PROHIBITION OF FISHING FOR SEALS, ETC., ON CHILIAN TERRITORY.

REMUNERATION TO BAILIFFS.

TABLE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Order regarding Remuneration to Bailiffs, to take effect from and after the 1st March, 1894, viz.:—

Salaried officers shall continue to receive the execution fee and mileage, but when such gross fees and mileage reach Two hundred pounds within the financial year, such officer shall cease to draw any further amount for such fees or mileage unless, under exceptional circumstances, the Law Officer shall otherwise direct.

Non-salaried officers shall continue to receive One pound for every pound of amounts actually recovered and paid to revenue, but when such gross fees and mileage reach Two hundred and fifty pounds within the financial year, the payment of One pound for every pound shall cease, and such bailiffs shall thereafter respectively receive only the execution fees and mileage.

Refund of guarantee premiums shall be made only to those bailiffs whose gross receipts do not amount to Sixty-five pounds in any financial year.

It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Patents, in writing under his hand and seal, to temporarily or permanently suspend for cause from practising as a patent agent any person holding any licence to practise as a patent agent in the colony of Victoria, and such suspension similarly to revoke at his discretion; subject, in the case of suspension, to an appeal to the Law Officer, who may confirm, vary, or annul such suspension.

. By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the City of Prahran, made under section 35 of the *Health Act 1890*, for the registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk, and numbered 105.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran do hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 90 made by the Local Board of Health for the City of Prahran shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk in the City of Frahran shall, on or before the 1st day of January in every year, register himself in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Town Clerk of the said City an application in the following form or to the like effect. Every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Ten shillings.

Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Town Clerk shall indere the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean. He shall sweep and cleanse his premises daily, and shall cause all animal excreta and filthy matter therein to be collected and placed where least offensive, and removed from the premises weekly at furthest, and he shall in the months of April and October in every year specially cleanse, in the following manner, the premises wherein he shall keep any cow, that is to say:—All dung, litter, and other matter shall be removed therefrom, and the doors, stalls, and woodwork thoroughly washed with water. Thereafter a coating of limewash, made up by mixing freshly burned lime with water, each gallon of limewash containing one-fifth of a pint of carbolic acid, shall be applied to the walls, floors, ceilings, and every other part of the premises with which animals or their excreta have come in contact.

5. Every person following the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the Health Officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

6. Neither he nor any person under his direction or control, whilst suffering from any infectious disease, or contagious disease, or

upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

6. Neither he nor any person under his direction or control, whilst suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, shall milk any cow or handle any vessel used in his business for containing milk, nor in any way take part or assist in the conduct of the business of a dairynnan as far as regards the extraction, distribution, or storage of the milk, until all danger of the communication of infection to the milk or of contamination thereof shall have ceased, and he shall have furnished satisfactory certificate to the Health Officer that such danger no longer exists; and he shall not mix the milk of a deceased cow with other milk, and shall not sell or use the same for human food or food for any other animal.

7. Every person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.





The births of 1,057 children, viz., 541 boys and 546 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of February. In the month of January, 1,122 births were registered, or 65 more than in the month under roview. The births were 27 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 140 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in February numbered 599, viz., 318 of males and 281 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 436, or 76 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in January by 119, and below the average of February during the previous ten years by 129.

If, however, allowance he made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 172.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.37, and of deaths registered 1.35.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 96·1° on the 5th, and the lowest was 46·2° on the 13th. The mean temperature of the month (65·5°) was one-fifth of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45·3°) took place on the 17th, and the least range (9·2°) on the 6th, the mean daily range being 21·3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30·318 inches on the 25th, and the lowest was 29·603 inches on the 20th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·926 inches) was a fraction of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 4 days, the amount of rainfall being 33 inch. The nortality of the month. Twenty-eight deaths were ascribed to violence during the month, of which twenty-two were set down to accident, two to homicide, and four to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A gold miner, aged 70, and a bootmaker, aged 73, were passed over by railway trains: a driver, aged 24, a bootmaker, aged 37, and a female, aged 55, died of injuries consequent on falls: an iron-dresser, aged 41, of injuries received through the bursting of an emery-stone: a coachbuilder, aged 47, of fracture of the skull, caused by some timber falling on him; a butcher, aged 16, of injuries resulting from being thrown from a cart; a boy, aged 13, of injuries received in a fight; a gentleman, aged 65, through being thrown down by a dog running against him; a male child, aged 2, two labourcrs, aged 23 and 27 respectively, a female, aged 35, and a verger, aged 42, of burns; a female, aged 58, of heat apoplexy: a boy, aged 11, and a cook, aged 69, were drowned in the River Yarra; a female, aged 27, in Hobson's Bay; a female infant, aged 1 year, was overlain; a labourer, aged 29, died under chloroform properly administered; a clerk, aged 24, of gunshot wounds, accidentally received. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male and a new-born female infant, who were smothered, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a carpenter, aged 47, who threw himself is a farmer, aged 68, who drowned himself; a boot salesman, aged 62, who hanged himself; and a farmer, aged 27, who threw himself from a window.

One hundred and twenty-five deaths, or 21 per cent, of the whole, tack place in public institutions viz :=62 in the

One hundred and twenty-five deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—62 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Women's Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 241, of which 129, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 112, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 165 were under one year of age, 54 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 358. Of these, 189, or 53 per cent., were males, and 169, or 47 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 30 were between twenty-five and thirty, 34 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty, 18 were between fifty and fifty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fisty-five, 25 were between seventy and seventy, 39 were between seventy-five and eighty-five and eighty-five and ninety, and 2 were between niety and ninety-five.

In the 28 days of February, as compared with the 31 days of January, deaths from miasmatic diseases rose from 27 to 40. Under this head, fatal cases of typhoid fever increased from 18 to 22, of diphtheria from 1 to 5, of whooping cough from 6 to 9, and of measles from nil to 1; whilst on the other hand, deaths from influenza fell from 4 to 1, and deaths from scarlet fell from 3 to 2. Moreover, deaths from those complaints classed under the head of diarrhead diseases fell from 29 to 21. Want of breast milk was set down as the cause of 5 deaths of infants in February, as against as many as 16 in January, and sunstroke as the cause of 1 death in February as against as many as 6 deaths in January.

THE subjoined Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Woodend Public Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the Cemeterics Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council.

Rules and Regulations of the Woodend Public Cemetery.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1830, the Trustees of the Woodend Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after publication in the Government Gazette, and all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescivingly.

rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four

mas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to rour p.m.

3. All applications shall be made to the trustees through the secretary. All fees and charges shall be paid to him at his office, and particulars given as in Schedule A before the ground or vault is opened, when a burial right will be issued (Schedule B).

4. Any order for internent shall be given to the secretary before Twelve a.m. on the day previous, except that for a burial on the Monday it shall be ordered before Twelve a.m. on the Saturday previous, otherwise an extra charge shall be made, and no burial shall be permitted in said cemetery unless a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

5. The principal entrance shall be open daily from Seven a.m. to Six p.m.

to Six p.m.

6. The hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week days, September to April inclusive, from Ten a.m. to Six p.m.;
May to August inclusive, from Ten a.m. to half-past Four p.m.
Sundays, throughout the year, One to Four p.m.
7. No burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Saven p.m, and Seven a.m. except by special permission of the trustees,
8. The time fixed for burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

9. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 8 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

10. That any person wanting a brick grave or vault may be permitted to construct the same under directions of the secretary on payment of the required fee.

11. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

- 2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.
- 3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsover beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.
- 4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.
- 5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.
- 9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.
- 10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department.
