FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Wednesday, the 28th day of February, 1894, and it is expedient to further prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Wednesday, the 28th day of February, 1894, until Thursday, the 26th day of April, 1894.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fifty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

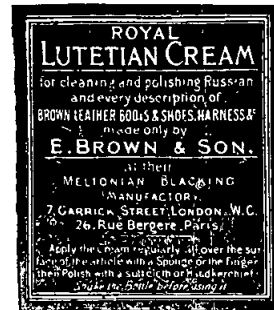

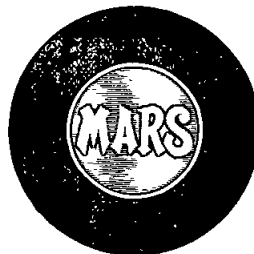

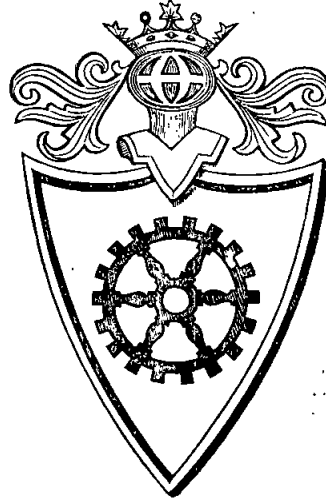

The births of 1,123 children, viz., 549 boys and 574 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of January. In the month of December, 1,027 births were registered, or 96 less than in the month under review. The births were 74 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 352 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 718, viz., 407 of males and 311 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 405, or 56 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in December by 51, but were below the average of January during the previous ten years by 111. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 304.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.37, and of deaths registered 1.51.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 102.5° on the 21st, and the lowest was 52.0° on the 13th. The mean temperature of the month (68.6°) was 2.2° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (42.4°) took place on the 22nd, and the least range (5.2°) on the 6th. The mean daily range was 21.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.087 inches on the 17th and 18th, and the lowest was 29.321 inches on the 11th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.784 inches) was one-tenth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 8 days, the amount of rainfall being .47 inch. The average rainfall in January during the previous ten years was 2.16 inches, or an inch and two-thirds more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 42 per cent. to that mortality, as against 50 per cent. in January, 1893; 53 per cent. in January, 1892; 50 per cent. in January, 1891; 48 per cent. in January, 1890; 57 per cent. in January, 1889; and 53 per cent. in January, 1888.

Forty-four deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these a carpenter and a dealer, each aged 75, died of cancer; a carpenter, aged 75, of apoplexy; a gardener, aged 75, of insanity; a miner, aged 75, of pleurisy; a commercial traveller, aged 75, of enlarged prostate; a carpenter, aged 76, of peritonitis; a female, aged 76, of insanity; a female, aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of gastritis; a builder, aged 77, of pericarditis; a female, aged 77, of

Forty-five deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which thirty-five were set down to accident, one to homicide, eight to suicide, and one to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A labourer, aged 43, died of injuries received by a kick from a horse; a gardener, aged 52, and a printer, aged 79, were run over by horses; a female infant, aged 7 months, a coachsmith, aged 42, a groom, aged 55, a vocalist, aged 58, a bottlemaker, aged 60, and a carpenter, aged 72, died of injuries resulting from falls; a medical student, aged 20, and a blacksmith, aged 42, of gunshot wounds; a female child, aged 5, of injuries consequent on scalds; three male infants, aged 3 months, 11 months, and 1 year respectively, a shoemaker, aged 36, two labourers, aged 40 and 58 respectively, of heat apoplexy (sunstroke); a boy, aged 6, an ironmonger's assistant, aged 17, a labourer, aged 18, a female, aged 26, a male of unknown occupation, aged 50, a gardener, aged 60, and a furniture broker, aged 73, were "found drowned" in the River Yarra; two boys, aged 7 and 11 respectively, in the Merri-Creek; a male infant, aged 2, a salesman, aged 21, and a seaman, aged 42, in Hobson's Bay; two female infants, each aged 3 months, were over-lain; a female infant, aged 4 days, was suffocated whilst taking food; two male infants, aged 11 and 12 days respectively, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a new-born male infant, which was smothered at birth, a verdict of wilful murder being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a farmer, aged 27, a police constable, aged 35, a hawker, aged 45, and a hotel broker, aged 64, who shot themselves; a bricklayer, aged 35, and a hangman, aged 45, who cut their throats; a male of no occupation who poisoned himself; and a female, aged 26, who drowned herself. The execution was that of a female, aged 24, who was hanged in the Melbourne gaol for child murder.

One hundred and twenty-nine deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—54 in the Melbourne Hospital, 14 in the Alfred Hospital, 10 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Women's Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 5 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Blind Asylum, 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 3 in the Infant Asylum, and 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 302, of which 174, or 58 per cent., were of males, and 128, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 251 were under one year of age, 36 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 416. Of these, 233, or 56 per cent., were males, and 183, or 44 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 46 were between twenty-five and thirty, 36 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 28 were between fifty-five and sixty, 58 were between sixty and sixty-five, 30 were between sixty-five and seventy, 30 were between seventy and seventy-five, 24 were between seventy-five and eighty, 11 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, 2 were between ninety and ninety-five.

As compared with the experience of December, deaths from scarlet fever rose from 1 to 3, those from influenza from 3 to 4, those from whooping cough from 3 to 6, and those from typhoid fever from 9 to 13. On the other hand, deaths from diphtheria fell from 3 to 1, and those from diarrhoeal diseases fell from 30 to 29. Attention is called to the fact that in January 6 deaths were set down to heat apoplexy or sunstroke, and 16 deaths of infants to improper feeding or want of breast milk. The execution noted was that of a woman for child murder. This was the only female executed during the last 25 years, and the second one since the first settlement of the colony.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of the years 1889 to 1893, and the first month of 1894:—

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1894.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations, viz.:—

REGULATION No. 1.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of the land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1894, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
 2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.
 3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
 4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
 5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
 6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.
 7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
 8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
 9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling, over Twenty pounds municipal valuation One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
 10. For every water trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a meter shall be 20,000 gallons, and for a supply to livery and carriers' stables Five shillings for each stall shall be charged.
 11. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
 12. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or if there be no contract then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.
 13. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.
 14. For water supplied to market gardens or for other than domestic purposes solely the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may specially be agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.
- That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on demand, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1894.
- Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION No. 2.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

1. *Service-pipes.*—The Trust may grant permission to persons requiring water for "domestic" and for "other than domestic purposes" to affix two service-pipes—one for domestic supply without meter, for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid; and one for other than domestic purposes, with meter, for which supply the ordinary charges by measure shall be paid, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Trust to prevent the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for any purpose not domestic.

2. *Meters to be tested and approved.*—No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons, and each $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch, and 1-inch meter must be capable of registering 10, 15, and 20 gallons per hour respectively, and each meter must be fixed with approved lead connexion above ground in a conveniently accessible position properly protected and fixed to the satisfaction of the Trust's officers.

3. *Where meter ceases registering, average may be charged.*—If any meter in use cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust will estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.

4. *Hire of meters and rate of rent thereof.*—Meter rent to be exclusive of rate.—Hirer to give notice of removal.—The Trust will, if it so think fit but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent of which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch	Six shillings
For $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch	Seven shillings
For 1-inch	Ten shillings
For 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch	Twelve shillings

which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due, and must be paid quarterly in advance, on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in every year, the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current quarter, and the occupier of the premises shall, at his own cost, cause such meter to be fixed and kept in proper repair, and when required on behalf of the Trust so to do, shall cause such meter to be removed to the office of the Trust to be tested, and when it shall have been so tested, shall cause it, or such other meter as may be furnished to him in lieu of it, to be replaced at his own cost, and shall be in like manner responsible for the same. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to leave the premises shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. *Services to be separate except by permission.*—Excepting with the permission of the Trust not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such sub-service; and any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

6. *Extensions subject to consent of the Trust.*—No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.

7. *Service-pipes to be repaired by owner or occupier.*—Penalty for refusal or neglect to repair service-pipe.—The service-pipes from 3 feet on street from building line being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any) and if none the owner shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice; and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

8. *Waste of water.*—Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

9. *Water not to be used or supplied without written authority.*—Any person receiving water from the Trust who, without the written permission of the Trust, shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. *Non-ratepayers may obtain water at the stand-pipes at certain hours.*—Non-ratepayers may obtain water at the stand-pipes at the scale of charges and at the hours fixed from time to time. Payments to be made by coupons only, which may be obtained at the office of the Trust.

11. *Unlawful taking of water without permission.*—Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from the premises of any other person so supplied, or from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. *Unlicensed persons not to interfere with pipes or services.*—Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13. *Licences to plumbers to be during pleasure of the Trust.*—Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employes committing any breach of the Act or of this regulation.

14. *Proof of fitness to be given by the applicant before granting of licence.*—Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the regulations of the Trust, and with the sections of the *Water Act 1890*, affecting his work, but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

15. *Notices to be given on printed forms.*—All notices and applications required by this regulation are to be made upon printed forms, to be obtained at the office of the Trust. Notices sent by post must be prepaid.

16. *Notice of proposed work to be given.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

17. *Fittings to be of the best quality and subject to approval.*—No person shall use any tap, stop-cock, bib-cock, ball, cock, valve, closet-cistern, service-box, waste-not regulator, bath-tap, or valve, or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the Trust which is not of the best quality and approved by the Trust.

18. *High-pressure cocks to be used.*—No person shall use any stop or bib cocks which are not loose-valve screw-down high-pressure cocks, made of hard brass or gun-metal, and in every respect of best quality and workmanship and approved by the Trust.

19. *Cisterns and tanks.*—No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball-valve, and the overflow-pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner, open to inspection, and in a position approved by the Trust.

20. *Water-closets.*—No person shall construct or use any water-closet fitting not approved by the Trust, nor unless the same be supplied with water from the service pertaining to a tenement through a proper closet-cistern or service-box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No person shall fix or use any service-pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with the basin or tap, or otherwise than with the cistern of a water-closet.

21. *Urinals.*—Every urinal shall be supplied only through a cistern or service-box fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No service-pipe shall be suffered to communicate directly with any urinal.

22. *Mains to be tapped by Trust only.*—The Trust only is empowered to tap the water mains or sub-mains in the streets and attach service-pipes thereto, fixing wherever practicable a separate service for each house or tenement; but in all cases where a supply is desired to premises situated in public streets or highways where no mains exist, such supply will be given only under special agreement.

23. *Trust will lay pipes to three feet from building line.*—The Trust will lay all service-pipes from the mains to a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line of the street, and the owner or occupier shall at his own cost lay and maintain the remaining three (3) feet to the building line in addition to all the pipes and apparatus on his premises.

24. *Service-pipes not to communicate with tanks.*—No service-pipe will be allowed to communicate with any cistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of rain water, whether above or below the surface of the ground.

25. *Service-pipes to be best quality.*—Weight, &c., of service-pipes.—Wrought-iron pipes, &c.—All service-pipes must be of lead or wrought iron of the best quality, and, where lead pipes are used, they must be of equal thickness throughout and of at least the following weights:—

Wrought-iron pipes must be those known as "wrought-iron lap-welded steam tubes," and all pipes, fittings, &c., must be capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height. No pipe to be laid at a less depth than ten inches (10 inches) below the surface of the ground.

26. *Laying pipes in sewers.*—No pipe or other apparatus must be laid through any sewer, drain, ash-pit, manure-tank, or other place where, in the event of the pipe becoming unsound, the water conveyed through such pipe would be liable to be fouled

or to escape without observation—unless such pipe or apparatus be laid through an exterior pipe or box of sufficient length and strength to afford due protection to the same and to bring any leakage or waste within easy detection.

27. *Size of service-pipes.*—Except when the supply is paid for by meter, the supply of water will be through separate service-pipes of the following diameters, according to the assessed annual value of the premises, as follows:—

For premises assessed at £20 or under ... ½-inch pipe
For premises assessed at more than £20 ... ¾-inch "

No pipe or larger bore than ¾-inch shall be allowed, except with the written authority of the Trust.

28. *Notice to lay services to be given.*—*Material to be approved and work inspected.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipe of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

29. *Maximum tapping without clip.*—The maximum tapping that will be allowed without clip for each size of main is as follows:—

For 3-inch and 4-inch pipes ...	¾-inch tapping.
For 5-inch, 6-inch, and 7-inch pipes...	1 " "
For 8-inch pipes ...	1½ " "
For 9-inch pipes ...	1¾ " "
Over 9-inch pipes ...	2 " "

30. *Private fire services, &c.*—Subject to previous written consent of the Trust, private fire services will be allowed, at expense of owner, but every such service must be sealed, except in cases where the Trust's officer shall have certified in writing that sealing is unnecessary. For each such private fire service there shall be paid a sum of Ten shillings upon the fixing thereof, and a sum of Ten shilling per annum thereafter. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion of such service except for extinction of fire. Except in case of fire no person shall, without authority of the Trust, wilfully break the seal affixed to any private fire service, and in the event of any such seal having been broken, accidentally or otherwise, the occupier of the tenement shall, within 24 hours thereafter, give notice, in writing, of the fact at the office of the Trust, and failing to do so shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and to a continuing penalty of Ten shillings for every day during which he shall neglect to give such notice.

31. *Brass couplings.*—All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings.

32. *Lead joints to be "wiped."*—All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of the licence of the plumber who by himself or his workman shall break these regulations.

33. *Stop-cock and cover-box.*—A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap shall be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line, at a uniform distance of 3 feet from the latter.

34. *Baths, restriction as to capacity.*—No bath shall be allowed which has a holding capacity when full of more than 100 gallons, except with the special permission of the Trust. The inlet pipe must be placed above the highest water level of the bath, and no overflow pipe will be allowed except when the bath is fitted with an improved waste-preventer.

35. *Reflex valve to be fixed in steam services.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

36. *Street watering to be by permission.*—No person other than an employé of the Trust or a municipality, or member of a fire brigade on duty shall, without the written permission of the Trust, be allowed to take water from the fire-plugs for watering the streets or any other purpose (except in case of fire). The streets shall not be watered from fire-plugs or hydrants directly, but the water is to be supplied to the streets by means of carts or manual labour. Any person offending against this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

37. *Supply to public parks and gardens.*—The water supply to all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Trust, and any person not duly authorized who shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

38. *Use, when allowed.*—No person shall convey water supplied by the Trust through a hose for any purpose except when the water is supplied by measure. Any person offending against this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

39. *Reward for information.*—The Trust will pay a reward of not less than Ten shillings to any person who will give such information as shall lead to the detection of any person or persons who shall wrongfully attach (temporarily or otherwise) any

pipe to any of the mains or services of the Trust, or to any pipe or apparatus connected therewith, or who shall wrongfully draw off, use, or take water of the Trust, or who shall knowingly permit the same to be done.

40. *Consent of Trust.*—*Notices to be addressed to secretary.*—*Conditions as to notice.*—*Consent may be given by chairman, secretary, or engineer.*—In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act, or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice, in writing, addressed to the secretary of the Trust, and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Act or in any regulation of the Trust, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the Trust's consent, in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the chairman of the Trust, the secretary, or the engineer, who, severally, shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the Water Trust for confirmation.

41. *Penalties.*—For every offence against any provision of this regulation for which a penalty is not hereinbefore specially prescribed, the offender shall upon conviction be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

42. *Interpretation clause.*—In the construction of this regulation, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, the words "the Trust" shall be understood to mean the Warrnambool Waterworks Trust, and the words "the Act" shall be understood to mean the *Water Act 1890*.

The foregoing Regulation was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Warrnambool Waterworks Trust on the 17th day of January, 1893, and the seal of the Trust was hereto affixed in the presence of

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION No. 3.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose water district has for the purposes of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1893 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement whether occupied or not, a rate of Eighteenpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being domiciles nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelvepence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Twelvepence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons.
- (h) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam-boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses will be charged half rates. Payments to be made before the supply is given.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With fixed meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Sixteenpence per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

The foregoing Regulation was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Warrnambool Waterworks Trust, on the 17th day of January, 1893, and the seal of the Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

**SWAN HILL SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—
URBAN PORTION.—REGULATION FOR 1894 BY
THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.**

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Waterworks Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loans, in accordance with the Act of Parliament in that behalf, and the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf it enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust:

And whereas notice that the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*:

And whereas by two Proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Kerang and Castle Donnington) were proclaimed Urban Districts within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 5th December, 1893, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said Urban Districts should be made for the year 1894, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act:

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 5th December, 1893, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban Districts for the year 1894, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1894 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said Urban Districts.
2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.
3. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
4. The rate to be made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1894.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf the 13th day of December, 1893.

Regulation for graduated rate by the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust under the *Water Act 1890*.

WHEREAS it is anticipated that the moneys receivable by the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust during the current year will not without a rate be sufficient to meet the estimated expenditure and liabilities of the said Trust for the current year 1894, and it is therefore necessary to make a rate to meet the estimated expenditure and liabilities for the current year 1894:

And whereas by an Order made by the Governor in Council on the 17th day of October, 1892, the district of the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust was divided into three divisions, numbered in the said Order:—

- The No. 1 Division,
- The No. 2 Division,
- The No. 3 Division,

with the several boundaries to such divisions set out in the said Order.

And by the said Order in Council it is directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust for the construction and maintenance of its works, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, will be levied differentially as between such said divisions, and doth determine that the proportions in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another, regard being had to the cost and expenses of the works constructed wholly or in part for the benefit of such divisions respectively, shall be as follows, that is to say:—That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said divisions shall be—

The No. 1 Division	Sixpence
The No. 2 Division	Ninepence
The No. 3 Division	Fifteenpence

And whereas the Commissioners of the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust have, in accordance with the said recited Order in Council, determined, for the several purposes authorized in the said Act, to make the rate set out in the following Regulation, and have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, submitted such rate and regulation for the approval of the Governor in Council, who has, by Order in Council made on the 17th day of October, 1892, given his approval to the same, and such approval was published on the 21st day of October, 1892, in the *Victorian Government Gazette*, and was also published on the 28th day of October, 1892, in the *Pyramid Hill Advertiser* newspaper, being a newspaper circulating in the said district.

Now therefore the Commissioners of the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and for the several purposes authorized by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the Order in Council of the 17th day of October, 1892, do, upon this 1st day of February, 1893, make the Regulation to which the Governor in Council has given his approval by Order in Council as above recited by the Regulation following, that is to say:—

The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the aforesaid divisions shall pay in respect of the term of one year from the 1st day of January, 1894, to the 31st day of December, 1894, on all lands and tenements according to the municipal valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements during the said year, that is to say:—

- On rateable property within the No. 1 Division, a rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling of such valuation.
- On rateable property within the No. 2 Division, a rate of Ninepence in the pound sterling of such valuation.
- On rateable property within the No. 3 Division, a rate of Fifteenpence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rates are hereby made payable on the 1st day of June, 1894.

Such person or persons appointed by the Trust for that purpose shall be authorized to collect and recover such rates.

The foregoing Regulation numbered 10 was made by the Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 1st day of February, 1894.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1891 (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the Land Act 1890, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that upon the publication in the Government Gazette of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that subject as aforesaid such old road or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Eaglehawk, county of Bendigo: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say) :-

Two roads 34 perches, county of Bendigo, municipal district of Eaglehawk: Commencing at the south-east angle of section 17, being a point on the north-west side of Victoria-street; bounded thence by a line bearing N. 73° 51' W. seven chains thirty-four links and seven-tenths to Market-street; thence by a line bearing S. 7° 33' W. one chain one link and one-tenth; thence by a line bearing S. 73° 51' E. six chains ninety-one links and four-tenths; and thence by Victoria-street aforesaid bearing N. 31° 53' E. one chain three links and nine-tenths to the point of commencement: in lieu of that portion of an existing road defined in the following description (that is to say) :-

Three roads, county of Bendigo, municipal district of Eaglehawk, being part of Campbell-street: Commencing at the intersection of the north-east side of the said street with the north-west side of Victoria-street; bounded thence by lines bearing respectively N. 58° 7' W. five chains, S. 31° 53' W. one chain fifty links, and S. 58° 7' E. five chains; and thence by Victoria-street aforesaid bearing N. 31° 53' E. one chain fifty links to the point of commencement.

SHIRE OF SOUTH GIPPSLAND CONSTITUTED AND SHIRE OF ALBERTON RE-DEFINED.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Acts, a sum of Five hundred pounds a shire; to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; to alter the boundaries of or abolish the subdivisions existing in any municipal district; to determine and alter within the limits prescribed by the said Acts the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and to alter and adjust the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, and determine any questions arising out of such alteration and adjustment; and that every such Order shall be published in the Government Gazette, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the West Riding of the Shire of Alberton, praying that such portion may be severed from the said shire and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of South Gippsland: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a shire to be named the Shire of South Gippsland, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shire of Alberton and of the West Riding thereof as reduced, shall be those hereunder set forth and described; and doth hereby further order that the Council of the said newly-constituted Shire of South Gippsland shall consist of nine members, and that the said new shire shall not be subdivided at present:—

SHIRE OF SOUTH GIPPSLAND.

Commencing at the south-east corner of the parish of Welshpool at Lewis' Channel; thence north by the east boundary of the parish of Welshpool to the north-east corner thereof; thence by the north boundaries of the parishes of Welshpool and Toora to the north-west corner of block 35A; thence in a straight line to Mount Fatigue; thence westerly by a direct line to the north-east angle of block 61A, parish of Mirboo South; thence westerly by the north boundaries of blocks 61B and 61A, north-westerly by a road forming the south-west boundary of block 37, parish of Dumbalk, and west by a road to the south-west angle of block 98B; thence south-westerly by a road to the eastern boundary of the parish of Nerrena; thence southerly by that boundary and the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Meeniyah and Tarwin South to the northern boundary of the parish of Waratah; thence easterly by that boundary to the sea coast; thence easterly and north-easterly by Corner Inlet and Lewis' Channel to the commencing point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary.

ALBERTON SHIRE REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing on the sea coast at the embouchure of Merriman's Creek; thence westerly and south-westerly by that creek to its intersection with a portion of the north boundary of block 63, parish of Callignee; thence west and south by the north and west boundaries of the said block, east by block 68A, south by the latter block and block 68B, west by the last-mentioned block, south by the west boundary of allotments 11, 12, and 21, west by the north boundary of allotment 19, south by the west boundary of allotments 19 and 20 to the north boundary of the parish of Bulga; thence west, south, and west by that boundary to the road from Traralgon to Yarram at the north-west angle of allotment 1; thence southerly by that road to the road from Rose-dale to Foster at the south-east boundary of A. Sturgeon's selection; thence south-westerly by the latter road through the parishes of Bulga, Jumbulk, Wonyip, and Gunyah Gunyah to Mount Fatigue; thence by a direct line south-easterly to the north-west corner of block 35A; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Toora and Welshpool to the north-east angle of the last-named parish; thence south by the east boundary of said parish to Lewis' Channel; thence south-westerly by said channel to the sea coast; and thence easterly and north-easterly by the sea coast, including the islands at Corner Inlet and Port Albert, to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1891* (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that subject as aforesaid such old road or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Bairnsdale has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a road in the parishes of Wuk Wuk and Coongulmerang, counties of Tanjil and Dargo, in the said Shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

BOROUGH OF CHEWTON.

BY-LAW No. 25.

A By-law for the registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk, and for cleansing milk stores and shops, and for the suppression of any nuisance connected therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Borough of Chewton, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses thereof, doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

1. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the 31st day of January in every year, register himself with the Borough Council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Town Clerk an application in the form contained in the schedule hereto, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings.

2. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the Town Clerk shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall cause the same to be properly indexed.

3. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation or under his management or control and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale to be kept thoroughly clean.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade shall forthwith report in writing to the Health Officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in any person or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

5. Every person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

6. This by-law shall apply to, and be in force in the whole of the Borough of Chewton, and shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

BOROUGH OF CHEWTON.

BY-LAW No 26.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c., and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c.; disinfecting and deodorizing night-soil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Borough of Chewton, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction hereby make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.
 2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
 3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Borough of Chewton.
 4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground, and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid the Council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.
 5. The occupier of any land in the said borough, on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to 1 cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Council at the expense of such occupier.
 6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said borough shall cause every cesspool already in existence and until its abolition to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of 2 feet from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.
 7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or caused to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.
 8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.
 9. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Council from time to time for the final reception of the same.
 10. Every person placing or depositing or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than 6 inches in thickness.
 11. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said Council at the expense of such occupier.
 12. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet.
 13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.
 14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid.
- And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty notwithstanding that the Council may be

empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BOROUGH OF PORTLAND.

BY-LAW No. 43.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the Borough of Portland, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 39 of the said Council, made the 5th day of February, 1890, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 28th March, 1890, shall be and is hereby wholly rescinded.
2. This by-law, No. 43, shall come into full force and operation after confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and after the 1st day of February, 1894.

Part 1.

3. This part of this by-law, No. 43, shall have operation and apply in the whole of the area within the Borough of Portland enclosed by the left bank of the Salt Creek, commencing at its confluence with Portland Bay, and following up its course and that of the "Swanup" until it meets the prolongation of a line drawn in the centre of Blair-street; thence northwards along the said line drawn in the centre of Blair-street to the intersection of a line drawn in the centre of Townsend-street; thence eastwards by such line drawn in the centre of Townsend-street and produced until it strikes the sea-coast of Portland Bay; and thence by the said sea-coast of Portland Bay to the point of commencement; and shall apply and extend to every occupier of a tenement therein.

4. The method of directly employing a nightman shall be abolished, and, instead thereof, the work of night-soil removal shall be carried out under the direction of the council by their licensed nightmen.

5. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the said council may from time to time hereafter direct, the council shall cause the pan in use in every tenement to be emptied, properly cleansed, and replaced, the contents thereof being removed in a proper air-tight iron night-cart to such place or places as the council may provide for the reception, utilization, or deposit of night-soil.

6. No individual householder shall contract for the removal of night-soil from his premises.

7. Every occupier of a tenement shall provide a properly constructed galvanized iron closet-pan, properly riveted together and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity of not more than three cubic feet, and shall keep the same in good and thorough repair.

8. Each householder, as aforesaid, shall from time to time provide and keep in use in the closet or closets on his tenement a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

9. To provide for the proper removal of night-soil, the occupier of every tenement within the aforesaid boundaries shall pay to the Council of the Borough of Portland the sum of One pound (£1) annually per pan, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said council, for emptying and removing night-soil.

10. Such annual charge shall be payable by each occupier in four equal instalments, due and payable on the 1st day of January, April, July, and October in each year, commencing from the date of the coming into operation of this by-law. Such charges shall be paid to the Town Clerk of the said Council, at the Town Hall, Charles-street, Portland.

PART 2.

11. This part of this By-law, No. 43, shall come into full force and operation within the whole of the Borough of Portland.

12. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging to such premises, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse-matter to be removed from time to time from such yard or ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Borough Council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

13. The occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stable, cow yard, cattle shed or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein, to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to three cubic yards. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall fail or neglect to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said borough council at the expense of such occupier.

14. All blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places as the council may appoint from time to time for the reception of the same.

15. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any cesspool or other place, shall, immediately on the depositor spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered with a layer of earth not less than twelve inches in thickness.

16. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether as an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water liquid, soil or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, once in every twenty-four hours to be removed therefrom and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

17. No closet door or trap shall abut upon any street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

18. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds (£5) for every breach, or of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings (5s.), to be paid; and any person committing any breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF COLAC.

 4. No person shall in any way damage or injure the fences or gates of the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein without the authority, in writing, of the council.
 6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the council first obtained.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE
CRESWICK BOROUGH COMMON.**

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on 3rd July, 1893, the Council of the Borough of Creswick, as managers of the Creswick Borough Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of clause 2 of the Regulations in respect of such Common, which were approved by the Governor in Council on 28th May, 1877:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for that purpose.

VERMIN DISTRICTS.—ANNUAL RATES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any vermin district shall within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the vermin district for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the vermin districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said vermin districts respectively: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the annual rates per square mile payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of lands within the vermin districts respectively named in conjunction therewith, that is to say:—

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Northern Vermin District shall be Two shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District shall be Three shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Warracknabeal Vermin District shall be Nine shillings per square mile.

The annual fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence shall be Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing.

The annual fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Warracknabeal Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence shall be Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing.

A By-law of the Shire of Phillip Island, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 3, for preserving public decency.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Phillip Island order as follows:—

No person above the age of twelve (12) years shall use the beach within the Shire of Phillip Island for the purpose of bathing within a distance of fifty (50) chains from any one of the public baths erected or to be erected thereon, except within the said baths. No person above the age of twelve years shall use the beach within the Shire of Phillip Island for the purpose of bathing at any place which is a greater distance than fifty chains from any one of the public baths erected or to be erected thereon between the hours of Seven o'clock in the morning and Seven o'clock in the evening, except such person being a male person be clothed with trunk of close texture and every female person in full bathing costume.

Every person offending against this by-law shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

SHIRE OF PHILLIP ISLAND.

BY-LAW No. 4.

A By-law of the Shire of Phillip Island, made under section 450 of the Local Government Act 1890, and numbered 4, for the management of the Cowes Baths.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Phillip Island order as follows:—

1. The baths situated on the Western Port Bay at Cowes, in the said shire, shall be known as the Cowes Baths.

2. The baths shall be open for the use of the public daily from daylight until dark (or at such other times as the Council may appoint), subject to the payment of the charges set forth in the schedule hereto appended, or such other charges as the Council from time to time may direct.

3. The hours of bathing—Ladies (denoted by white flag), from half-past Seven a.m. to Five p.m.; gentlemen (denoted by red flag), from daylight to half-past Seven a.m. and from Five p.m. until dark.

4. The time for bathing for each person shall not exceed forty minutes.

5. No person shall use obscene language or deface the walls or doors of the said baths by writing or drawing thereon.

6. No person shall smoke in the baths except in the apartment set apart for that purpose.

7. No person shall be admitted to the baths who shall be under the influence of liquor or guilty of disorderly conduct.

8. No dogs shall be allowed within the precincts of the baths. Any person found guilty of offending against this by-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

CITY OF BENDIGO, BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK, AND SHIRE OF MARONG.

BY-LAW No. 16.

A Joint By-law of the City of Bendigo, the Borough of Eaglehawk, and the Shire of Marong, made under the provisions of the Tramways Act 1890, Second Schedule, Clause 14, and in conformity with Part VII. of the Local Government Act 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1890 and the Tramways Act 1890 and Second Schedule thereto, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eaglehawk, and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Marong jointly order as follows:—

1. The by-law hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all tram cars and motors of the Bendigo Tramways Company Limited, and to premises of the said company with respect to which the councils have powers to make by-laws.

2. No person shall smoke inside of any car used on the tramway lines.

3. No passenger or other person while riding in or upon any car shall solicit alms, play or perform upon any musical instrument, distribute hand-bills or advertisements, or, without having first obtained the permission of the company, in writing, offer for sale any article.

4. No person who in the opinion of the conductor is in a state of intoxication shall be allowed to enter or mount upon any car, and if found in or upon any car shall, at the request of the conductor, leave the car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned, and if he does not at once leave the car he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and in such case he shall also be liable to the penalty provided by this by-law.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger, and any person who in the opinion of the conductor shall have committed a breach of this by-law shall leave the car on the request of the conductor to do so upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned, and if he does not leave the car at once he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and he shall also be liable to the penalty fixed by this by-law.

6. No person shall in any way soil or damage any motor or car, or remove or interfere with any fastening on any motor or car, or remove, affix, or deface any number, plate, printed notice, or advertisement, or writing on any part of, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any motor or car. Any person acting in contravention shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by this by-law, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

7. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who for any other reason might be offensive to passengers, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, nor shall he enter any car after being requested not to do so by the conductor, and any such person may be prevented from entering any car, and if found on any such car he shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned, and if he does not at once leave the car he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and in such case he shall be also liable to the penalty provided by this by-law.

8. No person shall without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall be on him) wilfully do any of the following things, namely, persist in riding or driving any horse, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any sheep, cattle, pigs, or other stock on the tramway line in front of any motor or car after the bell on such motor or car shall have been rung as a warning that the motor or car is coming behind or overtaking such horse, cart, carriage, or vehicle, sheep, cattle, pigs, or other stock. Interfere with, remove, or alter any part of the tramway, or of the works connected therewith. Place or throw any stones, dirt, wood, refuse, or other material on any part of the tramway. Do, or cause to be done, anything in such manner as to obstruct any motor or carriage using the tramway, or to endanger the lives of persons therein or thereon, knowingly aid or assist in doing of any such thing, he shall for every such offence be liable (in addition to any proceedings by way of indictment or otherwise to which he may be subject) to the penalty prescribed by this by-law.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, exhibit and deliver up his ticket, or pay to the conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey.

10. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of workmen) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any car.

11. Every passenger who shall take upon a car any article or articles which shall exceed altogether the weight of 28 lbs. shall pay to conductor on demand the sum of Three pence for every such article or for each package of luggage so in excess. Nevertheless, the conductor may refuse any such article or any excess luggage and may remove it from the car if found thereon.

12. No person not being a servant of the company shall enter or mount any motor, or stand on the platforms of any car, or travel on the steps of any car.

13. No person shall enter or attempt to enter, or leave or attempt to leave, any car while such car is in motion.

14. No person except a passenger or intended passenger shall enter or mount any car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of the car or motor.

15. When a car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to carry, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such car when warned by the conductor not to do so.

16. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, paints, oils, or glass, or anything which shall project beyond the car, or which may, in the opinion of the conductor, be liable to damage the car or the person or property of any person.

17. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the company in the execution of his duty upon or in connexion with any motor, car, or tramway of the company.

18. No person shall be entitled to have any dog or other animal in or on any car.

19. Any servant of the company guilty of incivility or discourtesy to any person or persons using the cars of the company, or in a state of intoxication while in the execution of his duty, shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by this by-law.

20. Any person offending against or committing a breach or any offence under this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

21. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the company.
