EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1895.

It is hereby notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 1st August, 1895, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

1. [N.B.—In the case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or should he reside in a Native State, by the highest political officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]
- (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.
- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.

The births of 1,177 children, viz., 614 boys and 563 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of November. In the month of October, 1,141 births were registered, or 36 less than in the month under review. The births were 14 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 84 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in November numbered 507, viz., 286 of males and 221 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 670, or 132 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in October by 3, but below the average of November during the previous ten years by 158. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 197.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.65, and of deaths registered 1.14.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 105.7° on the 27th, and the lowest was 41.5° on the 14th. The mean temperature of the month (62.2°) was 1.7° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (44.8°) took place on the 27th, and the least range (9.5°) on the 12th; the mean daily range was 21.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.311 inches on the 20th, and the lowest was 29.418 inches on the 11th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.899 inches) was a small fraction of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 7 days, the amount of rainfall being .79 inch. The average rainfall in November during the previous ten years was 2.98 inches, or 2.19 inches more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 33 per cent. to that mortality, as against 38 per cent. in November, 1893; 36 per cent. in November, 1892; 40 per cent. in November, 1891; 35 per cent. in November, 1890; 55 per cent. in November, 1889; and 47 per cent. in November, 1888.

Forty-one deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a tinsmith, aged 75, died of cancer; a male of no occupation, aged 75, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 75, of heart disease; a squatter, aged 75, of cirrhosis of liver; a bootmaker, aged 75, of arthritis; a female, aged 75, of cancer; a female, aged 75, of apoplexy; a female, aged 75, of epilepsy; a female, aged 75, of syncope; a labourer, aged 76, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, of cancer; a female, aged 76, of epilepsy; a female, aged 76, of syncope; two females, aged 76, of bronchitis; a smith, aged 77, of cancer; a bootmaker, aged 77, of ichthyosis; a female, aged 77, of cancer; a weaver, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a male of no occupation, aged 78, of cystitis; a female, aged 78, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 79, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 79, of cancer; a coach-smith, aged 80, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 80, of bronchitis; a jeweller, aged 80, of pneumonia; a female, aged 80, of neuritis; a carpenter, aged 82, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 82, of enteritis; a groom, aged 84, of pneumonia; a female, aged 84, of syncope; a dealer, aged 85, of apoplexy; a female, aged 85, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 86, of bed sores; a female, aged 87, of pneumonia; a grocer, aged 92, of cirrhosis of liver; a carter, aged 75, a carver and a pyrotechnist, each aged 81, a female, aged 87, and a labourer, aged 90, of old age.

Thirty-one deaths were set down to external causes during the month, of which 18 were ascribed to accident, 4 to homicide, and 9 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A seaman, aged 23, a publican, aged 34, a lamp-lighter, aged 39, a horse trainer, aged 56, an aboriginal, aged 70, a female infant, aged 2, and a female, aged 65, died of injuries consequent on falls; two labourers, aged 34 and 42 respectively, were killed by a fall of pipeclay; a male infant, aged 4, died of sunstroke; two boys, aged 11 and 13 respectively, a male of no occupation, aged 24, a tailor, aged 47, and a labourer, aged 54, were found drowned in the River Yarra, a boy, aged 3, was drowned in a water-hole, and a boy, aged 4, at Blackburn; a cabdriver, aged 45, died of suffocation—how caused not stated. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male and a new-born female infant, who were smothered, and a female, aged 34, who was stabbed in the neck, a verdict of Wilful Murder being returned in each case; also that of a gold miner, aged 60, who died of septic meningitis, the result of a blow, a verdict of Manslaughter being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a major in the Volunteers, aged 42, a fellmonger, aged 56, and a tutor, aged 60, who shot themselves; a lamp-lighter, aged 52, who cut his throat; a ship's steward and a female, each aged 41, who poisoned themselves, the latter with "rough on rats"; a female servant, aged 17, who drowned herself; and a butcher and a builder, aged 29 and 47 respectively, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and eleven deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—50 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the St. Vincent's Hospital, 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Women's Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 13 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 170, of which 97, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 73, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 135 were under one year of age, 17 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 337. Of these, 159, or 56 per cent., were males, and 148, or 44 per cent., were females; 9 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 8 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 24 were between fifty and fifty-five, 22 were between fifty-five and sixty, 28 were between sixty and sixty-five, 28 were between sixty-five and seventy, 24 were between seventy and seventy-five, 24 were between seventy-five and eighty, 10 were between eighty and eighty-five, 5 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 2 were between ninety and ninety-five.

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In November, as compared with the previous month, miasmatic diseases caused only 29 deaths as against 43. Under this head, whilst deaths from typhoid fever rose from 1 to 6, those from scarlet fever fell from 5 to 3, those from influenza from 13 to 3, those from whooping-cough from 21 to 16, and those from diphtheria from 3 to 1. From the beginning of the year to the end of November, typhoid fever caused 111 deaths in 1893 and 139 in 1894, and diphtheria caused 30 deaths in 1893 and 43 in 1894.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of the years 1889 to 1893, and the first eleven months of 1894:—

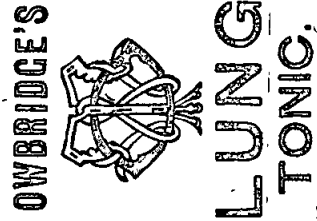

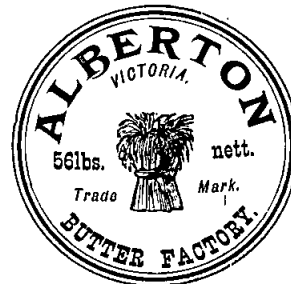

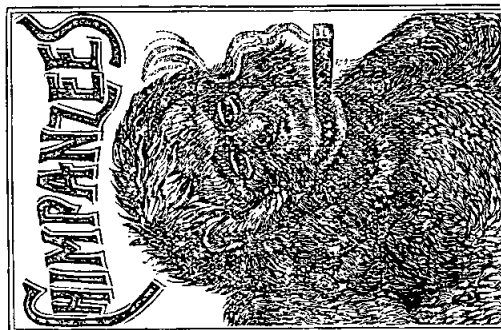

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of St. Arnaud which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of St. Arnaud, and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Warrimbirchip."

Area described in petition:—Commencing at a point where the one hundred and forty-third meridian cuts the boundary line between the parish of Corack and Corack East; thence by that meridian line to the south boundary of Tchim Lake, and thence following the southern and western boundary of Tchim Lake northerly to a three-chain road; thence along that road northerly to the north-east corner of allotment fifty-seven, parish of Karyie; thence westerly by the north boundary of said allotment to the said meridian line; thence northerly by the meridian line to a point where it intersects the Government vermin-proof fence; thence westerly along that fence to the north-east corner of mallee allotment six hundred and twenty-seven, county of Karkaroo; thence northerly to the said county; thence westerly to a point on the northern boundary of mallee allotment six hundred and two, being the north-east corner of the Borung Shire; and thence by the eastern boundary line of the Borung Shire southerly to a point where the said eastern boundary of Borung Shire crosses a three-chain road and southern boundary of mallee allotment one hundred and twenty-one A; thence easterly, south-easterly, and easterly along said three-chain road to the south-east corner of allotment forty-two, parish of Warmur; thence easterly across a three-chain road and easterly along the boundary between allotments twenty-three, twenty-four, and twenty-five to a one-chain road; thence across that road and thence northerly along east side of that road to the division line between allotments twenty-six and twenty-seven; thence easterly along that division line to a three-chain road and across that road; thence north-easterly along east side of that road to a one-chain road between allotments thirty-one and thirty-two; thence in a line continued easterly to the point of commencement.

The petitioners state that the shire as at present constituted is of great extent, and portions thereof are so far from the centre of local government that their interests are practically unrepresented; that the rapid increase and extension of settlement in the western portion of the Central Riding, and more particularly in the mallee country, have, during the last few years, completely altered the relative numbers of the inhabitants and amount of rateable property in the various portions of the shire, with the result that their interests are no longer identical with those of the remainder of the shire, &c.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said area from the Shire of St. Arnaud, and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Shire of Warrimbirchip," such municipality to be not subdivided.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1895.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling and upwards, situated within the waterworks district of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1895.
2. Upon properties of the municipal value of Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty-three pounds, a rate of One pound and ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.
3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before-mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.
4. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) from the works of the Trust, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid.
5. For every public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust the sum of Forty shillings per annum, unless supplied by measurement.
6. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.
7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum; otherwise by special agreement.
8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.
9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.
10. A minimum rate of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using a hose for ornamental, garden, or other purposes.
11. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid monthly.
12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY
TRUST.—REGULATION No. 9.

ALL water supplied from the Trust's works for the irrigation of lands shall be paid for by measure. The form of measure shall be and is hereunder for the year 1894 determined by the Trust.

2. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered by gravitation from the River Murray, the Gumbower Creek, or the Barr Creek, through the Trust's channels or otherwise, shall be for indigenous grasses One penny per inch per acre, three inches to be considered a watering. For the watering of cereals, maize, sorghum, amber cane, fallow land, lucerne, and field crops other than those named shall be by gravitation One penny per inch per acre, six inches to be considered a watering. For crops situated outside the Trust's District the charges for irrigating cereals, sorghum, maize, amber cane, lucerne, and field cultures shall be Sixpence per inch per acre, four (4) inches to be a watering.
3. Filling of tanks by gravitation inside the Trust District free for the first day, Ten shillings (10s.) for each subsequent day when delay is caused by the owner or occupier. Outside the Trust District Thirty shillings (30s.) for the first day and Ten shillings for each subsequent day the delay being caused by the owner or occupier.
4. Irrigation by pumping inside the Trust District.—All kinds of cultivation Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre, four inches to be a watering. The irrigation of natural grasses Threepence (3d.) per inch per acre, four inches to be a watering.
5. Filling of tanks by pumping inside the District.—The charge for filling tanks by pumping shall be Ten shillings (10s.) each, and Ten shillings for each subsequent day's delay when delay is caused by owner or occupier. Outside the district rates for irrigation by pumping shall be double of those charged inside of district, with the exception of the filling of tanks, which shall be Two pounds (£2) each for the first day and Ten shillings for each subsequent day's delay by occupier or owner.
6. Garden rights.—The rate or price to be paid for the right to irrigate under a garden right (which may be taken out at any time during the year 1894, and any right so taken out shall be in force only during the continuance of that year) shall be One pound (£1) for the first and same acre, Fifteen shillings for the second and same acre, and Ten shillings per acre for each subsequent acre.
7. A fractional part of an acre shall in connexion with the foregoing Regulations be considered an acre.
8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.
9. The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of the provisions of Part III. of the *Water Act 1890*, this 29th day of November, 1893.

**HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR THE YEAR 1895.**

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the waterworks district of the said Trust shall pay for the year 1895 in respect of water supplied by the Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.
2. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, the sum of One shilling in the pound sterling.
3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied township or subdivisional allotments shall be Sixpence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value, provided that no rate of less than Ten shillings shall be made.

4. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at the price mentioned, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July; and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

**TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1895.—No. 1.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1895, which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments of land liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.
2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.
3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land shall be One pound per annum for each and every additional allotment.

4. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1895.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893, Part I.

**ABOLITION OF DIFFERENTIAL RATES ON CERTAIN
LINES OF RAILWAY.**

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 77 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* (56 Vict. No. 1288, Part I.) it is enacted that when any newly constructed line of railway is opened for traffic the amount of the fares for passengers and rates for live stock, goods, and merchandise carried thereon shall in all cases be calculated as though such line of railway were detached and separate from other lines of railway, and that so far as such line of railway is concerned no reduction shall be made in the fares and rates chargeable in respect of passengers, live stock, goods, or merchandise carried over such railway by reason of their being carried over other railways vested in the Victorian Railways Commissioners: And whereas by sub-section (2) of the same section it is further enacted that whenever it appears that the traffic receipts from any such new line of railway have paid for the cost of working such line from the date of the opening of the same for traffic, and have also paid full interest at the rate of Four pounds per centum per annum on cost of construction and of rolling-stock, and on the sum (if any) paid by the constructing authority as purchase money or compensation, then if it appears from any report of the Victorian Railways Commissioners that the traffic receipts on such new line are likely to continue in the future to pay such interest and such cost of working, the Governor in Council may direct that the provisions of sub-section (1) of the said section shall cease to apply to such line of railway: And whereas the Acting Victorian Railways Commissioners have reported that the traffic receipts on the lines of railway named hereunder have paid the cost of working and full interest at the rate of Four pounds per centum per annum on total cost of construction and of rolling-stock, and that they are likely in the future to pay such interest and such cost of working: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 77 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* aforesaid shall cease to apply to such lines of railway, except in the case of wheat not the produce of this season's harvest and now stacked at stations, that is to say:—

The Warracknabeal to Hopetoun Line of Railway, and
The Donald to Birchip Line of Railway.

And the Honorable Henry Roberts Williams, Her Majesty's Minister of Railways for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban excepted) from 20th December, 1894, till 3rd January, 1895 (both days inclusive, Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example.—An excursion ticket issued on 3rd January will be available till 3rd February. When the last day falls on a Sunday the ticket will be available till the next day, and on lines where there is not a daily train service the ticket will be available till the next day on which the train runs. The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger. (See exception as under.) During the same period tickets will also be issued at Messrs. T. Cook and Sons, 82 Swanston-street, City, from Melbourne to all stations; and at Yarra-street, Geelong (C. H. Swift); Lydiard-street, Ballarat (E. W. Niven and Co.); High-street, Bendigo (J. Henning), to Melbourne only. On tickets issued at Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations, and at Messrs. T. Cook and Sons, 82 Swanston-street, City, bearing dates from 20th till 26th December, 1894, inclusive, and from 27th December, 1894, till 3rd January, 1895, inclusive, the journey may be commenced on any day during the respective period, and the tickets will be available for return till 26th January or 3rd February, 1895, inclusive (as the case may be).

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From 17th till 31st December, 1894 (both dates inclusive), excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Sydney at the following return fares, viz.:—*Vid* Southern line, first class, £5 6s. 6d.; second class, £4 1s. *Vid* Harden and Blayney, first class, £5 12s. 6d.; second class, £4 6s. 6d. These tickets will be available for return for six calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line. Passengers can, however, travel by the express train on the New South Wales line on payment of 15s. first class and 10s. second class. The journey cannot be broken on the New South Wales line.

Adelaide Excursion Tickets.—From 19th till 31st December, 1894 (both dates inclusive), excursion tickets, available by the express and ordinary trains, will be issued at Melbourne for Adelaide and Broken Hill at the following return fares, viz.:—Adelaide—First class, £4 4s. 5d.; second class, £2 10s. 6d.; Broken Hill—First class, £7 2s. 5d.; second class, £4 6s. 11d. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken.

Brisbane Excursion Tickets.—From 14th December, 1894, till 1st January, 1895 (both dates inclusive), excursion tickets, available by the express and ordinary trains on all lines, will be issued at Melbourne for Brisbane at the following return fares, viz.:—First class, £10; second class, £6 17s. 6d. These tickets will be available for return for six calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for, and the address should be affixed in such a way that it will not come off.

Horses and Vehicles.—From 20th December, 1894, till 3rd January, 1895 (both dates inclusive), the Department cannot engage to forward horses or vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From 20th December, 1894, till 3rd January, 1895 (both dates inclusive), commercial travellers' samples will only be taken to or from road-side stations by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On 22nd, 29th, and 31st December, parcels must be at the Parcels offices at Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations half-an-hour before the starting times of ordinary trains.

Goods Sheds Holidays.—The 25th and 26th December, 1894, and 1st January, 1895, will be observed as holidays in the goods branch, and only dairy produce goods trains will run. Perishable goods will be delivered at all stations on application. On 20th, 21st, 22nd, 24th, 25th, and 26th December, 1894, and 1st January, 1895, fruit and dairy produce will not be carried by purely passenger trains between Melbourne, Ballarat and Bendigo, nor on the North-Eastern line, unless parcels rates are paid. Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheat hay.
- The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.
- The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.
- Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.
- Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
- In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.
- If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.
- When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.
- A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
- Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
- It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September, 1895, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
- The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.

By-Law No. 26.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 26, for regulating keeping goats within the Shire of Heidelberg, being sections 1 to 8 inclusive, Part VIII., 13th schedule of Act. No. 1112.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. Every owner or keeper of any goat usually kept within the municipal district shall register with the municipal clerk his name and address as a keeper of goats, and shall at the time of such registration pay to such clerk the sum of Sixpence, and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a collar bearing the name and address, so registered; and if any person shall, without lawful excuse, offend in any respect against this section, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

2. If any goat shall be found having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall, *prima facie*, be presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

3. The council from time to time shall provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and safe custody of goats for the purposes of this subdivision, and forthwith when any such enclosure shall have been provided shall notify the same, and the situation thereof, in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood.

4. Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place may, by the proper officer of the council, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

5. Whenever a goat having on the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the municipal district, registered as aforesaid, shall be seized hereunder, the proper officer of the council shall forthwith cause notice of such seizure to be given to such person, or left at the place of such address.

6. Subject to the provisions hereinafter in this by-law contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid which shall not have upon the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid, may by the proper officer of the council be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure, and every such goat which shall have on the neck such a collar as aforesaid may by the said officer be destroyed at or after noon of the day following next but one the day of such seizure.

7. The owner of any goat which shall have been seized as aforesaid may apply, *ex parte*, to any justice that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if a justice shall so order and not otherwise, be, unless the same has been destroyed, restored to such owner accordingly; and such order of a justice, or any minute thereof under the hand of such justice, shall, for all purposes of the subdivision, be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

8. The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of any goat found at large in any street, road, or public place, shall, whether such goat be destroyed or not or be restored or not, forfeit and pay a penalty of Five shillings.
