in charge after the saw-miller has been requested to remove the same.

## CHAPTER XIII.—TIMBER LICENCES.—LICENCES ON CROWN LANDS (NOT BEING STATE FORESTS OR TIMBER RESERVES).

In Regulation 5 of the Regulations made by Order dated the 3rd day of July, 1893, after the word "wood" the following words are added, viz., "including ironbark."

## SCHEDULE 71.

The fee for the removal of sand from the unappropriated Crown lands within Sandridge Bend shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per load instead of Two shillings (2s.) per load as prescribed in Regulation dated 22nd May, 1894.—(M.68479.)

## SCHEDULE 80.

The following condition is added to Schedules 80:—  
13. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land and on the half-width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the Thistle Act in like manner as holders of freehold lands.—(S.62461.)

And the Honorable Robert Wallace Best, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

After 3rd January, those for Preston, Whittlesea, and Collingwood will run to and from the present Williamstown platform at Spencer-street station.

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenders failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheat hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September, 1895, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

2. In case the said land, or any part or parts thereof, shall be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with; or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than the return of such portion of his licence-fee paid by him as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering Division II. of the *Land Act 1890* may think fit. This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

3. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the licence has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same without the permission or sanction of the licensee or any one claiming under her, him, or them.

4. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

5. This licence entitles the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but does not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or to fence any portion thereof.

6. If the licensee desire a renewal of this licence, notice to that effect must be given to the responsible Minister aforesaid one month prior to the expiration thereof, but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to confer the right to any renewal.

7. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.

8. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.

9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12.
