MARINE ACT 1893 (No. 2).—ROYAL ASSENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithric, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander, in Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by the Constitution Statute it was amongst other things enacted that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land, which relate to the giving and withholding of Her Majesty's assent to Bills, and the reservation of. Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and the instructions to be conveyed to Governors for their guidance in relation to the matters aforesaid, and the disallowance of Bills by Her Majesty, should apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the Constitution Act of Victoria and the now reciting Statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly: And whereas the Bill hereinafter mentioned was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: And whereas by an Order of the Queen in Council made on the third day of March, One thousand eight hundred and -ninety-four, a copy whereof is hereto appended, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the said Bill: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill the title whereof is herein set forth, that is to say,

"An Act to amend the Sixty-fifth Section of the Marine Act WHEREAS by the Constitution Statute it was amongst other

"An Act to amend the Sixty-fifth Section of the Marine Act 1890."

which was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's plea-bure thereon, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

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of the said Colony shall signify either by speech or message to the Legislative Conneil of the said Colony or by Proclamation as therein aforesaid that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same:

And whereas by another Act passed in the thirteenth and flourteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies, it was provided among other things that the provisions of the said former Act concerning the reservation of Bills for the signification of ther Majesty's pleasure thereon should apply to and be in force in the Colony of Victoria:

And whereas the said provisions were maintained in force, as regards Bills passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony by a subsequent Act passed in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of the reign of Her said Majesty, entitled An Act to enable Her Majesty to ussent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of Victoria; to catablish a Constitution in and for the Colony of Victoria; to catablish a Constitution in and for the Governor of the said Colony, entitled An Act to amend the Sixty-Hith Section of the Marine. Act, 1890 for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon:

And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the issuid Bill should be assented to by Her Majesty:

Now therefore Her Majesty, in pursuance of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to Her Majesty as aforesaid, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, declare Her assent to the said Bill.

By the ordinances and regulations issued for the Protectorate of the German New Guinea Company, the only ports of entry and clearance within the limits of the said Protectorate are the

The port of Friedrich Wilhelmshafen, for Kaiser Wilhelms The port of Friedrich Wilhelmshafen, for Kaiser Wilhelmsland; and the roadstead of Herbertshoch for the Bismarck Archipelago, including New Mecklenberg (formerly called New Ireland), and New Pomerania (formerly called New Britain), and for northern part of the Solomon Islands and adjacent islands and groups.

Trading, recruiting of Pacific Islanders, and fishing of pearl shells, pearls, and beche-de-mer within the limits of the said Protectorate are permitted only after obtaining a special licence for such purpose through the competent German colonial authority.

These ordinances, as well as the Custom House Regulations, have to be observed by the captains and the crews, of ships of all nations visiting the said Protectorate.

Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the Factorics and Shops Act 1890 (54 Vict. 

WHEREAS by Part I. of the Defences and Discipline Act 1890 it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Financial and Store Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART II., PAY OF MILITIA FORCES.—SECTION III., VICTORIAN MILITIA.

I.-Rates of Pay.

In para. 57, for the sub-heading—"Artillery, Field Company of Engineers, and Infantry," the following sub-heading is substituted—"Artillery, Field Company of Engineers, Infantry, and Ambulance Corps."

The rates of pay fixed for the Ambulance Corps are cancelled.

PART VII., STORES.—SECTION I., GENERAL REGULATIONS, ORDNANCE STORES.

After para. 167 the following is added:—
167A. When Government rifles or carbinos have become damaged or unserviceable in any other way than by fair wear and tear, or have been lost through negligence, the corps or person responsible will be required to pay the cost of the same, allowance being made according to the period during which the arm has been on issue.

The life of a rifle or carbine will be fixed at ten years constant issue. During the first two years no allowance will be made; to the reach successive year during which the arm has been in use one-tenth of the cost of repairs will be allowed; for example, if the damage has occurred at the end of the third year of issue, seven-tenths of the cost of repair will be charged; and so on until completion of the tenth year, after which the cost will be borne by the State.

When a new barrel has been fitted, the rifle will be considered as new from the date of re-issue.

If, in the opinion of the Commandant, culpable negligence shall be proved in the case of arms on issue, it shall be in his power to order the full or any proportionate value to be paid irrespective of the age of the weapon; but not less than half-price will be charged for any article wilfully or carelessly lost or damaged, although it may have been in use for the prescribed period of wear.

Tampering with arms, such as filing sights, using on them, or any part of them, emery or other forbidden substances, will be considered culpable negligence, and will be charged for accordingly.

 9. After the expiration of this permit, and on satisfactory proof being given that the above conditions have been fulfilled, a lease for 21 years will be issued under the provisions of Part I. Division 6, of the Land Act 1890. The rent under the lease shall be fixed by the Governor in Council.

 10. In all proceedings for any alleged breach of the conditions of this permit, or of the regulations under which it is issued, the burden of proof of compliance therewith shall rest with the holder thereof.
- 11. Should the holder of this permit commit a breach of or neglect to comply with the above conditions, or be deemed by the Minister not to be a fit and proper person to hold a lease as aforesaid, this permit may be cancelled and possession of the land resumed.
- 12. The publication of a notice in the Government Gazette, purporting to declare that this permit has been forfeited or cancelled, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited
